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MINUTES

Call to Order

Jack A. Koontz, M.D., President of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, called this meeting to order at the Raleigh Hilton at 8:00 p.m., December 1, 1985. OB/Gyn Representatives to the Joint Committee on Midwifery

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners write letters to each of these physicians thanking them for their participation, asking if one would be willing to serve for two additional years and if the other would be willing to serve for another three years, and informing them that these additional terms would be subject to renewal should the physicians wish to serve again. Dr. Duckett commented that the Joint Committee on Midwifery may wish to discuss the terms of the physician members of this Joint Committee at its meeting in December.

AGENDA ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION CONTINUED

Aiken, George Stephen, M.D.

Dr. Alexander reported that Dr. Aiken completed the FLEX examination and failed to obtain a passing score. The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners not approve Dr. Aiken's request for additional time to complete a FLEX examination; that the Board so inform Dr. Aiken; and that the Board further inform this physician, if there is additional information which he wishes the Board to consider and if he provides this additional material, the Board of Medical Examiners may reconsider his request.

Ginsberg, Brian M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board of Medical Examiners accept Dr. Ginsberg's graduate medical training as adequate for meeting the requirements in this state and permit him to be interviewed for licensure.

Cromer, William Browning, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board of Medical Examiners approve a request from Dr. Cromer to work at a "Willie M" type facility in Kinston.

Peisel, Francis James Jr., M.D.

The Board reviewed a letter from Dr. Peisel stating his reason for not providing the Board with a current psychiatric report. The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Fitz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners accept this letter from Dr. Peisel as information; and that it request this physician to provide the Board with written current status reports from the Virginia Board of Medical Examiners, from the Virginia Impaired Professionals Program, and from his personal physician Tom Douglas, M.D., specifically regarding Dr. Peisel's psychiatric treatment. The Board unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Fitz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board advise Dr. Peisel, if he wishes to practice in North Carolina, to notify the Board of Medical Examiners prior to engaging in such practice, in order that the Board may request this physician to appear for an informal interview.

Perkerson, Ralph Benton, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board accept a report from the Georgia Board as information and that it require Dr. Perkerson to appear for an informal interview prior to entering the practice of medicine in North Carolina.

Ratcliffe, Robert Richard, III, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Fitz that the Board of Medical Examiners continue to monitor this physician under the provisions of the suspension of Dr. Ratcliffe's licensure revocation; that the Board not require Dr. Ratcliffe to remain in therapy for five years unless the treating psychiatrist decides that this period of therapy is necessary; and that the Board of Medical Examiners interview Dr. Ratcliffe at its August, 1986 meeting.

Wolk, Michael L., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board inform Dr. Wolk it has dismissed all charges preferred against him and that it further inform Dr. Wolk he has a license to practice medicine in this state without encumbrances of any kind.

Thompson, G. R. C., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners accept notification of Dr. Thompson's retirement as information.

HEARINGS

Guess, George Albert, M.D.

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Continuation Hearing on charges preferred against George Albert Guess, M.D., at 1:00 p.m., Monday December 2, 1985, at the Raleigh Hilton, Raleigh, North Carolina. Dr. Godwin did not participate. Both George Albert Guess, M.D., and his attorney attended this Continuation Hearing.

At the conclusion of this Continuation Hearing, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, on the basis of six affirmative votes and one abstention, found that Dr. Guess' utilization of certain preparations known generally as "homeopathic medicines" in his practice of medicine departs from and does not conform to the standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice in this state; and concluded that the utilization of certain preparations known generally as "homeopathic medicines" constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of N.C.G.S. 90-14(a) (6).

The Board of Medical Examiners ordered that the license issued by the Board to Dr. Guess be revoked effective five days from the date the President of the Board of Medical Examiners signs this Order and that the revocation be stayed for a temporary period of three years, after which such stay of revocation shall become permanent provided that:

1. Dr. Guess refrains from the use in his practice of medicine of certain preparations known generally as "homeopathic medicines";
2. Dr. Guess conducts his practice of medicine in accordance with the standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice in North Carolina;

3. Dr. Guess continues to be of high moral character; and
4. Dr. Guess violates no state or federal laws.

Johnstone, Thomas, III, PA

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Daniel that it accept as information a report indicating the Board of Medical Examiners has received a signed Consent Order from Thomas Johnstone, III, PA; Paul A. Mabe, Jr., M.D.; and Angus G. McGinnis, M.D.

MICN Regulations

The Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board accept an opinion from the Attorney General concerning these regulations as information.

Amphetamines, North Carolina Medical Society Resolution on

The Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board accept this Resolution as information and include it in a future "Board Bulletin."

McConville, Robert H., Jr., M.D., Proposed Corporation Name Change

1. From Robert H. McConville, Jr., M.D., P.A., to Sandhills Family Practice and Obstetrics, P.A.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners not approve this requested name change as it is confusing. Dr. Citron commented that, if Dr. McConville is in Family Practice, the Obstetrics is redundant; and, if there is a change to Sandhills Family Practice, P.A., this name could be confused with Sandhills Family Health Center, P.A.

Holderness, Howard, Jr., M.D., Proposed Corporation Name Change

2. From Howard Holderness, Jr., M.D., P.A., to North Carolina Plastic Surgery Center, P.A.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board of Medical Examiners allow the Executive Secretary to approve this proposed name change provided the corporation is not in the same county as Carolina Plastic Surgery Specialists, P.A.

Proposed Legislation to Enhance Board's Ability to Carry out Disciplinary Functions

By consensus, the Board agreed to support proposed legislative changes which would provide for:

- a. six year staggered terms of office in existence prior to changes made by the Sunset Commission
- b. investigators' reviewing prescriptions without subpoenas
- c. broader authority in subpoena power
- d. final judgement of felony conviction, unless the Board orders otherwise, to result in automatic revocation of licensure
- e. substitution of "may be" instead of "shall be" reinstated
- f. authorizing the Board to assess fines and recover costs pending Dr. Citron's report to the Board on Federation Committee's recommendations regarding this issue
- g. authorizing the Board to require restitution of fees to patients when such fees are excessive.

LICENSE BY ENDORSEMENT INTERVIEWS

Sonek, Mojmir George, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Fitz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners issue Dr. Sonek a temporary license for a period of two years and that it advise him, if he wishes to retain licensure in North Carolina, he must appear before the Board prior to the expiration of this temporary license.

Brinton, Lewis Floyd, M.D.

The Board accepted Dr. Fitz's recommendation that the Board of Medical Examiners prefer charges against Lewis Floyd Brinton, M.D.; that it so notify him in writing; and that the Board further notify Dr. Brinton it will hold a Hearing on the charges preferred against him. Dr. Fitz stated that the basis of these charges is 90-14 (a) (1): immoral, dishonest, and unethical conduct. He recommended that this Hearing be held as soon as possible - preferably in Charlotte.

Shaftner, Kimberly K., M.D.

The Board accepted a recommendation made by Mrs. Walston that the Board of Medical Examiners prefer charges against Kimberly K. Shaftner, M.D.; that it so notify him in writing; and that it further notify him the Board will hold a hearing on the charges preferred against him. Mrs. Walston stated that the basis of these charges is 90-14 (1) (5): inability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to patients and drug abuse.

Brewer, Thomas Edmund, M.D.

The Board accepted a recommendation from Dr. Koontz that an investigator determine whether the Winston-Salem Police Department has completed its investigation and, if so, that the Board prefer charges against Brewer; that it so notify him in writing; and that it further notify Dr. Brewer that the Board will hold a hearing on the charges preferred against him. Dr. Koontz stated that the basis for these charges should be Cocaine Possession Dr. Duckett will preside at the Hearing.

Verwoerdt, Adriaan, M.D.

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing on charges preferred against Dr. Verwoerdt at 1:00 p.m., Tuesday, December 3, 1985, at the Raleigh Hilton, Raleigh, North Carolina. Dr. Verwoerdt attended this Hearing with his attorney.

At the conclusion of the Hearing, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina unanimously adopted a motion that it finds over the course of time during which Dr. Verwoerdt had a physician-patient relationship with a female he also developed, encouraged, and failed to discourage a non-professional personal relationship with this individual, to include numerous instances of sexual relations with her; that the patient also encouraged and failed to discourage a non-professional personal relationship with Dr. Verwoerdt and was a non-objecting participant in sexual relations with this physician; but that Dr. Verwoerdt did not represent or intend

that the sexual relationship between himself and this female was a part of any professional medical services or advice he rendered to her.

The Board of Medical Examiners further concludes that the non-professional personal sexual relationship between Dr. Verwoerd and this female constitutes dishonorable and unprofessional conduct on his part and orders that Dr. Verwoerd's license to practice medicine in North Carolina be revoked effective ten days after receipt of the Order by Dr. Verwoerd.

However, the Board also orders that such revocation shall be suspended after an active period of ninety days with Dr. Verwoerd's being on probation for a period of five years during which time he shall violate no state or federal laws; shall abide strictly by the ethical precepts of the medical profession in general and of his specialty of psychiatry in particular; shall continue his periodic monitoring as required by the decision of the Ethics Committee of the North Carolina Neuropsychiatric Association; and shall provide the Board with an annual report from the individual conducting such monitoring. During this period of probation, should Dr. Verwoerd fail to abide by any of the conditions of probation, the Board may vacate the suspension of the revocation of his license to practice medicine in North Carolina following notice and a further hearing.

Magee, Archibald Carter, M.D.

At the request of Dr. Magee, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing at 3:00 p.m., December 2, 1985, at the Raleigh Hilton. Dr. Magee and his attorney appeared at this Hearing.

At the conclusion of the Hearing, the Board unanimously adopted a motion that it finds:

1. The Board automatically suspended Dr. Magee's license by virtue of his adjudication of mental incompetency and involuntary commitment;
2. Dr. Magee was involved in a shoot-out with Wayne County Sheriff's deputies who were attempting to serve a warrant upon him in connection with his having fired a shotgun at a neighbor;
3. Dr. Magee, although he has undergone treatment for his substance abuse and presently appears to be abuse-free, has a lengthy history of substance abuse: including amphetamines, barbiturates, and alcohol;

4. Dr. Magee has not regularly practiced medicine for a considerable length of time and is not current in either his medical knowledge or clinical skill;
5. Evidence shows that Dr. Fleury, even though he testified that, in his opinion, reinstatement of Dr. Magee's license to practice medicine would be reasonable, has seen Dr. Magee on only two occasions, has not taken a longitudinal history of Dr. Magee, and was essentially unaware of Dr. Magee's lengthy history of antisocial behavior;
6. Dr. Magee appears to suffer from a chronic personality disorder which renders him unfit for the practice of medicine;
7. Dr. Magee has not carried his burden of satisfying the Board of his current qualifications for licensure to practice medicine in North Carolina.

Based on these findings, the Board of Medical Examiners concludes that grounds exist to deny issuance of a license to practice medicine to Dr. Magee and orders that his request for reinstatement of a license to practice medicine in North Carolina be denied.

Glatz, Frank Robert Jr., M.D.

The Board accepted Dr. Fitz's recommendation to prefer charges against Frank Robert Glatz, Jr., M.D., to so notify him in writing, and to further notify Dr. Glatz that the Board will hold a hearing on the charges preferred against him. Dr. Fitz stated that the basis for these charges is 90-14 (a) (1) and (6), sexual misconduct. He further stated that this Hearing should be scheduled during a meeting in Winston-Salem.

Campbell, John Duane, M.D.

The Board accepted a recommendation made by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners prefer charges against John Duane Campbell, M.D., that it so notify him in writing, and that the Board further notify Dr. Campbell it will hold a hearing on the charges preferred against him. Dr. Duckett stated that the basis for these charges is licensure revocation in Florida because of unethical practice.

Kay, Burns Wen-Fun, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board of Medical Examiners not approve Dr. Kay's licensure application.

Duffy, Eileen Teresa, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners issue Dr. Duffy a two year temporary license limited to Broughton Hospital, renewable, should no difficulties affecting licensure occur during this two year period, upon review of her request by the Board without the necessity of a personal interview.

Monder, Chet Singh, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that Dr. Monder does not meet the statutory requirement of three years approved graduate medical education.

Foote, Charles Pennock, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Fitz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners not approve Dr. Foote's application for licensure; that the Board inform him in writing of its decision; and that the Board further inform Dr. Foote that the Board of Medical Examiners has based this decision on 90-14 (a) (3), willfully concealing from the Board information concerning a licensure application.

Branly, Louis Phillip, M.D.

The President instructed that the Board of Medical Examiners obtain a complete medical report from the Medical College of Virginia; a copy of Dr. Branly's discharge summary from Walter Reed Hospital; a copy, if available, of the action of the military medical evaluation board, to include a copy of his medical discharge; and documentation of sleep apnea and narcolepsy. The President instructed that he, Mrs. Walston, and Mr. Paris review this information and recommend appropriate action. The President also stated that, if and when this subcommittee recommends temporary licensure, the full Board of Medical Examiners act upon this recommendation.

Bravy, Stan Boris, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that, upon verification of completion of three years of graduate medical training in the United States, the Board of Medical Examiners will reconsider Dr. Bravy's application. The Board unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that, should Dr. Bravy provide this verification, he must answer the routine questions again but will not need to have another personal interview.

Lester, Allan John, M.D.

Dr. Lester Surrendered his license to practice medicine in North Carolina on December 3, 1985.

Phoenix - "Chiropractic Orthopedist"

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Fitz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners refer this advertisement to the Attorney General and to the Consumer Protection Division since it indicates the practice of medicine, represents false advertising since there are no "Board qualified Chiropractic Orthopaedists," and misleads the public since "Orthopaedic" refers to surgery.

DeHaven, Harry E., Jr., M.D.

The Board accepted Dr. Koontz's recommendation that the Board of Medical Examiners institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Dr. DeHaven; that it so notify him in writing; and that the Board further notify this physician it will hold a hearing on the charges preferred against him. Dr. Koontz indicated that the basis for these charges is licensure revocation in California, 90-14 (13).

Appiah, Augustine, M.D.

The Board agreed by common consent to instruct its attorney to devise a Consent Order stating that Dr. Appiah agrees to meet with the Board of Medical Examiners prior to entering medical practice in this state; that he agrees to his license being suspended and the suspension stayed for a period of five years provided he remains of good moral character during this time period and violates no state or federal laws; and that, if Dr. Appiah refuses to agree to these conditions, the Board will proceed with the charges preferred against this physician.

AGENDA CONTINUED

Retainer for 1986 Fiscal Year

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners approve this proposed retainer and express its appreciation to Mr. Weddington.

Federation Nominations

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Daniel that Dr. Duckett be the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners' nominee to the FLEX Board. Dr. Citron wished to support Mr. Paris as Executive Secretary nominee to the Board. Mr. Paris expressed his appreciation but indicated his inability to accept. The Board discussed asking Dr. Alexander if he would accept a nomination.

Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate Applications Approved by the Board

Mobile Intensive Care Nurse Applications Approved by the Board

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Citron that it approve 10 MICN applications.

Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic Applications Approved by the Board

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Citron that it approve 12 EMT-P applications.

Bee Sting Certifications

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Citron that it approve 245 Bee Sting Certifications.
