Minutes of the Open Sessions of the North Carolina Medical Board Meeting June 21 and 22, 2001.

The June 21 and 22, 2001, meeting of the North Carolina Medical Board was held at the Board's Office, 1201 Front Street, Suite 100, Raleigh, NC 27609. ## **MISCELLANEOUS**

### **Presidential Remarks**

Dr. Kanof commenced the meeting by reading the North Carolina Board of Ethics' "ethics awareness and conflict of interest reminder." Dr. Kanof relayed several topics of discussion at the recent AMA meeting.

### **Board Telephone Conference Meeting of May 23, 2001**

It was noted that as a result of the Medical Board telephone conference meeting on May 23, 2001, the Medical Society will put together a task force which will explore and recommend rules for office based surgery. Although composition of the task force has not been finalized Dr. Herring and Mr. Walsh have been nominated to represent the Medical Board.

### **Annual Physician Assistant Conference in California**

Ms. Hunter-Buskey attended the Annual PA Conference held in California this year and gave an overview to the Board. Two of the issues she relayed to the Board were: (1) PA immigration status – there is a visa category which foreign MD graduates can apply for which

has certain loophole language in some states that may let an unqualified candidate in the United States. (2) CME documentation requires some clarification as to when the period starts and ends.

## **POLICY COMMITTEE REPORT**

### **Policy Committee Meeting of May 17, 2001**

The Policy Committee was called to order at 5:00 p.m., Thursday, May 17, 2001, at the office of the Board. Present were: John W. Foust, MD, Chair; Stephen M. Herring, MD; Elizabeth P. Kanof, MD; Walter J. Pories, MD; Aloysius P. Walsh; George C. Barrett, MD; John T. Dees, MD; Andrew W. Watry, Executive Director; H. #### **Office Based Surgery**

Dr. Foust began this meeting by stating that a position statement has been developed, a survey is going out with Medical Care Commission's (MCC) concurrence, that positive steps are being taken, and that a number of states are taking similar steps, but there remains the question of guidelines.

Mr. Watry said that standards are being reviewed, the survey has been put together and the staff have met with the contractor/vender for the next batch of registrants. The hope is to get data in Board Members' hands quickly. This should give us a good idea of what is going on in the state. We will need to coordinate with the North Carolina Medical Society and others to survey options of what we want to do in the way of regulatory response, precluding legislation. Mr. Watry also noted he had had an informal discussion with Mr. Jenkins, CEO of Medical Mutual, about the prospect of mandating requirements. If we define what constitutes anesthesia in the outpatient surgery setting and if we determine what the minimum standards be, would the prospect of liability coverage in the amount of \$5,000,000 to \$6,000,000 provide a significant impact? If safeguards are not in place and standards met, the physician could not get coverage. Mr. Watry stated that this was just an idea that might be worth considering, he was not advocating it. One way would be for the Board to define the standards, and Medical Mutual decide to cover anyone based on those standards.

Dr. Pories stated the Board has done something important – it has agreed that this is important role for the Board, but now the Board needs to decide what the standards are (and should be) and how to enforce them.

Dr. Kanof gave words of appreciation to the hard work the Committee has done and how quickly and expeditiously Ms. Meelheim and Ms. Phelps prepared the survey. She does not think the Board needs to wait for the results of the survey to start the second step. If the standards are out there from the Dental Board and other states then she would like to start working up the rules and regulations and not wait for the results. She does not want to eliminate the Board from undertaking the inspection process until we have had a thorough review of what agencies are out there to inspect and enforce. We agree that the Medical Board does not have the personnel, expertise, experience, or funding to carry out the inspection process. All would have to be provided for by statutory change. She is not advocating the Medical Board buy into it, only study it.

Mr. Keene stated that the Board would be correct to collect 2-3 months of information from the survey and that it would be a mistake to disregard the survey information.

Dr. Herring stated that he believes he has enough information to reach a conclusion but does need to consider direct Board involvement. He wants to give a preliminary report in June consisting of a summary of what is out there, the shortcomings, limitations, options, etc.

Mr. Keene stated that MCC is very interested in what the Medical Board is doing in this area. They would like to work with the Board, not react to what the Board does. They will attempt to define what a "limited, incidental ambulatory surgical procedure" is. When they do, that has the potential to leave some procedure to fall through the cracks. It all has to come together in the end and one way to make sure that happens is to include the MCC in each step of the process. The MCC is very interested in what the survey yields. Mr. Keene conveyed that the MCC wants to be included in all steps the Board takes (preliminary guidelines, work products, etc.). Ms. Phelps added that Mr. Bob Fitzgerald has been involved in all of this thus far.

Dr. Barrett stated that the committee might find it useful to know that the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) has a special committee in charge of developing a model for all state boards on office-based surgery. The goal is to have a recommendation before the House of Delegates by April 2002. They are probably not as far ahead as we are based on experience but may be a little ahead based on what has been done in other states. Dr. Barrett believes it would be useful if this committee and the FSMB track each other and get good feedback. Liaison could be easily established with Mr. Watry, Ms. Meelheim and/or Dr. Barrett for this purpose. It would best that several models not be floating around. Better, he believes, to have a uniform model.

Mr. Watry concurred that we can easily track with the FSMB and can invite Bob Fitzgerald to come to all open meetings. It was noted that Mr. Fitzgerald is head of Facility Services now.

Ms. Meelheim interjected that she has just recently talked to all of the state execs for the second time regarding anesthesia and has a pretty good handle on what is going on in the other states.

Dr. Foust suspects the MCC has forces pushing them that are not the same as ours. This being a monetary issue, he wonders how much they are being pushed to do something about office-based surgeries.

Mr. Keene tends to think money is partly behind it.

Dr. Foust emphasized that the Board's primary responsibility is the welfare of patients, not physicians, and he was motivated to call this meeting to see where the Board needs to go.

Ms. Meelheim is not sure the Board has the statutory authority to make any rules regarding office based surgery.

Dr. Pories suggested that for the next meeting of the Policy Committee we invite representatives from the MCC to hear what they have to say.

Mr. Keene suggested that someone talk informally with the MCC to say we are going to put together a presentation and want them to attend. The Board could sketch an outline of

where the Board is going with this. At the last meeting with the MCC they just wanted the Board to define "limited, incidental" and now circumstances require a more comprehensive approach. It may mean that the MCC will ultimately define what a limited care facility is.

Dr. Pories stated he was uncomfortable with that and thinks the Board is "walking into gun fire" if we make a presentation prior to finding out the MCC's thoughts and concerns.

Dr. Herring stated we should work on this as hard as we can and as much as we can. He stated that the nurse anesthetists have been calling him almost daily with their concerns and want to be in on any meetings about this subject.

Ms. Meelheim reminded all concerned that if there is any individual or group that desires to be notified of a Board meeting concerning any specific topic, she needs to be notified in order to make that happen.

Motion: (EK, SH) That the Policy Subcommittee develop a preliminary report regarding the rules and regulations for office-based surgery in North Carolina and that the Chair call the MCC and indicate the Board would like to meet with them in June to discuss the report at that time. Motion failed.

Motion: (WP, AW) That a meeting be called and the Board act as a hearing body to address questions and issues from others allowing each outside group or individual five minutes. Then the Board should consider its next step.

Motion: (EK, WP) That the above motion be tabled until the June meeting. Motion passed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:15 p.m., Thursday, May 17, 2001.

#### **Minutes**

The minutes of the April and May 2001 meetings were reviewed and approved.

#### **Scope of Practice Committee (Drs Herring and Pories)**

No report.

#### **Alternative Medicine Subcommittee Update (Dr Kanof and Mr Walsh)**

Mr. Walsh reported on a meeting in Washington, DC, in May. He noted that most of the comment related to the need for further research.

### **Microdermabrasion – A Presentation by Dr. Robert Clark, Cary Skin Center**

Dr. Clark gave a slide presentation and answered questions. He explained that Microdermabrasion (MDA) is a type of resurfacing procedure performed on an outpatient without anesthesia. His practice is involved in MDA. All procedures in his office are performed by licensed aestheticians who have been trained in the technique. He is the medical director of the Cary Skin Center and has no financial investment in any of the companies that sell the equipment. He discussed various skin smoothing strategies. He said MDA can be performed by a non-physician and is a non-surgical, mildly abrasive technique designed to remove upper layers of epidermis. A vacuum-generated stream of aluminum oxide crystals smoothes the skin surface. This is only mildly uncomfortable and requires no anesthesia. He also covered: who is a candidate for MDA, how is MDA performed, what to expect after MDA, and what are the risks of MDA.

He stated that MDA is a very popular procedure that is done in many offices, not just dermatology. It is almost never performed by a physician. It is also being done in nail salons and hair salons. Studies are just beginning to be done about the affects on the dermis.

In discussion, Dr. Pories explained that his concern is who and who cannot do it and what degree of supervision is used. Once we say this is not surgery, then the barber down the street can do it. Dr. Pories stated that he believes MDA is surgery because the dermis can be infected and bleeding can occur. MDA should be administered under a physician's supervision.

**Motion:** (WP, SH) MDA is surgery.

Dr. Kanof spoke against the motion. She thinks Dr. Clark's presentation made clear that MDA is not surgery.

Mr. Walsh stated that, from what has been presented, he does not feel comfortable with the Board saying MDA is or is not surgery. He would like to have some more time to consider the material.

**Motion:** (AW, HH) To table the above motion till the next Policy Committee Meeting.  
**ADOPTED.**

### **Writing Prescriptions – Position Statement Review (Mr Watry)**

The committee reviewed input from Mr. Work of the Pharmacy Board on possible revision to the Writing Prescriptions Position Statement.

**Action:** Staff is asked to go back to the Pharmacy Board with a look towards a joint position statement that will also cover electronic signatures, email prescriptions, faxed prescriptions, etc.

### **Development of Guidelines for Problem Physicians**

At the April 2001 Policy Committee Meeting, it was decided that a workgroup consisting of Dr. Herring, Mr. Walsh, Ms. Hunter-Buskey, Mr. Watry, Drs. Townsend, Wilkerson, and Pendergast, and Mr. Mansfield would be assembled to discuss development of these guidelines, and Dr. Charles Trado will be invited to participate. Dr. Herring would be chair. (Mr. Watry would notify Dr. Trado.)

Dr. Herring now states that he does not think there is a consensus that the Board wants to be consistent in the management of cases but would prefer to look at all cases individually regardless of how a similar instance had been handled in the past.

Dr. Pories stated that if the concept is to have repository of data, he applauds it. Dr. Barrett echoed that a repository of past actions would be a valuable tool and that the Board should avoid “foolish” consistency.

Ms. Meelheim said a potential solution is in place with the current data system, now in process of being further developed. This concept is being incorporated into the whole package to track what types of cases and what types of outcomes occurred. This is currently being tested for the Legal and Investigative Departments. In a year and a half, all the data will be there.

Mr Breaden pointed out that concise summaries of Board actions have been prepared and printed regularly since 1996 in the reports of the Public Affairs Department and in the Forum, facilitating any review of past actions.

**Action:** Within the next two weeks, staff will provide Dr. Herring with data on physicians who have had Board actions taken against them following felony convictions during the past five years. Dr. Herring will have a rough guideline to present at the August Policy Committee meeting.

#### **Malpractice Settlements; Reporting Issues**

In February 2001, a complaint and review of malpractice information associated with that complaint revealed that Duke had set up a series of limited liability partnerships and corporations with generic names. They then made settlements in the name of these generic partnerships and corporations, thus skirting the need to report individual physicians under the state statute or to the NPDB. Mr. Watry was asked to research this further and check with other North Carolina medical schools. There is concern that every insurance company in the State is not reporting these malpractice cases as they should. The Board is not getting a full report.

**Action:** Staff will compile information from the Insurance Commission and also request an opinion from the Office of the HHS Inspector General. The responses will be examined to gain a clearer view of the potential problem programs such as that at Duke present.

#### **Possible Fee Splitting by Commercial Laboratories; a letter from Dr. Keith Nance**

The Board received a letter from Dr. Keith Nance stating that some physicians who contract with commercial laboratories for anatomic pathology consultations arrange for the lab to charge on a per specimen basis at a cost significantly less than that laboratory's typical billing rate. Then the referring physician bills the patient and/or the patient's insurance company at the higher, “usual and customary” rate for the pathologic interpretation of these specimens. He states that this practice appears to be at odds with the Medical Board's policy on fee splitting.

Mr. Keene stated that he feels the practice of marking up purchased diagnostic tests is probably common in all states. He thinks it is a business issue vs a medical practice issue. Mr. Walsh sees this markup fee as minimal. If it were double or triple the fee, however, it would be gouging. He added that the federal government will acknowledge modest markup (labor from staff, etc.).

**Action:** Mr. Watry will respond to Dr Nance with a noncommittal letter, suggesting

the Board prefers to deal with specific case issues arising from particular complaints.

### **System Error Prevention**

Dr. Herring asked if the Board wants to get involved in developing a system for error prevention for hospitals in the State? Dr. Kanof stated that this is a national issue and should probably be handled by a national organization (Institute of Medicine, AMA, National Patient Safety Foundation, etc.)

**Action:** The Medical Board should not get involved with this at this time.

### **Electronic Documentation of CME**

Mr. Watry noted that an agreement had been reached with the Medical Society on this issue.

**Action:** Guidelines concerning electronic documentation of CME will be published in the *Forum* and the Web site.

### **Motion Tabled in May for the June Meeting**

The motion relating to calling an advisory meeting on office-based surgery, tabled at the May meeting, was considered. It was noted that the original motion was no longer applicable due to decisions made by the Board on May 23, 2001.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:15 p.m., Thursday, June 21, 2001.

## **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT**

Chairman, Liz Kanof, MD, President; called the Executive Committee of the North Carolina Medical Board to order at 8:30 am, June 22, 2001. Members in attendance were Paul Saperstein, Walter J. ### **Financial**

May financials were discussed in detail. Mr. Saperstein noted that the budget is balanced. Mr. Saperstein announced that a financial evaluation of PHP has been requested.

### **Statistics**

Online registration is up to 69%. The number of instate licensees as of the end of May 2001 is 20,000 MD/DO's; 2,235 NP's; 2926 PA's; and there are 7,723 licensees outside our borders. It is projected that by the end of the year the Board will have 29,000 total licensees.

### **Personnel**

Dain Mickalites, a Licensing Assistant, has resigned. Interviews to fill the position are ongoing.

**New Business**

Dr. Pories noted that Dr. Willis has resigned as Director of the ECU Assessment Program. Dr. Pories believes the program has been a failure due to it being too expensive, assessments take too long to set up and the answers that were forthcoming were not particularly useful. He asked the board if there was any priority to revive the program. Dr. Barrett reminded the Board that on a national basis once PLAS in Colorado has reached its capacity, the ECU program was next in line to receive candidates. He stated that if the ECU assessment program closes the NBME will have to be notified so they can designate another program to replace it. The consensus is to “wait and see what happens at the ECU program.”
