

REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL
EXAMINERS - JUNE 15th, 1936 - SIR WALTER HOTEL, Raleigh, N. C.

Call to order by the President, F. Webb Griffith. The following members were present: Drs. Hamilton W. McKay of Charlotte, Dr. James W. Vernon of Morganton, Dr. William H. Smith of Goldsboro, Dr. Roscoe Dr. McMillan of Red Springs, Dr. Ben F. Royal of Morehead City, and Dr. Ben. J. Lawrence, Secretary of Raleigh, N. C.

The minutes of the preceding meeting, December 1935 and of the special meeting at Asheville May 1935 were read and approved. President Griffith stated that he wished to be recorded as voting in the affirmative on the actions taken at the Asheville meeting.

A resolution on the death of Dr. Averitt, drawn by Drs. McKay and Royal was read and ordered recorded.

"RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF DR. K. G. AVERITT, R. F. D. FAYETTEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA, (CEDAR CREEK)

WHEREAS, God in his wise providence has removed from our midst Dr. K. G. Averitt, and

WHEREAS, we are desirous of evincing and permanently recording our great affection, great sense of loss, and our sincere sorrow:

Therefore be it resolved:

FIRST, that the North Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners has lost one of its most beloved and loyal members:

SECOND, that the Medical Profession of North Carolina has lost a practitioner of medicine who up until the time of his death daily studied medicine and devoted the rest of his time to his patients and family:

THIRD, that the sick and suffering have been deprived of a wise and kindly councillor and guide:

FOURTH, that these resolutions be spread on the minutes of the North Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners, copies be sent to the family, and to the City and County papers of the County in which he lived.

Dr. William H. Smith then presented a request from Dr. W. B. Murphy of Snow Hill requesting that we give special consideration to Dr. Philip Breece's application at the July meeting. There was a motion by Dr. Smith and seconded by Dr. Royal that, "We write Dr. Murphy stating to him that we will hear his friend, Dr. Breece, at the July meeting provided he files his application at once". Motion was carried.

The Secretary then presented the list of applicants for consideration of their credentials. The following applicants were granted a license upon the endorsement of their credentials as presented:

Dr. L. L. Parks.

Dr. Smith made a motion which was carried, to the effect that "The Secretary write Dr. Fox calling his attention to the fact that health officers should not assume duty without first obtaining a license to practice medicine in this State". This was seconded by Dr. McMillan and carried. The letter was written.

Dr. William B. Dalton of Baltimore, Md. appeared before the Board and after presenting his credentials, there was a motion made by Dr. McKay and seconded by Dr. Smith that, "We do ask Dr. Dalton to present his application and other credentials completed at some future date". Motion was carried. He was not licensed.

Dr. Lloyd Uber Lumpkin was licensed conditionally upon the presentation of his diploma to Dr. F. Webb Griffith and when the same was inspected and approved, license to be issued. Same was complied with and the license was issued.

Dr. Walter Lawrence McMann, whom the Board requested to appear was not present.

Dr. B. L. T. Woods of Chicago was present and asked for a license in this State. His credentials were incomplete in that he did not have either his M. D. degree or his State License with him. There was a motion by Dr. McMillan and seconded by Dr. Royal and carried to the effect that "We do defer action for the time being on the application of Dr. B.L.T. Woods." The license was not granted.

Dr. Charles C. Carr was present and his credentials were reviewed and found to be deficient. Dr. Carr was therefore denied a license to practice in this State upon a motion by Dr. McMillan and seconded by Dr. Royal and carried.

Dr. Harry E. Wolk of New York, Germany, and Ohio was present and presented his credentials. After they were reviewed and after some discussion as to the merit or the lack of merit of his credentials, there was a motion by Dr. McKay seconded by Drs. Smith and Vernon to the effect that, "The case of Dr. Wolk's application and the facts presented therein, be presented to Dr. William D. Cutter as Secretary of the Council of Medical Education for his opinion". The same was passed six members voting in the affirmative and the Secretary voting in the negative.

At this point the Board recessed for lunch under instructions that, "We reconvene at 2:30 P. M. for the purpose of registering applicants for examination".

The Board registered 130 applicants including those taking the first two years, last two years and all four years and adjourned at 4:30 P. M.
