RE: Temporary License - At the direction of the Board, the secretary investigated the laws of all the other states with regard to temporary license and submitte a summary of the same.

Dr. Combs: Do you plan to open an office?

A. Yes, I have talked to some doctors in that area and they all seem anxious for me to come in.

Dr. Edmondson: When do you plan to come?

A. In the next two or three years.

VERDICT: Dr. John Elmer Burt was approved for license by endorsement by a vote of four to two.

RE: Dr. Elisha Judkins Cain appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. Prior to appearing he had furnished the secretary of the Board with information that he had been a patient at the Georgia Institute of Mental Health in Atlanta with a diagnosis of "Depressive Reaction"; that he was discharged and tranquilizers were prescribed. He said that due to the difficulty in obtaining the drugs prescribed he had taken the drugs, without authorization, from the Pharmacy at the Veterans Administration Hospital, for which he was arrested and charged with converting to his own use drugs and medical supplies, property of the United States, a value in excess of One Hundred Dollars. Dr. Cain plead guilty in the United States District Court, was committed to the custody of the Attorney General for imprisonment for a period of three years, sentence suspended and defendant placed on probation for a period of three years; that he consult with a psychiatrist for regular and continuous treatment until discharged and refrain from using drugs of any type except those that may be prescribed by a duly licensed physician.

Dr. Taylor: Dr. Cain, what are your plans for practice in North Carolina?

A. I have a job offered me in Goldsboro at the Wayne County Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Large: What would be your duties?

A. Working in the emergency room.

Dr. Combs: When did Wayne County offer you this job?

A. Last Monday

Q. Do you have any statement that they have offered you a job?

A. I do not have a statement, but they have offered me a job.

Dr. Galusha: Are you an urologist?

A. Yes

Q. Your duties would be in the emergency room?

A. Yes

Q. Do you think you will be satisfied?

A. Yes, I can not go in private practice, this is a job I need very much. I need a job with a salary. This job pays \$25,000 a year, plus a bonus.

Dr. Taylor: We read your letter explaining your problem. What drugs were you taking?

A. Valium

Q. Any other?

A. No

Dr. Galusha: Can I ask why you were taking these drugs until May?

A. Yes

Q. What has changed that you have total independence from the drugs?

A. I found out I did not need the drugs?

Q. Has there been an attitude change, environment?

A. Attitude, I found out I did not need these drugs.

Q. I am presuming if you were in an environment that does not have the pressure of private practice - - -.

A. Yes, if I take a drug I will be sent to prison. My whole life depends on I can not take any drugs.

Q. Do you have a family, children?

A. Yes, I have four children. As soon as I can get settled, my family will move. My family is with her family. I lost my home when I had a breakdown. I



Dr. Cain continued

- Dr. Cain: I read an advertisement from the Wayne County Memorial Hospital. I wrote them and they called me from Goldsboro. I went there last Monday a week ago and interviewed Mr. James and four other doctors. They offered me the job.
- Dr. Combs: You did not tell me you discussed with the group of people you interviewed your present situation, your court trouble.
- A. Yes, I have not made any bones about it.
- Dr. Edmondson: Was alcohol or any other drug involved other than valium?
- A. No sir
- Dr. Combs: You said the drug was hard to obtain.
- A. You can not write a prescription for an abuse drug for yourself and family.
- Q. You were put on it in Georgia, could you not get someone to prescribe it.
- A. I was supposed to go to a psychiatrist in Alabama. It is hard to go to a psychiatrist. I thought I could do it myself. I was O. D., I had a key and got it out of the drug room. I had cut down but was accumulating because I did not know when I could get any more.
- Q. What was the value of the drug you took without permission?
- A. I do not know.
- Q. Over how long a period of time did you take it?
- A. From Christmas until May 8th.
- Q. How much did you take out of the pharmacy at the time?
- A. About 100
- Q. A 100 would last about how long?
- A. Forever, I was sort of like a squirrel. I did not know when I would have an opportunity to get back in there.
- Dr. Edmondson: Is this the first episode of acute depression you have gone through with?
- A. I had a nervous breakdown in May, 1968, was in a mental institution three weeks. I had to leave it, I could not afford it. I went back to practice after November, 1968, had another breakdown.
- Q. Prior to 1968 you had no trouble.
- A. I had been under a psychiatrist for depression.
- Q. For how long?
- A. It all goes back to the time my mother had a stroke four years ago. I was very much upset about it, I still am but I have adjusted. She can not talk, is paralyzed on one side. I think that is what started it, that and all the other responsibility with four children supporting them, and helping to support my mother. She is in a nursing home. This is all being taken care of by me and my sister. I can not cope with it now.
- Q. Are you under psychiatric supervision?
- A. Part of my probation stipulation is will stay under a psychiatrist until I am dismissed. I went to Dr. Claude Brown in Mobile. He told me to go to Mobile County Health Institution. I did not do that because I was coming up here. The probation officers are aware of that. They told me not to start with another psychiatric group until I get settled. If I get the job in North Carolina I will go to the Mental Health group in Goldsboro. I have to do that, it is part of my probation.
- Dr. Taylor : Have you ever been convicted of any crime other than this? A. No sir
- Q. Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No sir
- Q. Have you ever faced disciplinary action with any medical examining board?
- A. No sir
- Q. You never had used narcotics or barbiturates? A. No sir
- Q. You have used valium, tranquilizers? A. Yes



Dr. Cain continued

Dr. Combs: You are not licensed in Alabama?

A. No sir, I am licensed in Louisiana and Georgia

Dr. Hooper: Were you with the Marines or Army Medical Corps?

A. Only in Europe two years.

Q. Nothing was said about lifting your narcotic tax stamp or revoking your license when you were in the Corps?

A. No sir

Dr. Galusha: If you had your choice of the position you are offered or in a sheltered position to serve as an urologist, which would you rather have?

A. I would have the emergency room, the strain is too great in private practice.

Q. Have you worked in a busy emergency room?

A. Yes, in the Army and in Atlanta.

Dr. Large: Were you dismissed from the Veterans Administration?

A. Yes

Dr. Large: Have you sought gainful work in the states in which you are licensed?

A. No sir, I was sentenced July 23rd, I saw this advertisement and answered the letter and they telephoned me in Mobile. They seem anxious to have me and I want to go there.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that this matter be tabled for further discussion, the motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously. (See p. 162 these Minutes).

RE: Dr. Jack Cely Childers appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He has had a special limited license to the University North Carolina School of Medicine and is now an instructor in Orthopaedics.

Dr. Taylor: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

The meeting was adjourned.


