**EMS REPORT**

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board approve the 190 initial applications and 195 recertification applications for Advanced Life Support personnel submitted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services. The Board also adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board approve the 232 Bee Sting Certifications submitted by the Office of Emergency Medical Services.

**EMS MEETING**

On May 5, 1989, Ed Browning, Assistant Chief-Education, of the Office of Emergency Medical Services and Dr. Nicholas Benson, the EMS Medical Director, met with the Board to discuss the following recommended regulatory changes to the mobile intensive care regulations:

1. Add the pharyngo-tracheal lumen airway, as an alternative airway adjunct for EMT-Intermediates, EMT-Advanced Intermediates and EMT-Paramedics
2. Add external cardiac pacing as a skill for EMT-Advanced Intermediates and EMT-Paramedics
3. Add the skill of establishing an intraosseous infusion line in appropriate patients to administer any intravenous fluid or drug approved by the Board for EMT-Advanced Intermediates and EMT-Paramedics
4. Allow EMT-Advanced Intermediates to administer parenterally, orally, or topically any drugs approved by the Board of Medical Examiners for use by EMT-AIs.

In addition, the following items were discussed and approval from the Board was sought:

5. The elimination of the number of units required on the mandatory EMT-advanced intermediate minimum drug list

6. An exemption for Cape Lookout National Seashore
7. Approval of optional EMT-paramedic drug formulary as presented
8. Approval of the MICN's as presented
9. Approval of a reasonable time for co-signature by a physician or medical director relative to orders issued by MICNs.

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Stratas that items 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 enumerated above be approved. It should be noted that item 3 is to be used in truly a life and death situation and will not be used on any patient over the age of two years.

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Stratas that item 7 above be approved with the drugs Amyl Nitrite Pearls, Sodium Nitrite and Sodium Thiosulfate deleted.

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Nance that item 8 above be approved, however, the Board has requested detailed information on which hospitals now use MICNs (detailed on a county-by-county basis) and whether those hospitals are staffed by physicians 24 hours a day.

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Daniel that, relative to item 9, the physician on duty countersign the orders immediately and, in situations where the hospital is not staffed by a physician, the orders can be signed by the Medical Director within 24 to 72 hours.

The Board also indicated it would like to receive a report of the number of cyanide cases that have received treatment and who have survived.

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Stratas that the Board write to Dr. Burke of Northern Hospital of Surry County to inform him that it is the opinion of the Board of Medical Examiners that the supervising physician should be actually present if and when a circumcision is performed by a physician extender.

### **PHYSICIAN EXTENDER DUTIES**

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Chairman of the PA Subcommittee, the Chairman of the NP Subcommittee and Mrs. Willis meet to determine reasonable suggestions on exactly what duties a PA and NP can and cannot perform.

### **PE ORDERING CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES**

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Henry that an extender may receive a verbal order from his supervising physician for a controlled substance and transcribe that order onto the patient's chart for administration to the patient in the same manner that an RN transcribes orders for controlled substances (VO dr. Jones/John Smith, PA) and have the physician co-sign that verbal order on the patient chart within 24-72 hours; and that a letter be sent to Jeff Katz of the NC PA Academy informing him of this action.

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Stratas that the Board accept the formulary as revised.

On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Stratas and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Executive Secretary prepare a draft letter to be sent to anyone who has not re-registered informing them of the alternatives open to the Board, i.e., injunctive procedures against anyone practicing medicine without a license. Also, this letter, or an article, should be placed in the N.C. Medical Journal and Bulletin along with a list of physicians whose licenses have been suspended.

## **MEETING WITH DR. VANDERBERRY, PHEP**

On May 5, 1989, Dr. Robert Vanderberry, Medical Director of the PHEP program, met with the full Board. He reported that he had just returned from Denver, Colorado, where he met with his counterparts from the various states. There are 47 committees in the 50 states, 27 full-time programs with 20 full-time directors. He indicated that not all states have the working relationship with the Medical Board and Medical Society that North Carolina has.

Dr. Vanderberry presented an update on activity. There are 64 participants, 56 are active, 8 are inactive. There are three in treatment in and out of the state at the present time. There have been as many as five in treatment at one time. Dr. Vanderberry presented that there are 34 Board Action cases and 21 program cases. He indicated that he would have no problem sending the full Board the Board cases only. However, he would have a problem sending all the members of the Board the program cases. At this point it was agreed that he would furnish the Board with the Board Action cases only.

Dr. Vanderberry indicated his willingness in having the Physician Assistants become a part of the PHEP program. It was noted that legislatively, the PA's are not part of the bill creating PHEP. The bill would have to be rewritten and funds would have to be obtained.

The Board unanimously passed a motion of support for Dr. Vanderberry's recommendation of an Executive Assistant being hired this year. However, funds have not been allocated in the budget.

The Board suggested that PHEP cost out the services for the treatment, monitoring, etc., for each individual and once they are recovered, request a donation in the amount it cost to assist them. Dr. Vanderberry indicated that the percentage mix for program participants is 90% substance abuse, 5+% psychiatric.

## **UPDATE ON PROPOSED LEGISLATION**

On May 5, 1989, Mr. Breeze presented an update on current legislation.

The bill approving the use of steroids has been withdrawn.

803 - This an attempt by a coalition of anesthesiologists and ophthalmologists to define the practice of surgery. At present, it is not scheduled for hearing. On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Patterson that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina oppose Bill 803 as written. Dr. Stratas opposed the motion and voted for the bill.

949 - Also known as the Medical Ethics Practice Act. On May 5, 1989, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Patterson and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board opposes this bill.
