

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

Mid Pines Club, Southern Pines, North Carolina

March 24 - 26th, 1972

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Mid Pines Club, Southern Pines, North Carolina, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and other business.

Friday, March 24th
6:30 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner. Drs. Cornelius T. Partrick, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr. and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. were present. Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Administrative Secretary, and Mrs. Betty Joe Cooke attended.

Credentials for license by endorsement were reviewed by the members of the Board.

RE: Assistant to Physicians - The secretary presented applications as follows:

RE: Dr. Leonard J. Goldwater has submitted application for David Ellis Lowe, which application is in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick, Jr. moved that Dr. Leonard J. Goldwater be passed to register David Ellis Lowe as an assistant to physician. Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. duly seconded this motion and the same was passed by four in favor and one against.

RE: Assistant to Physician - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the application for assistant to physician have a blank in front of application file showing whether or not requirements have been fulfilled relative to requirements set up by this Board. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and passed.

RE: Dr. William Mitchell's application to register Charles Eugene DuBay as an assistant was presented to the Board.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that the secretary be instructed to write an inquiry about the reply to question 5 regarding obstetrics, complicated fractures, tendon repair and badly traumatized wounds. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. Harry T. McPherson has submitted application for Glenn LeRoy Rowand, which application is in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that the application of Dr. Harry T. McPherson to register his assistant, Glenn LeRoy Rowand, be approved. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed.

RE: Dr. Elpenor Rudolf Ohle has submitted application for Janet Ohle, which application is in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that the application of Dr. Elpenor Rudolf Ohle to register his assistant, Janet Ohle, be approved. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed by a vote of four to one.

RE: Dr. Harry Wynn Hollingsworth has submitted application for Steven Michael Pulliam, which application is in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that the application of Dr. Harry Wynn Hollingsworth to register his assistant, Steven Michael Pulliam, be approved. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed by a vote of four to one.

Assistant to Physician continued

RE: Dr. Ernest Whitmal Furgurson has resubmitted application for Craig George Bruno, which application is in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the application of Dr. Ernest Whitmal Furgurson to register his assistant, Craig George Bruno, be approved. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. John Elliott Dixon - See previous Minutes with regard to Dr. Dixon's application to register his assistant, Stephen Larry Joyner. Dr. Frank Edmondson stated that Dr. Dixon had qualified the duties of the assistant and he is satisfied that he is abiding by the rules.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the application of Dr. John Elliott Dixon to register his assistant, Stephen Larry Joyner, be approved. The motion was passed.

RE: Dr. Kenneth E. Cosgrove - The secretary submitted application for assistant to Dr. Cosgrove, Charles W. Kirchner, who had his training at the University of Alabama, which program has not been approved by this Board. He has had 20 years of meritorius service in the army as a corpsman.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper moved that the Board advised Dr. Kenneth E. Cosgrove that this Board can not certify Charles Willim Kirchner as assistant to a physician as he does not meet the standards. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed.

RE: Dr. Thomas Francis Flynn appeared November 21st, 1929 applying for license by endorsement of credentials and was approved when and if he located in the state, within one year, for practice. Dr. Flynn has now advised that he has returned to active duty with the United States Public Health Service and is living in Norfolk, Virginia; that he has an all-year round vacation home at Kill Devil Hills; that he spends many week-ends and several weeks in the summer there, and requested license on the basis of his previous application.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that Dr. Thomas Francis Flynn be granted license to practice medicine in this state on the basis of endorsement of credentials. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. Kanu A. Gujrati, graduate of a foreign medical school has made application to take Flex examination, looking towards locating in Clinton, North Carolina. He is licensed in the Virgin Islands and is certified by the American Board of Ophthalmology.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that Dr. Kanu A. Gujrati be seen in May, 1972 with the idea that he be presented to the Board and on the basis that he has the American Board of Ophthalmology, may take this in lieu of Flex and consider his credentials. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed.

RE: Dr. Merton W. Olson has applied to take Flex. He is graduated by the University of Guadalajara, Mexico and was certified as completing the medical course as a physician and surgeon.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that Dr. Merton W. Olson does not qualify for the examination since he does not have the titulo degree. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and passed.

RE: Dr. Joseph Kreplick - The secretary presented application for narcotic tax stamp for approval.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper moved that the Board does approve Dr. Joseph Kreplick's application for narcotic tax stamp. This motion was seconded and passed.

Dr. Hooper moved that if Dr. Joseph Kreplick requests audience before this Board that he have his court problems cleared up before the audience be granted. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed.



RE: NARCOTIC BUREAU: Dr. Bryant Galusha moved that the Board inform John Ingersoll, Director of the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, if we do not get co-operation. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. James Spullock Lambert, Swannanoa, North Carolina - (See previous Minutes) - The secretary presented report from the North Carolina Board of Pharmacy as follows: "Review of prescriptions reveal very few prescriptions for narcotics. There are, however, a lot of his prescriptions around for amphetamines. No time was wasted doing a tabulation on such. If this is desired so notify." This report was received as information.

The meeting was adjourned.

RE: Dr. Harry Swain Willey appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He went to Currituck in November, 1971 and stated that he is not doing anything right now.

Dr. Partrick: Have you been convicted of a crime? A. No sir
 Q. Have you used alcohol to excess? A. I do not use it at all.
 Q. Have you used barbiturates or narcotics? A. No sir
 Q. Have you had difficulty with boards of medical examiners? A. No sir



Dr. Willey continued

Dr. Combs: Are you going into fulltime practice down there?

A. I do not know yet. I am 17 miles from a hospital. I am going to inquire.

VERDICT: Dr. Sanford Mark Meyers was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary.

RE: Dr. Mehrdad Majdzadeh Sahba appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is graduated from an Iranian medical school, is a naturalized citizen and certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine. He will be associated with Dr. William V. Singletary. He had a special limited license to the University of North Carolina School of Medicine in 1962.

Dr. Taylor: Have you been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q. Have you used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q. Have you used barbiturates and narcotics? A. No

Q. Have you had difficulty with boards of medical examiners? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Mehrdad Majdzadeh Sahba was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. John Cary Merritt appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a native of North Carolina.

Dr. Edmondson: You are planning to come to Clinton to practice?

A. In that area



Dr. Merritt continued

Dr. Partrick: Have you been convicted of any crime? A. No
 Q. Have you used alcohol to excess? A. No
 Q. Have you used barbiturates or narcotics? A. No
 Q. Have you had difficulty with boards of medical examiners? A. No

Dr. Large: What type of practice do you do?

A. I am a resident in Ophthalmology.

Dr. Combs: Are you going to limit your practice to Ophthalmology when you move to North Carolina?

A. Yes

Dr. Partrick: When will you complete your residency?

A. 1974

VERDICT: Dr. John Cary Merritt was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. Carl Casper Warren surrendered his narcotic tax stamp at the instruction of the Board of Medical Examiners in January, 1964. He is an anesthesiologist and appeared at this time to petition for reinstatement of his narcotic tax stamp. He stated that he needed it in his work; that it had been over eight years since he had a dose of self-administered narcotics.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the Board of Medical Examiners recommend that Dr. Carl Casper Warren have a BBND number. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed by a vote of five to one, Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. dissenting.

RE: Dr. Bobby Oliver Heafner, Stony Point, North Carolina - Dr. Heafner appeared at the request of the Board. His physician, Dr. James F. Toole, Bowman Gray School of Medicine reported that Dr. Heafner had been a patient there and was taking narcotic drugs, however, he did not consider him addicted. He was, therefore, requested to appear at this time. Dr. Heafner stated that he had a heavy work load; that he has seven children; that he has always had headache; that he has had bleeding ulcer on several occasions and tension. He admitted taking narcotics to relieve his many problems; that he has had no drugs since February, when he was hospitalized. He stated that he has plans to take regular time off from his office to help relieve his tension.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that Dr. Bobby Oliver Heafner be advised that the Board is concerned about his misuse of narcotics; that if we have any inkling of this happening again we will have him back up with the idea of any action that might be necessary; that in the meantime we will keep close interest in his case through his attending physician and will request reports from Dr. Toole every three months or as Dr. Toole feels necessary. This motion was duly seconded and passed by a vote of five.

Dr. Heafner was given the action of the Board by the president.

The meeting was adjourned.

Saturday, March 25th
2:30 P. M.

The meeting was convened.

RE: Dr. L. B. Skeen, Mooresville, North Carolina, appeared at the request of the Board. He has previously appeared with regard to prescribing for narcotic addicts, at which time he was given certain instructions relating to his practice of treating narcotic addicts. (See previous Minutes). Dr. Skeen appeared at this time and stated that he had phased out the addicts he was treating with methadone. He admitted having some medically addicted addicts under treatment; that he gives amphetamines for overweight.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that Dr. L. B. Skeen be advised as follows:

1. That he be told again to register immediately his known narcotic addicts.
2. As previously, that he accept no more known addicts for treatment of addiction.
3. That he thoroughly abstain from the use of amphetamines in his practice.



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Dr. Skeen continued

That if he does not abide that he will be recalled for disciplinary action of the Board; that in all fairness it should be known by him that he will be under constant and close surveillance by this Board. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Fitzhugh Lee Smith, Burlington, North Carolina - Pursuant to report from the Pharmacy Board as to Dr. Smith writing for an excessive amount of amphetamines, he was requested to appear at this time. Dr. Smith came in and stated that he had given amphetamines for obesity and mood elevators; that he was not aware that he was not exercising good judgment, but that he had discontinued writing for amphetamines since hearing from the Board and would not write for any more if the Board so stated. He made the statement that he should have retired.

The Board discussed this situation and Dr. Smith was advised by the president the danger of writing for excessive amounts of amphetamines and the possibility of the same getting into the black market; also that it had become increasingly evident that the firm indications for amphetamines were confined to a few conditions. He told him that the Board was not interested in his retiring and that the Board respected his right to exercise his judgment and hoped he would continue an active and productive practice.

RE: Dr. Robert Edward Gardner, O'Berry Hospital, Goldsboro, North Carolina - Dr. Gardner appeared for a routine interview. He was very disappointed that he had failed to receive a trip to Vietnam to work in a out-patient clinic for two months. It also appeared in his conversation that he was finding his routine work tedious. He was told by the president that the Board was pleased; that he appeared well and it would like to see him in a happier situation, but that he should be very cautious in what he planned to do and that the Board felt he should be in a protected atmosphere.

RE: Dr. James Valentine Thomas, Eden, North Carolina, came in for a routine interview. He stated that he had changed associates, which was done in an amicable manner, and is now associated with Dr. Herbert Baker, but they have separate practices. He denied having used alcohol or drugs and looked well. Dr. Thomas was commended by the Board and told he would be invited in from time to time.

RE: Dr. James Richard Hughes was requested to appear at this time but called in and stated because of snow he could not make the trip.

The secretary advised that Dr. Hughes had applied for a BNDD number and he had received request of approval from the Narcotic Bureau, and that he had replied to the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, giving Dr. Hughes' situation and requesting that BNDD number not be granted. The secretary also reported that he had received a phone call from the Bureau of Narcotics asking for more positive reason for his not receiving a BNDD number.

The secretary was directed to tell the Bureau of Narcotics that this doctor had been in deep trouble and that in the judgment of the Board he should not have a narcotic tax stamp, to tell them clearly why the Board does not recommend that he have narcotic tax stamp and that reply was delayed because of the expected interview.

The Board directed that Dr. James Richard Hughes be directed to appear before the Board in May, 1972.

RE: Written Examination - Part II - Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that June, 1972 be unequivocally the last examination on Part II to be given. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor and passed.

Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that everyone on this list be written a form letter that this is the last time Part II is going to be given; that if they wish to take an examination after June, 1972, it will be necessary to take Flex. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Deans of Medical Schools - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board of Medical Examiners invite the deans of the four medical schools and advise that it will be meeting at the Medical Society meeting and if there is anything they wish to discuss with the Board, to let us know. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.



RE: Dr. Jerko Poklepovic - To summarize he failed to take one-third of the questions in the basic science subjects, but made a passing Flex weighted average, and was granted license. The Board has been advised by the National Board of Medical Examiners that this procedure had not occurred before and Dr. Poklepovic might have difficulty in the future getting license by endorsement.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that Dr. Jerko Poklepovic be advised as per the above information, the motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. Manuel de la Serna, Jr. - The secretary advised that Dr. de la Serna, Jr. had been advised that due to the fact that he was residing out of the state, he was not eligible to have his license converted to full license upon becoming naturalized. Dr. de la Serna replied that he was in military service and would return to practice Urology either in Winston-Salem or Elkin this September.

The Board directed that Dr. Manyel L. de la Serna, Jr. be granted the privilege of converting license to full license upon furnishing certification.

RE: Report to American Medical Association - The secretary presented request from the American Medical Association that report be made on any type of license, special, et cetera. The Board does not at this time report resident's training license.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board conform with the desires of the American Medical Association and send information. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: James O. Bailes, Chiropractic Physician - Report from the Pharmacy Board alleging that Dr. Bailes has been purchasing certain prescription legend drugs was presented to the Board at its last meeting, at which time they directed that the advice of the attorney for the Board be procured. The attorney advised that in view of the absence of evidence that he has prescribed or dispensed drugs, the institution of any action against him by the solicitor would not be warranted.

The following physicians have applied for conversion of limited to full license:

Dr. Chapin Henley
 Dr. Harriman ^HHarding Jett
 Dr. Khye Weng Ng - Naturalized
 Dr. Emile E. Werk, Jr.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the above physicians be granted full license when all requirements are met. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. William H. Strickland, Hendersonville, North Carolina - The secretary advised on report from John H. Anderson, Attorney for the Board, that the court action had been settled, which included return of all North Carolina properties. The investigation also revealed that Dr. Strickland had rendered competent, satisfactory and attentive services to Mrs. Gudger in connection with her several illnesses.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that this report be received as information and might be considered closed until further information should be forthcoming. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. L. R. Staton, Hayesville, North Carolina - The State Bureau of Investigation gave a report that Dr. Staton had been indicted on four counts of unlawfully distributing controlled drugs; that Dr. Staton waived preliminary hearing to be held March 22nd and was to be tried in superior court. The agent stated that the hearing set for April might be postponed until the Board could interview Dr. Staton.

VERDICT: The Board directed that Dr. L. R. Staton be seen at the June, 1972 meeting.



RE: Meeting of the Board - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board meet at the Mid Pines Club March 22-24th, 1973. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor and passed.

The meeting was adjourned.

Saturday, March 26th
9:30 A. M.

RE: Anesthesiologists - Dr. J. F. Patterson came in and discussed with the Board the effort his society is making to procure more anesthesiologists.

RE: Dr. Henry Oldham Williams, resident in Radiotherapy at Duke University School of Medicine, appeared at the request of the Board. Dr. R. G. Lester, Chief of the Department of Radiology, appeared with him. This was precipitated by a report from the State Bureau of Investigation that Dr. Williams had written prescriptions for narcotics, using his own name and others; that he had used the drugs himself. Dr. Williams admitted having taken percodan, first in October, 1971, and had continued until his interview with the State Bureau of Investigation agent with regard to the prescriptions he had written. He has been receiving psychiatric care and feels that he is doing well. He stated that he had previously had depression.

Dr. Lester talked with the Board and stated that he was a conscientious and good physician; that the department had every intention of keeping him. Dr. Lester said that at this moment no official action had been taken; that the solicitor had reserved his privilege of taking the case to the Grand Jury. He also said that as a resident Dr. Williams would not need his narcotic tax stamp for #2 narcotics.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that the Board of Medical Examiners request that Dr. Henry Oldham Williams relinquish his narcotic license; that he be continuously on psychotherapy and that this Board get a progress report at three month intervals; that the Board see him at three month intervals; that the secretary write a letter to the State Bureau of Investigation that it is cognizant of this problem and is taking remedial action. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

On being questioned Dr. Williams stated that he had no misgivings about surrendering his BNDD number and agreed to do so.

The secretary presented to the Board a letter from Dr. Glenda H. Weber, Chief of Staff, of the Davidson County Hospital, Mocksville, North Carolina. This letter was accompanied by a document outlining a nurse practitioner clinic being set up by the Bowman Gray School of Medicine at Farmington, North Carolina. Dr. Weber then propounded the question of the legality of the operation and the policy that their hospital should have regarding that clinic. Mr. John H. Anderson, Attorney for the Board, had studied this proposal and was present for the discussion. The Board took sometime in talking about the whole situation. It came to the conclusion that the legal angle should be left to the Attorney General's office, but that the Board should suggest some rules for the operation of the clinic, with the following action:

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that the minimum standards and controls should include:

1. The name of a specific physician or a group of physicians designated as assuming authority and responsibility for the medical care provided for this clinic.
2. A mechanism should be developed to assure there is no gap in the continuity of the medical care available to the patients attending this clinic at anytime.

This motion was duly seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor and passed.



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RE: Governor's Report on Cherry Hospital Investigation - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the president and secretary review further this report and where any physician is implicated to the extent that any action might be necessary, to be taken up by the Board; that the be instructed to appear at a future meeting for an interview. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and seconded.

The meeting was adjourned.
