Minutes of the Open Sessions of the North Carolina Medical Board Meeting May 19-21, 2004.

The May 19-21, 2004, meeting of the North Carolina Medical Board was held at the Board's Office, 1203 Front Street, Raleigh, NC 27609. MISCELLANEOUS

Presidential Remarks

Dr. Herring commenced the meeting by reading from Governor Easley's Executive Order No. 1, the "ethics awareness and conflict of interest reminder." No conflicts were reported.

Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) Annual Meeting Debrief

The President asked for feedback from Board Member attendees at the recent FSMB Annual Meeting held in Washington, DC, April 29 – May 1, 2004. As the Board's Representative, Ms. Hunter Buskey provided a brief on meetings and break-outs she attended. During the "Day on the Hill" held in conjunction with the Federation's Annual Meeting, more than 150 state medical board representatives visited with their Congressional members and staff. She noted that Dr. George Barrett, a past Board President, was given a distinguished honor award. Although she did not get elected to the FSMB Board of Directors, she thanked those that supported her.

Other comments from Board Members: a lot of items had already been discussed at the Board (dated material), energized meeting, and good breakout sessions. Dr. Fretwell would like to talk about the implications of "*Wall of Silence: The Untold Story of Medical Mistakes that Kill and Injure Millions of Americans*," by Rosemary Gibson, who sat in on some of the Public Member Forums.

Dr. Herring summarized by saying the Board needs to get members on panels and nominate members for FSMB positions yearly. He also indicated that the breakout sessions were excellent but that he wished the format had been different so that he could have attended all rather than only two of the four.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Stephen Herring, MD; Charles Garrett, MD; Robert Moffatt, MD; Arthur McCulloch, MD; Aloysius Walsh

The Executive Committee of the North Carolina Medical Board was called to order at 10:40 am, Wednesday May 19, 2004 at the offices of the Board. Members present were: Stephen M. Herring, MD, Chair; Charles L. Garrett, MD; Harlan A. McCulloch, MD; Robert C. Moffatt, MD; and Aloysius P. Walsh. Also present were Janelle A. Rhyne, MD, R. David Henderson (Executive Director), Hari Gupta (Director of Operations), and Peter T. Celentano, CPA (Comptroller).

Financials

Mr. Celentano, CPA, presented to the committee the March 2004 compiled financial statements. March is the fifth month of fiscal year 2004.

The Boards' deficit continued to decrease for fiscal year 2004 and should approach breakeven by the end of the fiscal year. Mr. Celentano explained to the Committee about several income items that are seasonal and which historically peak in the spring and early summer months, including Temporary License, License by Endorsement, Resident Training Licenses and Datalink Income.

The March 2004 Investment Summary was reviewed and accepted as presented.

Dr. Garrett made a motion to accept the financial statements as reported. Dr. Moffatt seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

Old Business

There was no old business to discuss.

New Business

Pulse Athletic Club membership: Mr. Celentano explained to the Committee the arrangement that had been made a year ago to encourage the staff to join a local health club (Pulse Athletic Club). The Board agreed to pay ½ of the monthly dues (\$17.50) to any employee who joined this club under the one-year contract. This contract ran from June 1, 2003 thru May 31, 2004. Several employees have asked if the Board would expand this option and agree to reimburse an employee the same \$17.50 regardless of what health club an employee joins or is a current member of. Pulse Athletic Club has proposed the same rates going forward and has eliminated the term contract. The funds for 20 employees (at \$17.50 per month) have been budgeted thru the end of fiscal year (10/31/2004). Dr. Garrett made a motion to allow the reimbursement to staff of up to \$17.50 per month on a continuing basis regardless of which health club the employee joins. This would become effective on June 1, 2004. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

Human Resource Director - Budget: Mr. Celentano explained to the Committee that just about a year ago the Board approved the hiring of a Director of Human Resources. The Board agreed to allow the staff to hire a part-time Director of Human Resources for a period of one year. The staff recommends to the Board that they consider making this position a permanent part-time position in the organizational structure of the Board. The funds for this have been budgeted thru the end of fiscal year (10/31/2004). Dr. Moffatt made a motion to make this position a permanent part-time position in the organizational structure of the Board. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

Personnel Update: Mr. Celentano informed the Committee that currently we are short one person in the Licensing Department due to Tammy O'Hare's recent departure. Kelli Singleton has moved into that position which leaves us one Licensing position short. We

currently have filled one of our temporary positions in the Licensing Department to help with the inflow of Graduate Medical Training Licenses.

The Investigative Department is also actively looking to fill the vacant Wilmington/Fayetteville Investigator position that has been vacant since Jason Ward took a position with the DEA in April. Curt Ellis is currently conducting a search and has interviewed several candidates.

Board Meeting Schedule: Dr. Garrett informed the Committee that the schedule for hearings during the remainder of calendar year 2004 and 2005 has filled up rapidly. As a result of this, Dr. Garrett made a motion that an additional day (Friday) be added to the August and October meetings, both of which are scheduled two-day meetings. This could be accomplished without additional budget considerations due to the fact that we are not scheduling a December 2004 Board Meeting. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously. The December 2004 Board Meeting would be eliminated. Dr. Moffatt asked about the December 2004 vote list for Licensing. Dr. Garrett and Mr. Henderson stated that this could be accomplished via telephone conference, email, mail referendum or CD.

Dr. Garrett and Dr. Herring also wanted to formally thank the Legal Department for the work done on cleaning up the backlog of cases.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:25am.

POLICY COMMITTEE REPORT

Termination/Denial of Monitoring services by NCPHP (Ms. Bason)

At the March 2004 Medical Board Meeting the North Carolina Physician Health Program Board of Directors referred the following to the Policy Committee for review:

(Excerpt from NCPHP Board of Directors Meeting of March 17, 2004.)

"Dr. Gather brought up a new agenda item that had been raised for discussion by Dr. Kanof at Compliance Committee just prior to the Board of Directors meeting. The issue under

consideration is a possible policy regarding termination or denial of monitoring services by NCPHP in selected cases of repeated relapse and/or non-compliance where there is felt to be a very poor prognosis. The board Members undertook an initial discussion of whether development of such a policy should move forward, and if so, what would be the general guidelines for this action by the Medical Directors and/or Compliance Committee.

The initial consensus was that further consideration of this idea is appropriate. Such a policy would likely be implemented largely on a case-by-case basis, and Compliance Committee would have to discuss and approve action in each individual case. Legal opinion would probably be sought prior to any approval of a written policy by the Board of Directors.

The Board Members agreed that input on a possible policy would be sought from appropriate stakeholders in the NCPHP mission, including the NC Medical Board and the NC Medical Society, with further discussion at the next Board of Directors meeting.”

Action: This item is referred back to the NCPHP Committee for additional information and possibly a joint meeting with representatives from the NCPHP Committee.

Periodic Review of Position Statements

(Ms. Bason)

Dr. Moffatt stated that the Board position statements should be formally reviewed periodically by the Board, and that the review date should be included with the position statement, much like the revision dates.

Dr. Saunders agreed that the 3-year review cycle made more sense to him. He then proceeded to discuss his memo to the committee members regarding his review of the current position statements.

Dr. Rhyne disseminated and discussed her proposal for the reordering of the position statements and a possible numbering system. Mr. Breaden explained that the current order is based on like topics being put together.

Action: For the July Committee Meeting: (1) Dr. Moffatt, Dr. Rhyne and Dr. McCulloch will review '*Management of Chronic Non-Malignant Pain*'; (2) Dr. Saunders and Mr. Walsh will review '*The Use of Anorectics in Treatment of Obesity*'; and (3) Dr. Saunders and Dr. Rhyne will work together to formulate a numbering system and a rotation/review schedule for the position statements.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 3:45 p.m. The next meeting of the Policy Committee is tentatively set for 3:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 21, 2004.

ALLIED HEALTH COMMITTEE REPORT

CPP Practice - The history of this topic was given by Ms. Hunter Buskey. The possibility of CPP site checks was passed from the Allied Health Committee to the Compliance committee, but the committee disbanded. A checklist was created for the investigators to use for the CPP site check, but has never been used. With the increased number of approved CPP's in NC, the committee requested at the April 2004 Meeting random site checks to be performed. The investigations department explained that site checks are not performed randomly. The Allied Health Committee discussed the issue again, and still feels the need to perform site checks where CPP's practice. The full Board opposed the proposal, however, this item will be placed back on a future agenda when the Investigative Department is fully staffed.

Nurse Practitioner new rule change proposals – The Allied Health Committee discussed the remaining changes that the Medical Board wishes to incorporate in the NP rules. These items include the termination of temporary approval and interim status, strengthening the language regarding discipline (by including statutory authority to rule), and the reference to Collaborative Practice Agreements in the scope of practice definition. This language will be drafted and distributed to the NP Joint Subcommittee members before its next meeting in July 2004.

RTLs for non-ACGME programs

Catchline: ECU School of Medicine wants to set up a “non-accredited ACGME fellowship” in diabetes. The House Staff Office wants to know if the Board will issue resident training licenses to physicians who are participating in a “non-accredited” program. Past Boards have issued resident training licenses to physicians who were not enrolled in ACGME accredited programs.
