The North Carolina Medical Board ("Board") has preferred and does hereby prefer the following amended charges and allegations:

1. The Board is a body duly organized under the laws of North Carolina and is the proper party to bring this proceeding under the authority granted it in Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the North Carolina General Statutes.

2. Respondent, Clancy C. Laizure, PA ("Mr. Laizure"), is a physician assistant licensed to practice medical acts, tasks and functions by the Board on or about July 17, 1996 license number 100970.

3. During the times relevant herein, Mr. Laizure practiced in the Summerfield, North Carolina area.

4. On July 8, 2014, the Board issued a Notice of Charges and Allegations against Mr. Laizure.

5. The First Charge, paragraphs 4 through 14 of the July 8, 2014 Charges, alleging unprofessional conduct in Mr.

Laizure's care of Patient A, including, but limited to, failure to conform to, the standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a) (6) is re-alleged and incorporated herein by reference.

SECOND CLAIM

6. The allegations contained in the above paragraphs are incorporated herein by reference.

7. After reviewing Patient A's case, the Board obtained six (6) additional patient charts (hereafter Patients B - G) of Mr. Laizure for a review by an outside expert reviewer to determine if the care rendered by Mr. Laizure was within the accepted and prevailing standard of care of the medical community in North Carolina.

8. The expert reviewer identified areas where Mr. Laizure's care and treatment of the Patients B - G was below the standard of care including, but not limited to:

a. Mr. Laizure failed to obtain appropriate laboratory and radiographic studies.

b. Mr. Laizure failed to obtain or document a complete history and physical examination.

c. Mr. Laizure failed to refer patients to appropriate specialists for evaluation or treatment.

d. Mr. Laizure failed to establish and document an appropriate differential diagnosis.

9. Mr. Laizure's care of Patients B - G, as described above, constitutes unprofessional conduct, including, but not limited to, failure to conform to, the standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6), which is grounds for the Board to annul, suspend, revoke, condition, or limit Mr. Laizure's license to practice medical acts, tasks and functions.

NOTICE TO MR. LAIZURE

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14.2, it is hereby ordered that a hearing on the foregoing Notice of Charges and Allegations will be held before the Board, or a panel thereof, at 8:00 a.m., Thursday, October 16, 2014, or as soon thereafter as the Board or panel thereof may hear it, at the offices of the Board at 1203 Front Street, Raleigh, North Carolina, to continue until completed.

The hearing will be held pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 150B-40, 41, and 42, and N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14.2, 14.4, 14.5, and 14.6. You may appear personally and through counsel, may cross-examine witnesses and present evidence in your own behalf.

You may, if you desire, file written answers to the charges and complaints preferred against you within 30 days after the service of this notice.

The identities of Patients A - G are being withheld from public disclosure pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-8. However, this information will be provided to you upon your request.

You may, if you desire, file written answers to the charges and complaints preferred against you within 30 days after the service of this notice.


All preliminary motions, including motions for continuances, shall be filed no later than 14 days prior to the date of the hearing. Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 150B-40(c)(5), it is further ordered that the parties shall arrange a pre-hearing conference at which they shall prepare and sign a stipulation on pre-hearing conference. The pre-hearing stipulation shall be submitted to the undersigned no later than seven days prior to the hearing date.

The right to be present during the hearing of this case, including any such right conferred or implied by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 150B-40(d), shall be deemed waived by a party or his counsel by voluntary absence from the Board's office at a time when it is known that proceedings, including deliberations, are being conducted, or are about to be conducted. In such event, the

proceedings, including additional proceedings after the Board has retired to deliberate, may go forward without waiting for the arrival or return of counsel or a party.
