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MINUTES

Charles H. Duckett, M.D., President of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina called this meeting to order at 8:45 p.m., at the Sheraton Imperial, Research Triangle Park, North Carolina.

The Board members present at this meeting included: John T. Daniel, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer; Eben Alexander, Jr., M.D.; Harold L. Godwin, M.D.; Simmons Patterson, Jr., M.D., and Mrs. Martha Walston.

Staff members present included: Bryant D. Paris, Jr.; Don Pittman; William H. Breeze, Jr.; Robbie Broyles; Kathy Burke; and Sibyl Lamoreaux.

MOHR, JACK, M.D., Chapel Hill, North Carolina

On March 15, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board prepare a Certified, Registered letter for Dr. Mohr informing this physician, as the Board of Medical Examiners requested him to attend its March, 1987, meeting; and, as he failed to appear as scheduled, the Board now requests Dr. Mohr to surrender voluntarily his DEA prescribing privileges in Schedules 2, 2N, 3, and 3N.

ANORECTIC PRESCRIBING

On March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board request from the Internal Medicine Section of the North Carolina Medical Society an opinion on use of anorectics in weight control, in order that the Board of Medical Examiners may obtain specific answers to the following questions:

1. Is prescribing anorectics for weight control justifiable for any period of time?
2. Is prescribing anorectics for weight control justifiable on a short-term basis; and, if so, for what period of time?
3. Is prescribing anorectics for weight control justifiable on

a long-term basis; and, if so, for what period of time?

On March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board's Executive Secretary call and write requesting the Internal Medical Section of the North Carolina Medical Society to provide the Board with answers to these questions as well as data supporting its answers as soon as possible; and that he present a report to the Board members on the Internal Medical Section's opinion on anorectic prescribing for weight control.

FARAHANY, Hossein, M.D.

In accordance with the probationary conditions placed upon the suspension of the revocation on the medical license of Hossein Farahany, M.D., on March 12, 1987, Dr. Farahany appeared as requested for an interview. Dr. Duckett informed this physician that the probationary conditions placed on his licensure end in April, 1987.

On March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board write to the Administrators and Chiefs of Staff at Mercy Hospital, Presbyterian Hospital, Charlotte Memorial Hospital (should Dr. Farahany request the Board to do so), and to their counterparts at any other hospitals where Dr. Farahany chooses to practice informing them the Board of Medical Examiners has removed the probationary conditions placed on Dr. Farahany's licensure five years ago and further advising them this physician's hospital privileges are now the responsibility of the hospitals where he practices.

The Board also recommended to Dr. Farahany that, if he chooses to enlarge his present non-invasive Cardiology practice, he renew his skills through educational means.

TAYLOR, STANLEY DOUGLAS, M.D., San Bernardino, California

On March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board offer Dr. Taylor the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order agreeing to abide by the same conditions imposed upon his licensure in the state of California and that this Consent Order contain an addition stipulation requiring Dr. Taylor, prior to engaging in the practice of medicine in this state, to notify the Board of

Medical Examiners so that it may schedule him to appear for an interview.

CREED, GEORGE OTIS, M.D., Laurinburg, North Carolina

After reviewing information indicating that Dr. Creed has suffered a stroke in addition to problems with cancer and has retired from medical practice, on March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept this report as information; and that, if the Board determines that Dr. Creed has not retired from the practice of medicine, it consider requesting him to appear before the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina and to surrender voluntarily all DEA prescribing privileges.

MINUTES OF THE JANUARY, 1987, MEETING

On March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board approve these Minutes with a correction in the action regarding Joseph Citron, M.D.

BERRIOS, OSWALD, M.D., Carolina Beach, North Carolina

On March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board prefer charges against Dr. Berrios on the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (a)(11), citing inadequate records and failure to prove competency by passing the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX).

BUNN, DAVID GLENN, M.D., Whiteville, North Carolina

On March 12, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board accept as information a report from Dr. Clark concerning Dr. Bunn.

BRANLY, LOUIS PHILLIP, M.D., Goldsboro, North Carolina

On March 12, 1987, as requested by the Board of Medical Examiners, Dr. Branly appeared for an interview.

At the conclusion of this interview, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board approve Dr. Branly for a two year dated license; that it limit this license to the practice of Psychiatry; that it advise Dr. Branly to provide the Board with a report from Dr. Shaw within six months; and that it further advise Dr. Branly to notify the Board of Medical Examiners should he change his practice location.

ROBERTS, JANIFER C., M.D., Lumberton, North Carolina

On March 12, 1987, as requested by the Board of Medical Examiners, Dr. Roberts appeared for an informal interview. Dr. Daniel congratulated her on complying with the instructions of the Board of Medical Examiners.

At the conclusion of this interview, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board approve Dr. Roberts' dated licensure for one year; that it advise her to consult her Internist on a regular basis as he may deem necessary; and that the Board also request Dr. Roberts to appear for an interview prior to the expiration of this dated license.

ALESSI, JOSEPH FRANCIS, M.D., Swansboro, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board prefer charges against Dr. Alessi on the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (a)(6).

BEST, ANDREW ARTHUR, M.D., Greenville, North Carolina

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board requests him to surrender voluntarily his Schedule 2 and 2N prescribing privileges.

KHATRI, SAT DEV, M.D., Asheville, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board write a letter to Dr. Khatri stating the Board of Medical Examiners is pleased he passed FLEX, will review several of his patient records in accordance with the conditions of the Consent Order, and will consider his request

of March 10, 1987, at a later date.
 On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board instruct a member of its staff to subpoena ten patient records from Dr. Khatri for the Board of Medical Examiners' review by its August, 1987, meeting.

**Although the Board approved this application, it did not approve Dr. Mintzer's request for five day chart review and countersignature, and instructed the staff to inform this physician that the Board will allow a maximum of seventy-two hours with three days on weekends between chart entries made by the physician assistant and countersignature by a supervising physician.

The Board approved all actions processed administratively.

VENABLE, ROBERT STEPHEN, M.D., Fayetteville, Arkansas

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board extend Dr. Venable's temporary license through the June, 1987, meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners and that the Board request Dr. Venable to appear for an interview at the June, 1987, meeting.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Fred Glass, M.D., Medical Director, Office of Emergency Medical Services, and Assistant Chief of the Educational Component of the Office of Emergency Medical Services, Ed Browning, met with the Board of Medical Examiners at 9:30 a.m. on Friday, March 13, 1987.

The representatives of the Office of Emergency Medical Services and the members of the Board of Medical Examiners discussed several subjects of mutual concern.

Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic Drug Formulary

The Board recommended that EMS divide this Formulary into Optional and Mandatory categories; that it change Sodium Bicarbonate to an optional drug to be chosen by a Medical Director who will then train personnel to his satisfaction in the use of this drug; that it change Calcium Chloride to an optional drug; that it add Ipecac 60 cc or nitroglycerin sublingual spray to the mandatory drugs; that it change Interhospital Transfer Drugs Ancef I.V. and Mefoxin I.V. to

antibiotics I.V. started in a hospital setting; and, finally, that EMS complete more research on Thiamine (Intramuscular Only), Amyl Nitrite Pearls, Sodium Thiosulfate, and Sodium Nitrite, to include the number of Cyanide poison cases taken to the hospital, as well as further research on NaCl Injection 30 mg, and present a follow-up report to the Board.

Emergency Medical Technician-Advanced Intermediate Drug
Formulary

The Board of Medical Examiners recommended to the Office of Emergency Services that it divide this Formulary into Optional and Mandatory categories.

Bee Sting Statistics

The representatives of the Office of Emergency Medical Services reported that this organization does not know how many lives have been saved by the implementation of House Bill 1233 and that it is extremely difficult to determine either the long or short-term benefits of this legislation. The Board recommended that, after a discussion between the Board of Medical Examiners, represented by Dr. Daniel and Dr. Citron; the North Carolina Medical Society; and the Office of EMS; Bee Sting Statistics and Legislation be a future Agenda Item to be considered and discussed by the Board of Medical Examiners.

Dr. Duckett recommended some form of reporting mechanism for Bee Sting statistics, and Mr. Paris suggested adding to the current Bee Sting Recertification Form the following questions:

1. How many times has this individual administered Epinephrine?
2. Where has he or she administered this drug?
3. What was the outcome?

Ed Browning and Dr. Daniel indicated that they would develop a new form to be used for the purpose of compiling bee sting statistics and that completion of this new form would become a requirement for approval. Ed Browning also stated that EMS will review and report to the Board at each meeting the number of times an individual has used Epinephrine and the outcome of each use.

Recommendations from the North Carolina State Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council concerning EMS Certification/Recertification, and EMT-Defibrillation

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board accept a report on these recommendations as information; that it request Dr. Daniel to coordinate with EMS the compilation of literature and statistics on V-TAC; and that it request a V-TAC report and, possibly, a demonstration at the June or August, 1987, meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners.

The Board did not oppose the Office of Emergency Medical Services' forwarding all advanced life support certification materials to the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners for certification prior to Provider Affiliation.

DURANTE, SPENCER EMANUEL, M.D., Charlotte, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board send Dr. Durante a letter of concern certified, return receipt requested; that the letter of concern point out Dr. Durante's failure to comply with the conditions of the Consent Order; that this letter also state the Board of Medical Examiners looks forward to receiving a prompt response; that the Board investigate this matter further; and that, if the Board of Medical Examiners has not received an appropriate response from Dr. Durante by its May, 1987, meeting it then consider taking the necessary formal action.

GLASER, MARILYN KNOLL, M.D., Alderson, West Virginia

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board write a letter reminding Dr. Glaser she is to provide a report from Theodore Clark, M.D., for the Board of Medical Examiners review, and that she is to appear for an informal interview at the August, 1987, meeting of the Board.

HINSON, HARRY LEE, M.D., Pensacola, Florida

On March 13, 1987,, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board deny Dr. Hinson's request for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina.

HANHAM, WILLIAM JAMES, M.D., Troy, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board amend its original Consent Order to remove the mandatory restrictions placed on Dr. Hanham's Schedule 2 and 2N prescribing privileges and that Dr. Hanham agree voluntarily to restrict his office prescribing of Schedule 2 and 2N controlled substances to patients whose records document terminal cancer.

PEISEL, FRANCIS JAMES, JR., M.D., Savannah, Georgia

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board accept as information a favorable report from Candler General Hospital concerning Dr. Peisel.

SHAFTNER, KIMBERLY K., M.D., Garner, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board write a letter acknowledging receipt of his communication dated January 31, 1987; and that the letter state the Board of Medical Examiners is pleased with Dr. Shaftner's progress and has no objection to his current practice plans.

WALDEN, BURT MARCUS N., M.D., Smyrna, Georgia

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board send a certified, return receipt requested letter to Dr. Walden advising him to inform the Board of Medical Examiners whether he wishes to practice medicine in North Carolina; that this letter also advise Dr. Walden, if the Board of Medical Examiners does not receive a response to its communication, the Board will assume he does not wish to continue his licensure in this state; and that the Board accept as information a report indicating Dr. Walden has no DEA registration.

BODY TALK

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board accept as information a letter indicating

Eckerds will not renew the contract for "Body Talk" in its stores.

WESTERN CAROLINA EYE ASSOCIATES

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board approve this proposed corporate name providing it is acceptable to Western Carolina Retinal Associates, P.A.; and that, if the proposed corporate name is not acceptable to Western Carolina Retinal Associates, P.A., the Board of Medical Examiners again consider this corporation question.

COMPREHENSIVE NEUROLOGICAL SERVICES, P.A.

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board not approve this proposed name as it does not believe the word "comprehensive" is appropriate for a professional corporation name.

MOLLICA, GARY STEPHEN

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board write Mr. Mollica thanking him for his inquiry and advising him the Board of Medical Examiners has discussed the situation at considerable length with Dr. Greenberg who has informed the Board he will be communicating with Mr. Mollica regarding this matter; and that the Board of Medical Examiners send a copy of this letter to Dr. Greenberg.

HEAPHY, LEO JOSEPH, JR., M.D., Amherst, New York

On Friday, March 13, at 1:15 p.m., the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing on charges preferred against Dr. Heaphy. Neither Dr. Heaphy nor his representative appeared at this Hearing. On the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (7), the Board proceeded with the Hearing in the absence of the respondent. At the conclusion of this Hearing, on March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board finds the Charges to be sustained by the evidence and, on the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (a) (6), enters an Order revoking Dr. Heaphy's license to practice medicine in North Carolina.

AMEEN, WILLIAM ROBERT, M.D., Great Falls, South Carolina

On Friday, March 13, 1987, at 2:00 p.m., the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing on charges preferred against Dr. Ameen. Although neither Dr. Ameen nor his representative appeared, the Board of Medical Examiners, on the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14.7, proceeded with this Hearing. On March 13, 1987, at the conclusion of the Hearing, the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners finds the charges to be sustained by the evidence and on the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (a)(13) orders the revocation of Dr. Ameen's license to practice medicine in this state.

CITRON, JOSEPH, M.D., Atlanta, Georgia

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board reaffirm its previous action to deny approval of Dr. Citron's licensure application and that the Minutes of the January, 1987, meeting reflect this action.

KHURI, RAJA, M.D., New Haven, Connecticut

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners indicated that Dr. Khuri may apply for a dated license limited to the practice of Nephrology at East Carolina School of Medicine and its affiliated institution(s).

ASSADI, MOHAMMED ASHFAK HUSSAIN, M.D., Durham, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that Dr. Assadi's postgraduate medical education and training outside the United States does not meet the requirements of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

WATSON, NEIL, M.D., United Kingdom

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board inform Dr. Watson his graduate medical education does not meet the requirements for licensure in the state of

North Carolina and that the Board of Medical Examiners furnish Dr. Watson with a copy of the North Carolina Medical Practice Act.

MORRIS, ADRIAN ANTHONY, M.D., Albany, New York

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board believes at the end of his residency at Albany Dr. Morris will be eligible to apply for licensure.

JANUARY, 1988, BOARD MEETING

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board meet at the North Raleigh Hilton, Raleigh, North Carolina, in January, 1988, during the same time period as the January, 1987, meeting.

MARCH, 1988, BOARD MEETING

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board hold this meeting March 9 through 13, 1988, at the Sheraton Imperial, Research Triangle Park, North Carolina.

WHITE, STEVEN MERLE, M.D., Greenville - Hearing

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board hold a continuation of the Hearing on charges preferred against Steven Merle White, M.D., on June 5, 6, and 7 in either Greenville or Raleigh.

HEARINGS, SCHEDULING OF

Dr. Patterson suggested allotting one day at each meeting to a Hearing and, if a continuation is necessary, allot one day at the next meeting until a particular Hearing concludes. On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board of Medical Examiners' President, Executive Secretary, and Legal Counsel explore methods to shorten hearing procedures, to include researching hearing procedures utilized by other state medical Boards; and that they present a report on this matter at the May, 1987, meeting.

REGULATION HEARING

On May 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board hold this Regulation Hearing on May 15, 1987, in the North Carolina Medical Society building in Raleigh; that, if appropriate, the Board of Medical Examiners designate the Executive Secretary to act as Hearing Officer; and, that if it is not appropriate for Mr. Paris to serve in this capacity, the Board appoint Dr. Alexander to act as Hearing Officer.

MAGEE, ARCHIBALD CARTER, M.D., Washington, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating that the Board's attorney will report further on the matter of method of payment for Dr. Magee's legal fees.

GUESS, GEORGE ALBERT, M.D., Asheville, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating this matter will probably come before the Superior Court either in April or May, 1987.

KREPLICK, JOSEPH, M.D., Massachusetts

On March 13, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating the Board's office, to date, has received no final report of action affecting Dr. Kreplick's licensure status in the state of Massachusetts.

HUGHES, WILLIAM HENRY, M.D., Columbia, South Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating there has been no report received on the exact status of Dr. Hughes' licensure in the state of Colorado.

JONES, LEELAND ANTHONY, M.D.,

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating attempts to locate this physician have been unsuccessful.

MCNEIL, MAURICE RALPH, M.D., Glencoe, Minnesota

On March 13, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating a Consent Order will be sent to Dr. McNeil.

CAMP, EDMUND WEYMAN, III, M.D., Louisiana

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating a staff member will send Dr. Camp a Consent Order for this physician's signature.

FRESH, JAMES WILLIAM, M.D., Sardis, Georgia

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report concerning Dr. Fresh.

CHELATION THERAPY

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board, through its attorney, once again request the physicians who utilize chelation therapy in their medical practices, based upon the fact that the Federal Drug Administration's study on the efficacy of this therapy is only in the initial stages and remains unapproved at this time, to stop utilizing this treatment method.

BENNETT, ROBERT JOHN, M.D., Asheville, North Carolina

On March 13, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board permit this physician to take the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX).

PEER REVIEW ORGANIZATION

On March 15, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board request the President to call Ralph Snyder, M.D., Peer Review, Raleigh, to discuss with him some questions the Board of Medical Examiners has concerning the effect of Peer Review proposals; that the Board consider requesting Dr. Snyder to meet with the Board of Medical Examiners at its May meeting to discuss this issue; and that the Board discuss this matter with the Deans at the May, 1987, meeting.

The Board also instructed that, if Dr. Snyder does not meet with the Board of Medical Examiners in May, 1987, that the Peer Review Organization be an Agenda Item for Discussion at the May meeting.

DEANS, MEETING WITH

The Board instructed that the following items be discussed in May, 1987, when the members of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina meet with the Deans of the North Carolina Medical Schools .

1. Statutory Change requiring three years of Graduate Medical Education and Training of all applicants who have graduated from medical schools outside the United States or Canada;
2. Reasons resulting in the Board's request for an Increase in Licensure Fees;
3. Board's efforts to extend the Impaired Physicians Program in North Carolina: specifically, steps the Board of Medical has taken as well as how the Deans might contribute to this program, specifically by thoroughly questioning residents and physicians joining the medical school staffs;
4. Board's questions concerning Peer Review Organization; and
5. Any Questions from Deans directed to the Board of Medical Examiners.

The President recommended that the Board members provide the Executive Secretary written suggestions for other items to be discussed at the May, 1987, meeting with the Deans of the North Carolina Medical Schools.

PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS, MEETING WITH

The Board instructed that the staff invite representatives of the North Carolina Association of Physician Assistants to meet with the Board of Medical Examiners in May, 1987; that one item of discussion be a situation involving a supervising physician and a physician assistant, in which this physician assistant not only performed various medical acts on a patient: including a physical examination, formulating a conclusion on the basis of this examination, planning treatment, and conducting a follow-up visit, but also provided a "routine summary of an examination, conclusion, treatment plan and follow-up visit" to a consultant physician in letter form bearing the physician assistant's signature rather than the signature of his supervising physician.

DRUG ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION REPRESENTATIVE

The Board instructed that the staff invite a new member of the Drug Enforcement Administration staff from Greensboro to speak to members of the Board of Medical Examiners at the May, 1987, meeting.

BALDWIN, MARION AUGUST, M.D., Atlanta, Georgia

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board deny approval of Dr. Baldwin's licensure application; and that the Board of Medical Examiners require Dr. Baldwin to take and pass Component II of FLEX prior to reconsidering this physician's application for licensure.

The President stated that the basis for this denial is: (1) Dr. Baldwin falsified the written application for licensure and (2) Dr. Baldwin lacks the necessary current medical knowledge to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to patients in accordance with the acceptable standards of care in this state.

CHASTAIN, TRUMAN LEROY, M.D, Mobile, Alabama

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board issue Dr. Chastain a dated license for a period of one year; that it interview Dr. Chastain prior to the expiration of this dated license; that the Board, during Dr.

Chastain's next interview, request him to clarify his current status with the educational process, update the Board on all suits, and inform the Board of Medical Examiners of any interim problems; and that the Board also determine, prior to approving Dr. Chastain for an extension of this dated license or for permanent licensure, that this physician has continued to advance in medical knowledge.

Dr. Duckett informed Dr. Chastain that he should clarify for the Board of Medical Examiners in writing the details of the suit.

DEBNATH, SUBODH CHANDRA, M.D., Saudi Arabia

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board inform Dr. Debnath his graduate medical education and training do not meet the statutory requirements for licensure in the state of North Carolina; that the Board permit Dr. Debnath to withdraw his application without prejudice; and that the Board refund Dr. Debnath's application fee.

MICHET, CLEMENT JOHN, M.D., Palos Heights, Illinois

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board deny approval of Dr. Michet's application and that it inform this physician, if he takes and passes Component II of the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX), the Board of Medical Examiners will reconsider and may approve his application for a medical license in the state of North Carolina.

HAYES, ALBERT DRAKE, M.D., Hendersonville, North Carolina

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board issue Dr. Hayes a dated license for a period of six months, that it inform Dr. Hayes it is his responsibility to insure the treating Psychiatrist furnishes a progress report to the Board of Medical Examiners at the end of three months and again just prior to the expiration of his dated license; that the Board advise this physician to abide by his Psychiatrist's recommendations; and that the Board of Medical Examiners also interview Dr. Hayes prior to the

expiration of this dated license.

MILLER, NORMAN E., M.D., Liverpool, England

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board waive the ECFMG requirement and, if Dr. Miller's credentials are complete, allow him to take the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX) in June, 1987.

STANLEY, KARL HARVEY, M.D., Winston-Salem, North Carolina

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board commend Dr. Stanley on his progress; that it request him to appear for another informal interview at the end of six months; that it advise him to discuss problems with the Director of his Residency Training Program as soon as possible, or at least by April 14, 1987; and that the Board ask Dr. Stanley, during his next scheduled interview, whether he has complied with the Board's instructions.

LUDINGTON, LAURIE CHURCHILL, M.D., Lumberton, North Carolina

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board advise Dr. Ludington to surrender her license; and that it issue her a dated license to expire at the end of June, 1987.

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSURE INTERVIEWS

The Board agreed that, when an individual member interviews an applicant for licensure, he or she will either approve the physician for a full, unrestricted license or advise the applicant to appear before the full Board of Medical Examiners. The Board noted that the staff prefers the interviewing Board member or someone from this Board member's office to request copies of credentials from the staff of the Board of Medical Examiners.

TODD, GARY PRICE, M.D., Waynesville, North Carolina

On March 14, 1987, as requested by the Board of Medical Examiners, Dr. Todd appeared for an informal interview. The President read a statement of Dr. Todd's rights and the attorney representing this physician stated that, if the Board expresses its concerns in writing, Dr. Todd will then respond to the Board of Medical Examiners' concerns in writing .

After Dr. Todd's attorney made his statement, the President of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina declared this interview concluded; and, on March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board prefer charges against Dr. Todd on the basis of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (a)(6) Unprofessional Conduct.

IMPAIRED PHYSICIANS

Dr. Duckett reported to the members of the Board of Medical Examiners that recently he and Dr. Godwin, together with the Executive Secretary, met with a Task Force of the Medical Society. This Task Force has a plan and budget for a part-time staff, which by 1990 would become full-time, to identify and assist impaired physicians. The Board's President further reported that insurance companies intend to contribute to this impaired physicians program financially; but that the primary source of funding for the program will be an increase in biennial registration fees.

Dr. Duckett also reported that there are plans to request the Legislature for authorization of a fee increase to be utilized in funding an impaired physicians program. The President commented that the Board of Medical Examiners may contribute to this program. On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board philosophically approve the current concept of an impaired physicians program;

and that the Board support this concept financially by requesting a fee increase subject to review from time to time by the Board of Medical Examiners as it may then be constituted.

CAROLINA EYE ASSOCIATES, P.A.

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board notify this Corporation to provide a response to the Board of Medical Examiners' letter by May 2, 1987.

ROBERTSON, LOGAN THOMSON, M.D., Canton, North Carolina

On March 14, 1987, the President of the Board instructed that the staff schedule the hearing on charges preferred against Logan Thomson Robertson, M.D., at the June, 1987, meeting.

VIDAL, FRED LOUIS, M.D.

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board notify Dr. Vidal the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina is aware of his failure to appear for an interview scheduled during the March, 1987, meeting of the Board; and that the Board further notify Dr. Vidal, because of his failure to attend this meeting, the Board of Medical Examiners instructs him, prior to engaging in medical practice in the state of North Carolina, to notify the Board so that it may schedule another interview.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES APPLICATIONS APPROVED BY THE BOARD

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board approve all the Emergency Medical Services applications and Bee Sting Certifications submitted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services.

LICENSURE APPLICANTS BY ENDORSEMENT AND EXAMINATION

On March 14, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board approve the following applicants for licensure.


identification cards under advisement.
