## **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT**

Stephen Herring, MD; Charles Garrett, MD; Robert Moffatt, MD; Arthur McCulloch, MD; Aloysius Walsh

The Executive Committee of the North Carolina Medical Board was called to order at 11:10 am, Wednesday February 18, 2004 at the offices of the Board. Present were: Stephen M. Herring, MD, Chair; Charles L. Garrett, MD; Harlan A. McCulloch, MD; Robert C. Moffatt, MD; and Aloysius P. Walsh. Members of the staff in attendance were R. David Henderson (Executive Director), and Peter T. Celentano, CPA (Comptroller).

### **Financials**

Mr. Celentano, CPA, presented to the committee the December 2003 compiled financial statements. December is the second month of fiscal year 2004.

Mr. Henderson stated to the Committee the possibility of a shortfall in the current year's budgeted revenues for physician registration income. This possible shortfall would be the result of the current CME requirements that went into effect in 2001.

Mr. Walsh asked what steps were taken in order to maintain adequate cash positions to meet current expenditures. Mr. Celentano explained that current income levels match up very close with current expenditures.

Dr. Garrett made a motion to accept the financial statements as reported. Dr. Moffatt seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

The December 2003 Investment Summary was reviewed and accepted as presented.

### **Old Business**

There was no old business to discuss.

### **New Business**

A motion passed to close this session pursuant to NCGS 143-318.11 (a) to discuss current litigation and to preserve attorney client confidences.

Mr. Mansfield spoke with the Committee regarding current litigation.

A motion passed to return to open session.

Mr. Mansfield updated the Committee on the hearings that took place last week at the NC General Assembly in the Blue Ribbon Task Force on Medical Malpractice Reform. The Committee accepted this report as information and thanked Mr. Mansfield for his efforts as the Board's Legislative Liaison.

Approval to insert signature font in orders: Mr. Henderson proposed to the Committee the use of an electronic signature with respect to Board Orders and Notices of Charges as opposed to the mailing of these orders to the President for signature via private courier service. Mr. Moffatt made a motion to approve the use of this new procedure at the discretion of the President. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

Iowa Board of Medical Examiners Resolution: Mr. Henderson reviewed with the Committee a resolution that will be submitted by the Iowa Board of Medical Examiners for consideration at the Federation of State Medical Board (FSMB) annual meeting. The resolution asks the FSMB to assist state boards with resolving issues over the quality of international medical education. Dr. Garrett made a motion that the Executive Committee recommend to the full Board that the Board co-sponsor this resolution along with the Iowa Board. This motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

Scheduling of Board Meetings: Mr. Henderson discussed with the Committee his desire to look at ways board meeting schedule could be altered to increase Board and staff efficiency. Dr. Garrett proposed that staff study possible scheduling changes and bring any proposal they might have back to the Committee at a later date.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:10pm.

**Pharmacist Proposed Rule for Administering Vaccinations** – The committee discussed a few minor changes to the proposed rules. The Allied Health Committee has accepted all of the changes are recommended approval from the full Board. The full Board approved the rules for pharmacists to administer vaccinations.

**DNR Orders** – The Medical Society requests the Medical Board's opinion regarding whether or not the law allows physician assistants and nurse practitioners to sign DNR orders. This request is made from the Medical Society upon receiving information from a specific NC county where EMT's were disregarding those DNR orders signed by the PA's and NP's. The Allied Health Committee recommends having the Board issue an opinion written by the legal department that nurse practitioners and physician assistants can sign DNR orders. The Full Board approved that a letter be sent to OEMS that if it is in the NP or PA protocol to sign DNR's then it is valid.

**NP Proposed Rules** – Differences in BON and NCMB versions – The Committee reviewed a list of differences found in the NP proposed rules. It is agreed that the two versions should hold the same language. These differences will be presented at the public hearing for the NP rule changes next month.

**PA DEA Numbers** – The Medical Board staff requested an opinion of the Allied Health Committee regarding the legality of a PA using a hospital DEA number to prescribe controlled substances. The request was made by the staff upon receiving information that a particular hospital was cited by the Division of Health Facility Services for allowing this to happen. A DEA investigator told the hospital that it is legal for a PA to use a hospital's DEA number. 21 NCAC 32S.0109(4) clearly states that both a physician assistant and his/her supervising physician must hold a current DEA certificate for the physician assistant to write prescriptions for controlled substances. It has been recommended for staff to write a letter to the DEA and the hospital in question explaining the current rules. The Full Board concurs, both the supervising physician and the PA must have a DEA number.

**FSMB Board Action Data Bank Inquiry Form** - The committee reviewed a sample physician assistant inquiry form and has approved it as a required piece of all PA applications. All Applicants will be required to request a FSMB Data Bank Report.

**EMS Disciplinary Committee Report** – This EMS report was accepted as information. The report noted that a letter would be sent requesting that the NCMB investigate a physician for refusing trauma patients and intimidating EMT's. This letter, if received by the Allied Health Committee, will be forwarded to the Complaint Department.

**NCCPA Presentation** – The Committee has agreed to invite an NCCPA representative to the May Allied Health Committee meeting for the presentation they have offered.

**Criminal History Record Checks**

Catchline: Previously the Board approved allowing applicants to proceed with the personal interview and licensing if their applications were being delayed because the SBI had to do a "name search" for the background check due to bad quality of fingerprints. We have recently experienced another snafu – The SBI is not forwarding the rejected prints to the FBI for rejection because they know they will be rejected. Some applicants are unable to obtain good fingerprints (occupational hazard, thin skin, trauma, etc.). Therefore a name search cannot be requested. Currently there are about 4 applicants in this situation.

Committee Recommendation: Allow these applicants the same privilege as applicants obtaining a name search – to proceed with the interview and license approval while additional prints are being obtained to proceed with a background check. Pursue scheduling an interview

with the Director of this Division of the SBI to establish written protocols on how poor quality prints will be processed.
