

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina

May 17 - 18, 1970

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, May 17-18, 1970 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement and for other business.

Sunday, May 17

2:30 P. M. - The Board convened and Drs. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr., Cornelius T. Partrick and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary, were present.

RE: Dr. Nadia N. Malouf, graduate of the American University of Beirut - She has taken and passed the Flex examination given by the California Board of Medical Examiners, but is not as yet eligible for California license as she has not met the internship requirement. She is coming to North Carolina with her husband and can not meet this requirement at this time. Dr. K. M. Brinkhous, Chairman of the Department of Pathology has informed the Board that he would like to appoint Dr. Malouf as an instructor in Pathology beginning August 1st, 1970. She has alien registration receipt card.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that the Board of Medical Examiners accept the Flex examination given by California to Dr. Nadia N. Malouf, provided she meets the requirements of this Board. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Vyashanakere Satyanarayana Rao was originally granted special limited license to train at Watts Hospital, transferred to New Hanover Memorial Hospital in 1969, and has advised that he desired to transfer to Watts Hospital as fellow in Surgery. Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. stated that he had been offered fellowship in Surgery to supervise the breast clinic.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that Dr. Vyashanakere Satyanarayana Rao's special limited license be extended for one year to Watts Hospital to work as a fellow under Dr. James E. Davis. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed unanimously.

RE: Personnel State Institutions - (See Minutes March, 1970) - The Board of Medical Examiners reconsidered its resolution of the March, 1970 meeting and the secretary presented statement with proposal from the Commissioner and Regional Commissioner of the State Department of Mental Health dated May 6, 1970 as follows:

"The North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners and the Department of Mental Health, in a jointly sponsored continuing program that enables the Department of Mental Health to recruit highly qualified foreign graduate physicians, present the following guidelines:

- "1. All applicants and any questions about them should be handled through the Department of Mental Health's liaison person with the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners, Dr. William M. Fowlkes, Jr.
- "2. No applicant is to be employed by the Department of Mental Health until the physician's eligibility for licensure is established by the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners.
- "3. All applicants must have passed the E. C. F. M. G. and possess their alien registration receipt card.



"4. These physicians will be employed in a training capacity which will be certified by the employing institution in a letter to the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners. During this period, the Department of Mental Health will provide formal training programs for these men to qualify them for staff physician positions in the Department which would be dependent upon their passing the examination of the North Carolina. These examinations are given in June and December and the trainee must take the first examination after his employment.

"Failure to pass this examination means the physician trainee cannot be employed as a staff physician in the Department, or remain any longer as a trainee.

"This does not apply to physicians who are in the Department of Mental Health's approved residency training programs."

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that the Board of Medical Examiners endorse the principal as presented by the Department of Mental Health, with the modification that the physician must take and pass the first or second available examination of the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners after employment begins. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Conversion of Limited to Full License - A motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously that the following doctors' limited licenses be converted to full license, provided all requirements are met:

RE: Flex Examination - Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that our Board representative attending the Flex Examination Committee meeting be granted the North Carolina per diem, not to be retroactive.

Substitute motion - Dr. Large moved that this per diem be made retroactive. This motion was seconded by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Flex Examination - Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the three deans of the medical schools be invited to come and view the Flex examination; that the schedule of the examination be furnished; that they might be able to send an assistant. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. James Spullock Lambert (See Minutes March, 1970) - The secretary reported that the Councilor had advised following investigation he could find no evidence of drug abuse in that community; that the Pharmacy Board had reported it would make an investigation when an agent was in that area. This was received as information.

RE: Dr. A. Jones Smith - The secretary presented letter from Dr. Edgar T. Beddingfield, Jr., President of the North Carolina Medical Society, saying that the State Bureau of Investigation had reported to him there had been complaints made against Dr. Smith in the nature that he was indiscriminately prescribing and dispensing large amounts of amphetamines and barbiturates. He also reported the State Bureau of Investigation agent later indicated that upon investigation records were in order.

The Board stated that it would hold this matter in abeyance until report of the State Bureau of Investigation received.



RE: Dr. William Hines - The secretary presented letters from Dr. Edgar T. Beddingfield, President of the North Carolina State Medical Society, alleging misuse of drugs and advised that the State Bureau of Investigation had made an investigation, a copy of which has not been received by this Board.

The Board stated that it would hold this matter in abeyance until report of the State Bureau of Investigation is received.

RE: Narcotic Tax Stamp - Letter was submitted from Dr. Edgar T. Beddingfield, Jr., President of the North Carolina State Medical Society with regard to two physicians in Asheville not having narcotic tax stamps and that there had been no notification to the hospital and whether or not hospitals should be notified when a physician loses his narcotic tax stamp. The Board directed that a conference be held with Dr. Beddingfield. (See p.39 below these Minutes).

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials and residents' training license were reviewed by members of the Board.

The meeting was adjourned.

Conference with Dr. Edgar T. Beddingfield, President of the State Medical Society.

RE: Dr. James Gilles, graduate of the University of Glasgow, Scotland - Dr. Edgar T. Beddingfield, Jr. presented letter from Dr. F. D. Burroughs, Hatteras, making an appeal on behalf of Dr. Gilles. He is presently practicing in North Dakota, he does not have the certificate of the ECFMG and desires to locate at Hatteras. Dr. Beddingfield asked that the Board give this matter special consideration due to the fact that the only physician there was leaving at an early date.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved with respect to Dr. James Gilles that the requirement of the certificate of the ECFMG be waived in consideration of his taking the Flex examination. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick and passed unanimously.

Dr. Gilles is to be interviewed on June 15th.

RE: Corporation Regulations - Certain changes were made by Attorney John H. Anderson and presented to the Board for its consideration.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that changes be made in the corporation regulations as advised by the attorney for the Board. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick and passed unanimously.

RE: Narcotic Tax Stamp -(See page 39 above) - VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the Board direct the secretary to notify the Executive Secretary of the North Carolina State Medical Society with regard to the surrendering of narcotic tax stamp by a physician. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and passed unanimously.

A. As soon as I am licensed.

RESOLVED: That the medical license of the above listed physicians be reinstated.

RE: Dr. Elizabeth Mayrand, Advance, North Carolina, who had received notice of suspension for failure to register as required by law biennially, appeared and stated that this was an oversight on her part; that she would pay the fee and penalty. She had a change of address and did not receive notice.

RE: Dr. J. J. Richardson (See previous Minutes) - He appeared to petition for recommendation of reinstatement of his narcotic tax stamp. He stated that he had surgery on his ankle, which was a success, and that he expected to return to his practice of surgery in the near future; that he felt that in his situation, in a small town with a limited number of doctors, he needed his narcotic tax stamp. The Board received a strong recommendation from one of his constituents in that area.

Dr. Richardson was given report of the action of the Board by the president.

RE: Dr. Paul J. Chambers- (See previous Minutes) - It was reported by the secretary that Dr. Chambers surrendered his narcotic tax stamp and unused order forms to the Internal Revenue Center as directed.

RE: Biennial Registration - Suspension - Following notice given by mail for failure to register as required by law that they appear before the Board of Medical Examiners at 12:30 P. M. 
