

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS  
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Holiday Inn, Charlotte, North Carolina

July 24-26th, 1969

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Holiday Inn, Charlotte, North Carolina, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and special limited license and for other business.

Thursday, July 24th  
7:00 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner and Drs. Frank Edmondson, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr., Cornelius T. Partrick, and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials and special limited license were reviewed by the members of the Board.

RE: National Board of Medical Examiners - The president, Dr. Frank Edmondson, reported that he and the attorney for the Board were advised by the Attorney General of the State of North Carolina that as per the present law the Board could not accept the certificate of the National Board of Medical Examiners as a basis for license by endorsement.

RE: July, 1970 Meeting - Dr. Joseph W. Hooper moved that this meeting be held at a place to be selected by the president and secretary the latter part of the month to accommodate the results of the Flex examination. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Narcotic Talk - Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the narcotic talk be repeated and that Dr. Bryant L. Galusha make the same. Substitute motion: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. make the narcotic talk for the written examination. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and passed unanimously.

Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the meeting be adjourned, the motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. G. R. C. Thompson, Wilmington, North Carolina - In an investigation by the New Hanover County Sheriff's Department with reference to barbiturates and stimulant drugs violations, it was ascertained that Dr. Thompson had signed blank prescriptions and left with the druggist. (See file on report of New Hanover County Sheriff's Department)- Dr. Thompson was, therefore, requested to appear for an interview.

Dr. Thompson appeared and stated that he thought the drug clerk was honest; that he had tried to take care of elderly patients who lived in the country and it was hard for them to get in. He was advised of the law in handling prescriptions for any drugs and more particularly narcotic drugs. Dr. Thompson when asked if he could adhere to the law under conditions of his practice in Wilmington said that he could and would.

RE: Dr. E. E. Marlowe - Pursuant to report from the Pharmacy Board of excessive number of prescriptions for narcotic drugs being written by Dr. Marlowe in the name of his wife, he was requested to appear at this time. He stated that his wife had migraine headaches which had become worse with postpartum depression; that he had ceased prescribing narcotics for her; that he will procure the professional services of a colleague for his wife; that he realizes that he had used poor judgment. No action was taken by



the Board of Medical Examiners.

RE: Dr. William Murphy Bethune, Jr. - (See previous Minutes) - Dr. Bethune appeared at the request of the Board of Medical Examiners and said that he planned to apply for a position with the Veterans Administration either in or out of the state. The following is the action of the Board:

Upon motion of Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs, it was RESOLVED that the license of William Murphy Bethune, M. D. to practice medicine, which has been heretofore revoked by this Board, be reinstated so long as he shall comply with the following terms and conditions, not to exceed a period of one year from this date, namely:

That he confine his practice to the limits of a hospital or institution approved by this Board, that he refrain from the use of alcohol, narcotics, barbiturates, or other drugs, except upon the prescription of another licensed doctor of medicine, that he violate no State or Federal law, and that he otherwise remain of good behavior.

This resolution was given to Dr. Bethune in the form of an Order of the Board of Medical Examiners.

RE: Dr. Henry Eugene Barnes, Jr. (See previous Minutes) Pursuant to report that Dr. Barnes was on duty in the hospital seeing patients under the influence of drugs, he was requested to appear at this time. He stated he had broken ribs and resorted to the use of narcotic drugs for pain. To summarize he surrendered his narcotic tax stamp in 1962 because of drug addiction and the same was reinstated in June, 1967. He admitted the allegation of seeing patients while taking narcotic drugs.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that Dr. Henry Eugene Barnes, Jr. be requested to voluntarily surrender his narcotic tax stamp, order forms and supplies to the narcotic agent in Greensboro; that he seek and procure psychiatric evaluation and have the psychiatrist report to the Board of Medical Examiners. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed unanimously.

Dr. Barnes was given the verdict of the Board.

RE: Dr. Richard Bland Williams, Jr. appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He stated that he was considering going to Rowan Hospital.

Dr. Partrick: Are you definitely planning to locate in North Carolina?

A. No sir, I have quite a few relatives.

Dr. Edmondson: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No sir

Q. Have you ever had any difficulty with any medical examining board?

A. No sir

Q. Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. No sir

Q. Have you ever used narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No sir,

I have used some barbiturates, I have never used narcotics.

Q. What was the purpose for the barbiturates?

A. I used some in the Navy, I had a heavier load than I should handle, I have not used any since. I took in terms of two either seconal or nembutal. They retired me on temporary disability after 23 years of active service, took it back two years later and wanted to know if I wanted to come back in.

Q. How long since you took any barbiturates?

A. At least five years, I do not take one for anything.

Dr. Hooper: Why have you decided to leave Maryland?

A. There are several reasons, it is not specifically Maryland, is leaving a particular job. Last spring I attempted to resign, but had four months contract, annual contract, it was too late to give notice. This year they cancelled the contract and I found a letter on my desk. I told them it was a meeting of the minds and I would be happy to leave.

Dr. Edmondson: What was the reason for sending you a letter?

A. We have had a continuous battle. They have a strong testing program. It is an unusual condition. The doctors have no control over what the board of trustees does. It has been improved in the last couple of years.



VERDICT: Dr. Richard Bland Williams, Jr. was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, if and when his credentials are completed and he locates in the state for practice, within one year.

RE: Dr. George Douglas Blenkarn was granted special limited license to Duke University School of Medicine in 1967. He is now returning to the Department of Anesthesia at the University of North Carolina School of Medicine and has applied for reinstatement of his special limited license and petitioned to take the written examination. The Board of Medical Examiners approved the request for renewal of special limited license until he can take the written examination in December, 1969.

RE: Flex Examination - Following a discussion, with information from Dr. Frank Edmondson, the Board reached the following conclusion:

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that the Flex Examination be adopted by the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners, the first examination to be given in December, 1969, provided we are definitely assured we will be able to review and have in our possession all failures for a minimum of 30 days. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed unanimously.



Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that upon adoption and giving the Flex Examination that we cease to examine students at the end of the second year in medical school. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.
