Revised Letter to be Mailed to Supervising Physicians of Physician Assistants together with New Application Forms

Dr. Fitz reported favorably on meeting with the North Carolina Academy of Physician Assistants on November 12, 1983, and stated that suggestions made at this meeting, together with comments from various supervising physicians, have been incorporated into a revised letter for mass mailing.



Thomas John Byrne, M.D., Washington, North Carolina

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a hearing on Saturday, December 3, 1983, at 9:00 a.m., at the Radisson Plaza, 420 Fayetteville Street Mall, Raleigh, North Carolina, at which hearing Dr. Byrne appeared and was not represented by counsel. The Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion that it found the charges to be true, officially reprimanded Dr. Byrne, notified him that any future conduct of the type demonstrated by the Findings of Fact may result in the loss of his license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina, and informed Dr. Byrne that he shall hereafter conform his conduct to the ethical and professional standards of conduct demanded of all physicians practicing medicine in the state of North Carolina.

Stephen John Tremont, M.D., Chapel Hill, North Carolina

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina on December 3, 1983, at 10:30 a.m., at the Radisson Plaza, Raleigh, North Carolina, held a hearing on charges preferred against Dr. Tremont. At this hearing, Dr. Tremont appeared with counsel. The Board found the charges preferred against Dr. Tremont to be true and also found that Dr. Tremont's conduct fails to conform to acceptable and prevailing ethical and professional standards of the practice of medicine in the State of North Carolina. The Board of Medical Examiners officially reprimanded Dr. Tremont and notified him that any future conduct of the type demonstrated by the Findings of Fact may result in the loss of Dr. Tremont's license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina. The Board ordered that Dr. Tremont maintain patient records for all individuals for whom he prescribes and with whom he maintains a physician/patient relationship and further ordered that Dr. Tremont review the Controlled Substances Act (N.C.G.S. Paragraphs 90-86 et seq.) and inform the Board in writing that he has reviewed this Act and understands the provisions and requirements of this Act. The Board of Medical Examiners also ordered that Dr. Tremont review the statutory and regulatory responsibilities of a physician in a working relationship with a physician extender such as a physician assistant (N.C.G.S. Paragraphs 90-18.1, 90-18.2, and regulations thereunder) and inform the Board in writing that he has reviewed and understands these responsibilities.

Letter from Missouri State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts  
Concerning Investigating Foreign Medical Schools

The Board reviewed a letter from the Missouri Board regarding a proposal for evaluating foreign medical schools. The Board adopted a motion that the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners send a letter to Dr. Ladyman stating the Board's interest in participating in the plan proposed in his letter dated October 31, 1983, and further stating that the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners is in favor of this plan and will support it.

Letter from Warren A. Hutton, Attorney, Concerning Formation of a  
Corporation to Perform Medical Testing for the General Public and  
upon Payment of a Fee

The Board reviewed a letter from Mr. Hutton dated November 23, 1983, inquiring about forming a corporation for the purpose of medical testing to be performed by registered nurses and laboratory technicians without direct orders from physicians. The Board adopted a motion that Mr. Hutton be written a letter with the advice of the Board's attorney stating that the Board of Medical Examiners considers the acts described in Mr. Hutton's letter to be medical acts which should only be performed under the supervision of a physician who is directly responsible for these acts. The Board also adopted a motion that this letter further state the Board does not approve of the formation of a corporation to function as outlined in Mr. Hutton's letter of November 23, 1983.



Robert Alfred Blackburn, M.D., Fayetteville, North Carolina

The Board adopted a motion that the hearing concerning charges preferred against Dr. Blackburn be postponed until March, 1984.

Mary Grace Swinburne Jaynes, M.D., Tryon, North Carolina

The Board adopted a motion that the charges preferred against Dr. Jaynes be withdrawn, that she be so notified in writing, and that she be further notified the Board expects, as a result of her retirement, Dr. Jaynes will no longer issue prescriptions and will no longer engage in any type of medical practice.

Bradley James Bergquist, M.D., Chapel Hill, North Carolina

The Board adopted a motion that the proper procedures be instituted to prefer charges against Bradley James Bergquist, M.D., that he be so notified in writing, and that he be further notified the Board will hold a hearing concerning charges preferred against him. The Board adopted a further motion that this hearing assume top priority and that it be placed on the hearing schedule as soon as possible.

Peter V. Alexander, M.D., Virginia Beach, Virginia

The Board adopted a motion that the proper procedures be instituted to prefer charges against Dr. Alexander, that he be so notified in writing, and that he be further notified the Board of Medical Examiners will hold a hearing on the charges preferred against him.

Harry Lee Hinson, M.D., Lebanon, Pennsylvania

The Board adopted a motion that Dr. Hinson's request for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina be denied.

Archibald Carter Magee, M.D., Washington, North Carolina

This physician furnished the Board with a letter stating that a psychiatrist has found him to be mentally competent to practice medicine. For future reference, should Dr. Magee be declared mentally competent to practice medicine, the Board will consider testing his competency by requiring Dr. Magee to take and pass Day III of FLEX.

John Lee Waeltz, M.D., Greenville, North Carolina

The Board reviewed a request from Dr. Waeltz that his resident's training license be reinstated. The Board adopted a motion that this request not be approved.

Proposed Changes in EMS Regulations

Mike Eddinger and John W. Baker, M.D., from the Office of Emergency Medical Services met to discuss with the Board some proposed changes in EMS Regulations. Dr. Baker stated that EMS is moving towards a regional concept and that EMS is also emphasizing the role of the receiving hospital in transmitting orders to personnel in the field.

Center for Well-Being of Health Professionals, J. Pfifferling, Ph.D., Director

The Board reviewed a letter from this center requesting a meeting with the Board of Medical Examiners to discuss possible working relationships. The Board adopted a motion that Dr. Pfifferling be referred to Ted Clark, M.D., as the Board is required by law to work with the Physicians' Health and Effectiveness Committee which is under the direction of Dr. Clark. The Board adopted a further motion that Dr. Pfifferling request Dr. Clark to make a recommendation to the Board regarding utilization of the Center for Well-Being of Health Professionals.



#### Request from the Joint Practice Committee

The Board instructed that a letter from Hettie Garland, R.N., be answered as follows: "The Board of Medical Examiners has received and considered your letter dated June 16, 1983. The Board believes that the functions of the respective Boards are the responsibilities of the Boards and not the Joint Practice Committee." The Board also instructed that a second paragraph be added to this letter as follows: "Many of the individuals with whom the Board of Medical Examiners deals neither read the Journal nor belong to the North Carolina Medical Society."

#### Notification of Licensure Jeopardy

The Board reviewed a letter from the attorney for the Board of Medical Examiners in answer to a question regarding notifying an individual that his or her license is in jeopardy which states: "We have taken a careful look at the APA and cannot find any procedure provided therein which would be applicable to this fact situation. It therefore seems to me that incidences of infractions which come to the attention of the Board but which do not rise to the level of seriousness that would require the bringing of formal charges could be continued to be handled by cautionary letters to the physicians concerned. While there is no express statutory procedure for the issuance of such letters, it would be my position that the issuance of such letters is an inherent part of the general grant of authority to the Board by the Legislature." The Board adopted a motion that this report be accepted as information.

#### Subcommittee Appointments

Dr. Pagter rescinded his previous Subcommittee appointments. He then appointed Dr. Kermon to the Physician Assistant Subcommittee, which now consists of Dr. Kermon, Dr. Fitz, and Mrs. Walston, and appointed Dr. Duckett to the Joint Subcommittee, which now consists of Dr. Koontz, Dr. Duckett, and Dr. Pully.

#### Karl Lander Lawing, M.D., Lincolnton, North Carolina

He appeared in accordance with the previous order of the Board of Medical Examiners. As a result of this interview, the Board adopted a motion that the revocation of his license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina be suspended for six months; that Dr. Lawing be informed the Board of Medical Examiners is concerned about his concept of a primary physician's responsibilities for patients he treats who have been referred to other physicians; that Dr. Lawing request consultants to outline for him programs of follow-up patient care; that Dr. Lawing avail himself of additional postgraduate medical education such as the program at the University of Maryland; that he appear for an informal interview at the end of the six months' suspension of his license revocation; that Dr. Lawing bring to this interview records of twenty patients with varied problems usually treated by a primary care physician; and that this action be communicated to Dr. Lawing both verbally and in writing.

#### Gerald Coburn Shingleton, M.D., Mountain Home, Tennessee

The Board requested that if Dr. Shingleton wished the Board to consider his request for licensure reinstatement he provide two letters of recommendation and appear for an informal interview. He failed to appear for a scheduled appointment in October, 1983, indicating as a reason: transportation difficulties. He also failed to appear at this meeting. The Board took no action at this time.



Joel Gregg Puleo, M.D., Durham, North Carolina

The Board adopted a motion that Dr. Puleo's application for licensure be denied.

Graduates from the University of Guadalajara

The Board adopted a motion that a letter be written to this medical School stating, as the Board has previously approved graduates of this university for medical licensure in the state of North Carolina, the Board of Medical Examiners requests that you indicate whether the plan to which you refer in a recent letter represents a change in academic curriculum.

Status of Hearings

Dr. Koontz reported to the Board that there seems to be no advantage in holding hearings before a hearing officer because, if physicians appeal findings, additional hearings must be held before the full Board. Dr. Koontz suggested several possibilities: (1) schedule six short hearings for a particular meeting (2) schedule one long hearing for the next meeting (3) consider holding six hearings on Friday afternoon at the January, 1984, meeting and (4) consider adding an additional hearing day to the June and December Board Meeting Schedule.

Recommendations Concerning Fees

The Executive Secretary presented recommendations to the Board regarding increased fees. These recommendations are attached to the Minutes. The Board adopted a motion that the Executive Secretary's recommendations be approved.

Letter from Postal Inspector

The Board reviewed a letter indicating that Universidad CETEC, School of Medicine, Dominica Republic, has been supplying through the postal service documentation of degrees which may not be legal. The Board adopted a motion that this report be accepted as information.

Interviews for License by Endorsement of Credentials

The following physicians applied for license by endorsement of credentials, appeared for personal interviews before the Board, a subcommittee of the Board, an individual Board member, or the Executive Secretary, and obtained licensure December 6, 1983.



The Board of Medical Examiners has reviewed the physician assistant application and the Board's policy regarding the physician supervision of physicians assistants. It has always been the policy of the Board of Medical Examiners to hold the primary supervising physician responsible for all medical and administrative supervision of the physician assistant. Previously, the Board has also delved into the individual characteristics of the physician's practice and the physician assistant's ability, on the basis of education and training, to function in various practice situations.

After considering the above factors, the Board has developed an application form for physician assistants which will require only basic information. Further, the "Commentary of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina Regarding Physician Assistants and Nurse Practitioners" and the "Guidelines Regarding Medical Acts and Supervision of Physician Assistants" previously distributed by the Board are no longer in effect. This reaffirms the Board's position that the supervising physician assumes total responsibility for the physician assistant's performance in the particular field or fields for which the assistant has been trained. It is the Board's assumption that the supervising and responsible physician is competent to perform and to supervise properly all acts or tasks delegated to the physician assistant. The Board's approval of the new application will place the responsibility upon the supervising physician for the extender's conduct. The supervising physician must understand that conduct of the physician assistant, or of the supervising physician, which is contrary to the laws and regulations governing physician assistants may subject the supervising physician to sanctions including the suspension or revocation of the physician's license to practice medicine in North Carolina.

The Board of Medical Examiners requests that you sign the attached CERTIFICATION OF UNDERSTANDING AND COMPLIANCE and return it to this office indicating your understanding of the Board's position and reaffirming your acceptance of responsibility for the acts performed by the physician assistant under your supervision.

Also, the Board adopted a position of charging \$125.00 as a processing fee to regrade an examination.

Beginning this date, December 12, 1983, on any request for photocopies, there will be a \$15.00 service fee, which will include processing and any mailing fees, plus 25¢ per page for photocopies.
