EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Members present were: George L. Saunders, MD; Donald E. Jablonski, DO; Janelle A. Rhyne, MD; Janice E. Huff, MD and John B. Lewis, Jr. Also present were R. David Henderson (Executive Director), and Peter T. Celentano, CPA (Comptroller).

Financial Statements

Mr. Celentano, CPA, presented the March 2009 compiled financial statements. March is the fifth month of fiscal year 2009. Mr. Celentano also reviewed the Board's current cash position as of March 31, 2009. Dr. Jablonski made a motion to accept the financial statements as reported. Dr. Saunders seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

<u>Proposed 2010 Meeting / Hearing Schedule</u>: Mr. Henderson reviewed with the Committee the proposed 2010 Board Meeting / Hearing schedule. Dr. Rhyne made a motion to accept the schedule of NCMB Board Meeting dates as proposed. Dr. Jablonski seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

Medical Conditions Renewal Question: Mr. Henderson reviewed with the Committee the results of a study conducted by the staff. Approximately one year ago, the "medical conditions" question on the annual renewal form was changed to require licensees to list all their medical conditions. Prior to that time, the licensee only had to answer "yes " or "no" to whether he/she had a medical condition that would affect his/her ability to practice safely. The Board voted to ask for all medical conditions so that the Board, not the licensee, could decide whether the medical condition might affect the person's ability to practice safely. The study indicates the current question has not uncovered many licensees of concern and requires a large amount of staff time. In addition, it has generated a perception of overreaching by the Medical Board. The staff recommends to the Committee to return to the original wording of question #5 on the renewal form. Dr. Rhyne made a motion to change the wording of question #5 on the renewal form back to the original wording but retain the wording for this question on license applications. Dr. Jablonski seconded the motion and the motion was approved unanimously.

RETENTION OF MEDICAL RECORDS

Physicians have both a legal and ethical obligation to retain patient records. The Board, therefore, recognizes the necessity and importance of a licensee's proper maintenance, retention, and disposition of medical records. The following guidelines are offered to assist licensees in meeting their ethical and legal obligations:

- State and federal laws require that records be kept for a minimum length of time including but not limited to:1
 - Medicare and Medicaid Investigations (up to 7 years);

HIPAA (up to 6 years);

- Medical Malpractice (varies depending on the case but should be measured from the date of the last professional contact with the patient)—physicians should check with their medical malpractice insurer);
- North Carolina has no statute relating specifically to the retention of medical records:
- Immunization records always must be kept.
- In addition to existing state and federal laws, medical considerations may also provide the basis for deciding how long to retain medical records. Patients

Physicians should retain medical records as long as needed not only to serve and protect patients, but also to protect themselves against adverse actions. The times stated may fall below the community standard for retention in their communities and practice settings and for the specific needs. Physicians are encouraged (may want to) seek advice from private counsel and/or their malpractice insurance carrier.

should be notified regarding how long the physician will retain medical records.

- In deciding whether to keep certain parts of the record, an appropriate criterion is whether a physician would want the information if he or she were seeing the patient for the first time. The Board, therefore, recognizes that the retention policies of physicians giving one-time, brief episodic care may differ from those of physicians providing continuing care for patients.
- In order to preserve confidentiality when discarding old records, all records should be destroyed, including both paper and electronic medical records.
- Those licensees providing episodic care should attempt to provide a copy of the patient's record to the patient, the patient's primary care provider, or, if applicable, the referring physician.
- If it is feasible, patients should be given an opportunity to claim the records or have them sent to another physician before old records are discarded.
- The physician should respond in a timely manner to requests from patients for copies of their medical records or to access to their medical records.
- Physicians should notify patients of the amount, and under what circumstances, the physician will charge for copies of a patient's medical record, keeping in mind that N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-411 provides limits on the fee a physician can charge for copying of medical records.

MEDICAL RECORD DOCUMENTATION

The North Carolina Medical Board takes the position that an accurate, current and complete medical record is an essential component of patient care. Licensees should maintain a medical record for each patient to whom they provide care. The medical record should contain an appropriate history and physical examination, results of ancillary studies, diagnoses, and any plan for treatment. The medical record should be legible. When the care giver does not handwrite legibly, notes should be dictated, transcribed, reviewed, and signed within a reasonable time. The Board recognizes and encourages the trend towards the use of electronic medical records ("EMR"). However, the Board cautions against relying upon software that pre-populates particular fields in the EMR without updating those fields in order to create a medical record that accurately reflects the elements delineated in this Position Statement.

The medical record is a chronological document that:

- records pertinent facts about an individual's health and wellness;
- enables the treating care provider to plan and evaluate treatments or interventions:
- enhances communication between professionals, assuring the patient optimum continuity of care;
- assists both patient and physician to communicate to third party participants;
- allows the physician to develop an ongoing quality assurance program;
- provides a legal document to verify the delivery of care; and
- is available as a source of clinical data for research and education.

The following required elements should be present in all medical records:

- 1. The record reflects the purpose of each patient encounter and appropriate information about the patient's history and examination, and the care and treatment provided are described.
- 2. The patient's past medical history is easily identified and includes serious accidents, operations, significant illnesses and other appropriate information.
- 3. Medication and other significant allergies, or a statement of their absence, are prominently noted in the record.
- 4. When appropriate, informed consent obtained from the patient is clearly documented.
- 5. All entries are dated.

The following additional elements reflect commonly accepted standards for medical record documentation.

- 1. Each page in the medical record contains the patient's name or ID number.
- 2. Personal biographical information such as home address, employer, marital status, and all telephone numbers, including home, work, and mobile phone numbers.
- 3. All entries in the medical record contain the author's identification. Author identification may be a handwritten signature, initials, or a unique electronic identifier.
- 4. All drug therapies are listed, including dosage instructions and, when appropriate, indication of refill limits. Prescriptions refilled by phone should be recorded.
- 5. Encounter notes should include appropriate arrangements and specified times for follow-up care.
- 6. All consultation, laboratory and imaging reports should be entered into the patient's record, reviewed, and the review documented by the practitioner who ordered them. Abnormal reports should be noted in the record, along with corresponding follow-up plans and actions taken.
- 7. An appropriate immunization record is evident and kept up to date.
- 8. Appropriate preventive screening and services are offered in accordance with the accepted practice guidelines.

REVIEW OF POSITION STATEMENT:

Departure from or Closing of Medical Practices

Issue: Review Committee referred this issue to Policy Committee to determine if the current position statement should be amended to cover nurse practitioners physician assistants.

5/2008 – It was pointed out that not all physician extenders work in the same circumstances. Many physician extenders are at-will employees; others work in practice environments in which they are the owner and/or the sole practitioner. The statement should cover both extremes. It was suggested that the layout of the statement could be similar to the Physician Supervision position statement, which

lists circumstances to be considered on a case by case basis. Additionally, it was stated that continuity of care for patients must be the ultimate concern.

North Carolina Medical Board Position Statement—Draft May 2009

DEPARTURES FROM OR CLOSINGS OF MEDICAL PRACTICES

Departures from or closings of medical practices are trying times. If mishandled, they can significantly disrupt continuity of care and endanger patients.

Provide Continuity of Care

Practitioners continue to have obligations toward their patients during and after the departure from or closing of a medical practice. Practitioners may not abandon a patient or abruptly withdraw from the care of a patient. Patients should therefore be given reasonable advance notice (at least 30 days) to allow other medical care to be secured. Good continuity of care includes preserving and providing appropriate access to medical records.* Also, good continuity of care may often include making appropriate referrals. The practitioner(s) and other parties that may be involved should ensure that the requirements for continuity of care are effectively addressed.

It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that during such times practitioners and other parties that may be involved in such processes must consider how their actions affect patients. In particular, practitioners and other parties that may be involved have the following obligations.

Permit Patient Choice

It is the patient's decision from whom to receive care. Therefore, it is the responsibility of all practitioners and other parties that may be involved to ensure that:

- Patients are notified in a timely fashion of changes in the practice and given the
 opportunity to seek other medical care, sufficiently far in advance (at least 30
 days) to allow other medical care to be secured, which is often done by
 newspaper advertisement and by letters to patients currently under care;
- Patients clearly understand that they have a choice of health care providers;
- Patients are told how to reach any practitioner(s) remaining in practice, and when specifically requested, are told how to contact departing practitioners; and
- Patients are told how to obtain copies of or transfer their medical records.

No practitioner, group of practitioners, or other parties involved should interfere with the fulfillment of these obligations, nor should practitioners put themselves in a position where they cannot be assured these obligations can be met.

Written Policies

The Board recommends that practitioners and practices prepare written policies regarding the secure storage, transfer and retrieval of patient medical records. Practitioners and practices should notify patients of these policies. At a minimum, the Board recommends that such written policies specify:

- A procedure and timeline that describes how the practitioner or practice
 will notify each patient when appropriate about (1) a pending practice
 closure or practitioner departure, (2) how medical records are to be
 accessed, and (3) how future notices of the location of the practice's
 medical records will be provided;
- How long medical records will be retained;
- The procedure by which the practitioner or practice will dispose of unclaimed medical records after a specified period of time;

- In the event of the physician's death or incapacity, how the deceased physician's executor, administrator, personal representative or survivor will notify patients of the location of their medical records and how patients can access those records; and
- The procedure by which the deceased or incapacitated physician's executor, administrator, personal representative or survivor will dispose of unclaimed medical records after a specified period of time.

5/2008 BOARD ACTION: Accept the proposed Position Statement with the following change. Do not delete the following sentence: "If patient photographs are used, they should be of the physician's own patients and demonstrate realistic outcomes." This Position Statement is to be published in the Forum for comments.

9/17/2008: The Committee discussed the fact that the proposed changes to the current Position Statement would not be consistent with the information currently being provided on the Board's website. (b) Any physicians advertising or otherwise holding himself or herself out to the public as "Board

(c) Physicians shall not list their names under a specific specialty in advertisements, including

but not limited to, classified telephone directories and other commercial directories unless: (1)

training program in the advertised specialty that is accredited by the Accreditation Council for

Graduate Medical Education or approved by the Council on Postdoctoral Training of the

1. Proposed list for pre-approved PLOC s

Summary: Earlier this year Senior Staff Review Committee was tasked to develop a proposal for a process for "pre-approving PLOCs recommended by Board members" by developing a "narrow list of failure to disclose information" that are of moderate or less significance. What follows is a draft listing of pro forma licence application/renewal plocs (the "L-ploc"). These are PLOC's associated with license approvals that do not require full Board action, but can be issued by a single Board member when appropriate: (each such PLOC will need a reference either by number or name). Content of PLOC will be standardized in form and content for each of the below.

Application/reactivation must be otherwise "pristine." In each instance below, there can be no question that the circumstances that led to the error are inadvertent and unintentional. Only one of the following may be present in a given application.

- 1. Failure to report academic probation or other action during medical school that was successfully addressed with subsequent remediation ("probation L-ploc")
- 2. Failure to report any privilege suspension action during training, including fellowship, that was successfully addressed with subsequent remediation during training ("training L-ploc")
- 3. Failure to report any privilege suspension action that was successfully addressed with subsequent remediation or other appropriate response from provider organizations or insurance companies ("privileges L-ploc")
- 4. Failure to report health condition that does not limit or restrict fitness to practice ("fitness L-ploc")
- 5. Failure to report misdemeanor arrest, except those which are expunged (misdemeanor-ploc")
- 6. Failure to report professional liability policy cancellation/renewal due to actions not associated with applicant (eg bankruptcy of insurance company; insurance company policy decisions) ("cancellation L-ploc")
- 7. Failure to review application if completed by others as evidenced by incorrect demographic information, professional history, specialty Board certification status ("demographic L-ploc")

8. Failure to renew registration and continue to practice medicine without a license for up to 90 days after expiration of previous license gets retroactive with a ploc. ("_____" L-ploc)

LOI (letter of information)

1. Send letter clarifying that PA can only use the title of physician assistant and not the title of physician or medical doctor, to mid-level licensees who also have "MD" degrees.

BOARD ACTION: Accept proposed draft with modification to include "academic probation" under #2. Add to the Board Book.

2. Immigration Status for Applicants

Summary: Staff has been investigating how to check "lawful residence status" on applicants. An update will be e-mailed to members of the License Committee prior to the May Board meeting.

BOARD ACTION: Continue to investigate process.

3. Processing time for licensure.

Six Month Report:

- 6 physicians were present out of 14 site visits
- 14 reviews found no discrepancies
- During the first round, the main areas of concern were discrepancies related to the collaborative practice agreements and Quality Improvement meetings.
- Some of the discrepancies on this round were as follows:
 - o Five NPs lacked sufficient continuing education.
 - Five NPs were required to submit additional documentation within 30 days of the site visit or mail-in review.
 - Two had discrepancies with the CPA requirements
 - Two had issues with the required QI meetings

- One submitted documentation of only one QI meeting and this lacked signatures of NP and MD.
- One NP has not practiced in a year but maintains active approval. Due to his wife's illness, the NP contends he is having difficulty completing the CE requirements. Kugler and Pittman will present a full report related to this individual at the next JSC meeting.

Compliance Review Summary:

Ms. Kugler and Mr. Pittman report the following strengths and weaknesses of the NP audit process:

- The mail-in process is time consuming and cumbersome necessitating multiple contacts with NPs, in some cases, to obtain the required documentation.
- Site visits facilitate review of the documentation, allow for the NCBON and NCMB to build relationships with the NPs, the NPs witness the joint regulation between the two boards, encourage NPs and system to function within rules, and the NPs give tours of their practice to the reviewers.

Compliance Review Continuation:

Ms. Kugler and Mr. Pittman recommended to the JSC that there should be 20 site visits and 10 mail-in reviews (streamline mail-in process) for 2009.
