Minutes of the Open Sessions of the North Carolina Medical Board Meeting July 17-19, 2002.

The July 17-19, 2002, meeting of the North Carolina Medical Board was held at the Board's Office, 1201 Front Street, Suite 100, Raleigh, NC 27609. The meeting was called to order at 8:01 a.m., Wednesday, July 17, 2002, by Walter J. Pories, MD, President. Board members in attendance were: John T. Dees, MD, Vice President; Charles L. MISCELLANEOUS

Presidential Remarks

Dr. Pories commenced the meeting by reading the North Carolina Board of Ethics' ethics awareness and conflict of interest reminder.

Office-Based Procedures – A Presentation by the North Carolina Medical Society

The North Carolina Medical Society presented a document titled "Recommendations of the North Carolina Medical Society Office-Based Procedures Task Force" to the Board.

John Fagg, MD, Immediate Past President of the Medical Society, introduced the presentation in his capacity as president of the Medical Society during formation of the Task Force. He noted this was perhaps the most difficult committee he appointed as President of the Medical Society.

Zane Walsh, Jr., MD, Chair of the Office-Based Procedures Task Force was the next speaker. He recollected the history of the Task Force and how the document presented came about. He then went over five minor changes in the document. He emphasized that throughout development of this document patient benefit and protection were paramount.

Dr. Pories opened the floor for comments by interested parties.

Mary P. Johnson, RN, Executive Director, North Carolina Board of Nursing read aloud a letter to the Medical Board.

H. Arthur McCulloch, MD an Anesthesiologist was on the Task Force. He explained that he works with CRNA's every day. He stated he is proud to do so and respects their dedication and professionalism as well as their training. However, he disagrees with them on the topic of physician supervision of CRNA's and states it is not illegal to require that physicians supervise CRNA's. He assured the Board that this is not a turf war between Anesthesiologists and CRNA's.

Sharon Pearce, CRNA, President, North Carolina Association of Nurse Anesthetists (NCANA), in summary stated that the NCANA and its members support safe anesthesia practices in office facilities and that the standard of anesthesia care is the same no matter who stands at the head of the table and they want the Medical Board to adopt guidelines to ensure patient safety.

Johnny M. Loper, Esquire, attorney for the North Carolina Association of Nurse Anesthetists (NCANA), stated that his comments are directed at a small portion of the Task Force report requiring supervision of CRNA's. No where does it say CRNA's pose a health problem in North Carolina. He noted that the Medical Board would be stepping into a tenuous position for the Board to attempt to restrict the practice of CRNA's because, since 1994, the rules governing CRNA's have allowed them to select and manage general anesthesia. He encouraged the Medical Board to review the Federation of State Medical Board's (FSMB) report titled "The Report of the Special Committee on Outpatient (Office-based) Surgery" prior to making any decision.

Julian D. Bobbitt, Jr., Esquire, attorney for the North Carolina Society of Anesthesiologists, in summary stated that having read these guidelines they are thoroughly and totally in compliance with the Nursing Practice Act and the Medical Practice Act. He argues that the language of these guidelines uses statutory language.

Motion: (SH, RM) A motion passed that this document is referred to the Policy Committee of the Medical Board for further study.

AD HOC COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE

The Ad Hoc Compliance Committee was called to order Thursday, 3:30 p.m., June 20, 2002. Members present: Norins(ch), Gupta, Moffatt. Staff present: Watry, Forward (M. Norins, Recorder)

Charge: President Pories instructed the committee to consider the need for a standing compliance committee to monitor and direct compliance activities of the Board.

The following activities and potential activities were identified as possible areas the might require oversight:

- Consent Order conditions and requirements
- CME documentation by Licensees
- Verifying documentation pertaining to PA's, NP's and CPP's
- Potential activity pertaining to regulations governing Office Based Surgery
- Replacing Informal Interviews with NCPHP contractees
- Other performance issues which the Board may determine from time to time at their discretion

Mr. Watry informed the Committee that as part of an effort to enhance efficiency among the staff that the Compliance department had been created and the Ms. Forward will assume responsibility as the department head. He sees this as an approach to integrating staff functions.

Ms. Forward does not yet have a report on the activities which she will engage, although she states there are approximately 80 Consent Order cases that need follow-up.

Dr. Norins suggested that a compliance committee may be able to work in a proactive and educational fashion to ensure that the rules, regulations and requirements of the Board are enforced in a constructive fashion.

Next Steps:

- Ms. Forward to provide a report on known work tasks for her department, including volume of work.
- Dr. Norins will contact the chairs of Investigation Committee, Complaint Committee, Licensing Committee, PHP Committee, and Policy Committee to solicit their ideas regarding compliance issues
- Mr. Gupta, Drs. Norins and Moffatt will discuss their final impressions and recommendations via e-mail over the next several weeks.
- A report with recommendation will be presented to the Board at the July '02 meeting.

Update and recommendation to the Board:

Dr. Norins reported that the committee recommends not establishing a Compliance Committee although there may be a future need.

Motion: (CG, RM) A motion passed to accept the committee's recommendation.

POLICY COMMITTEE REPORT

Charles Garrett, MD, Chair; Stephen Herring, MD; Aloysius Walsh; Elizabeth Kanof, MD; Michael Norins, MD

The Policy Committee was called to order at 3:41 PM, Wednesday, June 19, 2002, at the office of the Board. Present were: Charles L. Garrett, MD, Chair; Stephen M. Herring, MD; Michael E. Norins, MD; and Aloysius P. Walsh. Also attending were Walter Pories, MD; Andrew W. Watry, Executive Director; Thomas Mansfield, JD, Board Attorney; Melanie Phelps, JD, North Carolina Medical Society; Steve Keene, JD, North Carolina Medical Society; Dale G Breden, Director, Public Affairs (PC Staff); and Jeffery T. Denton, Board Recorder (PC Staff).

Minutes

The April 2002 Policy Committee Meeting minutes were presented for information only, having been approved previously by e-mail.

Alternative Medicine Subcommittee Update (Dr Kanof and Mr Walsh)

The Committee reviewed an analysis by attorneys for the American College for Advancement in Medicine (ACAM) of the recently developed Federation "Model Guidelines for the Use of Complementary and Alternative Therapies in Medical Practice." Dr Garrett noted the analysis makes clear that ACAM, probably an alternative medicine proponent, does not approve the Model Guidelines and thinks states should not adopt the document because "all kinds of problems will come of it."

Mr Walsh added that at the recent Federation Meeting in California it was brought home to the Federation that there were major concerns about the Model Guidelines proposal. He noted the Presidential Commission's statement is also now available and has aroused concern because it is viewed by some as too vague and too pro-CAM.

By consensus, the Committee will not deal with the issue of the Federation' Model Guidelines again unless specifically asked to do so by the Federation.

Recommendation to Board: Accept ACAM letter and analysis as Information.

Purchased Laboratory Tests (Dr Garrett and Mr Mansfield)

Dr Keith Nance previously wrote the Board requesting a review of the Board's fee splitting policy that endorses the AMA Code of Medical Ethics Opinion. He believes the current practice arrangements between physicians and laboratories are at odds with the Board's policy. At the February Policy Committee meeting, Mr Mansfield and Dr Garrett were asked to work with the Medical Society and the information at hand, including the AMA ethics opinions, in an attempt to address this issue in a policy statement.

The Medical Society has now looked at this issue and come to the same conclusion as the Medical Board: this is not fee splitting, but there are concerns that this practice may be in violation of the AMA's Code of Ethics. This should be addressed directly with the AMA Council on Ethical and Judicial Affairs.

The following motion, proposed by the Committee, passed at the full Board Meeting on June 20, 2002, Board Meeting.

Motion Approved: That the Medical Board and Medical Society's attorneys will jointly seek a private opinion from the AMA Council on Ethical and Judicial Affairs describing this particular case and ask them if this is in violation of medical ethics.

Guidelines for Avoiding Misunderstandings During Physical Examinations – Position Statement Review

At the May 17 Board meeting, revisions to this position statement were again discussed without resolution. At this point, the Board President appointed an ad hoc committee consisting of Dr Kanof (Chair), Ms Hunter-Buskey, and Dr Fretwell to present a proposal to

the Board via the Policy Committee. Dr Garrett requested that the proposal be given to the Policy Committee at least 10 days prior to the next regularly scheduled Policy Committee meeting.

The ad hoc committee's draft was prepared and distributed, but Dr Kanof was not available to present it during the June Policy Committee meeting.

Action: Action on this item is deferred until the August Committee meeting, when Dr Kanof will be in attendance.

Writing of Prescriptions – Position Statement Review

Mr Mansfield presented a revised *Writing of Prescriptions* Position Statement for the Committee's consideration. He explained in detail the changes which have been added. There was a brief discussion and minor additional changes made by the Committee.

Recommendation to Board: The Policy Committee recommends that the following revised Position Statement be adopted by the Board:

Motion: A motion passed to adopt the following revised Position Statement.

NCMB Position Statement--PROPOSED REVISION

WRITING OF PRESCRIPTIONS

- It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that prescriptions ~~for controlled substances or mind-altering chemicals~~ should be written in ink or indelible pencil or typewritten or electronically printed and should be manually signed by the practitioner at the time of issuance. Quantities should be indicated in both numbers AND words, eg, 30 (thirty). Such prescriptions must not be written on presigned prescription blanks.
- Each prescription for a DEA controlled substance (2, 2N, 3, 3N, 4, and 5) should be written on a separate prescription blank. Multiple medications may appear on a single prescription blank **only** when none are DEA-controlled.
- No prescriptions, ~~including those for controlled substances or mind-altering chemicals,~~ should be issued for a patient in the absence of a documented physician-patient relationship.
- No prescription ~~for controlled substances or mind-altering chemicals~~ should be issued by a practitioner for his or her personal use. (See Position Statement entitled "Self-Treatment and Treatment of Family Members and Others with Whom Significant Emotional Relationships Exist.")
- The practice of pre-signing prescriptions is unacceptable to the Board.
- It is the responsibility of those who prescribe controlled substances to fully comply with applicable federal and state laws and regulations. Links to these laws and regulations may be found on the Board's Web site (www.ncmedboard.org).
- ~~A physician who prescribes controlled substances should pay particular attention to the part of the Code of Federal Regulations dealing with prescriptions, which may be found at 21 CFR 1306, entitled "Prescriptions."~~

Health Care Safety Net Improvement Act (Federation of State Medical Boards item)

The following cover letter was received from the Federation: "The Health Care Safety Net Improvement Act (HR 3450) may be considered in the U.S. House of Representatives later this spring. This legislation would establish a grant program for state medical boards to develop programs to reduce regulatory barriers relating to telemedicine. Attached are a memo from Dr James Thompson regarding HR 3450 and a sample support letter that could be used by your Board in contacting House members from your state."

It was noted that Mr Mansfield and Mr Keene have not yet reviewed the request for letters endorsing HR 3450. Mr Keene stated that the extent to which practitioners may support this may be limited depending on which barriers are being addressed. He continued that one

could probably characterize North Carolina law as being very conducive to telemedicine inside its borders but not conducive outside its borders. He believes there may be some concern about this.

Mr Breaden stated that there would also be serious concern regarding acceptance of federal funding of any kind for any purpose in view of the regulatory baggage it inevitably brings. This is the traditional opening of the door to federal control.

Dr Garrett stated he is not sure what the position of the licensees of this state will be, since they put up the barriers in the first place, and does not know what barriers they would be willing to break down.

Mr Keene agreed with Mr Breaden about taking money from the federal government to do anything. He thinks the Federation should be concerned about getting involved to this degree with the federal government. He stated the Supreme Court has ruled over and over again that the federal government can do anything it wants as a precondition to dispensing money.

Mr Watry commented that the Federation did consider this and is trying to quell any federal efforts that step on the licensing process. He added that there is a significant telemedicine lobby pushing legislation that usurps state law and that the perceived barriers are licensing statutes. He said that the Federation thinks this refocuses the efforts back to the state boards, allowing adjustments for individual licensing packages.

Mr. Walsh indicated that in this document reference is made repeatedly to mechanisms to mitigate regulatory barriers that inhibit telemedicine.

Recommendation to Board: The Policy Committee recommends not sending a letter to our Congressional delegation supporting HR 3450.

Motion: A motion passed to not send a letter to our Congressional delegation supporting HR 3450.

Visiting Teaching Physicians – A Request From Murray K. Seidel, MD

The Board recently received a request from Dr Seidel (New Hanover Regional Medical Center) for the Board to address the issue of visiting teaching physicians being required to have a North Carolina medical license prior to scrubbing and being allowed at the operating room table. His request also included an opinion from the hospital's attorney as to why they could not allow a visiting teaching physician at the operating room table without a North Carolina license.

Mr Watry responded to Dr Seidel's letter, indicating that their attorney's advice seemed sound and well reasoned

Dr Garrett stated the the research presented by their attorney lays it out completely.

Recommendation to Board: Accept as Information.

Trichomonal Vaginitis and Prescribing to the Partner Without an Examination

The Board recently received a request from Neal A. Adkins, MD, requesting an interpretation of the Board's position "that prescribing drugs to an individual the prescriber has not personally examined is inappropriate except as noted in the paragraph below. . . ." Dr Adkins indicates the examples given did not cover the following situation: when trichomonal vaginitis is diagnosed in a female patient the partner is usually also offered treatment, generally Flagyl, 2 grams, one day only. Dr Adkins wants to know if this is "now considered inappropriate." In his experience, many of these partners have no established health care provider and, therefore, will go untreated.

Dr Garrett noted that the Board's position statement, in fact, the standard of care in North Carolina and includes the physician creating a record of the partner's name and what was dispensed.

Dr Norins stated he tells the female that the partner has to see their own physician or go to an STD clinic. He believes the partner needs to be seen, treated, counseled about the medication, and counseled about STD's. He recommends not making an exception to this standard of care.

Mr Watry provided a draft response to Dr Adkins request indicating essentially that "if the above practice is the standard of care within North Carolina for the practice of Ob-Gyn, then this does not present a problem," and "if, on the other hand, such practice is below the standard of care for your colleagues, it would present a problem."

Recommendation to Board: Send Mr Watry's letter as is.

Computer Generated Prescriptions (CGP)

At the May committee meeting, Dr Herring stated "if no one has any objections, I am going to start using CGPs." His intention is to start this month. Dr Garrett discussed CGPs and pointed out they are in wide use in North Carolina, and that he could find nothing against doing it. Ms Hunter-Buskey cautioned the Board specifically that in her experience these types of prescription are easier to copy.

Dr Garrett stated that we know hospitals do it, emergency rooms do it, yet the Board does not have a policy on it.

Dr Pories noted it is being done electronically via e-mail and electronic signatures.

Mr Watry said that the Medical Board is not the final authority on prescription scripts, the Pharmacy Board is. Apparently, this is acceptable around the state and if the Pharmacy Board should say there is a problem, the Medical Board can revisit this issue.

Recommendation to Board: Accept as Information.

System Failure (Dr Herring)

Dr Herring is exploring this with the Head of Clinical Quality Insurance at Dartmouth. He requested the Medical Board, the Medical Society, and the insurance companies work together on this as a joint venture.

Dr Herring now requests this item be removed from the agenda at this time.

Alternative Medical Malpractice Payment Systems

Dr Garrett stated that the Legal Department is looking into alternative medical malpractice payment systems that allow the organization the physician works for to make malpractice settlement payments without reporting these payments to the Medical Board as would normally be requested by NCGS § 90-14.13.

Mr Keene indicated he read in the Federal Register about two weeks ago of a proposed rule making that will close this particular loophole (if done by an organization for a physician, the name of the affected practitioner still has to be reported).

Action: This item will remain on the agenda until such rule making occurs. Mr Breaden was asked to retrieve this from the Federal Register and Mr Keene offered to make a copy of the material available to Mr Breaden.

Policy Committee Oversight

Dr. Garrett stated that he plans to have the Legal Department review all of the Policy Committee items.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:42 PM, Wednesday, June 20, 2002.

Motion: A motion passed to accept the Policy Committee Report as corrected.

Motion: A motion passed to approve the Executive Committee Nomination Report as presented to the Board; the following Board Members were elected for the noted positions for 2003: President, John Dees, MD; President Elect, Charles Garrett, MD; Secretary, Stephen Herring, MD; and Treasurer, Hari Gupta. (Dr. Barrett voted via telephone conference call.)

June Report

The Executive Committee meeting was held on Thursday, June 20, 2002, at 7:30 am and was called to order by Walter J. Pories, MD, and President. Board members in attendance were: John T. Dees, MD, Vice President; Charles L. Garrett, MD, Secretary/Treasurer. Absent was Elizabeth P. Kanof, MD. Staff in attendance were Mr. Watry and Ms. Meelheim.

Financials

The April 2002 financials were reviewed in detail, discussed and accepted.

Budget 2003

Dr. Pories asked that the Board members in attendance consider the proposed budgets titled 2% and 5% pay raises without expansion. Dr. Garrett moved that the proposal titled 2% pay increases be approved, in light of the current fiscal situation faced by all licensees and the state. Dr. Dees seconded and all three Board members voted to support the motion. Discussion followed regarding the HR proposed position. The committee instructed staff to research the possibility of out sourcing this function and communicate with Dr. Pories regarding the findings before the next meeting. If it appears that this may offer a viable solution for the Medical Board, a decision may be postponed until the July committee meeting. If this is not a viable option then Mr. Watry will, after consultation with the president, proceed with hiring an individual from the staff. Dr. Garrett made it clear that he would expect the staff to do this for \$5000 and that staff would not ask for another position to replace the staff member given the new duties.

Personnel

Dr. Pories reported on the interviews conducted on the 18th for the new position of part time physician. Dr. Dees and Garrett expressed that they were comfortable with Dr. Pories', Townsend's and Mr. Watry's recommendations and would support the individual selected by this committee. They asked for assurance that the proposed salary was included in the 2003 budget and when given asked that staff make the offer. No provisions were discussed regarding the remainder of fiscal 2002 and funding.

A copy of the committee approved budget with detail is included for review of the Board.

Investments

The committee was informed that the expected CD rate for 90 days will be around 2%. The committee will be informed when the exact rate is known. The committee will interview individuals on the Tuesday before the August board meeting regarding the opportunities for long term investments.

Space and floor plans

The committee reviewed and accepted as information the proposed floor plans for adding the additional staff members at the 1201/1203 Front Street location. .

PHP

The financial information provided by PHP was reviewed. The audit will be available for the NCMB review in August 2002, after the finance committee of PHP has reviewed and approved in July 2002.

Statistical Report

The committee accepted the information presented. Some discussion followed regarding the appearance of no growth in the licensed population for North Carolina.

New Business

Dr. Dees asked for an accounting of the cost of preparing and mailing Board materials now as compared to five years ago (before the electronic board book.) This information was reviewed and a significant reduction in cost was noted. Dr. Garrett asked if there were a way to decrease the cost of mailing clippings.

Dr. Garrett reported on a meeting at his office with Mr. Watry and Ms. Meelheim. The committee was informed that the process review suggested by Dr. Anderson is beginning in the investigative department and may take some time to complete. The committee will be informed of the progress. This process review will not necessitate delays in improvements that have been noted by departmental directors or the ED.
