

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS OF
NORTH CAROLINA

Mid Pines Club, Southern Pines, North Carolina

January 5 -6th, 1967

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Mid Pines Club, Southern Pines, North Carolina, January 5-6th, 1967 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials, for special limited license and other business.

Thursday, January 5th

6:00 P. M. _____ - The Board convened for dinner. Drs. James E. Davis, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, H. Lee Large, Jr., W. Boyd Owen, Clark Rodman, Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials and special limited license were reviewed by the members of the Board.

RE: Dr. Robert Brown has requested information with regard to applying for license by endorsement of credentials as he owns a summer home in western North Carolina; also that he probably would retire there.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that Dr. Robert Brown be advised the policy of the Board of Medical Examiners with regard to receiving license upon locating in the state for practice and that he communicate with this office when he is ready to retire and come to North Carolina. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. W. Boyd Owen and passed unanimously.

RE: Constitution and By-Laws Committee of the State Medical Society - The secretary presented communication from the chairman of this committee advising that it had under consideration a change in the method of election of the Board of Medical Examiners from the open general session to the House of Delegates; also that it might consider the desirability of limiting the tenure on the board that the member could not succeed himself, but could be re-elected after a lapse of two years. It was stated that this committee would meet January 28th, 1967 and indicated that it would welcome representation from the Board of Medical Examiners, if it so desired.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the Board of Medical Examiners be represented at the committee meeting and that this representative be the president, Dr. James E. Davis. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. W. Boyd Owen and passed unanimously.

Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the representative of the Board before the committee of the State Medical Society be instructed that the feeling of the Board of Medical Examiners is that the society not prohibit a man from succeeding himself on the Board of Medical Examiners. This motion was duly seconded and passed by a vote of five to one, Dr. Rodman opposing the same.

Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that the Board of Medical Examiners recommend procedure for electing the Board of Medical Examiners remain the same, but to change the day of voting to the day of the first general session. This motion was duly seconded and passed by a vote of four to one, Dr. Rodman abstaining.

RE: Audit - The Finance Committee, Drs. Clark Rodman, Chairman, H. Lee Large, Jr. and W. Boyd Owen, reported that it had inspected the audit for 1966, found it satisfactory and the chairman moved that the Board of Medical Examiners accept the report. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

The Board accepted the report of the Finance Committee.



RE: Dr. Marcel Kinsbourne, graduate of the University of Oxford in 1955 - The president of the Board presented letter from Dr. William G. Anlyan, Dean of Duke University School of Medicine, advising that Dr. Kinsbourne had received an appointment as associate professor there to begin in July, 1967; that he was of international repute; that he would be unable to arrive here until after the 1967 written examination. He asked that some consideration be given to enable him to begin work at the time of his appointment.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that Dr. Marcel Kinsbourne's application for licensure be handled in the usual manner. Dr. Owen seconded this motion and the same was passed unanimously.

RE: Written Examination - Narcotic Talk - Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. make this talk at the annual written examination. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.

RE: Meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners October, 1967 - Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that the Board meet at the Jack Tar Hotel, Asheville, October 19-22nd. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners January, 1968 - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board meet at Mid Pines Club, Southern Pines January 4-7th, 1968. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.

RE: Salaries - The Board approved salaries as of January 1st, 1967, to be increased as follows:

RE: South Carolina Board of Medical Examiners - The secretary presented report that the South Carolina Board of Medical Examiners beginning June, 1967 would examine in Medical Ethics; that this would in no way affect its endorsement policy.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that this be received as information. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Erich K. Lang, graduate of the University of Vienna in 1953 - The secretary presented petition from Dr. Lang that he be granted the privilege of taking the written examination in June, 1967, in order to accept an appointment in the Department of Radiology of Duke University School of Medicine, together with letter from Dr. Richard G. Lester, Chairman of the Department.

VERDICT: Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that Dr. Erich K. Lang be granted the privilege of taking the written examination in June, 1967, provided his credentials are in order. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Rodman and passed unanimously.



RE: Dr. William E. Bowman of North Adams, Massachusetts, graduate of Middlesex University - The secretary advised the Board that Dr. Bowman, native of North Carolina, was desirous of retiring in North Carolina and that he had inquired with reference to license in this state. His medical school was not an approved medical school. No action was taken by the Board.

RE: Application to convert to full license:

RE: Dr. Joel Richard Temple was granted license limited to Duke University School of Medicine, where he was a resident in Medicine. He has now joined the staff of the Wilson Clinic as of January 1st, 1967, and has applied for conversion to full license. He has met the requirements of the Board.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the limited license of Dr. Joel Richard Temple be converted to full license. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. William Caswell Sugg, Jr. was granted license limited to the University of North Carolina School of Medicine. to cover him as a resident in Medicine. He plans to enter the private practice of Internal Medicine in Charlotte in July, 1967, and has applied for conversion to full license. He has not met all the requirements of the Board.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the limited license of Dr. William Caswell Sugg, Jr. be converted to full license when he has met the requirements of the Board of Medical Examiners. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously. (Requirements met)

RE: Dr. Jose O. Castellanos, Coats, North Carolina, was granted license limited until citizenship obtained, which has been accomplished and he has applied for conversion to full license.

VERDICT: Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that the limited license of Dr. Jose O. Castellanos be converted to full license. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Gottfried R. F. Kaestner of Charlotte, North Carolina, was granted license limited until citizenship obtained, which has been accomplished, and he has applied for conversion to full license.

VERDICT: Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that the limited license of Dr. Gottfried R. F. Kaestner be converted to full license. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that the following letter from Mrs. Ralph G. Templeton be placed in the Minutes:

"Thank you so very much for sending me a copy of the Resolution. The children and I are pleased and proud to have this glowing tribute to Ralph spread upon the Minutes of the Board and we would like each of you to know how deeply we appreciate your thoughtfulness."

The meeting was adjourned.

The following physicians appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials:

RE: Dr. Howard Lacy Armistead, Jr. appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is an interne at James Walker Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Edmondson: Do you plan to stay in North Carolina?

A. Yes, that is why I came to North Carolina to get internship.

Dr. Combs: How much training do you expect to take?

A. I am going to finish my internship and I have thought seriously of taking another year of training and then doing general practice.

Dr. Davis: You are pretty sure you will remain in North Carolina?

A. Yes, that is why I went to Wilmington, that is where I plan to stay. I want to do some work now, this has Dr. Mason's approval and the Medical Education Committee.

Dr. Combs: There is no plan to drop out of internship?

A. No sir, not at all.

Dr. Davis: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever been faced with disciplinary action by any state board? A. No sir

VERDICT: Dr. Howard Lacy Armistead, Jr. was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. Leon Wendell Binns was granted special limited license in July, 1966 to cover him for training at Kate B. Reynolds Hospital. He has now received license in Georgia on the basis of written examination and is applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Edmondson: Where are you now?

A. Kate B. Reynolds

Q. Have you been there since graduation?

A. I had one year of residency at Meharry.

Q. Are you contemplating practice there?

A. Yes sir, definitely.

Dr. Davis: When will you finish your training program?

A. I intend to go in practice immediately after this goes through.

Q. Do you plan to open an office?

A. No sir, I will join a team at Kate B. Reynolds.

Dr. Edmondson: Emergency room?

A. Yes sir

VERDICT: Dr. Leon Wendell Binns was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. Joseph Franklin Borg appeared before the Board of Medical Examiners in May, 1958, applying for license by endorsement of credentials, for which he was approved contingent upon coming in the state for practice, within one year. In May 2nd, 1966, he appeared before the Board again and stated that he still planned to come to North Carolina to practice, at which time the pre-verdict was reaffirmed. Dr. Borg is now located in Tryon, North Carolina, where he plans to become associated with Tryon Medical Associates upon receipt of license to practice medicine.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph Franklin Borg was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. John Henry Bumgarner, North Carolina native, appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Edmondson: What are your plans?

A. I am under obligation to the Hospital Care Commission for two years and will do general practice, probably around Hickory.

Q. Are you interning?

A. Yes, I will finish the first of July.

A. I have made some plans, I had planned full-time practice.

VERDICT: Dr. John Henry Bumgarner was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. Mark Edward Frankel appeared with incomplete credentials in July, 1966 applying for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to Duke University School of Medicine, where he is a resident in Orthopaedics. His credentials are now completed.

VERDICT: Dr. Mark Edward Frankel was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to Duke University School of Medicine.

RE: Dr. Thomas Robert Glasco appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Davis: What have you done since graduation?

A. Two years in the Army, South Hill.

Q. You want to go to Liberty?

A. I am considering it.

Q. General practice?

A. Yes sir

Q. How firm are your plans?

A. I have not made firm commitment.

Q. What is your target date?

A. I will make a decision prior to March 15th.

Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q. Have you ever faced any disciplinary action by any board of medical examiners? A. No sir

Q. It is our policy not to grant license unless it is to be used in North Carolina and our decision will be contingent upon your coming to North Carolina.

VERDICT: Dr. Thomas Robert Glasco was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary and he locates in the state for practice, within one year. (Requirements met)

RE: Dr. Robert Walter Hooker appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is an interne at James Walker Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Davis: What are your plans after completion of internship?

A. To do general practice in the Wilmington area.

Q. About July of this year?

A. Yes sir

Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. Nothing

Q. Have you ever faced disciplinary action by any board of medical examiners? A. No

Dr. Davis: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

He is a resident in Radiology at Duke University School of Medicine, for which he was granted special limited license in July, 1966, since which time he has received license in West Virginia. He stated that he desired to do some Emergency Room work in other hospitals.

Dr. Large: What hospital?

A. Watts Hospital

VERDICT: Dr. Hubert Ashley Royster, Jr. was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, upon motion of Dr. Clark Rodman, seconded by Dr. W. Boyd Owen and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Novello Egidio Ruggiero appeared with incomplete credentials in July, 1966, applying for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to Duke University School of Medicine, where he was to begin residency in Plastic Surgery. At that time he stated that he would be at the Veterans Administration Hospital six months. His credentials are now complete.

VERDICT: Dr. Novello Egidio Ruggiero was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to Duke University School of Medicine.

RE: Dr. Lester Rumble, Jr. appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials and stated that he planned to practice Anesthesiology.

A. I hope to get a decision this week. The catch is my lack of academic background.

RE: Dr. Robert Bruce Salmon appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He stated that he planned to join Dr. Robert S. Lackey in the practice of Radiology in Charlotte March 1st, 1967.

Dr. Davis: Have you signed a contract?

A. I have not signed the contract but have made commitment; that is contingent upon getting state license.

Q. Not contingent upon anything else?

A. No

Dr. Large: If you get license you are going to work?

RE: Dr. LeGrand Thurman Scott, Jr. appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Rodman: What are your plans?

A. General practice with Dr. Stanley Vetter in Rockingham.

Dr. Davis: When?

A. As of to-day, I have been waiting since November.

Q. Do you have a home in Rockingham?

A. Yes, we moved about a month ago.

Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever been addicted to narcotics? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever been faced with disciplinary action? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever faced disciplinary action by a state medical board? A. No sir

Q. You are practicing without license.

A. I have not begun as yet. I just moved Wednesday.

VERDICT: Dr. Larry Click Smith was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to Bowman Gray School of Medicine, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary. (Credentials completed)

RE: Dr. Henry Perkins Stockwell appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He was granted special limited license to Charlotte Memorial Hospital in 1963 to cover his residency training there, he then left and has returned to Charlotte, where he stated he had been invited to join a group in Charlotte in Pediatrics on March 1st.

Dr. Combs: Will there be any activity outside of Mecklenburg County?

RE: Dr. Jan Barentse Wemple appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials, and stated that he was going in practice with Dr. James A. Johnson of High Point in Neurological Surgery.

Dr. Davis: Where have you been since 1959?

A. Surgical internship at the University of Virginia, assistant resident in Surgery there, four years in Neurological Surgery there, past one and

one-half years in Memphis with a group in Neurosurgery.

Q. When do you plan to go to work in High Point?

A. I am there, moved a few days ago.

Q. Your family is there?

A. Yes

Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir

A. No sir

Q. Have you ever been addicted to narcotics? A. No sir

VERDICT: Dr. Jan Barentse Wemple was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

He appeared before the Board of Medical Examiners in October, 1966, with incomplete credentials applying for license limited to cover him as a resident in Surgery. His credentials are now complete.

SPECIAL LIMITED LICENSE - HOSPITAL RESIDENT

RE: Dr. John Jamieson Stewart, graduate of Duke University School of Medicine, appeared applying for special limited license to cover him as a resident in Ophthalmology at Bowman Gray School of Medicine. He stated he became an interne last January; that he was given the opportunity to begin the residency because of a vacancy in the residency staff. He was approved for special limited license on an annual basis.

Dr. Davis: The special limited license does not carry authority to have a narcotic tax stamp, is renewable annually at the request of your chief of service.

RE: Dr. Carlos Modesto Solano, graduate of the University of Brazil in 1962, appeared with incomplete credentials applying for special limited license to cover him as a resident in Surgery and Gastroenterology, for which he was approved on an annual basis, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary. He presented exchange visa. Photograph compared with that on his visa. (Credentials completed)

RE: Dr. Yung Kee Lee, graduate of Kyung Pook University, Korea in 1959 appeared applying for special limited license to Watts Hospital, where he is an interne in Surgery, for which he was approved on an annual basis.

RE: Dr. Laurence Grundy, graduate of the University of Otago, New Zealand, in 1962, appeared applying for special limited license to Duke University School of Medicine, where he is a resident in Radiology, for which he was approved on an annual basis.

RE: Dr. Demosthenes C. Amparo, graduate of the University of Santa Tomas, Philippines in 1964, appeared for special limited license to Forsyth Memorial Hospital, where he is a resident in General Surgery, for which he was approved on an annual basis. He presented exchange visa.



RE: Dr. Frank William Varese appeared with incomplete credentials applying for special limited license at Duke University School of Medicine, where he is a resident in Psychiatry. He is a native of Italy and presented Naturalization certificate #774 3848 dated January 25th, 1957. Photo was compared with that on naturalization certificate. He also requested the privilege of taking the written examination.

Dr. Davis: You have been in this country how long?

A. 1950, have been back and forth, came back in November, 1965, and have been interning in New Jersey.

Q. What are your plans as related to North Carolina?

A. I would like to take my training at Duke and would like to take the North Carolina board.

Q. Do you have an appointment in Psychiatry at Duke July 1st?

A. They are three residents short and they will take me. If possible I prefer taking boards when fresh from medical school .

VERDICT: Dr. Frank William Varese was approved for special limited license on an annual basis, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank William Varese was approved for the written examination, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary.

RE: Dr. Oscar Tanaka, graduate of the University of San Marcos, Peru, resident at Bowman Gray School of Medicine, failed to appear as requested.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the secretary contact Dr. Oscar Tanaka and if he had a reasonable excuse, to appear before the secretary and be allowed to begin work and appear at the next meeting of the Board in April, 1967. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Bagher M. Sheikholislam, graduate of the University of Tehran, Iran in 1960, and now a fellow in Pediatrics at Duke University School of Medicine, appeared petitioning for the privilege of taking the written examination in June, 1967. Dr. Robert S. Stempfelfel, Professor of Pediatrics, advised by letter that it was their hope that at the conclusion of this academic year, he might join the full-time faculty or be in a position to compete for this appointment. He presented immigrant visa.

Dr. Davis: If you become licensed, you are looking forward to joining the staff at Duke in Pediatrics?

A. Yes

Q. When do you finish your training?

A. July, 1967, after that I plan to have a position at Duke University, if I can pass the examination.

Q. If you should pass our examination, not being a citizen, it would be geographically limited until you get citizenship.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that Dr. Bagher M. Sheikholislam was approved to take the written examination in June, 1967, the same to be limited geographically until citizenship obtained, within six years. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Hiroshi Nagya, who holds special limited license to Duke University School of Medicine, where he is a resident, appeared petitioning to take the written examination for licensure. He presented immigrant visa.

Dr. Davis: How long have you been at Duke?

A. Since 1959

Q. If the Board grants you permission to take the examination and you are successful in passing, you will be given license limited geographically limited to Durham County until such time as you get citizenship.

Dr. Nagaya continued

Dr. Herbert O. Sieker, Professor of Medicine at Duke, advised the Board that it was the plan of the Department of Medicine there to make Dr. Nagaya a permanent member of the staff.

VERDICT: Dr. Hiroshi Nagaya was approved to take the written examination for medical licensure, the same to be limited geographically until citizenship obtained.

RE: Dr. Kurt Sachs, graduate of the University of Vienna, Austria, in 1935, appeared petitioning for the privilege of taking the written examination for licensure. He holds license to practice medicine in Connecticut, New York, Delaware and Michigan. He is presently at the Veterans Administration Hospital, Fayetteville, and desires to do some teaching at Duke. He is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine and is a naturalized citizen.

Dr. Davis: Did you take examination in these states?

A. Connecticut and New York

Q. You are now located in Fayetteville at the Veterans Administration?

A. Yes, chief of Medical Service.

Q. And you do some teaching at Duke?

A. Not yet, not until licensed.

Q. You have taken the ECFMG?

A. No, it came into effect long after my time.

Q. You are petitioning to take our written examination in June?

A. Yes, if I may request consideration of license by endorsement.

Q. We are not allowed to do that for foreign graduates. You are requesting license by endorsement?

A. No sir, if that not feasible, to take the examination. I have practiced Internal Medicine for many yearsz

Q. Your age?

A. 56

The verdict of the Board of Medical Examiners with regard to Dr. Kurt Sachs' petition was postponed until another session of the Board. (See p123 these Minutes)

RE: Dr. Enayatolah Tabesh appeared applying for special limited license to work at John Umstead Hospital on the staff until such time as he can take the written examination for licensure in June, 1967, and also that he be granted the privilege of taking the next examination.

Dr. Davis: You are located at John Umstead Hospital?

A. Yes

Q. What are your duties there?

A. I am taking over one of the units at John Umstead Hospital, Medical.

Q. How long have you been in this country?

A. I had graduate training in Cleveland and Philadelphia and came back in December.

Dr. Davis: In Medicine or Psychiatry?

A. Medicine and Cardiology

Q. And this is what you will do?

A. Yes, medically ill patients.



Dr. Tabesh continued

Dr. Davis advised that if he were successful in passing the examination he would be granted license limited geographically until citizenship obtained.

VERDICT: Dr. Enayatolah Tabesh was approved for special limited license to John Umstead Hospital to cover his duties until he can take the June, 1967 examination and obtain license.

VERDICT: Dr. Enayatolah Tabesh was approved to take the written examination for licensure in June, 1967, the same to be limited geographically until citizenship obtained, within six years.

RE: Dr. L. J. Moorefield, Mount Airy, North Carolina - To summarize Dr. Moorefield's narcotic tax stamp was surrendered at the direction of the Board of Medical Examiners in 1952 for violation of the Narcotic law. The same was reinstated in 1954 upon recommendation of the Board.

In November, 1966, the Bureau of Drug Abuse Control reported that Dr. Moorefield was promiscuously selling prescriptions for dangerous drugs; that he was signing and dating blank prescriptions, leaving it to the discretion of the patient as to the drug to be dispensed. Copies of such blank, signed prescriptions were furnished the Board. Pursuant to this information Dr. Moorefield was requested to appear before the Board at this time for an interview. Letter was received from a physician in Mount Airy that he was not physically able to travel and that no improvement in his condition was expected. Dr. Moorefield did not appear.

VERDICT: Dr. W. Boyd Owen moved that Dr. L. J. Moorefield be requested to voluntarily surrender his narcotic tax stamp; secondly, that the Board write and inform him that this is considered extremely poor medicine and that he desist. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned.

Dr. Franklin Stith Kincheloe, Jr. - See previous Minutes) - The following Charges and Accusations were served on Dr. Kincheloe by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

"You are hereby given notice that the following charges and accusations have been and are hereby presented against you by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, to-wit:

1. On August 17th, 1966 you undertook to attend and treat Deborah Jean Edwards as your patient in your offices at Selma, N. C., and while she was under your care as a patient at said time and place you engaged in the following conduct, namely:

- (a) You directed and caused Deborah Jean Edwards to enter a room in the rear of your offices, excluded her mother from the room, and you entered the room and closed the door.
- (b) You then directed and caused Deborah Jean Edwards to remove all of her clothing in your presence without any medical reason or necessity.
- (c) You examined various parts of the nude body of Deborah Jean Edwards in a room, the door or doors to which were closed, and in which no other person was present.
- (d) You administered to Deborah Jean Edwards a drug by hypodermic injection which rendered her unconscious for an appreciable period of time without any medical reason or necessity.



Dr. Kincheloe continued

- (e) While Deborah Jean Edward was unconscious and insensible to her surroundings and while no other person was present and while she was unclothed you examined, observed, touched and otherwise came in contact with her body, all without medical reason or necessity.
- (f) You attempted to kiss Deborah Jean Edwards.
- (g) You attempted to induce Deborah Jean Edwards to permit you to embrace her.
- (h) You placed your arms around Deborah Jean Edwards while she was unclothed without any medical cause or necessity.
- (i) You penetrated the vaginal cavity which caused a laceration at the entrance to the vagina of Deborah Jean Edwards without medical reason or necessity and without the presence of any other person.
- (j) By your remarks and actions in your dealings and attendance of Deborah Edwards, you displayed a lustful, lascivious and unprofessional attitude and demeanor, and you did take unprofessional liberties with her.
- (k) You engaged in sexual intercourse with Deborah Jean Edwards.

2. In your treatment of Deborah Jean Edwards on August 16th, 1966, and in connection therewith, you were guilty of unprofessional and dishonorable conduct unworthy of and affecting your profession, and grounds exist for the revocation of your license to practice medicine heretofore issued by this Board.

You are further given notice that a hearing will be held concerning the above charges and accusations before the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina at its meeting to be held at the Mid Pines Hotel, Moore County, N. C. on January 6, 1967 at 2:00 P. M. o'clock at which time you will be permitted to be heard, to cross-examine witnesses and to present evidence on your own behalf if you so desire. either personally or through counsel, and that following said hearing the Board will make such findings and take such action as the evidence may warrant and justify, with respect to the suspension or revocation of your license to practice medicine heretofore issued by this Board.

In the meantime you may file with the Secretary of the Board a written Answer to the foregoing Charges if you so desire although you are not required to do so.

Following the testimony of the above Dr. Kincheloe made a statement to the Board and denied the allegations.

Mr. George Eason appeared on behalf of the defendant.

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina finds from the testimony of the respondent, Franklin S. Kincheloe, Jr., that on August 17th, 1966, he caused Deborah Jean Edwards to enter a room at the rear of his offices in Selma, North Carolina, closed the door, directed her to remove all of her clothes, which she did, and while no other person was in the room proceeded to examine various parts of her body, including breasts and genitalia.

Upon motion, seconded, and unanimously adopted, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina finds and concludes from all the evidence that in connection with his treatment of Deborah Jean Edwards on August 17th, 1966, Franklin S. Kincheloe, Jr., M. D., was guilty of unprofessional and dishonorable conduct unworthy of and affecting his profession, as set forth in paragraph two of the Charges and Accusations preferred against him, appearing in the record.

Upon motion of Dr. Clark Rodman, seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson, and unanimously adopted the license of Franklin S. Kincheloe, Jr., M. D., to practice medicine heretofore issued by this Board is revoked, and it is directed that an order to that effect be entered.

Upon motion, seconded, and adopted unanimously, decision concerning the specific and itemized charges set forth in paragraph one of the Charges and Accusations is deferred.
