

BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

January 23-25, 1976
Pinehurst, North Carolina

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at The Pinehurst Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, January 23-25, 1976 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement, and conducting other business.

Drs. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., President, Charles B. Wilkerson, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer, David S. Citron, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, J. Jerome Pence, Jr. and E. Wilson Staub were present. Also present were Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary, Ms. B. Joe Cooke, Diane G. Freeman and Mr. Lee Denny.

Friday, January 23
5:00 p.m.

The Board convened for business and reviewing credentials of physicians applying for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Hassan Arar, Lexington, N.C. -- Executive Secretary reviewed Dr. Arar's file for the Board, and the fact that he held a resident's training license in North Carolina in 1958 and did not have the ECFMG at that time, still does not hold the Standard Certificate of the ECFMG, and has also taken training in the United States prior to the time that the ECFMG was required. Dr. Arar would like to apply to take FLEX when he receives his permanent resident status in the United States and would like a resident's training license in North Carolina at this time.

ACTION: Dr. Edmondson moved that if no derogatory information is received from inquiries sent to the areas where Dr. Arar has worked and trained, the Board waive the ECFMG requirement in the event he obtains the alien registration receipt card, and he can apply to take the examination. Seconded by Dr. Citron and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Barry Hickey, Wilson, N.C. -- Request for extension of Visiting Professor registration. The Board reviewed Dr. Hickey's file and his status as a Visiting Professor at the University of North Carolina School of Medicine and his request for extension of that registration for an additional six months.

ACTION: Dr. Galusha moved that the Board extend Dr. Hickey's Visiting Professor registration through July, 1976 and advise him and Dr. Ney that there would not be another extension, and if he intends to stay longer, he will need to apply as a FLEX candidate, and the Board will personally check to see if he is still practicing medicine in North Carolina after July. Seconded by Dr. Citron and discussion followed. Question called, and motion defeated by vote of two for and three opposed.

RE: Dr. Donald T. Pole, Wilmington, N.C. -- Board reviewed his request for continuance of his resident's training license even though he does not hold the ECFMG certificate; his resident's training license was issued prior to the Board's policy requiring American born citizens, who are foreign graduates, to hold the ECFMG.

ACTION: Dr. Galusha moved that Dr. Pole be allowed to continue in his residency training program and hold a resident's training license, and he be allowed to take FLEX for full licensure if he desires, but he be advised why his situation is different and why he was given individual consideration. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Office lease -- Following Board discussion, Dr. Edmondson moved that all efforts be pursued to keep the Board's administrative offices in the same location as they are now. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Administrative Procedures Act -- Following review and discussion, Dr. Pence moved that the Administrative Procedures Act information compiled by the Board's administrative staff be approved as presented and filed with the proper North Carolina State officials.

RE: Assistants to physicians -- application form. Dr. Wilkerson moved that the Executive Secretary and attorney for the Board work out a statement to be included on the application form for assistants to physicians to make responsibility for the assistants actions and medical acts legally binding on the physician who applies for the assistant. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Assistants to physicians-registered nurses-prescribing. Dr. Citron moved that the supervising physicians for assistants and registered nurses performing medical acts be permitted to add to the drug formulary any non-prescription (over-the-counter drugs) without Board approval. Seconded by Dr. Galusha and duly passed.

Dr. Citron moved that requests for additions or changes in the drug formulary, which do require prescriptions, for assistants to physicians, be received by the Board and handled at the discretion of the President of the Board, in conjunction with the Board members who meet with the joint subcommittee if he so desires. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Assistants to physicians -- applications.

RE: Dr. Allan J. Lester, Durham, N.C. -- Application complete for William T. Vaughan. Dr. Taylor moved that the application for Mr. Vaughan be returned to Dr. Lester for signature of his back-up physician for his assistant, and it be approved if and when this is completed. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Harry L. Johnson, Greensboro, N.C. -- Application complete for Dooley L. Underwood, III. Dr. Taylor moved that the application be returned for signature of the back-up physician for Dr. Johnson's assistant, and if he has no back-up physician, Dr. Johnson be informed that his assistant is not to work in his absence. Seconded by Dr. Galusha and duly passed.

Dr. Edmondson moved that Mr. Kerlee be approved for use as an assistant to a physician if and when the other back-up physician's signature has been received for the application. RE: Dr. Robert L. Poston, Elizabeth City, N.C. -- Application complete for Michael J. Turley. Dr. Pence moved that Mr. Turley be approved for use as an assistant to a physician. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Robert L. Rollins, Raleigh, N.C. -- Application incomplete for Timothy Van Mauldin. Dr. Galusha moved that if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary, Mr. Mauldin be approved for use as an assistant to a physician. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

Dr. Galusha moved that if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary, Mr. Lunsford be approved for use as an assistant to a physician. ACTION: Dr. Pence moved that the Board approve the actions of the joint subcommittee regarding the applications for the registered nurses performing medical acts. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Mobile Intensive Care Technician --Nurse. Following review and discussion of applications presented for approval of the mobile intensive care technician-nurse, Dr. Edmondson moved that Mr. Paris talk with Mr. Gentile of the Office of Emergency Medical Services concerning these applications, and get all the information he can and circulate it to the Board members for their review, and comments from each member be noted. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Emergency Medical Technicians--IV. Following review of applications presented for Board approval, Dr. Staub moved that the applications presented at this meeting be approved for the EMT-IV. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.

RE: Professional Nurse Midwifery -- Following Board discussion, Dr. Edmondson moved that the Board accept the criteria as recommended by the Joint Subcommittee of the Board of Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing for receiving applications for nurse midwives. Seconded by Dr. Citron and duly passed. Criteria as approved is as follows:

To obtain approval to practice as a Certified Nurse-Midwife in the State of North Carolina, the C.N.M. must meet the following criteria:

- (1) Be currently licensed as a registered professional nurse in North Carolina;
- (2) Be certified as a nurse-midwife (Certified Nurse-Midwife, C.N.M.) by the American College of Nurse-Midwives;
- (3) Have (a) graduated within the previous five years from an ACNM approved nurse-midwifery educational program; or (b) practiced in the United States as a C.N.M. within the past five years; or (c) have completed within the past five years an internship or refresher course approved by ACNM.




Professional nurse midwifery, cont'd. -- criteria.

Documents to be presented:

- 1) R.N. License in North Carolina
- 2) Copy of ACNM certification;
- 3) Proof of basic midwifery education and internship, refresher, or C.N.M. practice within the past five years;
- 4) Copies of licenses to practice as a C.N.M. in other states;
- 5) The proposed policy manual for nurse-midwifery practice, including practice protocols, standing orders, and so forth.

The application form for approval for practice might have to be revised for the C.N.M. because the information requested is somewhat different than for other groups.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, Dr. Pence moved the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.
