

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

December 6 - 9th, 1971

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Velvet Cloak Inn and the Medical Society Building, Raleigh, North Carolina December 6-9th, 1971, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials, giving the Flex examination and other business.

Monday, December 6th
6:30 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner. Drs. Cornelius T. Partrick, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr. and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. were present. Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Administrative Secretary and Mrs. Diane G. Freeman attended. Dr. Bryant L. Galusha was absent from the meeting.

Credentials for license by endorsement were reviewed by the members of the Board.

The meeting was adjourned.

Tuesday, December 7th
8:00 A. M.

Applicants for the Flex examination were registered and the examination started.

The secretary presented letter from Mrs. Jo Lynn S. Owenby with regard to a complaint against a physician in her town.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that Mrs. Jo Lynn S. Owenby be referred to the county Grievance Committee and a copy of our letter be sent to the state society. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed.

RE: Dr. Jack E. Foster, Eden, North Carolina - As per the direction of the Board of Medical Examiners, Dr. Thornton R. Cleek, Council for the Eighth District, was asked to make some investigation with reference to Dr. Foster's situation. Copies of letters to Dr. Cleek from the Transylvania Community Hospital, Brevard, and the Councilor of the 10th District, Asheville, revealed no derogatory information.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the secretary advise the hospital that Dr. Jack E. Foster has applied for the BNDD number without hard narcotics and this is the only type of narcotic stamp this Board would endorse and that this means his activities will continue to be closely watched by this Board. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

Dr. Bumgarner appeared and stated he had discontinued treating all drug addicts; that his interpretation was since he had stopped treating these patients no report was indicated. Dr. Bumgarner was again told that the Board wanted to help physicians and that since he had stopped the said treatment, the matter seemed to be resolved.

RE: Dr. Elish J. Cain was granted license December 12th 1970 limited to Wayne County Memorial Hospital. He had previously had some trouble with drugs and the Board directed that he be seen and that he furnish a report from his psychiatrist.

Dr. Cain appeared. He looked well and stated that he had no problems; that he had not had to resort to drugs. He presented a satisfactory report as to his progress from his psychiatrist, which covered the past year. Dr. Cain was told by the president that the Board was pleased with him and that he would be advised if it were necessary for him to be seen again.

RE: Dr. V. Clifton Lanier, Welcome, North Carolina - The Board received report from the State Bureau of Investigation that Dr. Lanier had been prescribing large amounts of amphetamines, which came out in a court trial. Dr. Lanier appeared at this time at the direction of the Board. He stated that he had given amphetamines for weight reduction, but since the president issued his news letter at the beginning of this year and the new law came into effect he had not been prescribing amphetamines. He also said that the man involved in the trial was selling the drugs but he did not know it.

Dr. Lanier was advised by the president that the concern of the Board was that the majority of amphetamines on the black market were legitimately prescribed. He also told Mr. Lanier that the Board was assured that he had modified his prescribing and stood ready to help him if needed.

RE: Dr. Grady C. Siske, Pleasant Garden, North Carolina - Pursuant to report from the Narcotic Bureau Dr. Siske was requested to appear at this time. This report revealed that in February, 1971, Dr. Siske's narcotic and DACA drugs were seized, at which time he surrendered his narcotic tax stamp and stated he planned to retire. The report revealed that he had kept no records on narcotics dispensed.

Dr. Siske appeared and related that in 1966 he tried to retire, after 34 years of practice, but was urged by the other doctor in the community to continue a limited practice, at which time he started a weight clinic. He said that he bought the drugs in large amounts because it was more economical to do so and in turn his patients could benefit from this practice; that he gave his patients a month's supply of drugs. In reply to a question he said some of his patients had abused the drugs, but that he weeded them out. He said he is no longer using dexedrine, but is buying tonain(?).



Dr. Siske continued

Dr. Siske has applied for BNDD number and his attorney, Mr. George W. Coggin, who appeared with him informally, stated that he made this application to prescribe narcotics only and not to dispense them.

The president advised Dr. Siske that his long, dedicated service was appreciated; that the Board did want to emphasize the problem of prescribing large amounts of drugs; that the main source for the black market was legitimately prescribed drugs and was also a danger for the patient. He was urged to use other methods for treating obesity, to curb the use of drugs, and was informed that the Board desired to help him in anyway indicated.

The secretary was instructed to write BNDD and approve his application.

The meeting was adjourned.

RE: Dr. Len Gordon Clarke, Eden, North Carolina - The State Bureau of Investigation reported that during another investigation it was ascertained that Dr. Clarke was prescribing large amounts of percan for a relatively few patients. Dr. Clarke appeared at the request of the Board and said these patients were being treated for chronic pain; that he did not feel any of the drugs had reached the black market. He stated that following the investigation he discontinued the use of narcotics for all these patients. The Board advised Dr. Clarke that he should consider this incident as a warning to him in the management of narcotics and that the Board was ready to help him at anytime if the need arose.

RE: Meeting of the Federation of State Medical Boards - Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that Mrs. Betty Joe Cooke be sent to this meeting in Chicago and that the Board pay her expenses. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. Ralph C. Reid, Pineville, North Carolina - To summarize, on June 15th, 1971, Dr. Reid was informed by the Board that due to his flagrant violation of dispensing of drugs that he give up totally the practice of dispensing drugs from his office; that all drugs be dispensed by a registered pharmacist. The following is letter from Dr. Reid of November 3rd, 1971, in reply to inquiry from the secretary's office:

"We are trying to follow to the letter at the request of the Board as of the last hearing. The inventory you speak of is still intact and sealed as we received it until Mr. Wolfe authorizes disposal. We are dispensing none of the so-called abuse drugs and are prescribing more and more of all other drugs."

RE: Dr. Albert Kodack, Asheville, North Carolina - Dr. Kodack reported on November 29th, 1971, that his patient had put off going to Broughton Hospital; that she had promised to go the first of next year; that she had reduced the intake of demerol.

VERDICT: The Board instructed the secretary to advise Dr. Albert Kodack if he has not committed Mrs. Wilsie Smith to Broughton Hospital, to appear before the Board at the January, 1972 meeting.

RE: Assistants to Physicians - The secretary presented applications as follows:

RE: Drs. Charles A. Keller, Jr. and F. Maxton Mauney, Jr. have submitted application for Larry Bryant King, which application is in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the application of Drs. Charles A. Keller, Jr. and F. Maxton Mauney, Jr. to register their assistant be approved. This motion was duly seconded and passed. Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. abstained from voting.

RE: Dr. R. V. Liles, Jr. submitted application for Donald E. Joiner, which application is in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the application of Dr. R. V. Liles, Jr. to register his assistant be approved. This motion was duly seconded and passed. Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. abstained from voting.



RE: Dr. M. W. Olson, Elizabethtown, North Carolina - Dr. Olson is a graduate of a foreign medical school and has failed to pass the examination of the ECFMG.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that native-born Americans, who have graduated from foreign medical schools, be allowed to take our examination, whether or not they have passed the examination of the ECFMG. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed by a vote of four to two.

RE: Dr. Chitte Ranjan Chatterjee, graduate of a foreign medical school, presently holds resident's training license at the University of North Carolina School of Medicine. He passed the Flex examination in Saskatchewan, Canada, and on that basis procured license in the State of Iowa.

VERDICT: Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. moved that Dr. Chitte Ranjan Chatterjee be considered eligible to apply for license on the basis of his Flex examination. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

The following licenses were converted from limited to full license on motion of Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr., seconded and passed.

Dr. Frederick Ross Cobb
Dr. Jose M. de Varona - Naturalized

RE: Dr. William H. Strickland, Hendersonville, North Carolina - The secretary presented copy of a complaint in a civil suit against Dr Strickland that had been instituted in Forsyth County, North Carolina, in which the plaintiff is claiming fraud.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that this case lay on the table until the next meeting and that the secretary ascertain what progress is made in the court and the judgment of the court. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Audit - Year Ending October 31st, 1971 - The Finance Committee is composed of Drs. H. Lee Large, Jr., Frank Edmondson and V. W. Taylor, Jr. and Chairman Large made the following report on this audit:

1. That the difference in examination expenses, page 4 of the audit, should be \$1,512.79
2. Recommend that the two bank accounts be reduced to \$20,000.00


