General Session Minutes of the North Carolina Medical Board Meeting held May 16-18, 2012.

The North Carolina Medical Board met May 16-18, 2012, at its office located at 1203 Front Street, Raleigh, NC. Ralph C. Loomis, MD, President, called the meeting to order. Presidential Remarks

Dr. Loomis commenced the meeting by reminding the Board members of their duty to avoid conflicts of interest with respect to any matters coming before the board as required by the State Government Ethics Act. No conflicts were reported.

1) Financial Reports

a) Monthly Accounting March and February 2012

2) Old Business

a) Credentialing Project

For the past several months, the Board has explored the possibility of sharing license application information with authorized credentialing organizations in an effort to streamline the licensing and credentialing processes. However, after careful study, it appears this project faces more uncertainties and would require substantially more resources than originally anticipated.

The Pharmacy Board is requesting the Board's views on whether the proposed amendment accurately reflects current Medical Board rules and policies.

05/2012 Committee discussion: The Committee reviewed the proposed rule change along with the pilot program that has been proposed. There was an extensive discussion about other telehealth models and pharmacy based clinics. The absence of any health care provider in the presence of the patient was a concern for the Committee.

1. Pending Applications Over One Year Old

Issue: Staff has been requested to report to the Committee every meeting the number of pending applications that are more than 1 year old. Currently we have 36. Of those, 3 have open investigations in other states and their NCMB application is on hold. Staff will review and confirm that the other 33 have not submitted all application materials and mark them "expired" as time permits.

Board Action: Accept as information.

2. CPEP Assessments

Issue: During the March License Committee report Dr. Walker requested adding to the May License Committee agenda, the topic of "referring/not referring" applicants to CPEP without a split Board license interview having been conducted."

Board Action: When SSRC recommendation is to get a competency assessment, forward the recommendation to the License Committee Chair to decide if a split board interview is required or whether the recommendation should be referred to the License Committee. Applicant will not be required to do anything until the License Committee and the Board have decided on the course of action.

3. 21 NCAC 32B .2001 Expedited Application for Physician License

Issue: The question has been raised as to whether it was the Board's intent that an applicant using the expedited license process has to have "current certification" or "certification or recertification within the past 10 years"? Sections (a) and (b)(7) of the Rule are not in sync.

Committee Recommendation: Ask Legal Department to study and suggest changes to bring the rule to a more appropriate state to reflect the Board's original intent that "current" certification is required.

SECTION .2000 – EXPEDITED APPLICATION FOR PHYSICIAN LICENSE 21 CAC 32B .2001 EXPEDITED APPLICATION FOR PHYSICIAN LICENSE

- (a) A specialty board-certified physician who has been licensed in at least one other state, the District of Columbia, U.S. territory or Canadian province for at least five years, has been in active clinical practice the past two years; and who has a clean license application, as defined in Paragraph (c) of this Rule may apply for a license on an expedited basis.
- (b) An applicant for an expedited Physician License shall:
 - (1) complete the Board's application form, attesting under oath that the information on the application is true and complete, and authorizing the release to the Board of all information pertaining to the application;
 - (2) submit documentation of a legal name change, if applicable;
 - (3) on the Board's form, submit a photograph taken within the past year, at least two inches by two inches, certified as a true likeness of the applicant by a notary public;
 - (4) supply a certified copy of applicant's birth certificate if the applicant was born in the United States or a certified copy of a valid and unexpired US passport. If the applicant does not possess proof of U.S. citizenship, the applicant must provide information about applicant's immigration and work status which the Board will use to verify applicant's ability to work lawfully in the United States; (Note: there may be some applicants who are not present in the U.S. and who do not plan to practice physically in the U.S. Those applicants shall submit a statement to that effect);
 - (5) provide proof that applicant has held an active license to practice medicine in at least one other state, the District of Columbia, U.S. Territory or Canadian province for at least five years immediately preceding this application;
 - (6) provide proof of clinical practice providing patient care for an average of 20 hours or more per week, for at least the last two years;
 - (7) provide proof of certification or recertification by an ABMS, CCFP, FRCP, FRCS, or AOA approved specialty board within the past 10 years;

4. Medical School Faculty Limited License – Plan to Educate

Issue: Recent issues have arisen regarding applicants applying for MSFL license who are not considered experts and some of which will be doing fellowships.

Board Action: Task Dr. Kirby to send letters to all appropriate individuals at NC teaching institutions reminding them of the appropriate use of the MSFL license.

5. Medical School Duration

Issue: The requirement for a minimum of 130 weeks of medical education has recently been a topic of discussion. An amendment to the rule has been filed allowing exception to the rule if the applicant is currently certified by a speciality board recognized by the Board.

Board Action: The requirement for a minimum of 130 weeks of medical education should not be changed other than the amendment already approved as stated above.

2. Remediation and Probation.

Issue: Marcus Jimison discussed the differences between remediation and probation. Remediation is typically used to correct an identified deficiency. Probation is a sanction that is imposed after a finding of some type of misconduct and typically involves imposing a trial period of some time for the licensee not to repeat the misconduct. Remedial actions usually are private, but not always, and can involve having the licensee take additional CME, undergo a mentoring program, or submit to an assessment, treatment or therapy. Probations are always public disciplinary actions and can include a component of remediation. For example, Licensee

A is placed on probation for one year during which time he must complete focused CME as recommended by a CPEP evaluation.

It is difficult to find current physician members of the NCMB who are able/willing to serve on this Committee in addition to all their NCMB work – particularly if they live outside the Raleigh area. It would help if the statute was changed to permit former NCMB members to serve.

- 1. Old Business
 - a. Update on "CPEP East." Ms. Apperson reported to the committee that Beth Korinek, CEO of CPEP, and Ms. Anne Cox, CPEP Board President (and recently retired General Counsel of COPIC) and Gerilyn McGaughran, CPEP staff, will travel to North Carolina June 12-15. They will meet with representatives of the North Carolina Medical Society, Academy of Physician Assistants, and Medical Mutual Insurance Company.

2. New Business

a. The committee had a conference call briefing with Ms. Paula Guy, RN, CEO of the Georgia Partnership for Telehealth, and Ms. Rena Brewer, the Chairman of the Southeast Telehealth Resource. The Georgia Partnership for Telehealth, an independent non-profit entity originally begun in 2004 with \$11 million in trust funds from the Georgia Anthem-Wellpoint merger with a mission to increase health care availability in rural and underserved areas, is apparently regarded as one of the nation's leaders in providing telehealth services. Ms. Brewer outlined her organization's history and success. In 2007 the group had 35 telehealth locations and 20 physician specialists. Last year, they had over 300 locations and over 200 physicians of all specialties and hosted 40,000 physician/patient encounters—a number expected to double this year.

The program relies on T1 lines into all facilities, with the main technological hub housed in a rural hospital. The Partnership provides technology, credentialing, scheduling, IT support and training for liaisons. Ms. Guy described a clinical encounter, emphasizing there is a licensed health care professional ("presenter") at the presenting site (where the patient is located) and the remote physician sees the patient in real-time. She identified telemedicine as a means to better oversee mid-levels and clarified that primary care is typically practiced within the context of an established physician-patient relationship. Sites exist in nursing homes, federally qualified health centers, and schools. Studies of school-based clinics seem to suggest their presence significantly reduces over-utilization of ER services and allows school nurses to consult with physicians and pharmacists in ways previously unavailable.

In 2006 the Georgia legislature mandated health insurance coverage for telemedicine visits and Medicaid reimburses as well. The Partnership is now largely self-sustaining by charging a participation fee to physicians (\$195/month) and initiating sites (\$500/month [presenting sites are not required by law to be reimbursed but the cost is frequently offset by x-ray, lab tests and prescriptions filled where patient is physically located]). The current President of the Georgia Composite Board is a family practice physician who practices telemedicine with the Partnership. Once an outspoken critic of telemedicine, she is now a champion. The Partnership has worked with the Georgia Board on its telemedicine policy and a new iteration is expected to be released in June. Ms. Guy would be willing to speak to the full Board in person about the Partnership.

CURRENT POSITION STATEMENT:

Availability of physicians to their patients

It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that once a physician-patient relationship is created, it is the duty of the physician to provide care whenever it is needed or to assure that proper physician backup is available to take care of the patient during or outside normal office hours.

The physician must clearly communicate to the patient orally and provide instructions in writing for securing after hours care if the physician is not generally available after hours or if the physician discontinues after hours coverage.

(Adopted July 1993) (Amended May 1996, January 2001, October 2003, July 2006)

PROPOSED POSITION STATEMENT:

Availability of <u>licensees</u> physicians to their patients

It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that once a <u>relationship between a licensee and a patient physician-patient relationship</u> is created, it is the duty of the <u>licensee physician</u> to provide care whenever it is needed or to assure that proper physician backup <u>by a healthcare provider</u> is available to take care of the patient during or outside normal office hours.

If the licensee is not going to be available after hours, the licensee must provide clear instructions to the patient for securing after-hours care. It is the responsibility of the licensee to ensure that the patient has sufficient information regarding how to secure after-hours care.

The physician must clearly communicate to the patient orally and provide instructions in writing for securing after hours care if the physician is not generally available after hours or if the physician discontinues after hours coverage.

It should be noted that these duties are applicable to a licensee whether the licensee is practicing telemedicine or practicing medicine through traditional means.

CURRENT POSITION STATEMENT:

Sexual exploitation of patients

It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that sexual exploitation of a patient is unprofessional conduct and undermines the public trust in the medical profession. Sexual exploitation encompasses a wide range of behaviors which have in common the intended sexual gratification of the physician. These behaviors include sexual intercourse with a patient (consensual or non-consensual), touching genitalia with ungloved hands, sexually suggestive comments, asking patients for a date, inappropriate exploration of the patients or physician's sexual phantasias, touching or exposing genitalia, breast, or other parts of the body in ways not dictated by an appropriate and indicated physical examination, exchanging sexual favors for services. Sexual exploitation is grounds for the suspension, revocation, or other action against a physician's license. This position statement is based upon the Federation of State Medical Board's guidelines regarding sexual boundaries.

Sexual misconduct by physicians and other health care practitioners is a form of behavior that adversely affects the public welfare and harms patients individually and collectively. Physician sexual misconduct exploits the physician-patient relationship, is a violation of the public trust, and is often known to cause harm, both mentally and physically, to the patient.

Regardless of whether sexual misconduct is viewed as emanating from an underlying form of impairment, it is unarguably a violation of the public's trust.

As with other disciplinary actions taken by the Board, Board action against a medical licensee for sexual exploitation of a patient is published by the Board, the nature of the offense being clearly specified. It is also released to the news media, to state and federal government, and to medical and professional organizations.

(Adopted May 1991) (Amended April 1996, January 2001, September 2006)

PROPOSED CHANGES:

Sexual exploitation of patients

It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that sexual exploitation of a patient is unprofessional conduct and undermines the public trust in the medical profession and harms patients both individually and collectively. This Position Statement is based, in part, upon the Federation of State Medical Board's guidelines regarding sexual boundaries ("FSMB Guidelines").

Sexual behavior between a licensee and a patient is never diagnostic or therapeutic. Such behavior may be verbal or physical and may include expressions of thoughts and feelings or gestures that are sexual or that reasonably may be construed by the patient as sexual.

The FSMB Guidelines define and distinguish between two types of professional sexual misconduct: sexual impropriety and sexual violation. Both types of sexual misconduct could constitute a basis for disciplinary action by the Board.

Sexual impropriety may comprise behavior, gestures, or expressions that are seductive, sexually suggestive, disrespectful of patient privacy, or sexually demeaning to a patient, that may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Neglecting to employ disrobing or draping practices respecting the patient's privacy, or deliberately watching a patient dress or undress:
- 2. Subjecting a patient to an intimate examination in the presence of medical students or other parties without the patient's informed consent or in the event such informed consent has been withdrawn;
- 3. Examination or touching of genital mucosal areas without the use of gloves;
- 4. Inappropriate comments about or to the patient, including but not limited to, making sexual comments about a patient's body or underclothing, making sexualized or sexually demeaning comments to a patient, criticizing the patient's sexual orientation, making comments about potential sexual performance during an examination;
- 5. Using the physician-patient relationship to solicit a date or romantic relationship;
- 6. Initiation by the physician of conversation regarding the sexual problems, preferences, or fantasies of the physician;
- 7. Performing an intimate examination or consultation without clinical justification;
- 8. Performing an intimate examination or consultation without explaining to the patient the need for such examination or consultation even when the examination or consultation is pertinent to the issue of sexual function or dysfunction; and
- 9. Requesting details of sexual history or sexual likes or dislikes when not clinically indicated for the type of examination or consultation.

Sexual violation may include physical sexual contact between a physician and patient, whether or not initiated by the patient, and engaging in any conduct with a patient that is sexual or may be reasonably interpreted as sexual, including but not limited to:

- 1. Sexual intercourse, genital to genital contact;
- 2. Oral to genital contact;
- 3. Oral to anal contact and genital to anal contact;
- 4. Kissing in a romantic or sexual manner;
- 5. Touching breasts, genitals, or any sexualized body part for any purpose other than appropriate examination or treatment, or where the patient has refused or has withdrawn consent;
- 6. Encouraging the patient to masturbate in the presence of the physician or masturbation by the physician while the patient is present; and
- 7. Offering to provide practice-related services, such as drugs, in exchange for sexual favors.

The Board also refers its licensees to the Board's Position Statement entitled "Guidelines for avoiding misunderstandings during physical examinations."

REQUEST:

Mr. Brosius,

In response to our telephone conversation today and at the direction of the Chief of the Office of EMS, I am submitting the following issue asking for an official ruling of the Medical Board. The Board's position will be shared with the state's Emergency Medical Services and Specialty Care Transport Program Medical Directors.

NC General Statute 143-514 places the practice standards for emergency medical personnel under the authority of the NC Medical Board. Using these established standards, NC General Statute 143-508 requires the NC Medical Care Commission to promulgate rules consistent with the Medical Boards practice standards. These rules are 10A NCAC 13P. In order for a credentialed paramedic to practice invasive skills, these rules require the paramedic to practice under the license of the EMS System Medical Director. This Medical Director must be a licensed physician in North Carolina. Having said this, a situation has presented itself to our office that we are unable to address. The scenario is:

A physician is on duty in the emergency department of a hospital. A patient arrives that, following assessment, is determined to have overdosed on an illegal narcotic. This physician provides emergency care and the patient is stabilized. This physician serves the local EMS System as their Medical Director. The patient is a paramedic that functions under the license of this physician. The patient (paramedic) was not on duty when treated by the physician (their Medical Director) in the Emergency Department.

The dilemma for the physician is twofold. One, he has established a physician / patient relationship with this individual. Two, this individual is a paramedic that practices under his medical license. Does the physician have an obligation to maintain the patient's confidentiality, or is the physician obligated to report the substance abuse matter to the paramedic's state credentialing agency? The physician, in his role as system medical director, thinks his knowledge that a paramedic practicing under his license may be a potential risk to the public and those patients under the paramedic's pre-hospital care. However, ethically the physician realizes the rights of this patient may override his ability to address this situation.

Although the EMS rules do allow the medical director the authority to suspend, pending due process review, an individual from practicing under his license, if the medical director exercises this authority he will be required to disclose his reason for suspension during the paramedic's due process hearing. Also, there is nothing in either the EMS laws or rules that mandate a medical director disclose to the state EMS office his suspension of any person practicing under his license.

Taking into account the his patient's rights (the paramedic), the right of the public to be safe, the rights of the paramedic's patients, the physician's liabilities as both caregiver and medical director, etc., how would the Board advise a physician to handle such a situation?

CURRENT POSITION STATEMENT:

Care of patient undergoing surgery or other invasive procedure*

The evaluation, diagnosis, and care of the surgical patient is primarily the responsibility of the surgeon. He or she alone bears responsibility for ensuring the patient undergoes a preoperative assessment appropriate to the procedure. The assessment shall include a review of the patient's data and an independent diagnosis by the operating surgeon of the condition requiring surgery. The operating surgeon shall have a detailed discussion with each patient regarding the diagnosis and the nature of the surgery, advising the patient fully of the risks involved. It is also the responsibility of the operating surgeon to reevaluate the patient immediately prior to the procedure.

It is the responsibility of the operating surgeon to assure safe and readily available postoperative care for each patient on whom he or she performs surgery. It is not improper to involve other licensed health care practitioners in postoperative care so long as the operating surgeon maintains responsibility for such care. The postoperative note must reflect the findings encountered in the individual patient and the procedure performed.

When identical procedures are done on a number of patients, individual notes should be done for each patient that reflect the specific findings and procedures of that operation.

(Invasive procedures includes, but is not limited to, endoscopies, cardiac catheterizations, interventional radiology procedures, etc. Surgeon refers to the provider performing the procedure)

CURRENT POSITION STATEMENT:

Writing of prescriptions

It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that prescriptions should be written in ink or indelible pencil or typewritten or electronically printed and should be signed by the practitioner at the time of issuance. Quantities should be indicated in both numbers AND words, e.g., 30 (thirty). Such prescriptions must not be written on pre-signed prescription blanks.

Each prescription for a DEA controlled substance (2, 2N, 3, 3N, 4, and 5) should be written on a separate prescription blank. Multiple medications may appear on a single prescription blank **only** when none are DEA-controlled.

No prescriptions should be issued for a patient in the absence of a documented physicianpatient relationship.

No prescription should be issued by a practitioner for his or her personal use. (See Position Statement entitled "Self-Treatment and Treatment of Family Members and Others with Whom Significant Emotional Relationships Exist.")

The practice of pre-signing prescriptions is unacceptable to the Board.

It is the responsibility of those who prescribe controlled substances to fully comply with applicable federal and state laws and regulations. Links to these laws and regulations may be found on the Board's Web site (www.ncmedboard.org).

21 NCAC 32B .1001 AUTHORITY TO PRESCRIBE

(a) A license to practice medicine issued under this Subchapter allows the physician to prescribe medications, including controlled substances, so long as the physician complies with all state and federal laws and regulations governing the writing and issuance of prescriptions.

(b) A physician must possess a valid United States Drug Enforcement Administration ("DEA") registration in order for the physician to supervise any other health professional (physician assistant, nurse practitioner, clinical pharmacist practitioner) with prescriptive authority for controlled substances. The DEA registration of the supervising physician must include the same schedule(s) of controlled substances as the supervised health professional's DEA registration.

(c) A physician shall not prescribe controlled substances, as defined by the state and federal Controlled Substance Acts, for the physician's own use or that of a member of the physician's immediate family, which shall mean a spouse, parent, child, sibling, parent-in-law, son-in-law or daughter-in-law, brother-in-law or sister-in-law, step-parent, step-child, step-sibling, or any other person living in the same residence as the licensee, or anyone with whom the physician is having a sexual relationship.

21 NCAC 32S .0212 PRESCRIPTIVE AUTHORITY

A physician assistant may prescribe, order, procure, dispense and administer drugs and medical devices subject to the following conditions:

- (1) the physician assistant complies with all state and federal laws regarding prescribing including G.S. 90-18.1(b);
- (2) each supervising physician and physician assistant incorporates within their written supervisory arrangements, as defined in Rule .0201(8) of this Subchapter, instructions for prescribing, ordering, and administering drugs and medical devices and a policy for periodic review by the physician of these instructions and policy;
- (3) In in order to compound and dispense drugs, the physician assistant complies with G.S. 90-18.1(c);
- (4) in order to prescribe controlled substances,
 - (a) the physician assistant must have a valid Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) registration and prescribe in accordance with DEA rules;
 - (b) All prescriptions for substances falling within schedules II, IIN, III, and IIIN, as defined in the federal Controlled Substances Act, shall not exceed a legitimate 30 day supply;
 - (c) the supervising physician must possess the same schedule(s) of controlled substances as the physician assistant's DEA registration;
- (5) each prescription issued by the physician assistant contains, in addition to other information required by law, the following:
 - (a) the physician assistant's name, practice address and telephone number;
 - (b) the physician assistant's license number and, if applicable, the physician assistant's DEA number for controlled substances prescriptions; and
 - (c) the responsible supervising physician's (primary or back-up) name and telephone number;
- (6) the physician assistant documents prescriptions in writing on the patient's record, including the medication name and dosage, amount prescribed, directions for use, and number of refills; and
- (7) a physician assistant who requests, receives, and dispenses medication samples to patients complies with all applicable state and federal regulations. regulations: and
- (8) a physician assistant shall not prescribe controlled substances, as defined by the sate and federal Controlled Substances Acts, for the physician assistant's own

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use, or that of the physician assistant's supervising physician, or that of a member of the physician assistant's immediate family, which shall mean a spouse, parent, child, sibling, parent-in-law, son-in-law or daughter-in-law, brother-in-law or sister-in-law, step-parent, step-child, step-sibling, or any other person living in the same residence as the physician assistant, or anyone with whom the physician assistant is having a sexual relationship.

21 NCAC 32B .1402 APPLICATION FOR RESIDENT'S TRAINING LICENSE

- (a) In order to obtain a Resident's Training License, an applicant shall:
 - (1) submit a completed application, attesting under oath that the information on the application is true and complete, and authorizing the release to the Board of all information pertaining to the application;
 - (2) submit documentation of a legal name change, if applicable;
 - (3) submit a photograph, at least two inches by two inches, affixed to the oath, and attested by a notary public;
 - (4) submit proof on the Board's Medical Education Certification form that the applicant has completed at least 130 weeks of medical education. The applicant's date of graduation from medical school shall be written in the designated space, and the school seal shall be stamped on the form; the dean or other official of the applicant's medical school shall sign the form verifying the information;
 - (5) If the graduate of a medical school other than those approved by LCME, AOA, COCA or CACMS, furnish an original ECFMG certification status report of a currently valid certification of the ECFMG. The ECFMG certification status report requirement shall be waived if:
 - (A) the applicant has passed the ECFMG examination and successfully completed an approved Fifth Pathway program (original ECFMG score transcript from the ECFMG required); or
 - (B) the applicant has been licensed in another state on the basis of a written examination before the establishment of the ECFMG in 1958:
 - (6) submit an appointment letter from the program director of the GME program or his appointed agent verifying the applicant's appointment and commencement date;
 - (7) provide two original references from persons with no family or martial relationship to the applicant. These references must be:
 - (A) from physicians who have observed the applicant's work in a clinical setting;
 - (B) on forms supplied by the Board;
 - (C) dated within six months of the application; and
 - (D) bearing the original signature of the writer;
 - (8)(7) submit two completed fingerprint record cards supplied by the Board;
 - (9)(8) submit a signed consent form allowing a search of local, state, and national files for any criminal record;

- (10)(9) pay a non-refundable fee pursuant to G.S. 90-13.1(b), plus the cost of a criminal background check;
- (11)(10) provide proof that the applicant has taken and passed:
 - (A) the COMLEX Level 1 <u>within three attempts</u> and both components <u>each</u> <u>component</u> of COMLEX Level 2 (cognitive evaluation and performance evaluation); evaluation) within three attempts; or
 - (B) the USMLE Step 1 within three attempts and both components each component of the USMLE Step 2 (Clinical Knowledge and Clinical Skills); Skills) within three attempts; and
- (12)(11) upon request, supply any additional information the Board deems necessary to evaluate the applicant's competence and character.
- (b) An applicant shall be required to appear in person for an interview with the Board or its agent to evaluate the applicant's competence and character, if the Board needs more information to complete the application.

21 NCAC 32R .0101 CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION (CME) REQUIRED

(a) Continuing Medical Education (CME) is defined as <u>education</u>, <u>training and activities</u> <u>to increase</u> knowledge and skills generally recognized and accepted by the profession as within the basic medical sciences, the discipline of clinical medicine, and the provision of healthcare to the public. <u>The purpose of CME should is to maintain</u>, develop, or improve the physician's knowledge, skills, professional performance and relationships which physicians use to provide services for their patients, their practice, the public, or the profession.

(b) Each person licensed to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina shall complete no less than 150 hours at least 60 hours of Category 1 of practice relevant CME relevant to the physician's current or intended specialty or area of practice every three years. Years in order to enhance current medical competence, performance or patient care outcome. At least 60 hours shall be in the educational provider-initiated category as defined in Rule .0102 of this Section. The remaining hours, if any, shall be in the physician-initiated category as defined in Rule .0102

(c) The three year period described in Paragraph (b) of this Rule <u>begins on the physician's first</u> <u>birthday following initial licensure.</u> shall run from the physician's birthday beginning in the year 2001 or the first birthday following initial licensure, whichever occurs later.

21 NCAC 32R .0102 APPROVED CATEGORIES OF CME

 - (e) Successful Specialty Board Exam for certification or recertification
 - (f) Teaching (professional, patient/public health)
 - (g) Mentoring
 - (h) Morbidity and Mortality (M&M) conference
 - (i) Journal clubs
 - (i) Creation of generic patient care pathways and guidelines
 - (k) Competency Assessment
- (a) Category 1 CME providers are:
 - (1) Institutions or organizations accredited by the Accreditation Council on Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) and reciprocating organizations;
 - (2) The American Osteopathic Association (AOA);
 - (3) A state medical society or association;
 - (4) The American Medical Association (AMA); and
 - (5) Specialty boards accredited by the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS), the AOA or Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC).
- (b) Category 1 CME education shall be presented, offered, or accredited by a Category 1 provider as defined above and shall include:

- (1) Educational courses;
- (2) Scientific or clinical presentations or publications;
- (3) Printed, recorded, audio, video, online or electronic educational materials for which CME credits are awarded by the publisher;
- (4) Skill development;
- (5) Performance improvement activities; or
- (6) Journal-based CME activities within a peer-reviewed, professional journal.

21 NCAC 32R .0103 EXCEPTIONS

A licensee currently enrolled in an AOA or Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited graduate medical education program is exempt from the requirements of Rule .0101 of this Section.

- (a) A licensee is exempt from the requirements of Rule .0101 of this Section if the licensee is:
 - (1) Currently enrolled in an AOA or Accreditation of Council of Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited graduate medical education program;
 - (2) In good standing with the Board, serving in the armed forces of the United States or serving in support of such armed forces, and serving in a combat zone, or serving with respect to a military contingency operation as defined by 10 U.S.C. 101(a)(13); or
 - (3) Serving as a member of the General Assembly's House or Senate Health Committee.
- (b) A physician who obtains initial certification from an ABMS, AOA or RCPSC specialty board shall be deemed to have satisfied his or her entire CME requirement for the three year cycle in which the physician obtains board certification.
- (c) A physician who attests that he or she was continuously engaged in a program of recertification, or maintenance of certification, from an ABMS, AOA or RCPSC specialty board shall be deemed to have satisfied his/her entire CME requirement for that three year cycle.

At the time of annual registration immediately following the CME reporting period, renewal, each Licensee shall report on the Board's annual registration renewal form the number of hours of practice-relevant CME obtained in compliance with with, or exemption from, Rule .0101 of this Section. Records documenting CME hours compliance or exemption must be documented by eategories maintained for six consecutive years and may be inspected by the Board or its agents.

- (1) currently licensed by and in good standing with the Board;
- (2) serving in the armed forces of the United States or serving in support of such armed forces; and
- (3) serving in a combat zone, or serving with respect to a military contingency operation as defined by 10 U.S.C. 101(a)(13).
