

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Mayview Manor, Blowing Rock, North Carolina

July 23-26th, 1959

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met July 23-26th, 1959, for the purpose of certifying the grades of the annual written examination for medical licensure, to interview applicants for licensure by endorsement and for special limited license, and for other business.

Thursday, July 23rd

Dr. Combs: What is the relation of the American Academy of Applied Nutrition to the American Medical Association?

A. No relationship. The American Medical Association has been critical and it is not formally recognized but members of the Academy must be members of the American Medical Association. Some of the ideas are different from the Council.

Dr. Baker: On what subjects?

A. On nutrition and flouridation, advisability of certain types of foods, saturated fats. All ideas are individual. There has been as far as I know no formal criticism, but friction. There is no reason if a man believes a thing he should not stand up for it.

Dr. Combs: Are other non-professional people members of your academy?

A. M. D., D. D. S., Phd, doctors of science.

Dr. Baker: Why did you decide to move from Santa Barbara to Asheville?

A. I moved there 11 years ago. It was a beautiful small town, perfect climate, wonderful place to live. In three years explosive growth started, Federal electronics industry, air base brought in thousands of people, as a desirable place to live it is gone, pollution of the air. I am a country boy at heart. I love the feeling of the hills and space.

Dr. Baker: Do you plan on transferring your journal activities to Asheville?

A. I presume so unless they decide I am too far away. It is tied up with the American Nutrition Association, trying to educate.

Dr. Baker: Are you going to do more nutrition than allergy or you feel they dovetail?

A. They dovetail.

SPECIAL LIMITED LICENSE - APPROVED MEDICAL SCHOOLS _ RESIDENTS

Dr. Doffermyre: You are graduates of approved medical schools, but do not have a license or certificate which this Board can endorse for licensure. You are therefore, appearing before this Board for permission to continue your training within the bounds of North Carolina. In order to meet our state law it is necessary that you make a personal appearance for the purpose of being granted a permit to continue your training. This permit is continued on a yearly basis upon application and recommendation should you continue in North Carolina for training purposes. This permit does not in anyway imply that it can be converted to a full license without further examination; that is our written examination or a written examination from a board which this Board can endorse. This permit does not allow you to apply for narcotic registration to dispense or prescribe drugs. It is for the purpose of training only. Some of you have National Board certificate which according to law we can not recognize as a prerequisite for licensure. Those who are incomplete will be given a reasonable time to complete their credentials.

This special permit does not allow you to prescribe or dispense narcotic drugs within your hospital. Should patients under your care need such medication, it will be necessary for you to rely upon some member of the staff who has license to practice in North Carolina and who has a permit to prescribe and dispense narcotics.

RE: Dr. A. Stark Wolkoff - (See p. 33 these Minutes) - Dr. Wolkoff appeared to petition the Board for an examination in order that he might take up his position at the University of North Carolina School of Medicine as Assistant Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Dr. Wolkoff was advised that the Board had scheduled a special written examination September 28-October 1st, 1959.

RE: Dr. James A. Brown, Cleveland, North Carolina, appeared before the Board on his own volition with no request or charge by the Board. He stated that he had lost his staff privileges at the Rowan General Hospital; that false accusations had been made against him. After being questioned by the Board he stated that he had used some demerol and dilaudid about six years ago, for which he was treated for six weeks at Graylyn. He denied having used anything since that time. The questions were raised as to whether or not his faculties were impaired by medication at the time of his appearance.

The Board suggested to Dr. Brown that he submit urine specimens at intervals under the supervision of Dr. T. G. Thurston in order to clarify any opinion as to his using drugs. Dr. Brown did not appear to wish to co-operate. He was told to think the matter over and report to Dr. Thurston in a week.

VERDICT: Dr. J. B. Anderson moved that the Board request investigation of Dr. James A. Brown by the State Bureau of Investigation. This motion was seconded by Dr. Carl V. Tyner and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. John M. Gambill, Snow Hill, North Carolina (See previous Minutes) Following various reports, Dr. Gambill was requested to appear before the Board at this time. (See file for full interview). He admitted that a warrant had been sworn out for him; that he went to the home of a resident of Snow Hill to get his dog, which he alleged had been stolen; that the facts were misrepresented as to the simple assault charge; that he was advised by his attorney to plead nolo contendere in the court of the justice of peace for convenience, for which he was taxed with the costs of the court. That he was drinking when the incident in Goldsboro occurred; that he paid for damages done by him and no warrant was drawn. He denied the allegation that he was under the influence of anything when he was asked to leave the home of a patient; that members of the patient's family were already made with him about another matter.



Dr. John M. Gambill continued

He said that he had taken no narcotics in a year following treatment for the same at Duke Hospital. He admitted having obtained drugs on the black market after his narcotic license was surrendered in 1955. He said that he was in his office every day; that he took one-half day off on Wednesday during bird season.

VERDICT: Dr. T. G. Thurston moved that Dr. John M. Gambill be asked to see Dr. George A. Silver within the next week or two and bring Dr. Silver up to date on his activities. That he further report to Dr. Silver at regular intervals; that he have Dr. Silver send a summary of his past hospitalization and present findings to the Board. That he will be kept under constant surveillance; that he report to the Board at its January, 1960 meeting. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. L. R. Doffermyre and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. George Frankl, graduate of the University of Vienna in 1922, appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is licensed on the basis of written examination in New York and Missouri. Dr. Frankl stated that he desired to accept the position of director of the Child Guidance Clinic of Forsyth County. The secretary presented a letter from Dr. C. C. Carpenter, Dean of Bowman Gray School of Medicine, and advised that he had also telephoned in regard to Dr. Frankl. Dr. Carpenter stated that the Child Guidance Clinic is one of their teaching units and the professional staff are members of the faculty. That Dr. Frankl was an imminent man in his field and that they had been trying for several years to obtain the services of a qualified Child Psychiatrist.

Dr. Baker: You are a graduate of what medical school?

A. University of Vienna, Austria, 1922.

Q. You came to this country in what year?

A. 1937

Q. What license did you first obtain to practice?

A. New York 1938

Q. You practiced in New York how long?

A. I did not practice in New York. I was in New York State three years later, 1943-46.

Q. You took the written examination of the New York State Board?

A. That is right

Q. Where have you practiced since 1946?

A. I was all the time in Missouri, Kansas City.

Q. You got license in Missouri by endorsement?

A. No, written examination, 1946.

Q. You have been practicing in Kansas City since that time?

A. I am still there.

Q. What is the nature of your practice?

A. I have always been a child psychiatrist. At present I am closely connected with the University of Kansas Medical School in Kansas. I have my office in Missouri, in private practice in child psychiatry, am there approximately two days a week. The rest of the time I am at the University.



Dr. George Frankl continued

Dr. Baker: At the present time you have license in New York, Kansas and Missouri?

A. Not in Kansas

Q. They allow you to go across the border?

A. Yes

Q. Have you taken the examination of the Educational Council for Foreign Medical Graduates?

A. I do not know what that is.

Q. You are going to Winston-Salem?

A. I am considering it seriously.

Q. You have not accepted the offer?

A. No

Q. What is the offer?

A. Director of the Child Guidance Clinic of Forsyth County and the medical school offered me to be professor of Child Psychiatry.

Q. You did come for the purpose of appearing before the Board?

A. Yes

Q. If you accepted the offer at Bowman Gray, when would you wish to begin work?

A. I thought in the fall, October 1st, 1959.

Dr. Tyner: How old are you?

A. 62

Dr. Combs: Your general health has been good?

A. Very good

Dr. Frankl presented naturalization certificate #6117772 dated February 14th, 1944.

VERDICT: The Board voted unanimously that the license by endorsement of credentials be granted Dr. George Frankl, if and when his credentials were completed satisfactory to the secretary.

Dr. Frankl was advised that if he did not accept the above position, the above verdict of the Board would not be in effect.

RE: Certification of Grades on Written Examination - The Board canvassed the grades of the written examination given June 15-18th, 1959.

There were no failures on averages for Part I and the grades were certified.

All applicants made a passing average of 75% or more on Part II of the examination, with the following exceptions, and the grades were certified:

VERDICT: The above physicians will be required to repeat Part II of the written examination in order to obtain license.
