

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Jefferson Hotel, Morehead City, North Carolina, July 22nd, 1948

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Jefferson Hotel, Morehead City, North Carolina, July 22nd, 1948, for consideration of licensure by endorsement of credentials and for the purpose of reviewing the grades of examinees at the written examination on June 22-24th, 1948, and other business.

The board convened at 10 A. M. and the meeting was called to order by Dr. Malory A. Pittman, President. Drs. Charles W. Armstrong, M. D. Bonner, Thomas Leslie Lee, R. B. McKnight, Paul G. Parker, and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present. Dr. Ivan Procter, Secretary-Treasurer, was absent on account of illness.

Dr. Norman Mark Hornstein, graduate of the Middlesex Hospital, University of London in 1941, appeared before the Board of Medical Examiners with the request that he be granted license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina in order that he might be able to practice on the Outer Banks, where there is no physician at the present time.

The following is letter under date of July 12th, 1948 from I. P. Davis, Superintendent of the Dare County Board of Public Welfare, to Hon. R. Bruce Etheridge:

"You know what a struggle we have had over the past several years in an effort to get a doctor to locate at Buxton for service to the people on the South Banks.

"About two years ago a young doctor from Yonkers, N. Y., by the name of Norman M. Hornstein visited at Buxton on a vacation. I believe he had his family with him. He became very much interested in the possibilities of such a location, especially in view of the fact that the Coast Guard Infirmary and equipment was available for the use of any doctor who locates there. He came by my office and talked with me and I was very favorably impressed with the man. He is young, active and well trained. Since then we have had intermittent correspondence.

"The difficulty in the whole case now is that Dr. Norman Hornstein was educated in a foreign medical college and the State Board of Medical Examiners of North Carolina are not willing to accept persons educated in foreign schools. However, we now learn that the college in which Dr. Hornstein was educated is recognized as a grade A institution by the American Medical Association. Dr. Hornstein was rejected by the Board of Medical Examiners of North Carolina about a year ago. He plans now to go for another examination on July 22nd, although he is not sure he can appear in person. I am going to insist that he make a personal appearance because I feel that this will aid a great deal to his chances of getting a license in this state. He has been practicing in the



State of New York and was in the armed forces service as a doctor during World War II.

"The purpose of this letter is to ask you to talk with the Board of Medical Examiners there in Raleigh and go over this case carefully with the Secretary or Chairman and see if there is not a chance of getting license, even temporary or special, so that Dr. Hornstein can come and serve these needy people before winter. The folks on the Banks and I will certainly appreciate your assistance. It will demand a personal contact from you, I am sure."

The following is a letter under date of July 14th, 1948 from Hon. R. Bruce Etheridge, North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development:

"I am enclosing a letter from my friend, Ike Davis of Manteo, N. C., which is self-explanatory. Please read same and make any suggestions that in your opinion might be helpful. As you probably know, Buxton is on the Outer Banks, and we have always experienced much difficulty in keeping a doctor in that area. In Mr. Davis' letter it appears that Dr. Hornstein seems to be interested and willing to locate there, provided the barriers which would prevent him from locating there could be remedied. I shall appreciate anything that you could advise us to do."

Dr. Hornstein stated that it was his desire to establish permanent residence on the Outer Banks.

After considerable discussion the following resolution was made by Dr. R. B. McKnight:

RESOLVED: That after reviewing the case of Dr. Norman Mark Hornstein, he be given limited medical license to practice on the Outer Banks of North Carolina, provided his credentials are in order. This motion was duly seconded and passed by a vote of five to one, Dr. Thomas Leslie Lee opposing the same.

The board suggested to Dr. Hornstein that he attempt no major surgery other than an emergency and that he refer his surgical cases to nearby qualified hospitals.

Dr. Paul G. Parker reported to the board that he understood Dr. Wiley Royster Young was practicing medicine and doing all right; that he had not seen him to date.

The following letter under date of July 1st, 1948 from Dr. J. H. McNeill, Councilor of the Eighth District, was reported to the board:

"I have the unpleasant duty of informing you that a couple of our doctors in this district are getting into trouble with narcotics and alcohol. Dr. Carl V. Tyner of Leaksville reported to me yesterday at the eighth District meeting, that Drs. John S. Stone and Phil Ray of Leaksville are overindulging alcohol and both are narcotic addicts. It seems that the doctors in Leaksville consider both men to be dangerous to their patients. I will appreciate it if you will take the necessary steps to help them and to protect their patients."

The board instructed the secretary to request investigation by the Narcotic Bureau of Dr. John S. Stone and Dr. Samuel Philip Ray, both of Leaksville, and that the Board of Censors of Rockingham County Medical Society also make an investigation and report to the Board of Medical Examiners.

Dr. Thomas Leslie Lee moved that if in the opinion of the examiner, urinary examination be made on an alleged narcotic addict, that the Board of Medical Examiners defray expenses of said examination. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.



IN RE: Dr. John Samuel Hooker: Dr. John Samuel Hooker, whose medical license was revoked on June 20th, 1945, made application by letter under date of July 12th, 1948, for a hearing before the Board of Medical Examiners for the purpose of obtaining reinstatement of his license.

Dr. Hooker appeared before the board and requested reinstatement of his medical license. Dr. H. F. Eason, Superintendent of the Eastern North Carolina Sanatorium, appeared on behalf of Dr. Hooker.

Dr. Eason stated that Dr. Hooker began work in the Negro Division of the Eastern North Carolina Sanatorium in May, 1947; that he has worked closely with Dr. Hooker and his work has been entirely satisfactory from a standpoint of association with the staff and in the care of patients; that he has been authorized to give him a raise in salary if the action of the board were favorable. He said Dr. Hooker had bought a home in Wilson; that he had been a gentleman, a good citizen and a wonderful assistance in the hospital. Dr. Eason said he would not hesitate to recommend that Dr. Hooker be given another chance and thought he was ready for it.

The following resolution was made by Dr. M. D. Bonner:

RESOLVED: That the medical license of John Samuel Hooker, M. D. to/^{practice} in the State of North Carolina is hereby reinstated in full. FURTHER RESOLVED, that Dr. Hooker remain on probation and if at anytime his conduct is unbecoming that of a physician in the judgment of this board, his license will automatically be revoked. This motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

The following letter from Dr. James M. Northington was presented to the board:

"The enclosed letter which has just come in occasions this last appeal. I hope you will bear with me. Magnolis pop. some 750, is in Duplin County. In 1942 when the last Am. Med. Directory was published it had four doctors. For some 18 mos. it has had none. For some reason this Miss Cox wrote me asking that I try to get them a doctor. I replied, first with the idea of interesting someone else; then, when I learned that my own troubles were not over, with a view to going there myself, provided your board would accept that solution. You see the situation. If you would have the kindness and the patience, and could recommend to your fellow-members that a year of taking care of the sick folks in and about Magnolia be accepted or a substitute for deprivation of license for a year, I believe the people of the state and the ends of justice would be better served. This is my last appeal. Much as I am assured of the favorable issue of an appeal to the courts, I can not bear for the sake of my family to go through with the newspaper publicity incident to such a cause. I am in no way disposed to show lack of consideration for the authority of the Board of Examiners. I am only trying to offer a satisfactory equivalent or what might be considered in every way a better solution."

Dr. R. B. McKnight moved that Dr. James M. Northington's letter be accepted as information. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. M. D. Bonner moved that should Dr. James M. Northington continue to ask for the privilege of practicing medicine, the secretary refer him to the action of the board in June, 1948. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

The members of the Board of Medical Examiners agreed that it should be left to the discretion of the secretary as to the need for a fall meeting and if the same is to be held, that he set the date.

Dr. M. D. Bonner moved that if a fall meeting is held, the same shall be held in Wilson. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

IN RE: Dr. John Kinross-Wright: The following letter under date of June 28th from Dr. David A. Young, General Superintendent of the North Carolina Hospitals Board of Control, was submitted to the board:

"In regard to the request made by the Charlotte Mental Hygiene Clinic to your board for the temporary licensing of Dr. Vernon John Kinross-Wright, I am writing in order to define somewhat briefly the relationship which this agency has with the Charlotte Mental Hygiene Clinic.

"During the present fiscal year this agency has been acting as the designated Mental Hygiene Authority in connection with money being expended by the USPHS. A plan was worked out and put into operation to supplement local child guidance and mental hygiene clinics or actually to carry mental hygiene clinics by the use of one-third local and two-thirds Federal funds. It was thought that in this way the best use could be made of the money and that the organizations already in operation could be helped further, rather than trying to set up new clinics which would be in competition with the established ones and that this would be stimulating to the local areas to make available funds for mental hygiene activities and these, when turned over to the State, would provide the necessary matching funds. In accordance with this plan, we have for some time been willing to supplement the activities of the Mental Hygiene Clinic of Charlotte by the use of Federal funds for salaries of persons to be employed subsequent to the date at which the funds became available to us. We have already been actively supplementing these funds by having on our payroll, as par-time or full-time, some four persons including the psychometrist, two out-patient psychiatrists and a consultant psychiatrist, and we are also anticipating adding a secretary because of the increased activities of the clinic. The program there, however, has been somewhat hampered by shortages of personnel, as has been true with the other mental hygiene clinics.

"This agency feels a definite responsibility for the clinics being started throughout the state, not only because of the investment of money in these but also because the public is at the present time actively interested in the establishment of mental hygiene clinics and we hope not to be as disappointing to them as the shortages of trained personnel would at times suggest.

"Personnel being employed in this clinic by us are administratively responsible not only to the local authority, either the Board of Trustees or the President of the clinic, but also to this agency which actually pays them directly and which has to arrange for their employment by clearing this with the Budget Bureau and Merit System. This personnel has to meet Merit System requirements and discharge of these is subject to rules set up by that agency of the State. Such personnel are State employees in the true sense of the word and if full-time, for instance, would be given the same benefits, vacation, sick leave, retirement and etc. and, as I understand the relationship, can be discharged by this agency by proper procedure. I hope that your board will consider the licensing of Dr. Kinross-Wright in the same light as the employment of doctors in the State Hospitals, as they are both working directly under this agency and any safeguard which you may wish in this respect will, of course, be carried out."

The following resolution was made by Dr. R. B. McKnight:

RESOLVED: That Dr. John Kinross-Wright be given a temporary permit to practice medicine in the mental institutions of the State of North Carolina and their associate psychiatric clinics under the direction and supervision of Dr. David A. Young, General Superintendent, as per the resolution of this board January 12th, 1948.

The board was advised of the communication from Dr. Ellanor Lockhart Water house; that she had been under the care of Dr. J. J. Combs and Dr. E. E. Menefee for the past two years; that either of these would be able to give a report in regard to her condition.



Dr. M. D. Bonner moved that Dr. Waterhouse be allowed to consult Dr. Combs or Dr. Menefee in regard to her physical condition as to whether or not she be considered infectious. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. Thomas Leslie Lee moved that all previous motions regarding averages on written examination be rescinded and that an average of 75% be required as a passing grade. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

IN RE: Dr. Robert S. Carroll: According to the Minutes of July 20th, 1926, the medical license of Dr. Carroll was revoked. On January 13th, 1928 the following judgment was rendered in the Buncombe County Superior Court:

"That above entitled cause coming on to be heard and having been heard at the present term of the Court, before His Honor Judge Walter E. Moore, Judge Presiding and a jury, and the following issues to wit: "Has Dr. Robert S. Carroll been guilty of grossly immoral conduct with patients or nurses in the Highland Hospital, n Asheville, North Carolina, or elsewhere, as alleged in the record in this cause." Having been submitted to the jury and the jury having answered said issue "NO".

"It is now upon motion of Counsel for Dr. Robert S. Carroll, to wit: Mark W. Brown, R. R. Williams, and Martin and Martin, ordered and adjudged by the Court that the order of the State Board of Medical Examiners, dated the 20th day of July, 1926, and appealed from in this cause, rescinding the license to Dr. Robert S. Carroll, to practice medicine and surgery in the State of North Carolina, be and said order is hereby rescinded and reversed, and it is ordered by the Court that said Robert S. Carroll, be and he is hereby allowed to retain his said license and said license shall remain in full force and effect. And it is further ordered by the Court that said Robert S. Carroll have and recover of the complainants in this cause the cost of this proceeding.

The Book of Licensure of the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners shows that the medical license of Dr. Robert S. Carroll was revoked, but it does not show that said medical license was reinstated by the court. The Board of Medical Examiners directed the secretary to insert in its Book of Licensure that medical license of Dr. Robert S. Carroll was restored by the Superior Court of Buncombe County, North Carolina, January 13th, 1928.

Dr. Charles Davis Belcher, Jr., applicant for licensure by endorsement, appeared with incomplete credentials and was interviewed by the Board of Medical Examiners.

Dr. Charles W. Armstrong moved that Dr. Belcher be granted a license upon completion of his credentials, if the same are approved by the secretary. This motion was duly seconded and unanimously passed.

The meeting was adjourned.
