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MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Eben Alexander, Jr., M.D., President of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, called this meeting to order at 8:30 p.m., March 9, 1988, at the Hotel Europa, Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

The Board members present at this meeting included: John Thomas Daniel, Jr., M.D., Secretary-Treasurer; Charles Howard Duckett, M.D.; Harold L. Godwin, M.D.; Hector Himel Henry, II, M.D.; Nicholas Emanuel Stratas, M.D.; and Mrs. Kathryn Howell Willis.

Staff members present included: Bryant D. Paris, Jr.; Don Pittman; William H. Breeze, Jr.; Robert J. Broyles; L. D. Beaver; Kathy Burke; and Sibyl Lamoreaux.

ROGERS, CHARLES WILBURN, M.D., Chapel Hill, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board instruct its attorney to prepare an Order for Dr. Rogers to show cause why the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina should extend his licensure.

SHAIA, WILLIAM HARRY, M.D., Charlotte, North Carolina

The Board of Medical Examiners reviewed information indicating that Dr. Shaia plans to retire from the practice of medicine by January 1, 1989. On March 10, 1988, the Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board request written notification from Dr. Shaia when he has formalized these plans and has a definite retirement date.

WALTZ, FRANK CLINTON, M.D., Citronelle, Alabama

Dr. Daniel reviewed information indicating that this physician has experienced problems with a Board in another state.

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett

that the Board offer Dr. Waltz the opportunity to surrender his North Carolina medical license within a specified period of time; and that, if Dr. Waltz does not surrender his license within this time limit, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina prefer charges against Dr. Waltz on the basis of the State of Alabama Medical Licensure Commission's formal action.

ALESSI, JOSEPH FRANCIS, M.D., Swansboro, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board offer Dr. Alessi the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order; and that, if Dr. Alessi does not sign the Consent Order within a specified period of time, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina prefer charges against Joseph Francis Alessi, M.D.

PROGRAM ON SUPERVISION OF PHYSICIAN EXTENDERS

Dr. Duckett advised the Board that he and the Executive Secretary for the Board of Medical Examiners have prepared a one hour program on the supervision of physician extenders and the responsibilities of the physicians who supervise the medical acts performed by these extenders. Dr. Stratas suggested that it might be appropriate to videotape this program.

CRIMINAL HISTORY INFORMATION

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the President of the Board send the following letter to Mr. Corley again requesting criminal history information and that he also send the Attorney General a copy of this letter:

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH NURSING

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Henry that the President of the Board write a letter concerning this matter to Dr. Tolbert with copies to Dr. Imbus, Dr. Edwards, and Mr. Dux.

EXPERT WITNESSES

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board respond to Mr. Bryan indicating that a physician may set up a business corporation to provide expert testimony; but that, in acting on behalf of this business corporation, the physician may not provide medical services.

WENTZ, IRL JESSE, M.D., Morehead City, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board request that this physician provide a written response indicating his intention to comply with the following stipulations:

- (1) Dr. Wentz will prescribe medications in DEA Schedules 2, 2N, 3, 3N, 4, and 5 only in a hospital setting;
- (2) Dr. Wentz will complete a minimum of fifty hours of Category One continuing medical education approved by the American Academy of Family Practice or the Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons within one year;
- (3) Dr. Wentz will take and pass the SPEX examination to demonstrate his competency to practice medicine;
- (4) Dr. Wentz will appear informally before the Board as it may request; and
- (5) Dr. Wentz will submit his practice and office records to such monitoring as the Board may deem necessary.

BERRIOS, OSWALD, M.D., Carolina Beach, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board offer Dr. Berrios the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order with the Board of Medical Examiners and that, if within a reasonable time period Dr. Berrios does not sign this Consent Order, the Board prefer charges against Oswald Berrios, M.D.

BRIGGS, GERALD PAUL, M.D., Lexington, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously

adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board request Dr. Briggs to provide a written statement indicating that he will comply with the following conditions:

- (1) Dr. Briggs will discontinue using HCG and all anorectic medications in his medical practice;
- (2) Dr. Briggs will refrain from prescribing medications in Schedules 2, 2N, 3, and 3N except in a hospital setting;
- (3) Within one year, Dr. Briggs will furnish evidence of completion of fifty hours of Category One continuing medical education, applicable to his practice and approved by the American Academy of Family Practice;
- (4) Dr. Briggs will improve his record-keeping procedures by documenting in patient charts the medical indications for all medications prescribed; and
- (5) Dr. Briggs will submit to such monitoring of his practice and prescribing activities as the Board deems necessary.

WILLIAMS, JOHNNIE LEE, M.D., New Bern, North Carolina

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Daniel that, if the Board has not received a signed Consent Order prior to the June, 1988, meeting, that the Board of Medical Examiners hold a hearing in June on the matters contained in its proposed Consent Order.

ROSE, SELWYN, M.D., Winston-Salem, North Carolina

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board prefer charges against Selwyn Rose, M.D., on the basis of N.C.G.S. 90-14(a)(6), Unprofessional Conduct.

PRICE, CHARLES WILLIAM, M.D., Shreveport, Louisiana

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board interview Dr. Price prior to approving his application to reinstate his North Carolina medical license.

DUNCAN, GEORGE CLOVIS, JR., M.D., Spartanburg, South Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board issue Dr. Duncan a dated license for a period of one year, limited to the Developmental Evaluation Center in Asheville, North Carolina; and that the Board of Medical Examiners interview Dr. Duncan prior to the expiration of this dated, limited license.

MAUK, LOUIS MICHAEL, M.D., Biltmore Forest, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously

adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board will approve Dr. Mauk's medical licensure in this state for a period of one year contingent upon Dr. Mauk's signing a letter: (1) which will be public information; (2) which will contain a reprimand for engaging in the practice of medicine in North Carolina without a license; and (3) which will contain the following stipulations:

- (a) Dr. Mauk will obey all federal and state laws;
- (b) Dr. Mauk will be and remain of high moral character;
- (c) Dr. Mauk will, within a period of one year, furnish evidence of completion of fifty hours of continuing medical education; and
- (d) Dr. Mauk, should he desire continued medical licensure in North Carolina, will appear before the Board for an informal interview prior to the expiration of this dated license.

ASSAD-FALTAS, MARIE-THERESE, M.D., Durham, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board deny approval of Dr. Assad-Faltas' application for medical licensure in North Carolina on the basis of the fact that her postgraduate medical training does not meet North Carolina's statutory requirements.

HABASHI, NEVEEN MAHER, M.D., Southfield, Michigan

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Stratas that the Board deny approval of Dr. Habashi's licensure application on the basis of the fact that she has not completed clinical clerkships in hospitals with ACGME approved residency programs in the specialty areas of Dr. Habashi's clerkships.

FISHER, JOHN APFEL, M.D., Goldsboro, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel, based on Dr. Fisher's compliance with stated conditions, the Board issue Dr. Fisher a dated license for a period of one year.

SUMMERLIN, ROBERT LEE, M.D., Dublin, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board offer Dr. Summerlin an opportunity to enter into a Consent Order with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that, if Dr. Summerlin does not sign and return the Consent Order within a specified time period, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina prefer charges against this physician.

BICKLEY, SAMUEL TAYLOR, M.D., High Point, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board offer Dr. Bickley the opportunity to sign a Consent Order within a specified period of time from the date he receives this document.

PHYSICIANS HEALTH AND EFFECTIVENESS PROGRAM

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina discussed this program. The Board members instructed its representatives to participate in the development of a job description for the Medical Director of this Impaired Physicians Program which reflects the recommendations of the Board of Medical Examiners, particularly regarding the Board's belief that the Medical Director of the Program should be responsible for directing and monitoring the impaired physicians and their recovery programs. The Board members further stated that the Medical Director of the Impaired Physicians Program should follow-up on the status of individuals referred to this program and should provide progress reports to the Board of Medical Examiners.

The Board further discussed the concept that the North Carolina Medical Society should assume the responsibility for funding the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Program and indicated that the Board of Medical Examiners was not prepared to be either the sole, or major, source of financial support.

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously

adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board advertise an administrative hearing to adopt regulations for the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Program and that the Board also approve two additional ex-officio members of the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee Task Force to perform Search Committee functions only.

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board is prepared to authorize an expenditure of \$40,000 for 1988 and \$80,000 for 1989, contingent upon the following conditions:

- (1) Board approval of the Medical Director's job description;
- (2) Board approval of a narrative description of the Program's function;
- (3) Board approval of a budget analysis specifying how the Program will utilize the Board of Medical Examiners' financial contributions;
- (4) The North Carolina Medical Society's obtaining funds to match the Board of Medical Examiners' contributions during 1989; and
- (5) Board approval of a Memorandum of Understanding containing the conditions specified by the Board of Medical Examiners prior to a commitment of funds by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

The Board members recommended that they review a proposed Memorandum of Understanding containing their recommendations for enabling language at the May, 1988, meeting and clearly stated that they would not approve funding prior to the effective date of this Memorandum of Understanding containing conditions acceptable to the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

KELLER, TED STEVEN, M.D., Dayton, Ohio

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board advise Ted S. Keller, M.D., the Board of Medical Examiners expects a response to its offer of January 23, 1988, within two weeks or the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina will initiate formal action procedures.

TAYLOR, STANLEY DOUGLAS, M.D., San Bernardino, California

On March 11, 1988, at 1:15 p.m., the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a hearing on charges preferred against Stanley Douglas Taylor, M.D. Although neither Dr. Taylor nor his counsel attended this hearing, in accordance with N.C.G.S. 90-14.7, the Board of Medical Examiners continued with the hearing procedures.

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board finds the charges preferred against Dr. Taylor to be true and that the Board of Medical Examiners revokes the license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina previously issued to Dr. Taylor.

KROGER FOOD STORES HEALTHY LIFE SERVICES

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board write Kroger Food Store, 1116 Eastchester Drive, High Point, North Carolina, a letter regarding "Healthy Life Services" and that it send a copy of this letter to Kroger Food Store Headquarters.

RESIDENT TRAINING LICENSES PROCEDURES

The Board discussed obtaining a letter from Eastern Virginia School of Medicine which will indicate the type of supervision residents engaged in this medical school's training program have received and which will specifically answer the question: Have clinical faculty members provided supervision to residents?

The Board of Medical Examiners also directed its staff to establish a system whereby the Board is aware of:

- (1) physicians who are participating in training programs,
- (2) the time length of these programs, and
- (3) instances involving extensions of physicians' training programs.

The Board further advised the staff to place temporal limits on residents training licenses.

QUESTIONS ON APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSURE

Dr. Stratas discussed the need for revising the questions on

the Board's application for licensure form to reflect the concerns expressed in the current oral questions; the Executive Secretary offered to consult with Dr. Stratas in revising these questions; and Dr. Stratas and Mr. Paris stated they will present proposed revisions to written application questions for the Board's review.

MOORE, ANTHONY JOSEPH, M.D., Durham, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board extend Dr. Moore's dated license for a period of two years.

ROBERTS, JANIFER C., M.D., Whiteville, North Carolina

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board extend Dr. Roberts' dated license for a period of one year.

COFFMAN, DONALD RALPH, M.D., Greensboro, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander:

- (1) that the Board reaffirm its previous action;
- (2) that the Board offer Donald Ralph Coffman, M.D., the opportunity to enter into the Consent Order originally proposed by the Board of Medical Examiners; and
- (3) that, should Dr. Coffman not sign and return the Consent Order within a specified time period, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina advise him it will proceed with such other actions as the Board deems appropriate.

PATTERSON, BERNARD LOW, M.D., Louisburg, North Carolina

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel:

- (1) that the Board reaffirm its previous action concerning Dr.

Patterson;

- (2) that the Board offer Bernard Low Patterson, M.D., the opportunity to enter into the Consent Order originally proposed by the Board of Medical Examiners; and
- (3) that, should Dr. Patterson not sign and return the Consent Order within a specified time period, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina advise him it will proceed with such other actions as the Board deems appropriate.

SMITH, JOSEPH ARTHUR, M.D., Pennsylvania

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board offer Dr. Smith the opportunity to enter into an agreement specifying:

- (1) if this physician provides a written statement to the Board of Medical Examiners indicating that he will not engage in the practice of medicine in North Carolina, pending resolution, through the appeals process, of the matters concerning the Board,
- (2) and if this physician also indicates in this written statement that he will not engage in medical practice in this state prior to meeting with the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners,

the Board will hold in abeyance any further action concerning Joseph Arthur Smith, M.D.

BATTLE, MARGARET E. WHITE, M.D., Rocky Mount, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, Robert Broyles reported that this physician has retired and has surrendered her DEA prescribing privileges.

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board accept this report as information.

JOURNAL ARTICLE

Dr. Alexander suggested that it would be appropriate to prepare an article for publication in the Journal on the subject of older physicians and retirement.

SMITH, AMAZIAH PARKER, M.D., Goldsboro, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, Robert Broyles reported that this physician has retired from the practice of medicine.

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board accept this report as information.

MOSELY, CHARLES HERBERT, M.D., Anchorage, Alaska

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Stratas that the Board offer Dr. Mosely the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order based on the formal action by the Alaska Medical Board and containing the additional stipulation that, should Dr. Mosely plan to engage in the practice of medicine in North Carolina, he will meet with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina prior to entering into such medical practice.

SHIELDS, JAMES GORDON, JR., M.D., Asheboro, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Mrs. Willis that, should Dr. Shields apply to register his North Carolina medical license, the Board instruct him to meet with the Board of Medical Examiners to complete the registration process; and that, if Dr. Shields has already registered his North Carolina medical license, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina request him to meet with the Board prior to engaging in the practice of medicine in this state.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board instruct the Executive Secretary and its Attorney, if they deem such action to be appropriate, to proceed with the enactment of a legislative change to N.C.Gen.Stat.Sec. 90-14 providing, in substance: unless the Board of Medical determines the existence of mitigating circumstances, conviction of a violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice shall constitute the basis for automatic revocation of license.

STRAUCH, JOSEPH MEYER, M.D., No Address on File

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Duckett that, should Dr. Strauch apply to register his North Carolina medical license, the staff schedule him to appear for an interview as part of the registration process, prior to Dr. Strauch's engaging in the practice of medicine in North Carolina.

ENDODERMOLOGY

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board accept a report on "Endodermology" as information.

DOCTOR SHOPPING: VIDEOTAPE

Dr. Duckett stated that a video tape is being prepared on this subject.

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept a report on this matter as information.

Dr. Duckett reported to the Board members that there may be a cost to produce this videotape which will be absorbed, for the most part, by East Carolina University.

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board approve a reasonable expenditure of funds for this educational videotape in an amount to be decided upon by Dr. Duckett and Dr. Alexander.

GARDNER, ROBERT EDWARD, M.D., Murphy, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Executive Secretary write the following letter to Dr. Gardner:

At its March, 1988, meeting, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina reviewed and accepted as information your letter of February 13, 1988.

MINUTES OF THE JANUARY, 1988, MEETING

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board approve the Minutes of the January, 1988, meeting.

JANUARY, 1989, MEETING

The Board members suggested the North Raleigh Hilton, the Sheraton Imperial, the Pickett Suite Hotel, or the Sienna in Chapel Hill. Dr. Henry volunteered to accompany the staff to look at the accommodations available at the Sienna.

The Board members also recommended January 25-31, 1989, as the dates for this meeting.

MARCH, 1989, MEETING

The Board members discussed that they would prefer not meeting during the ACC tournament; however, they agreed upon the dates of March 15-19, 1989, for this meeting and suggested choosing a site among the locations recommended for the January, 1989, meeting. The Board also suggested obtaining meeting rooms larger than the Zurich Room at the Europa.

MORRISON, CAROL A., M.D.: THE KELLEY PROGRAM

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board advise Dr. Morrison, if she wishes to engage in the practice of medicine in North Carolina, she should apply for a medical licensure.

ANABOLIC STEROIDS, OHIO BOARD

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel

that the Board accept as information a report on the Ohio Board of Medical Examiners' rule concerning the use of anabolic steroids.

STATE LIBRARY

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Henry that the President of the Board advise Mr. David Bevan the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has appointed Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary of the Board of Medical Examiners, Post Office Box 26808, 1313 Navaho Drive, Raleigh, North Carolina 27609, Telephone: (919) 876-3885, to serve as Publications Officer for the Board.

BUSINESS LICENSE INFORMATION OFFICE

- (3) that he submit his practice activities to such monitoring as the Board deems appropriate.

KENDALL, JOHN HAROLD, M.D., Clinton, North Carolina

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Stratas that the Board commend Dr. Kendall for his decision to retire

by January 1, 1989, and that it request him to provide the Board of Medical Examiners with written notification of his retirement.

SMITH, ASHLEY ALLGOOD, M.D., Calhoun, Georgia

On March 10, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that, as the Board of Medical Examiners has determined Dr. Smith's completion of a Fifth Pathway Program satisfies the remedial provisions of the Regulations of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, the Board approve Ashley Allgood Smith, M.D., for licensure.

BROWN, ELDON JAMES, M.D., Chapel Hill, North Carolina

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that, as Dr. Brown's answer to a question on the Board of Medical Examiners' application form constitutes unprofessional conduct in violation of N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14(a)(6), the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina offer Dr. Brown the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order containing a reprimand for this statutory violation.

STANLEY, KARL HARVEY, JR., M.D., Whiteville, North Carolina

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board accept as information notification of Dr. Stanley's licensure surrender and that it advise Dr. Stanley, in order for the Board of Medical Examiners to consider approving him for licensure:

- (1) he must provide the Board with concrete evidence that he has been drug-free for one year;
- (2) he must submit to a minimum of twelve urine screens during this one year period;

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board finds the charges preferred against Dr. McDonald to be true.

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion, made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board orders that the license previously issued to William McDonald, M.D., be revoked.

GABRIELCZYK, M.R., M.B., B.S., Durham, North Carolina

On March 11, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina hold action on Dr. Gabrielczyk's request for extension of licensure in abeyance pending receipt of further information from William Anlyan, M.D., regarding this request; and that, if Dr. Anlyan endorses the request for extension of licensure, the Board of Medical Examiners extend Dr. Gabrielczyk's Visiting Professor Registration for a period not to exceed six months.

DRUG ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION: DON BROWN, DIVERSION GROUP

In response to an invitation from the Board of Medical Examiners, Mr. Don Brown, Diversion Group Supervisor, Drug Enforcement Administration, Greensboro, North Carolina, discussed his activities with the Board which relate to the practice of medicine.

Don Brown advised the Board members that the classification for the controlled substances: Doriden and Talwin, will soon change to Schedule 2. He further explained, "The Drug Enforcement Administration supports the state when state drug controls are stricter than those of the federal government and vice versa."

The President of the Board of Medical Examiners thanked Mr.

Brown for providing the Board with this report and stated, "I believe it will be to the Board of Medical Examiners' benefit to meet with you again." Mr. Brown indicated his willingness to meet with the Board members for future discussions.

At the conclusion of the interview, the President of the Board stated that he believed the Journal should publish some of the information presented by this representative of the Drug Enforcement Administration and further stated that, as President, he will write a letter on behalf of the Board expressing its appreciation for Mr. Brown's informative presentation.

BRESSLER, BERNARD, M.D., Virginia

The Board's Attorney reported that Dr. Bressler has indicated, after completion of litigation on one final case, he will surrender his license to practice medicine in North Carolina.

On March 12, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Stratas that, if Dr. Bressler has not surrendered his license prior to the June, 1988, meeting, the Board of Medical Examiners hold a hearing on charges preferred against Bernard Bressler, M.D., at its June, 1988, Board meeting.

MALPRACTICE REPORTS FROM INSURANCE COMPANIES

RIZK, MAGDY W., M.D., Sugar Land, Texas

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board accept as information a report indicating that this physician has withdrawn her application for a license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina.

SHEARIN, WILLIAM ARTHUR, M.D., Raleigh, North Carolina

At his request Dr. Shearin appeared before the Board. He stated, "I am the President of the Ophthalmologists Society for this year. The Advisory Board wanted me to come to you and asked that I discuss with you some of its concerns. Post-operative care is the main concern; and most Ophthalmologists believe that the operating surgeon or another Ophthalmologist should provide this post-operative care."

Dr. Shearin then asked the Board of Medical Examiners to define what it believes to be an appropriate period of post-operative care for a cataract patient. Dr. Alexander told Dr. Shearin, "The Board of Medical Examiners represents medical practice throughout the state of North Carolina. Although the Board agrees with your position regarding Ophthalmologists' providing

post-operative care to their patients, it cannot specify to Ophthalmologists how long they should follow patients post-operatively."

Dr. Stratas suggested, "Ophthalmologists could formally accept certain practices as representing the standards of care in North Carolina. The Board would then have this information as reference."

The President of the Board of Medical Examiners told Dr. Shearin, "The Board appreciates your bringing these matters to its attention and expressing your concerns. Moreover, it requests that you notify the Board of Medical Examiners of any specific practice which you believe a representative of this Board should investigate."

HOSPITAL MANDATORY REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett:

QUESTION FROM THE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Executive Secretary advise Christine H. Lockwood it is the opinion of the Board the procedures described in Dr. Homoly's letter are outside the scope of the practice of dentistry and may encroach on the practice of medicine.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES REPORT

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board endorse the following recommendations of John Thomas Daniel, M.D., Liaison Representative from the Board of Medical Examiners to the Office of Emergency Medical Services:

- (1) that the Board approve all Advanced Life Support Applications and Bee Sting Certifications presented by the Office of Emergency Medical Services;
- (2) that the Board hold action on the application submitted by Marty Edwards in abeyance pending receipt of additional information.
- (3) that the Board approve the Documents submitted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services as required by the Advanced Life Support Regulations which will become effective May 1, 1988;
- (4) that the Board advise C. J. Schmidt, M.D., there are statutory requirements and regulations with which he must comply and that the Board of Medical Examiners recommends you coordinate your efforts concerning this matter with Mr. Ed Browning, Assistant Chief-Education, Office of Emergency Medical Services.

STEVENS, ROBERT G., M.D., Kitty Hawk, North Carolina

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board accept a letter from this physician as information.

WATSON, NEIL, M.D., England

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board not approve this physician's request to take the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX).

MAGEE, ARCHIBALD CARTER, M.D., Washington, North Carolina

On March 13, 1988, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Duckett:


