

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Velvet Cloak Inn, Raleigh, North Carolina

March 14-15th, 1969

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Velvet Cloak Inn, Raleigh, North Carolina, March 14-15th, 1969, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials, special limited license, graduates of foreign medical schools applying to take the written examination, and for other business.

Dr. Edmondson: Where are you located?

A. Hazlehurst, Georgia

Q. What type of work are you doing?

A. General Surgery and some General Practice

Q. Tell the Board what you have done and where you have been since 1954.

A. I graduated from medical school in 1954, went to Brooks Army Hospital and did an internship and two years surgical residency. I resigned my residency in 1956 and was assigned to the United States Army Hospital in Teheran and then went to Fort Ord, California, for five months, then Jacksonville, Florida, and finished surgical residency there. From there I went to Quincy, Florida, and practiced five and one-half years.

Q. What are your plans relative to North Carolina?

A. I just bought some land and pretty well strapped myself. My plans are to sell my home in Hazlehurst and move to the area of Flat Rock.

Q. Have you made definite commitments?

A. No sir, I have purchased 113 acres of land in Henderson County and presently going to buy 40 acres to build a home. The only thing to keep me from moving now is finances. As soon as I can relieve myself of my obligations in Hazlehurst, I have a big house, I will move.

Q. When do you contemplate moving?

A. I wanted to be here in September, but finances will not permit that. It would probably be the following year because I do not want to take my children out of school.

Q. The policy of the Board is not to grant license until some definite commitment is made. That is if and when you make your definite commitment, if you will notify the Board within one year, they will give you a license, if you see fit to complete your plans. You should write and state you are moving and give the address.

A. My wife and kids have been coming up for six years to camp. We always look forward to coming and we are coming. If you will tell me I will be granted boards, I will go ahead and start building a house. I will then move as soon as feasible. It would not be wise for me to pick up and move.

His credentials are now complete and he has been approved for the same.

These credentials are now complete and he has been granted special limited license.

Dr. Edmondson: This special limited license does not carry the privilege of narcotic tax stamp.

RE: Dr. George F. El Bayadi, graduate of Cairo University, Egypt in 1940, appeared applying for the privilege of taking the written examination for licensure. He is certified by the American Board of Ophthalmology and is presently in the Department of Ophthalmology of the University of Syracuse as a member of the staff. He presented his alien registration card. He stated that he planned to join the staff of C. J. Harris Community Hospital, Sylva. Dr. El Bayadi was approved for the written examination.

RE: Dr. Joseph G. Gaal, graduate of Westphalian University, Germany in 1948, appeared petitioning for the privilege of taking the written examination for licensure. He is a naturalized citizen and was employed at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Salisbury. His services were terminated there a few months ago. Dr. Gaal holds medical licenses in Kentucky and Ohio and the Board waived requirement of the certificate of the ECFMG at its meeting in January, 1969.

Dr. Combs: What are your plans for North Carolina?

A. I would like to work in a state hospital.

Dr. Edmondson: Have you made application?

A. Yes, I tried all three places. I need a license.

Q. What kind of work do you contemplate doing?

A. Any kind of work.

Dr. Combs: How old are you?

A. 70

Dr. Edmondson: What have you done in the past?

A. Internal medicine, general, psychiatry.

Q. You have been with the Veterans Administration since 1965?

A. Yes sir

Q. What is your present position?

A. I have no position now. My work was finished in November. I was in Lexington, Kentucky, for 12 years.

Dr. Combs: Will you explain again why your services were discontinued.

A. I was there three years. This is finished.

Q. Is it because of your age?

A. I think so, Perhaps it is, perhaps something else. The Veterans Administration is a political organization. They like somebody else better than me. I understood they took a gentleman over 80, retired already. I am not a communist.

Dr. Galusha: We are not implying that. Did you resign?

A. Yes, I resigned. I got a letter from the director, they did not want my service longer.

Q. Do you feel you were discriminated against?

A. Yes, very much.

Q. If you had a license, what position would you seek?

A. Staff physician in a state hospital.

Q. Would you consider private practice?

A. Perhaps later

Q. Is anyone in the state system encouraging you to get a license in North Carolina?

A. I do not know, I made correspondence with Dorothea Dix, Morganton, and they told me if I would have to have the ECFMG, I would have job right now. They would like to take me.

The Board tabled its action until the May, 1969 meeting and instructed the secretary to make further investigation.

RE: Dr. Hector J. Kalagayan, graduate of the University of Santo Tomas, Philippines in 1958, appeared applying for the privilege of taking the written examination for licensure. He previously held a special limited license to Watts and Lincoln Hospitals where he is a resident in Surgery. He is presently at the University of Syracuse School of Medicine.

Dr. Edmondson: What are your plans for practice?

A. I am planning to join Dr. Donayre in Elkins.

VERDICT: Dr. Hector J. Kalagayan was approved for the written examination.

RE: Dr. Diego A. Aranda, graduate of the University of Madrid, Spain in 1955, appeared petitioning for the privilege of taking the written examination. He previously had special limited license to Charlotte Memorial Hospital, where he was a resident in General Surgery. He is at present working in the emergency room in the Clearwater, Florida, hospital.

A. I think it will be Wilmington. I still have to find out if that is a good place for plastic surgery.

VERDICT: Dr. Diego A. Aranda was approved for the written examination.

RE: Dr. S. Winston Singleton - The secretary presented letter from Dr. Singleton inquiring about licensure in this state. He is graduated by a foreign medical school, has Pennsylvania license and does not have the certificate of the ECFMG. He is coming to North Carolina with Burroughs Wellcome and Company.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved if Dr. S. Winston Singleton desires to take the written examination, that the certificate of the ECFMG be waived in view of his having Pennsylvania state medical license, obtained in 1952. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed unanimously.

Upon motion by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. the Board RESOLVED THAT, under the authority granted by the Medical Practice Act, qualified graduates of the presently existing American Colleges of Osteopathy who graduated in the year 1960 and later, be granted the privilege of taking the examination required by this Board for the issuance of a license to practice medicine, beginning in the year 1969, and that upon their passing such examination they be licensed to practice medicine.

A substitute motion was made by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha that the graduates of the American Colleges of Osteopathy referred to in the above motion be permitted to write the examination required for license, provided the colleges from which they graduated are approved by this Board after investigation and report concerning such colleges of osteopathy by representatives of this Board, was defeated. (Those in favor Drs. Large, Galusha, and Partrick and those against were Drs. Combs, Hooper and Taylor. Dr. Edmondson, President, voted against the motion.)

(Those in favor of the original motion were Drs. Combs, Hooper and Taylor and against Drs. Galusha, Large and Partrick, Dr. Edmondson, President, voting in favor to break the tie.)

RECOMMENDED CHANGES IN THE MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT

Upon motion by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr., the Board RESOLVED to recommend that the Medical Practice Act be amended to permit the use by the Board of the "FLEX" (examination of the Federation of State Medical Boards) written examination and that this be done by striking out the compulsory requirement that Part I of the examination be given at the end of completion of two years of medical college education and providing that the Board "may" give such examination at such time.

Upon motion of Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. and seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs, the Board RESOLVED to recommend that the fee required of applicants for the complete written examination be increased from \$50.00 to \$100.00.

Upon motion of Dr. Joseph J. Combs and duly seconded, the Board RESOLVED to recommend that the Medical Practice Act be amended to provide that the total amount of accumulated fees and penalties for failure to register biennially as required by the Medical Practice Act shall not exceed the sum of \$100.00.

Upon motion by Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. and seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha, the Board RESOLVED to recommend that the Medical Practice Act be amended to provide a fee for biennial registration not to exceed \$10.00, as might be determined by the Board.

Upon motion by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha, it was resolved that the Medical Practice Act be amended to provide that the Board be empowered, in its discretion, to reinstate or restore a license which had been suspended or revoked, subject to and upon such terms and conditions as the Board deems necessary and advisable.

The president was requested and authorized by the Board to transmit the foregoing recommendations for changes in the Medical Practice Act to the Executive Council of the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina at the meeting of the Council to be held March 23rd, 1969.

The meeting was adjourned.
