

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Voyager Inn, Greensboro, North Carolina

July 19 - 20th, 1968

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Voyager Inn, Greensboro, North Carolina, July 19-20th, 1968, for the purpose of canvassing and certifying the grades of the written examination given in June, 1968, to interview applicants for license by endorsement of credentials, for special limited license, and for other business.

Friday, July 19th
6:00 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner. Drs. W. Boyd Owen, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, James E. Davis, Frank Edmondson, H. Lee Large, Jr., Clark Rodman, Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

RE: Physicians on military duty in this state applying for license to do part-time civilian work - It has been the policy of the Board of Medical Examiners that where the need were indicated for their part-time services, that license be granted limited geographically.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that military personnel in this state applying for license by endorsement of credentials to do part-time civilian practice be required to have full license. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Robert Richard Ratcliffe III appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to the University of North Carolina School of Medicine, where he is a resident in Psychiatry. He was advised that he would be given one week within which to meet all requirements.

Dr. Owen: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you ever used narcotics personally? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever experienced disciplinary difficulty with any medical examining board? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever used alcohol or barbiturates to excess? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Robert Richard Ratcliffe III was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to the University of North Carolina School of Medicine, if and when his credentials are completed, within one week.

RE: December, 1968 Written Examination - Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the deadline for applying to take the December, 1968 examination be November 15th, 1968. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.

Dr. Clark Rodman moved that the examination questions for the December, 1968 examination be received in the office of the secretary not later than November 2nd, 1968. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. W. Boyd Owen and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Paul Dalton Rudd - (See previous Minutes) - The following Notice of Accusations and Charges were preferred against Dr. Rudd on May 6th, 1968:

"You are hereby given notice that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has preferred and does hereby prefer against you the following charges and accusations, to wit:

"1. That you are habitually addicted to the use of narcotic drugs.

"2. That you are habitually addicted to the use of barbiturates and other habit forming drugs.

"3. That you wrote prescriptions for percodan and other narcotic drugs in the name of various persons, ostensibly patients, some of which were fictitious or non-existing persons, and by the use of such prescriptions you obtained and consumed such

"drugs, among others as follows:

"In the name of James Kirk dated August 8, 1966 for percodan tablets and August 10, 1966, for 30 cc of demoral, dated April 8, 1966 and dated April 17, 1967 for 30 cc of demoral.

"4. That because of your mental condition, you are unable to safely practice medicine.

"5. That You have been guilty of dishonorable and unprofessional conduct unworthy of and affecting your profession, and grounds exist for the revocation of your license to practice medicine hretofore issued by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.



Dr. Rudd continued:

"You are further given notice that a hearing upon the above charges and accusations will be held before the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina on June 17, 1968 at 2:30 P. M. at the Sir Walter Hotel, Raleigh, N. C., at which time you will be given an opportunity to appear in person, to be represented by legal counsel, to confront and to cross-examine witnesses and to present evidence on your own behalf, and that following such hearing the Board will make such findings of fact and will take such action as the evidence may warrant."

The secretary reported to the Board that pursuant to the filing with Dr. Rudd of Notice of Accusations and Charges, Dr. Rudd appeared with his attorney, Mr. William H. Steed, at their request, with Dr. Joseph J. Combs, Secretary of the Board and its attorney, Mr. John H. Anderson, Jr. in the office of Attorney Anderson. Dr. Rudd and his attorney agreed to the following consent agreement:

"On this date, Paul Dalton Rudd, M. D., personally appeared before the undersigned, together with his attorney, William H. Steed, Esq., after being fully apprised of his rights to contest and to a hearing concerning the charges and accusations heretofore presented and served upon him by the Board, and with respect to such charges consented and agreed that the following judgment and order be entered to-wit:

"It is Ordered that the license of Paul Dalton Rudd, M. D., to practice medicine heretofore issued by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, be and the same is hereby revoked. It is further Ordered that the aforesaid revocation be suspended and not be effective, upon condition that Paul Dalton Rudd, M. D., for a period of five years from this date, refrain from the use and consumption, except upon the prescription of another doctor of medicine, of any drug containing narcotics, barbiturates, hallucigens, or mood affecting drug; that he refrain from excessive use of alcohol and alcoholic beverages; that he not violate any law (exclusive of minor traffic violations) or be guilty of conduct indicating to the satisfaction of the Board that he is not capable of practicing medicine safely and in a proper, professional manner; and that he assert his compliance with these terms and conditions in a personal appearance before the Board of Medical Examiners, or a member designated by the President of the Board, as directed by the Board; and the judgment of suspension may be invoked and made effective upon such evidence or information which shall satisfy the Board that the terms of the foregoing suspension have been violated.

"This agreement will be presented to the Board of Medical Examiners at its next meeting for entry of a Judgment in accordance with this agreement.

"This 12th day of July, 1968."

As per the above agreement of Dr. Rudd and his attorney, the following judgment was rendered by the Board of Medical Examiners, revoking his license to practice medicine, judgment suspended:

"In accordance with the agreement and order consented to by Paul Dalton Rudd, M. D. and his attorney, William H. Steed, before the Secretary of this Board on July 12, 1968, as appears in the record it is: Ordered that the license of Paul Dalton Rudd, M. D. to practice medicine heretofore issued by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, be and the same is hereby revoked. It is further Ordered that the aforesaid revocation be suspended and not be effective, upon condition upon condition that Paul Dalton Rudd, M. D. for a period of five years from this date, refrain from the use and consumption, except upon the prescription of another doctor of medicine, of any drug containing narcotics, barbiturates, hallucinogens, or mood affecting drug; that he refrain from excessive use of alcohol and alcoholic beverages; that he not violate any law (exclusive of minor traffic violations) or be guilty of conduct indicating to the satisfaction of the Board that he is not capable of practicing medicine safely and in a proper, professional manner; and that he assert his compliance with these terms and conditions in a personal appearance before the Board of Medical Examiners, or a member designated by the President of the Board, as directed by the Board; and the judgment of suspension may be invoked and made effective upon such evidence or information which shall satisfy the Board that the terms of the foregoing suspension have been violated.

"In accordance with the authority and direction of the Board of Medical Examiners at its regular meeting on July 19, 1968 at Greensboro, North Carolina. This 19 day of July, 1968."



Dr. Rudd continued:

Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the above judgment be adopted, the same was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Grayson S. Waldrop - The secretary advised that Dr. Waldrop held a special limited license to Broughton Hospital; that he had been discharged from his duties there and had accepted a position at Cherry Hospital.

VERDICT: Dr. James E. Davis moved that the Board of Medical Examiners not interview Dr. Grayson S. Waldrop unless he has a definite offer of a job in writing where he will need a license to practice medicine. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Edith Josephine Gertrud Hapke - The secretary presented letter from Dr. Hapke, who is on the staff at the Veterans Administration Hospital at Oteen, North Carolina, with regard to licensure in this state. She is a graduate of a foreign medical school.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that application for license in this state from Dr. Edith Josephine Gertrud Hapke be handled in the routine manner. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. John Custis Crawford, Virginia Beach, Virginia, was granted license 15792 March 30th, 1968, limited to Camden, Pasquotank and Perquimons Counties, North Carolina, in order that he might come across the state line for part-time work in the Family Planning Clinics. When making the proper entries it was ascertained that he had previously been granted license #10002, January 10th, 1955, limited to Charlotte Memorial Hospital to cover him for residency training there, which license he had kept registered biennially. Dr. Crawford paid a fee of \$10.00 for the license limited for hospital training and \$50.00 for the license limited to the counties in which he planned to do part-time practice.

The secretary reported that Dr. Crawford had been requested to return license #10002 in order that the additional geographic limitations might be added, for which he will be due a refund of \$10.00, as he has paid fees totaling \$60.00 and fee for limited license is \$50.00. He was also asked to return license number 15792 in order that the same might be voided.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that license number #15792 be voided in the case of Dr. John Custis Crawford due to the fact that he was issued license #10002 January 10th, 1955. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. James E. Davis and passed unanimously.

RE: Conversion of limited to full license - The following physicians were granted license by endorsement of credentials limited geographically to cover them for residency training, and they are now applying for conversion of limited to full license:
