

MEETING OF THE
BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS OF THE
STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

August 11-14, 1977
The Radisson Plaza Hotel
Charlotte, North Carolina

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at The Radisson Plaza Hotel, Charlotte, N.C., August 11-14, 1977 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and conducting other business.

Drs. Charles B. Wilkerson, Jr., President, J. Jerome Pence, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer, David S. Citron, Bryant L. Galusha, Joyce H. Reynolds, and E. Wilson Staub were present. Dr. Bruce B. Blackmon was absent from the meeting. Also present were Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary, Mrs. Betty Joe Barick, Assistant Executive Secretary, Mrs. Diane Freeman, and Mr. Lee Denney, Investigator.

Thursday, August 11

The Board convened for business and reviewing credentials of applicants for license by endorsement.

RE: Visa Qualifying Examination -- Dr. Galusha moved that the Board support the Board of Directors of the Federation of State Medical Boards in their resolution declaring the Visa Qualifying Examination as equivalent to the ECFMG examination for the purposes of ECFMG certification. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Hadrahan Banerjee, Cleveland, Ohio -- Request to be allowed to take FLEX, and be covered by a resident's training license at a state institution while waiting to take the examination, and during the interim of certification of the grades; and if he does not pass the examination the first time, but makes a FLEX Weighted Average of at least 70.0 on the first attempt, he be allowed to remain in the state institution, covered by the resident's training license until the next FLEX examination. Dr. Galusha moved that Dr. Banerjee be advised that based on his past performance on the FLEX examination, the Board feels this is tantamount to fulfilling the Board's policy on this matter, and the Board deny his request. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Federation of Associations of Health Regulatory Boards (FAHRB) Forum -- Following general discussion of the upcoming meeting, Dr. Citron moved that the Board's Executive Secretary attend the Fourth FAHRB Forum to be held in Louisiana September 16-18, 1977, which will have workshops during the meeting on State Board Recordkeeping, Competence of Health Professionals, and a Mock Hearing, as the Board's representative. Seconded by Dr. Reynolds and duly passed.

RE: Recertification examination for Mobile Intensive Care Technicians -- Following general discussion, Dr. Galusha moved that the procedure for the recertification examination be accepted as presented by the Office of Emergency Medical Services, and the Board would appreciate it if that office would present to the Board with each list of re-certified Mobile Intensive Care Technicians the following:

- 1) a list of all persons taking the recertification examination, passes and failures;
- 2) a copy of the examination for the Board's review;
- 3) a brief explanation of the examination procedure, including such things as whether it was closed or open-book examination, supervision, etc.;

and that the Executive Secretary so notify the Office of Emergency Medical Services. Motion seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Alton R. Anderson, Raleigh, N.C. -- Dr. Anderson missed taking the first part of the June, 1977 examination, stating that someone told him the first day of the examination was Wednesday instead of Tuesday. Must he re-take the entire examination or can he take only Part I at the next examination. The Board advised the Executive Secretary that the Board's policy is that the examination must be taken and passed in one sitting.



RE: Catawba Valley Technical Institute -- Assistant to Physician Program:

The Board discussed the training program for assistants to physicians at the Catawba Valley Technical Institute, which program presently will train assistants for work only in hospital emergency departments. The President of the Board was authorized to discuss the Board's concerns about the program with Colonel Charles Speed, Director of the Office of Emergency Medical Services, and the Board's concern for the students already enrolled in the program. The President was also authorized to tell Colonel Speed that the Board was considering making it a requirement for all assistants to physicians to pass the examination given by the National Commission on Certification of Physician's Assistants in order to be approved by the Board to function as an assistant to a physician.

Dr. Citron moved that the Board request their attorney to draft a proposed regulation which would require that an assistant to a physician pass the National Certifying Examination within a certain period of time after his graduation from an approved program as a requisite for his continued approval by the Board, after a certain date, and that this be considered at the October, 1977 Board meeting. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

Bolin did appear and was represented by counsel, Frank P. Cooke, Esq. Following this hearing and the presentation of evidence, and upon motion duly made, seconded and passed, Dr. Bolin's license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina was suspended; suspension stayed upon the terms and conditions as set forth in the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order of the Board.

RE: New legislation -- John Anderson, attorney for the Board, discussed the new legislation that was considered and passed by the North Carolina General Assembly during their most recent session, concluded in June, 1977. This included an additional requirement for licensure in the state of the successful completion of one year of post-graduate training in a Board-approved training program. Also included as part of the new legislation are new Board procedures relating to public hearings, and the collection and compilation of records and information regarding physicians licensed by the Board. Also in this same session of the General Assembly, a bill was passed entitled "An Act to Enable Registered and Licensed Practical Nurses to Carry Out the Orders of Physicians' Assistants Under Certain Conditions." This bill concerns the use of written standing orders which must be employed when a physician intends for his assistant to physician to give orders to registered or licensed practical nurses. Following general discussion on this particular new legislation, Dr. Citron moved that for any new applications for approval of assistants to physicians, or at the next registration period for all assistants to physicians, should the supervising physician intend for his assistant he is applying for approval of, to give orders to registered nurses or licensed practical nurses, the Board will require, as part of that approval or registration process, the submission of standing orders for the Board's review. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Joseph E. Swanton, Mississippi -- Dr. Citron moved that the charges preferred against Dr. Swanton be held in abeyance unless he advises the Board he is returning to North Carolina to practice. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Ali Shirkhoda, Chapel Hill, N.C. -- Dr. Shirkhoda appeared to discuss with the Board his request for special consideration for license by endorsement of credentials, although he does not meet the requirements of the Board regarding citizenship. Dr. Shirkhoda said he wanted a full license because with his training and credentials he does not feel he should have a resident's training license, especially since he is here to teach as well as receive additional training himself; and he possibly may want to do some locum tenens. He said he did not think the citizenship regulations were fair to him, and was asking the Board for their help in working out this situation. The Board advised him they could not make an exception to the rule, and since he does not yet have a resident's training license as of this date, he should apply for that immediately so he would be covered in his work.

RE: Joint subcommittee -- N. C. Board of Medical Examiners and N. C. Board of Nursing -- subcommittee report: Dr. Pence reported on the meeting of the joint subcommittee held on Thursday afternoon, August 11. Topics discussed by the subcommittee included House Bill 1216 which would allow registered nurses and licensed practice nurses to take orders from assistants to physicians and registered nurses performing medical acts. This Bill is valid only until July 1, 1978, and during this time will be reviewed by the Legislative Research Commission. Also discussed were the guidelines developed by the Joint Practice Committee for review by the subcommittee regarding nurses with graduate education who feel they have met the same requirements as nurses having completed the FNP programs, and wanting certification as registered nurses performing medical acts based on that graduate education. Dr. Citron informed the Board that the subcommittee members from the Board would keep all the other members informed on all aspects of House Bill 1216 and nurses with graduate education and action taken by the subcommittee in this respect. Other topics discussed included the time limit for countersigning orders, site visits to clinics utilizing nurse practitioners, and a workshop being planned by the Maternal and Child Health Branch of the N. C. Department of Human Resources.
