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MINUTES

Charles H. Duckett, M.D., President of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina called this meeting to order at 9:10 p.m., at the North Raleigh Hilton, Raleigh, North Carolina.

The Board members present at this meeting included: John T. Daniel, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer; Eben Alexander, Jr., M.D.; David S. Citron, M.D.; Harold L. Godwin, M.D.; Hector H. Henry, II, M.D.; Simmons Patterson, Jr., M.D., and Mrs. Martha Walston.

Staff members present included: Bryant D. Paris, Jr.; Don Pittman; William H. Breeze, Jr.; Kathy Burke; and Sibyl Lamoreaux.

COBBLE, CLARK ROBERT, M.D. - Danville, Virginia

At 1:10 p.m., January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing on charges preferred against Clark Robert Cobble, M.D. Dr. Cobble and his counsel appeared at this Hearing.

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board finds Charge Number One to be substantiated by the evidence. On this same date, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board, based upon the evidence presented on January 23, 1987, does not find Charge Number Two to be sustained by the evidence.

On this same date, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board issue an Order stipulating Dr. Cobble abide by the probationary conditions placed on his license in the state of Virginia; stipulating Dr. Cobble notify the Board of Medical Examiners prior to entering the practice of medicine in North Carolina; stipulating Dr. Cobble meet with the Board prior to engaging in medical practice in this state; and further stipulating, based on subsequent actions of the Virginia Board of Medical Examiners, the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners reserves the right to issue such further Orders as may be necessary.

On this same date, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board send the Virginia Board a copy of the Findings and Order of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

ROBBINS, THOMAS WATERS, JR., M.D. - Hightstown, New Jersey

At 3:00 p.m., January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing on charges preferred against Thomas Waters Robbins, Jr., M.D. Dr. Robbins did not appear at this Hearing.

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board enter an Order revoking Dr. Robbins' license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina on the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (a)(13).

DAY, PHILIP MARK, M.D. - Grover, North Carolina

On January 24, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board enter into a Consent Order with Dr. Day embodying a reprimand, expressing the Board of Medical Examiners' concern regarding his consumption of alcohol, the Driving While Impaired charges pending against him, and his failure to answer the controlled substance question honestly both on the written application and during a personal interview, referring Dr. Day to the Physicians' Health and Effective Committee of the North Carolina Medical Society with instructions that Dr. Day request Theodore Clark, M.D., to provide the Board of Medical Examiners with a progress report within three months of the date Dr. Day signs the Consent Order, instructing Dr. Day to refrain from consuming any alcohol or controlled substances unless prescribed by another physician or dentist, and advising Dr. Day the Board of Medical Examiners will request him to appear for future interviews.

SALEM PSYCHIATRIC ASSOCIATES, P.A.

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board inform this corporation the Board of Medical Examiners believes it should use the corporate name Salem Psychiatric Associates, P.A.

The Board members did not approve the proposed name, New Directions: A Treatment Center for Anxiety and Depression, A Division of Salem Psychiatric Associates, P.A.

DIRKERS, JEROME DAVID, M.D. - Asheville, North Carolina

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and

seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board of Medical Examiners enter into a Consent Order with Dr. Dirkers in which this physician agrees to the following conditions: (1) to surrender voluntarily his license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina; (2) to surrender voluntarily his DEA prescribing privileges; (3) to complete a drug rehabilitation program; (4) to authorize, if necessary, the Board's providing information to the rehabilitation program; (5) to authorize Dr. Talbot's providing progress reports as may be requested by the Board of Medical Examiners; and (6) to appear before the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners upon successful completion of this rehabilitation program.

TOPE, JOHN JEFFERY, M.D. - Greensboro, North Carolina

On January 24, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board and Dr. Tope enter into a Consent Order containing the following conditions:

that the Board of Medical Examiners reprimands Dr. Tope;

that Dr. Tope provide a psychiatric evaluation for the Board's review and that he furnish the Board of Medical Examiners with psychiatric progress reports at six month intervals;

that Dr. Tope undergo a complete physical examination by an Internist;

that the Internist who examines Dr. Tope provide the Board with an evaluation of Dr. Tope's medical condition;

that Dr. Tope continue under the care of a personal physician for his medical problems;

that Dr. Tope not consume any controlled substances other than those prescribed by his personal physician or dentist;

that Dr. Tope submit to random drug screens upon request;

that Dr. Tope appear before the Board at its request;

that Dr. Tope refrain from prescribing medications for family members or for individuals residing at his home;

that Dr. Tope maintain adequate records on all individuals whom he treats and for who he prescribes medications;

that Dr. Tope advise the Board of Medical Examiners within ten days of all changes in practice sites;

that Dr. Tope obey all federal and state laws; and
 that Dr. Tope be and remain of high moral character.

TODD, GARY PRICE, M.D. - Waynesville, North Carolina

On January 24, 1987, Dr. Todd did not appear for an informal interview as requested by the Board.

On January 27, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board write a letter to this physician stating:

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has now requested you to appear for an informal interview on two occasions.

The Board is concerned about your failure to respond to these requests; it will advise you to appear at its March, 1987, meeting; and, if you fail to do so, the North Board of Medical Examiners will have no choice other than to take more formal action.

MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER, 1987, MEETING

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board approve the Minutes of the December, 1986 meeting.

JANUARY, 1988, MEETING

The President directed that the staff reserve sleeping and meeting rooms at the North Raleigh Hilton for the January, 1988, meeting; that this meeting begin on Wednesday January 20, 1988, and continue through January 24, 1988; that, if after meeting at Sheraton Imperial, the Board of Medical Examiners wishes to schedule the January, 1988, meeting at this hotel, it will so advise the staff.

BARNES, JAMES ALLAN, M.D. - Beckley, West Virginia

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board accept as information a report concerning Dr. Barnes and that the Board of Medical Examiners reaffirm its previous action concerning this physician.

BUNN, DAVID GLENN, M.D. - Whiteville, North Carolina

LESTER, ALLAN JOHN, M.D. - Durham, North Carolina

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board write Dr. Dean informing this physician, unless the ECFMG reinstates her certificate, the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners cannot permit her to take FLEX.

SEBEL, PETER SIMON, M.D. - London, England

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina finds the graduate medical education of Peter Simon Sebel, M.D., meets its requirements.

HANNA, ANDRE N., M.D. - Danville, Illinois

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board accept Dr. Hanna's graduate medical education as meeting its requirements; and that it advise Dr. Hanna, when he completes the credentialing process, he may appear for a personal interview.

LIDOR, YARON JACOB, M.D. - Durham, North Carolina

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board advise Dr. Lidor, at the present time, he does not qualify for licensure in the state of North Carolina; however, if Dr. Lidor receives an appointment to a residency program in a North Carolina teaching hospital, he will then be eligible to take FLEX.

LITHOTRIPSY, ATTORNEY'S REQUEST FOR OPINION

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board write a letter to Mr. Sollins stating the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has reviewed the practice arrangement described in his letter of December 17, 1986, and has concerns that it may constitute a violation of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-18 or 90-14 (a)(12), although, not knowing all the details of this situation, the Board of Medical Examiners cannot pre-judge or pre-determine an answer to the questions raised in his letter.

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board also include a statement in this letter to Mr. Sollins indicating the Board of Medical Examiners understands both the American College of Surgeons and the American Urological Association have disapproved such arrangements.

IMPAIRED PHYSICIANS PROGRAM

Dr. Godwin discussed the letter he received from John Foust, M.D., regarding improving the impaired physicians program in this state. He indicated that Dr. Foust is in favor of combining the efforts of the Medical Society, medical liability insurance companies, and the Board of Medical Examiners to establish a funded, rather than volunteer, rehabilitation program for impaired physicians in the state of North Carolina.

The Board members discussed funding for this program. Dr. Duckett acknowledged that raising registration fees to \$100 is a possibility but that the Board should not consider this action at the present time. Dr. Alexander suggested utilizing money obtained from alcohol tax and further stated that impaired physicians should contribute financially to a rehabilitation program.

Dr. Citron suggested there is a need for a committee to study

this matter and raised several questions: (1) What kind of legal entity will the administrative body of this program be? (2) How will it function? (3) Who will be the beneficiaries of such a program?

The Board of Medical Examiners requested Dr. Duckett and Dr. Godwin to gather additional information on improving and funding an impaired physicians program and to present another report on this subject.

CITRON, JOSEPH, M.D. - Atlanta, Georgia

The Board unanimously adopted a motion that it deny licensure to Joseph Citron, M.D.

CLINICAL CLERKSHIP REGULATION

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating the earliest possible effective date for the Clinical Clerkship Regulation is March 1, 1987.

FISIONS CORPORATION - DATA REQUEST

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board not approve this data request.

SB ENTERPRISES - DATA REQUEST

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board not approve this data request.

PA/NP PRESCRIBING AND ORDERING MEDICATIONS

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board send a letter to Pharmacist Webb with a copy to Wayne V. Boss, Executive Vice President of St. Joseph's Hospital, stating the Regulations of the Board of Medical Examiners apply equally to in-patient and out-patient settings; and that the Board send a copy of its Regulations both to Mr. Webb and Mr. Boss.

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board authorize a staff member to advise the Chief Administrative Officer of Memorial Mission Hospital in Asheville it is the judgement of the Board of Medical Examiners that a physician extender must have an order issued by a supervising physician prior to entering this order into a patient chart.

PEISEL, FRANCIS JAMES, JR., M.D. - Savannah, Georgia

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board continue to require reports on Dr. Peisel at six month intervals in accordance with the Virginia Board Consent Order and that the Board further instruct Dr. Peisel to notify the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners of any practice plans for this state in order that the Board may schedule an interview with this physician prior to his entering medical practice in the state of North Carolina.

WEATHERS, BAILEY GRAHAM, M.D. - Stanley, North Carolina

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board respond to Dr. Weathers' request for reinstatement of Schedule 2 and 2N DEA prescribing privileges in both hospital and ambulatory settings by stating the Board of Medical Examiners will consider this request two years from the effective date of the original Order.

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board approve Dr. Weathers' request to prescribe Schedule 2 and 2N controlled substances in a hospital setting; that the Board send a copy of its letter concerning Dr. Weathers' prescribing privileges to the President of the Hospital; and that the Board request an annual report from the President on Dr. Bailey's in-patient prescribing practices.

MAGEE, ARCHIBALD CARTER, M.D. - Washington, North Carolina

The Board's attorney reported that he will ask the Attorney General if the State will pay Dr. Magee's legal fees which have been charged to the Board of Medical Examiners. On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board pay Dr. Halleck's psychiatric fees for evaluating Dr. Magee.

GUESS, GEORGE ALBERT, M.D. - Asheville, North Carolina

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report that the Court, pending judicial review, has stayed the Order of the Board of Medical Examiners.

KREPLICK, JOSEPH, M.D. - Massachusetts

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating the Board of Medical Examiners will delay further action until it receives notification of the Massachusetts Board's action on Dr. Kreplick.

HEAPHY, LEO JOSEPH, JR., M.D. - Tonawanda, New York

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board of Medical Examiners hold a Hearing on charges preferred against Dr. Heaphy in March, 1987. The Board instructed the staff to use its discretion in utilizing the material available for this Hearing.

HUGHES, WILLIAM HENRY, M.D. - Columbia, South Carolina

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating the staff will obtain additional information concerning Dr. Hughes.

JONES, LEELAND ANTHONY, M.D

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report from a staff member indicating that he has been unable to find a practice location for this physician.

CHELATION THERAPY

The President instructed the Board's attorney to contact Mr. Manning advising him that the Board of Medical Examiners will schedule a Hearing on Chelation Therapy, coordinating dates, and indicating that the Board may schedule a special meeting for this Hearing. The President requested its attorney to present a

further report on this matter.

ANESTHESIA ASSISTANT PROGRAM

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board of Medical Examiners write the following letter to Mr. Mollica:

At its January, 1987, meeting the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina reviewed information provided by Dr. Furgerson concerning the Anesthesia Assistant Program at Case Western Reserve University.

A careful review of the information provided on this program indicates that the curriculum is not of sufficient breadth to satisfy the Board of Medical Examiners' criteria for program approval. Specifically, there is insufficient documentation of training in the principles of primary medical care, for example: general physical assessment, preventive medicine, and management of clinical problems commonly encountered in the primary care setting.

If there is additional information you wish to submit, the Board of Medical Examiners will be glad to review this material.

REGULATION CHANGING FLEX DEADLINE FOR IN-STATE STUDENTS

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board initiate the Hearing process, including setting an appropriate date, to change its Regulations to permit in-state medical students to take FLEX provided they meet the following requirements: (1) Not less than seventy-five days before the date of the examination, the Executive Secretary must receive a letter from the Dean of the Medical School of the applicant stating that this applicant is expected to complete all requirements for graduation prior to the date of the examination; and (2) Prior to the date of the examination, the Executive Secretary must receive a letter from the Dean of the Medical School stating that the applicant has completed all requirements for, and will receive, the M.D. degree from the medical school.

LUPRECHT, GERI LYN, M.D. - Winston-Salem, North Carolina

On January 22, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion that the Board issue Dr. Luprecht a dated license for a period of one year; that she appear before the full Board prior to the expiration of this dated license; and that Dr. Luprecht request Dr. Mattox to send progress reports to the Board of Medical Examiners at four month intervals. Drs. Godwin, Patterson and Henry abstained from voting on this motion.

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSURE INTERVIEWS

The Board members discussed the following guidelines for conducting licensure interviews: (1) Consider scheduling an applicant who graduated from medical school more than ten years prior to date of application for an interview with the full Board; (2) Consider requiring an applicant who has not passed a comprehensive medical examination within twenty years to take an examination prior to approval for licensure.

When applicable, the Board requested the staff to note on applications: "This physician graduated from medical school more than ten years prior to date on application"; and/or, "This physician has not passed a comprehensive medical examination within twenty years of date on application."

MIXON, JAMES HENRY, M.D. - Biloxi, Mississippi

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board reinstate Dr. Mixon's license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina.

RALPH, James Walker, M.D. - Ogden, Utah

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board approve the reinstatement of Dr. Ralph's license.

BOYD, ARTHUR B., M.D. - Cleveland, Ohio

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report that Dr. Boyd

believes his felony conviction resulted from entrapment; and that this physician did not take FLEX in December.

GRACE, EUGENE VERNON, M.D. - Durham, North Carolina

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Daniel that a staff member visit Dr. Grace to explain: (1) this physician signed a Consent Order; (2) this Consent Order is a public record; (3) it is not possible to expunge the Consent Order from his record.

WILSON, JAMES WALTER, M.D. - Caneyville, Kentucky

On January 22, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board accept as information a report concerning Dr. Wilson's licensure status in another state.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

On January 23, 1987, Mr. Ed Browning, Representative of the Office of Emergency Medical Services, met with the Board of Medical Examiners to discuss matters of mutual concern.

Mr. Browning provided the following information on Bee Sting Certifications.

He reported that, since the North Carolina Legislature approved the bill on Bee Sting certifications, the Board of Medical Examiners, through the Office of Emergency Medical Services, has approved 6,829 certifications and recertifications.

Mr. Browning also reported that, during the summer months, there were several unconfirmed reports of lives saved as a result of these certifications in Pender and Brunswick Counties. He further stated that there were approximately three similar unconfirmed reports: one in Yadkin County and two in the western part of the state. Mr. Browning indicated that there were no figures available on the number of deaths which have occurred as a result of bee stings since the enactment of Bee Sting legislation; but that, according to Claude Frazier, M.D., prior to this legislation, four to six people per year died of bee stings in the state of North Carolina.

Mr. Browning reported to the Board that East Carolina University has trained quite a few individuals; but that physicians in Buncombe County have trained the largest number of individuals for Bee Sting certification. He indicated that Dr. Frazier has

not personally trained many individuals; that ten to fifteen physicians train most of the applicants; and that there is no fee involved. Mr. Browning reported to the Board that the EMT-P's, EMT-AI's, and EMT-I's administer most of the Bee Sting treatment in North Carolina.

Dr. Citron stated that it is time to re-evaluate this program. He recommended referring the matter to the North Carolina Medical Society with the suggestion that this organization appoint a Committee of Allergists, Immunologists, etc.; that the Board request the Medical Society's Committee to recommend answers to the following questions: (1) Should the program be continued? (2) Should it be modified? Dr. Alexander suggested to the Office of Emergency Medical Services that it review death certificates to obtain statistics on the number of deaths resulting from bee stings.

At the conclusion of the discussion of Bee Sting Certifications, Ed Browning updated the Board of Medical Examiners on the East Carolina University Study Project. He indicated that the Office of Emergency Medical Services should receive a report on this project in March. Mr. Browning reminded the Board members that the purpose of the study project is to determine whether the administration of nitrous oxide in a pre-hospital setting by EMT-AI's can be effective.

Mr. Browning told the Board that five counties in the state: Dare, Currituck, Union, New Hanover, and Pitt, are now functioning at the Advanced Intermediate level of life support and that, to date, the medical directors involved are quite pleased with the results.

He then reviewed various categories in the EMS system for the benefit of the new Board members. He stated that the North Carolina Medical Care Commission approves EMT's to provide basic life support. He indicated that approximately forty-three counties in the far eastern and western parts of North Carolina are still functioning at this level. Mr. Browning stated that EMT-I's can start IV fluids and utilize an esophageal airway. Dr. Alexander commented that the term "esophageal obdurator airway" is preferable to referring to an "esophageal airway."

In explaining how EMT-AI's differ from EMT-I's, Mr. Browning indicated that EMT-AI's have one-hundred hours of training above the educational level of EMT-I's. This group of individuals can defibrillate and administer four cardiac drugs. Moreover, Mr. Browning informed the Board that EMT-P's spend two to three hundred more hours in training than do EMT-AI's. They can perform all functions of EMT-AI's plus EMT-P's may utilize a much more extensive drug formulary approved by the Board of Medical Examiners and the various physicians at sponsor hospitals.

Dr. Patterson stated, "It is not recommended to administer Sodium Bicarbonate in cardiac arrest. In fact, use of this substance can be contraindicated." Ed Browning commented, "EMS will have to go through some regulatory changes to remove the administration of this drug from the EMT-AI skills; however, the present policy is to discourage use of Sodium Bicarbonate." Ed Browning further informed the Board of Medical Examiners that both EMT-AI's and EMT-P's can intubate.

Ed Browning next discussed the Mobile Intensive Care Nurses; they may issue orders to all EMT personnel. He indicated that reapproval requirements for MICN's include ten calls - supervised by the medical director of the program, continuing education, experience on a field ambulance, ALS certification or passing an examination administered by the Office of Emergency Medical Services. Mr. Browning stated that the requirement to complete ten calls supervised by a physician is difficult to achieve. He mentioned the example of an MICN's going to work at a sponsor hospital, working at the site for six months, becoming disabled, or deciding to change employment. During this Mobile Intensive Care Nurse's first six months of employment, he or she may have only completed three or four calls. At a later date, if this nurse decides to return to work, he or she may not have completed the required ten calls supervised by a medical director; therefore, the nurse cannot be reapproved as an MICN. Ed Browning told the Board that, in cases such as the one he described, it is the recommendation of EMS to allow the medical director/physician to develop ten simulated scenarios approved by the Office of Emergency Medical Services, supervise the MICN during these simulated calls, and offer the nurse an opportunity for reapproval without the necessity of repeating the entire training program.

Ed Browning also reported that the number of MICN's is decreasing in North Carolina.

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board refer the matter of Bee Sting Certifications to the North Carolina Medical Society; that the Board ask this group's advice on the subject; that the Board send the Medical Society all available statistics on the number of both Bee Sting Certifications and Recertifications since the program's inception; that the Board request the North Carolina Medical Society's opinion on the validity of this program, taking into consideration the number of deaths, if any, per year from bee stings, the dangers involved in administration of Epinephrine by non-physicians, as well as the question of time elapsing between the bee stings and the administration of Epinephrine; and that the Board of Medical Examiners request the North Carolina Medical Society to provide the Board with a report on Bee Sting Certifications.

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Henry that, when MICN's who have not completed the ten physician-supervised calls requirement for certification have a break in employment, the Board of Medical Examiners approve an extension of one year during which time the MICN must comply with this ten physician-supervised calls requirement; but that the Board permit a Mobile Intensive Care Nurse to use this extension only once.

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept the recommendations of the Office of Emergency Medical Services and approve 114 initial ALS applications, 106 ALS recertification applications, including three duplicates, and 223 Bee Sting Certifications.

REINSTATEMENTS

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board approve the reinstatement of licensure for the following physicians.

Bill Breeze reported that the North Carolina Board of Nursing has plans to study this project and will have a report available in the near future.

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board write Dr. Dulin a letter stating the Board of Medical Examiners is investigating this pilot project; that the Board request a staff member to present a report to the Board of Medical Examiners at its March, 1987, meeting on the results of the Nursing Board's study of Body Talk; that the Board's attorney determine the legality of a laboratory's performing blood tests without authorizations by physicians by clarifying the laws on this matter; that the Board also obtain information from Roche and National Laboratories on rules and regulations applicable to blood tests; that, as the advertising for this project may be misleading to the public, the Board's attorney discuss Body Talk with the Consumer Protection Agency; and that, if this agency believes the advertising by Body Talk is misleading, the Board's attorney obtain this opinion in writing.

FLEX, PHYSICIANS WHO HAVE PASSED & COMPLETED PGT

On January 23, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners approve six physicians for licensure who have passed FLEX and complied with the Board's graduate medical education requirement.

MALPRACTICE STUDY COMMISSION REPORT

Dr. Duckett reported that there was a minimal difference of opinion on the Board's proposed legislation; and that, if the malpractice portion of the bill becomes stymied, the Legislature will consider the portion concerning the Board of Medical Examiners as a separate item.

PELLEY, DEAN JAMES, M.D. - Robinson, Illinois

On January 24, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board write Dr. Pelley a letter advising him to notify the Board prior to resuming the practice of medicine in

North Carolina, in order that the Board of Medical Examiners can schedule this physician to appear for an interview; and that the Board determine whether Dr. Pelley is complying with the probationary conditions imposed by the Illinois Board.

BLACK, BILLY GENE, M.D. - Matthews, North Carolina

On January 24, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board enter into a Consent Order with Dr. Black stating that Dr. Black performed abortions in an unlicensed facility and containing a formal reprimand for these activities; that the Board request the Medical Society to publish information on the laws concerning abortions in the Journal; and that the Board also request the OB/Gyn Association to publicize information on this subject.

ROBERTS, JANIFER C., M.D. - Lumberton, North Carolina

On January 24, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett (1) that the Board enter into a Consent Order with Dr. Roberts; (2) that this Consent Order stipulate Dr. Roberts shall surrender her license to practice medicine in North Carolina; (3) that this Consent Order further stipulate Dr. Roberts shall obtain as soon as possible comprehensive medical and psychiatric evaluations from Board certified specialists in Internal Medicine and Psychiatry of her choosing, subject to approval by the Board; (4) that this Consent Order contain the stipulation Dr. Roberts shall arrange for her chosen Internist and Psychiatrist to provide directly to the Board complete evaluative reports regarding her current physical and mental condition: including their respective diagnoses, prognoses, and recommended courses of treatment, if any; (5) that this Consent Order contain the stipulation Dr. Roberts specifically authorizes the Board to provide to her physicians such information concerning her as the Board, in its discretion, shall deem necessary and appropriate; (4) that this Consent Order also stipulate, if the reports provided to the Board concerning Dr. Roberts by her physicians indicate, to the sole satisfaction of the Board, that Dr. Roberts is physically and mentally capable of practicing medicine, the Board, in its discretion, may issue to Dr. Roberts a dated license to practice medicine in North Carolina valid until the date specified on this dated license; (5) that this Consent Order stipulate Dr. Roberts will remain under the regular care of such physician(s) as are appropriate for whatever continuing medical problems she may have; and (6) that this Consent Order contain the stipulation Dr. Roberts shall meet again informally with the

Board at its regular meeting in March, 1987, at such place and time as the Board shall advise.

On January 24, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners empower its President, after he reviews the reports submitted by an Internist and Psychiatrist and deems these reports to be satisfactory, to issue Dr. Roberts a dated license.



On January 24, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board enter into a Consent Order with Dr. Hayes containing the following stipulations: (1) Dr. Hayes shall immediately surrender to the Board his license to practice medicine in North Carolina; (2) Upon receiving this license, the Board will issue Dr. Hayes a dated license to practice medicine in North Carolina valid through March 30, 1987; (3) Dr. Hayes shall obtain, as soon as possible, comprehensive medical and psychiatric evaluations from Board-certified specialists in internal medicine and psychiatry of his choosing, subject to approval by the Board; (4) Dr. Hayes shall arrange for his chosen internist and psychiatrist to provide directly to the Board within thirty days complete evaluative reports regarding his current physical and mental condition, including their respective diagnoses, prognoses, and recommended courses of treatment, if any; (5) Dr. Hayes shall authorize the Board to provide to his physicians such information concerning him as the Board, in its discretion, shall deem necessary and appropriate; (6) Dr. Hayes shall abstain completely from the consumption of alcohol and controlled substances, except such as may be prescribed for him by his regular physician or dentist; (7) Dr. Hayes shall be and remain of good moral character and shall violate no state or federal laws; and (8) Dr. Hayes shall meet again informally .

with the Board at its regular meeting in March, 1987.

ADJOURNMENT

As the Board of Medical Examiners had no further business to conduct at this meeting, Charles H. Duckett, M.D., President of the Board, declared the meeting adjourned at 6:40 p.m., January 24, 1987.
