The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Pinehurst Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, May 3-4, 1979, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and other business.

Drs. David S. Citron, President; Bryant L. Galusha, Secretary; Bruce B. Blackmon, Louis T. Kermon, A. T. Pagter, Jr., J. J. Pence, Jr., and Joyce H. Reynolds were present. Also present were Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary; Mrs. Betty Joe Barick, Assistant Executive Secretary; Mr. Lee Denney; and Mrs. Sibyl Lamoreaux.

The Board convened for business and reviewing credentials of physicians applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Elliott Hershel Klain, D.O., Fayetteville, North Carolina -- Mr. Paris reported on his osteopathic survey. There are thirty-one states that require some postgraduate training. Eighteen of those states responded that they did, in fact, license osteopaths to practice unlimited medicine, and that required one year postgraduate training in an approved DO program. Eight states responding indicated that they did not license osteopaths. Four states license osteopaths but do not require postgraduate training. Nebraska has a Board of Medicine and a Board of Osteopathy, and, if a doctor of osteopathy has graduated before a certain date, he can only practice osteopathic medicine; but, if he has graduated after a certain date and has passed FLEX, he can practice medicine; if he has completed two years of AMA approved surgical training, he can practice medicine and surgery. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that we recognize, as do all other except one state, American graduates of AOA approved American postgraduate training programs.

RE: Registration Form -- The Board reviewed the registration form. Certain changes in the form have been suggested. There are some suggested questions which may or may not be necessary in determining the physician's qualifications to practice medicine. It is questionable whether or not the Board has any authority to request physicians to respond to these questions. There should be no objection to asking a physician's speciality, but there have been objections to some questions asked on the registration form. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that Dr. Galusha bring to the Board his recommendations concerning this form. Dr. Galusha reported the following: Primary and secondary specialties should be required information as should board certification. The phrase "board eligible" should be deleted, as this could be misleading to patients. The section on educational background should be retained. Internship should be moved up allowing two lines for residency. Race should be deleted. Name and professional address, as well as license number and county of practice, should be retained. Birthplace and sex should be deleted. Date of birth should be retained. The form should be signed and home address indicated. The reverse side should be incorporated as it now stands with a line included indicating this is optional, highly desirable information that we hope you will see fit to fill out. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that the front side be required, and that the reverse side be optional. This motion was amended to place race and sex in the optional portion.

RE: Edmundo Guillemin Morales, M.D., Fairfax, Virginia -- Dr. Morales appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He does not have the ECFMG. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that this application be denied on the basis of the fact that he does not have the standard certificate of ECFMG.



RE: Jacob Alexander Orbock, M.D., Canadaigua, New York -- Dr. Orbock appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that he be licensed on a temporary basis from year to year for a period of five years, and that at the end of this time period he could become eligible for permanent licensure. He should be notified to come before the Board at the March, 1980, meeting.

RE: Ali Shirkhoda, M.D., Chapel Hill, North Carolina -- Dr. Shirkhoda is on an H-1 Visa and does not have full immigrant status. He has requested a temporary license for one year, by the end of which time he feels certain he will have his immigrant visa. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that he be given a temporary license for a period of a year until he receives his immigrant status.

RE: Walter Glenn Lewis, M.D., Gibsonville, North Carolina -- Following review of information presented and on motion made, seconded, and duly passed, the Board voted to institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Walter Glenn Lewis, M.D., that he be so notified in writing, and that he be advised that he will be given a hearing on such charges that will be presented against him.

RE: Mileage Increase -- Mr. Paris reported that the current cost for operating a medium-size car is .33 per mile. The Board and staff are presently receiving .17 per mile. Mr. Paris requested that the mileage cost be increased to .20 per mile for the staff members. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that the cost per mile be increased to .20 for staff members of the Board of Medical Examiners.

RE: AOA Post Graduate Training -- It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that the AOA be informed of the Board's action on Doctors of Osteopathy.

RE: Leon I. Hammer, M.D., East Hampton, New York -- Dr. Hammer had applied for license by endorsement of credentials. On April 8, he sent a letter asking to withdraw his application. It was moved, seconded, and duly passed that this report be accepted as information.


