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MINUTES

Charles H. Duckett, M.D., President of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina called this meeting to order at 9:30 p.m., at the Pinehurst Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina.

The Board members present at this meeting included: John T. Daniel, Jr., M.D., Secretary-Treasurer; Eben Alexander, Jr., M.D.; David S. Citron, M.D.; Harold L. Godwin, M.D.; Hector Himel Henry, II, M.D.; Simmons Patterson, Jr., M.D., and Mrs. Martha Kirkland Walston.

Staff members present included: Bryant D. Paris, Jr.; Don Pittman; William H. Breeze, Jr.; Robbie Broyles; L. D. Beaver; and Sibyl Lamoreaux.

OLYMPIC FESTIVAL PHYSICIANS

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Godwin: (1) that the Board request Mr. Prentice, by the June, 1987, meeting, to make available for the Board members' review all licensure credentials for physicians planning to serve on the Official Sports Medicine Staff of the United States Olympic Committee for the 1987 Olympic Festival; (2) that the Board advise Mr. Prentice the licensure fee will be \$50.00 for each application; (3) that the Board further advise Mr. Prentice it expects each of these applicants to meet the licensure requirements imposed upon all physicians who practice medicine in the state of North Carolina, to include, should the Board of Medical Examiners deem it necessary, appearing for a personal interview; (4) that the Board also advise Mr. Prentice the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has reservations concerning this method of providing medical care, but that, as a favor, it will process these licensure applications; that the Board also send a copy of this letter to Robert Voy, M.D., Colorado Springs, Colorado; (5) and that, if appropriate, the Board of Medical Examiners approve these applicants for licensure with temporal and geographic limitations.

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Godwin that the Board permit an individual Board member to

approve a routine licensure application.

Finally, the Board reaffirmed its earlier action which specified that all physicians who plan to serve on the Staff of the United States Olympic Committee must have completed the credentialing process by the June, 1987, meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina in order to be eligible for licensure limited to the time period and geographic confines of the 1987 Olympic Festival.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

At 1:00 p.m., Thursday, May 30, 1987, Fred Glass, M.D., and Mr. Ed Browning from the Office of Emergency Medical Services met with the Board of Medical Examiners. Three companies demonstrated automatic defibrillators.

In addition to the use of automatic defibrillators, the Board of Medical Examiners discussed the following subjects with representatives from the Office of Emergency Medical Services:

- (1) Request for One Year Extension of the Pharyngeal Tracheal Lumen (PTL) Airway Study Project for Mecklenburg County,
- (2) Requests for Modifications, Expansion, and Extension of the Nitrous Oxide Study Project at East Carolina University School of Medicine, and
- (3) Request for Approval of Chest Tube Insertion by Emergency Medical Technicians-Paramedics.

At the conclusion of the demonstrations and discussion, on April 30, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board of Medical Examiners approve the concept of utilizing automatic or semi-automatic defibrillators in the state of North Carolina. On April 30, 1987, the Board unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board approve the concept for utilization of any and/or all of three defibrillators demonstrated at this meeting.

On April 30, 1987, the Board also unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners approve the request for a one year extension of the Pharyngeal Tracheal Lumen Airway Study Project for Mecklenburg County.

On April 30, 1987, the Board adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board of Medical Examiners approve E. Jackson Allison, Jr., M.D., as Co-Medical Director of the Nitrous Oxide Study Project at East Carolina University School of Medicine.

On April 30, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a further motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board not approve the requests for expansion and extension of the Nitrous Oxide Study Project; and that the Office of Emergency Medical Examiners request Dr. Spicer to provide additional data concerning the possibility of conducting a significant study prior to the August, 1987, meeting of the Board in order that the Board of Medical Examiners may reconsider this matter. Dr. Godwin voted in opposition to this motion.

On April 30, 1987, the Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board of Medical Examiners not approve the doubled-blinded study request.

On April 30, 1987, the Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners not approve the insertion of chest tubes by Emergency Medical Services Technicians-Paramedics.

On April 30, 1987, the Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners approve all initial advanced life support applications, recertification applications, and bee sting certifications submitted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services for the Board members' consideration at the May, 1987, meeting.

ANORECTIC PRESCRIBING

The Board instructed its staff: (1) to obtain information from the American Medical Association on anorectic prescribing; (2) to obtain a copy of Dr. Stunkard's article in the New England Journal of Medicine on anorectic prescribing; (3) to forward this information to Dr. Patterson who will review and edit the material for future distribution by the Board of Medical Examiners; and also, (4) to request, after Dr. Patterson has consolidated the material, that the Journal of the North Carolina Medical Society publish this information.

BERRY, CHARLES MARKHAM, M.D., Georgia

On April 30, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board offer Dr. Berry the opportunity to surrender his license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina; and that, should this physician refuse to surrender his North Carolina medical license, the Board of Medical Examiners prefer charges against him.

MAY, 1988, BOARD MEETING

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion to hold this Board meeting in conjunction with the 1987 meeting of the North Carolina Medical Society. The Board reviewed information indicating that the Medical Society may hold this meeting in the fall.

JUNE, 1988, BOARD MEETING

On May 1, 1987, the Board decided to begin the June, 1988, Board meeting on Wednesday prior to the start of the North Carolina Examination for Licensure (FLEX). The Board members also discussed extending this meeting through Sunday following FLEX and mentioned approximate meeting dates of June 1 through June 5, 1988. The Board members also decided to meet at the North Raleigh Hilton and requested the staff to determine the exact dates for administering the June, 1988, North Carolina Examination for Licensure and to inform the Board of these dates at its June, 1987, meeting.

FIRST PHYSICIANS, P.A.

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board request the individuals wishing to use this corporate name to provide additional information concerning both the significance of, and the reasons for, use of this proposed name; that it advise these individuals that the Board of Medical Examiners has some reservations about approving this name; and that it also advise these individuals, upon receipt of the requested information, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina will be glad to act upon this request.

H & M DERMATOLOGY, P.A.

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board advise the individuals wishing to form this professional corporation that the regulations of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina do not permit the Board to approve this proposed corporate name.

HEALTH AND HYGIENE CLINICAL EVALUATION CENTER, INCORPORATED

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board acknowledge receipt of Mr. Howard L. Williams letter of April 8, 1987, and advise Mr. Williams that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has reviewed this letter and has accepted it as information.

CAPP CARE, DATA REQUEST

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board not provide the data requested by CAPP CARE.

WORLD MEDICINE CHEST, DATA REQUEST

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board not provide the data requested by World Medicine Chest.

PRESBYTERIAN HOSPITAL, DATA REQUEST

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board offer this institution the opportunity to purchase a Roster of Registered Physicians or a data print-out.

IMPAIRED PHYSICIANS PROGRAM

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett

that the Board accept as information a report concerning this matter.

CONSENT ORDER WORDING

The Board instructed that the staff, including the Board's attorney, review the language contained in Consent Orders and that the Board of Medical Examiners include in all Consent Orders a statement clearly informing respondents that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina will publicize this information.

INFORMAL INTERVIEWS, LETTERS REQUESTING APPEARANCE

The Board instructed that the staff add to letters requesting individuals to appear for informal interviews a statement advising them that they have the right to be represented by counsel.

CLEVELAND COUNTY MEDICAL SOCIETY

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board advise Dr. Carter concerning the procedure for obtaining public information from the office of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina and that the Board also advise Dr. Carter he should obtain any additional information concerning this matter from Dr. Day.

KAISER PERMANENTE

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board advise Kaiser Permanente by letter with a copy to the Board of Pharmacy that the proposal submitted by this organization meets the requirements as set forth in the current rules and regulations of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina; however, it remains the responsibility of Kaiser Permanente to stay apprised of any changes in statutory and regulatory requirements and to act accordingly.

DYKERS, JOHN R., JR., M.D., AIDS card

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr.

Duckett that the Board accept as information a letter from Dr. Dykers concerning AIDScard and that the Board of Medical Examiners continue to monitor the matters discussed in this letter.

PHYSICAL THERAPY QUESTIONS

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion that it advise Dr. Hatfield it is the opinion of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina that the physical therapy activities involving patient evaluation and treatment described in his letter of March 11, 1987, may be in violation of North Carolina General Statute 90-18; and that, prior to mailing this letter, the Board request its attorney to review the proposed correspondence.

MISSION AIR, INCORPORATED

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Executive Secretary send the proposed letter to Dr. Miles.

RETIREMENT SAVINGS PLAN

On May 1, 1987, the Board unanimously adopted a motion to approve a lateral move within the retirement plan.

HACKNEY, CHARLES LANDIS, PA, Jacksonville, North Carolina

On May 2, 1987, the Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board prepare a Consent Order to be signed by Mr. Hackney containing the following stipulations:

1. that this physician assistant will abstain from the use of mind-altering chemicals;
2. that Mr. Hackney will submit to random drug screens at his expense;
3. that he will attend AA and NA meetings on a regular basis;
4. and that failure to comply with any of these three stipulations will result in the revocation of Mr. Hackney's approval to perform medical acts as a physician assistant.

MCCOY, MARTIN LEMUEL, M.D., Monroe, Louisiana

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board prepare a Consent Order for Dr. McCoy's signature based on the conditions imposed in the state of Louisiana and containing an additional stipulation requiring Dr. McCoy to notify the Board of Medical Examiners prior to engaging in the practice of medicine in the state of North Carolina so that the Board may schedule an interview with this physician.

PEER REVIEW ORGANIZATION

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board accept a report concerning this matter as information and that it notify Dr. Snyder, at this time, there is no necessity for him to meet with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

The Executive Secretary presented a report concerning Peer Review at the Federation level and informed the Board of Medical Examiners that the Federation believes the results of all Peer Review efforts should be confidential.

SANDERS, JAMES HENRY, M.D., Brevard, North Carolina

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board advise Dr. Sanders it authorizes him to review and countersign chart entries made by Lee Franklin Murray, PA, within forty-eight hours; and that, for his information, the Board of Medical Examiners further advise Dr. Sanders, if there is Medicare billing for a patient, this organization requires physician countersignature of all extender chart entries, in addition to site visits by a physician.

ANORECTICS NATIONAL RESEARCH

On May 2, 1987, the President of the Board of Medical Examiners informed the Board members that Dr. Mack of Greenville, North Carolina, will research medical indications for anorectics on a national level and that this physician will make the results of his research available for the Board's review. Dr. Alexander also instructed the staff to request information on anorectics from the American Medical Association.

ANDRINGA, RICHARD CORNELL, M.D., Wisconsin

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion that it remind Dr. Andringa, prior to resuming the practice of medicine in this state, he must appear before the Board of Medical Examiners; that the Board further advise Dr. Andringa it can arrange an interview during its June, 1987, meeting; and that the Board also advise Dr. Andringa he may have counsel present during this interview.

CORPENING, WILLIAM NYE, M.D., Granite Falls, North Carolina

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina not comply with Dr. Corpening's request that the Board return this physician's North Carolina license certificate. Dr. Daniel and Dr. Alexander voted in opposition to this motion.

COBBLE, CLARK ROBERT, M.D., Danville, Virginia

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept a report indicating the state of Virginia has approved Dr. Cobble for full, unrestricted licensure as information; and that, if Dr. Cobble requests reinstatement of his North Carolina license, the Board implement the conditions contained in the Consent Order by instructing this physician to appear before the Board of Medical Examiners.

DURANTE, SPENCER EMANUEL, JR., M.D., Charlotte, North Carolina

On March 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report on the death of this physician.

LUPRECHT, GERI LYN, M.D., Winston-Salem, North Carolina

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept a report concerning this physician as information; that it thank Dr. Maddox for providing this report; that it request another progress report at the end of

six months; and that it interview Dr. Luprecht prior to the expiration of her temporary license.

MARCH, 1987, MINUTES

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board approve the Minutes of the March, 1987, Meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

DEBNATH, SUBODH CHANDRA, M.D., Saudi Arabia

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board not act upon this licensure application as the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has not been able to determine that Dr. Debnath's postgraduate medical education and training meets its equivalency standards. The Board members also indicated that, since Dr. Debnath did not withdraw his licensure application, he is not eligible to receive a fee refund.

NURSE MIDWIFERY SUBCOMMITTEE REPLACEMENT FOR DR. MATTOX

On May 2, 1987, the Executive Secretary stated that he will formally request Dr. Brame to recommend a replacement for Dr. Mattox; and that, when Dr. Brame makes a recommendation for Dr. Mattox's replacement, Mr. Paris will send out postcard ballots to all Board members.

MEETINGS: NP JOINT SUBCOMMITTEE & NURSE MIDWIFERY COMMITTEE

Dr. Citron recommended that the Board consider holding brief, annual meetings; and that the staff call a representative of the Nurse Practitioner Joint Subcommittee to determine whether there are sufficient agenda items to hold a meeting in June, 1987.

BIENNIAL REGISTRATION FORM

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners discussed the

following modifications to the current registration form:

adding a question asking physicians if they have experienced any problems with licensing boards or with institutions resulting in amended privileges;

adding a question asking physicians if they have received treatment for any medical condition;

adding routine questions asked all physicians who apply for licensure in North Carolina;

adding the three final questions which appear on Kentucky Board's registration form;

requesting attorney's opinion whether a request of physicians to provide additional information regarding problems is illegal and self-incriminating;

making it more obvious that physicians should complete portions only if there have been changes since their last registration;

adding a "c" to the Kentucky Board's registration form asking physicians about investigations for continued membership in or association with various organizations;

placing two boxes under question "1" instead of one;

clearly stating physicians are required to answer the following questions in order to register their licenses to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina;

advising physicians the front of the registration form contains the information the Board requires;

including a statement on the back of the registration form advising physicians it is optional to provide information on items printed below the line;

advising physicians it is their responsibility to inform the Board of Medical Examiners of address changes.

not requiring physicians to provide Social Security numbers;

requesting the Executive Secretary to determine whether Health Research Services wants registration information;

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously

adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board instruct the Executive Secretary, in consultation with the President of the Board, the Secretary of the Board, and the Board's attorney, to devise a new registration form. Dr. Citron indicated that it will not be necessary to obtain full Board approval of the new form.

MCGOVERN, LAWRENCE OWEN, M.D., Lexington, North Carolina

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board extend Dr. McGovern's temporary license for a year; that, for insurance purposes, the Board of Medical Examiners make the date of this licensure retroactive; that it include in a letter to Dr. McGovern, and to all physicians who receive temporary licensure, a statement indicating it is the physician's responsibility to insure he or she meets with the Board of Medical Examiners prior to the expiration of this license; and that, if Dr. McGovern has continued to make satisfactory progress, at the end of a year, the Board consider approving this physician for full licensure.

ADDRESS CHANGES

The President instructed that the Executive Secretary devise some formal and regular method of insuring that physicians receive correspondence from the Board of Medical Examiners, to include, if necessary, sending correspondence certified, return receipt requested; and that the Executive Secretary also include a statement in correspondence sent to physicians which indicates it is the physician's responsibility to inform the Board of Medical Examiners of his or her current address.

BRANTLEY, CHARLES KENNETH, M.D., Raleigh, North Carolina

As requested, on May 1, 1987, Dr. Brantley appeared for an informal interview. On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board approve Dr. Brantley for a one year dated license without practice site restrictions; that it provide Dr. Brantley with a full-size, regularly numbered license certificate bearing an expiration date; and that it interview Dr. Brantley prior to the expiration of this dated license.

SOWERS, ROBERT E., D.O., Dixon, Missouri

On May 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board advise Dr. Sowers his licensure credentials are incomplete.

DEANS, MEETING WITH

On May 1, 1987, at 1:00 p.m., the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met with William E. Laopus, M.D., Dean, East Carolina School of Medicine; Thomas R. Kinney, Associate Dean, Duke University School of Medicine; William Ernest Bakewell, Jr., M.D., University of North Carolina School of Medicine; and Charles Douglas Maynard, M.D., Bowman Gray School of Medicine.

The Board members discussed several mutual concerns with the representatives of the North Carolina medical schools, including:

1. the statutory change requiring graduates of medical schools outside the United States to complete three years of graduate medical education and training prior to the Board's approving these physicians for medical licensure in the state of North Carolina;

Dr. Citron discussed provisions enabling the Board of Medical Examiners, if it determines a physician's graduate medical education and training is comparable to the Board's requirements, to approve the individual for limited licensure, such as visiting professor registration, and requiring this physician, should he or she desire continued licensure, to take and pass FLEX.

2. increase in licensure fees

Dr. Citron reported on plans for computerized, state-of-the art National Board examinations involving a great deal of expense. He also discussed the cost of FLEX, which will be \$360.00, and the Board of Medical Examiners' intention to charge a fee to administer FLEX not to exceed \$400.00 plus the cost of the examination.

3. expansion of the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Program

Dr. Duckett stated that Dr. Godwin is Chairman of a Committee working on implementing this expansion program with the North Carolina Medical Society and also reported that, to date, the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee has been operating on a voluntary basis.

Dr. Godwin stated, "North Carolina would like to follow New Jersey's lead. In New Jersey, the insurance carriers have invested money in a physician rehabilitation program to prevent malpractice costs at a later date."

The representatives from North Carolina medical schools entered into this discussion of impaired physicians by reporting to the Board on plans to implement drug testing for medical school faculty and students throughout the state.

Dr. Godwin related the term 'impairment' to physicians with physical, mental, or emotional difficulties as well as to those who have experienced problems with substance abuse. Dr. Alexander stated that he believes the incidence of alcohol abuse among physicians is extremely high; and Dr. Citron mentioned that the Board has spent a great deal of its time in an effort to assist cognitively impaired physicians. He also commented on the Maryland physician rehabilitation program, which the Board has utilized on occasion, and stated that it would be helpful to the Board of Medical Examiners if North Carolina had a similar system for evaluating and rehabilitating impaired physicians.

During a discussion in which the Board asked a question concerning the appropriate method for contacting a physician from a medical school with a request to review records, the representatives from the medical schools suggested to the members of the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners that, if the Board wishes to obtain expert opinions from physicians at medical schools, it should contact the Chairmen of the various departments rather than contacting the Deans' offices.

3. problems with photograph certification;

The Board of Medical Examiners said that it has experienced difficulty, particularly with the Deans of Georgia and Wisconsin Medical Schools, in certifying photographs of physicians who graduated from medical school prior to 1978.

4. Peer Review Organization;

The medical school representatives advocated an increased sharing of information between the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners, the North Carolina Medical Society, and the Peer Review Organization. Dean Laupus stated that the term "peer" may need further definition. Dr. Maynard said that, if Peer Review becomes an extremely important concept, the medical schools may need to become involved in retraining physicians.

5. concerns of the representatives from medical schools
in North Carolina

The medical school representatives requested: (1) data on Family Practice recertification and (2) to be included on the Board of Medical Examiners' formal action mailing list.

MEETING FACILITIES

The Board members discussed obtaining reservations for the annual meeting at a different hotel from the one utilized by the medical society.

REINSTATEMENTS

On May 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board reinstate the licenses of the following physicians:
