

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Mayview Manor, Blowing Rock, North Carolina

July 22 - 24th, 1965

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Mayview Manor, Blowing Rock, North Carolina July 22-24th, 1965, for the purpose of canvassing and certifying the grades of the annual written examination for medical license, to interview applicants for license by endorsement of credentials, for special limited license and for other business.

Thursday, July 22nd
6:00 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner. Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr., President, was absent because of illness. Drs. Frank Edmondson, Acting President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, James E. Davis, W. Boyd Owen, Clark Rodman, Ralph G. Templeton and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials and special limited license were reviewed by the Board.

RE: Dr. Wilson Rocha was granted special limited license to Duke University School of Medicine in 1958 on an annual basis. This special limited license was not renewed in 1959 and, therefore, has been out of effect since that time. He has now related that he has been accepted for a fellowship in Pediatric Research at Duke University School of Medicine and has requested revival of his special limited license to cover his work there. This fellowship is to begin September 1st, 1965.

VERDICT: The Board ruled that the special limited license of Dr. Wilson Rocha's special limited license be renewed on an annual basis upon payment of fee of \$10.00.

Reid, Pineville, North Carolina - Pursuant to report from the State Medical Society Committee working with the Industrial Commission, Dr. Reid was requested to appear at this time to discuss said report. The Committee related that it recommended to the Industrial Commission that no further allowance be made for fractures or x-rays until films were approved by a Radiologist as being diagnostic. The Committee also referred to large amounts of drugs used and charged for.



Dr. Reid continued

The Board discussed this matter with Dr. Reid and advised that it had a responsibility to the citizens of the State of North Carolina and to the physicians of the state in that any questionable practice was a reflection on the medical practice of all physicians. Dr. Reid said he felt that his work had been satisfactory; that he had from time to time referred patients to radiologists and orthopedists, who had used his films; that after appearing before the Committee he was only doing first aid for industrial patients and sending others to Charlotte; that he would continue to x-ray and treat simple things with private patients.

VERDICT: Dr. James E. Davis moved that no further action be taken in regard to Dr. Ralph C. Reid at this time and that the Committee of the State Medical Society to work with the Industrial Commission be advised that the Board of Medical Examiners had interviewed and talked with Dr. Reid with regard to the problems which they had presented to us. This motion was seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.


