

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS  
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Sir Walter Hotel, Raleigh, North Carolina  
Jefferson Hotel, Morehead City, North Carolina

October 10-12th, 1957

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina convened at 9:30 A. M. at the Sir Walter Hotel, Raleigh, North Carolina, Thursday, October 10th. The following members were present: Drs. L. R. Doffermyre, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, J. B. Anderson, Thomas W. Baker, Edwin A. Rasberry, Jr. and Carl V. Tyner and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer.

RE: Dr. Wiley Royster Young, Angier, North Carolina - The Board of Medical Examiners upon report of investigation by the State Bureau of Investigation and on the basis of trial in the Superior Court of Harnett County, North Carolina, preferred the following charges against Dr. Young: (Dr. L. R. Doffermyre for personal reasons disqualified himself.)

"IN RE: WILEY ROYSTER YOUNG, M. D. - CHARGES AND ACCUSATIONS

"TO: Wiley Royster Young, M. D.

"You are hereby given notice that pursuant to order of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina the following charges and accusations are made and presented against you by said Board, to-wit:

- "1. That in the month of July 1956 and during the year 1956 you failed to maintain records of narcotic drugs administered by you in accordance with the laws of the State of North Carolina and of the United States.
- "2. That at the November term 1956 you were indicted pursuant to action by the Grand Jury of Harnett County upon the charge that you did unlawfully neglect and fail and refuse to keep a record of narcotic drugs administered, dispensed, or professionally used by you otherwise than by prescription and at the May 1957 term of Criminal Court of Harnett County you were found guilty of said charge for which you were indicted and you were convicted of a felony.
- "3. That you have been and are habitually addicted to the use of narcotic drugs.
- "4. That during the year 1956 you did unlawfully dispense narcotic drugs to various persons addicted to the use of the same in violation of the laws of the State of North Carolina and the laws of the United States.
- "5. That in the above respects you have been guilty of dishonorable and unprofessional conduct unworthy of and affecting the practice of your profession and grounds exist for the revocation of your license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina.



"6. You are further given notice that a hearing will be held upon the foregoing charges and accusations before the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina on October 10th, 1957, at 9 o'clock a. m. at the Sir Walter Hotel, Raleigh, North Carolina, at which time you will be given an opportunity to be heard, either personally or through counsel of your choice, to cross-examine witnesses and to present on your own behalf evidence in the matter, if you so desire, and that in the meantime the Board will receive any written answer or reply to the foregoing charges which you may wish to file although you are not required to make such written reply or answer. Following this hearing the Board will make such findings and will take such action regarding a suspension or revocation of your license to practice medicine as to the Board appears warranted and justified.

After a full hearing in the matter the following judgment was rendered by the Board:

"IN RE: WILEY ROYSTER YOUNG, M. D.            FINDINGS AND ORDER

"The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina following the presentation of all the evidence in the above matter at its regular meeting on October 10, 1957, at the Sir Walter Hotel, Raleigh, North Carolina, pursuant to notice to Dr. Wiley Royster Young of charges and accusations and of hearing, and after full consideration of all the evidence, rendered the following decision and verdict upon the charges and accusations presented against Dr. Wiley Royster Young:

"1. The Board finds Dr. Wiley Royster Young guilty of the charge set forth in paragraph one of such accusations.

"2. The Board reserves judgment concerning the charge set forth in paragraph two of such accusations.

"3. The Board finds Dr. Wiley Royster Young not guilty of the charge set forth in paragraph three of such accusations.

"4. The Board finds Dr. Wiley Royster Young guilty of the charge set forth in paragraph three of such accusations.

"Upon the foregoing findings and verdict, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina finds that Dr. Wiley Royster Young has been guilty of unprofessional and dishonorable conduct, unworthy of and affecting the practice of his profession, and orders that the license of Dr. Wiley Royster Young to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina be revoked, and the same is hereby revoked, and he is ordered to surrender his certificate of licensure issued by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina to the secretary of this Board.

The verdict of the Board was given to Dr. Wiley Royster Young and he was requested to either mail or bring his certificate of medical license in to the office of Dr. Joseph J. Combs, Secretary.

Attorney Robert Cotten represented Dr. Wiley Royster Young and Attorney John H. Anderson represented the Board in this hearing.

RE: Dr. John Samuel Stone, Leaksville, North Carolina - The following bill of indictment and judgment in the case of State vs Dr. John Samuel Stone in the Superior Court of Rockingham County, North Carolina, September Criminal Term, 1957 was presented to the Board:

"North Carolina, Rockingham County - SUPERIOR COURT  
"JANUARY TERM, A. D. 1957

"The Jurors for the State upon their oath present, that Dr. John Samuel Stone late of the County of Rockingham on or about the 1st day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, with force and arms, at and in the county aforesaid, did unlawfully, willfully, and feloniously administer and prescribe and advise and procure Mary Ellen Ross, a pregnant woman, to take any medicine, and drug and did employ, and use an instrument or application or other means with intent thereby to procure the miscarriage of Mary Ellen Ross, and to injure said Mary Ellen Ross, the same not being necessary to preserve the life of the said Mary Ellen Ross."

"NORTH CAROLINA, ROCKINGHAM COUNTY - SUPERIOR COURT - September Criminal Term, 1957 - JUDGMENT

"The defendant in open Court through counsel, Price and Osborne, tenders a plea of nolo contendere which is accepted by the State with the approval of the Court.

"Let the defendant be confined in the State's Prison for a period of not less than two or more than three years; this prison sentence is suspended for a period of five years by and with the consent of the defendant given in open court upon the following conditions:

- "1. That he be of general good behavior, and pay the cost of the action.
- "2. That he immediately surrender his medical license to the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners, and cease the practice of medicine.
- "3. That he immediately close his office located in Leaksville, North Carolina, and keep it closed as long as he has no license to practice medicine.
- "4. That he immediately avail himself of institutional treatment, and remain there until discharged by the authorities of said institution; that he cooperate fully with Mr. Henry Wimbish, the Rockingham County Service Officer, who has represented to the Court that in his opinion he can secure the needed institutional treatment for the defendant.

"Let the record show that the defendant present in open Court and represented by his counsel, Price and Osborne, consents to the foregoing judgment. This the 5th day of September, 1957."

The secretary reported that Dr. Stone's medical license was forwarded to him by the Clerk of the Superior Court of Rockingham County on September 9th, 1957 and that the same is on file in the secretary's office.

The secretary also reported that Dr. Stone's attorney had indicated to him that Dr. Stone had agreed to voluntarily surrender his license to practice and had agreed that his license should be revoked by the Board. That a form of consent for the voluntary surrender for revocation of Dr. Stone's license to be executed by Dr. Stone had been forwarded to his attorney.

VERDICT: That the Board finds from the foregoing that Dr. Stone has agreed that his medical license be surrendered to the Board and that it be revoked by the Board. WHEREUPON, upon motion duly made and seconded, it was ordered that the license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina of Dr. John Samuel Stone be and is hereby revoked.

Dr. Carl V. Tyner did not vote on this motion.

(Consent for voluntary surrender for revocation was received by the secretary.)

RE: Dr. W. Percy Carter, colored, Gastonia, North Carolina-  
The following bill of indictment and judgment in the case of State vs W. Percy Carter in the Superior Court, July Criminal Term, 1957, was presented to the Board:

"STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, GASTON COUNTY - IN THE SUPERIOR COURT  
23 April Term, 1957

"THE JURORS FOR THE STATE UPON THEIR OATH PRESENT, THAT: W. Percy Carter late of the county of Gaston on the 26th day of February, 1957, with force and arms, at and in the County aforesaid did wilfully, unlawfully, feloniously employ and use instruments, surgical devices, appliances, equipment and applications for the purpose of and with the intent to procure the miscarriage of Joanna Ina Couture, a pregnant woman."

"NORTH CAROLINA, GASTON COUNTY - IN THE SUPERIOR COURT  
JULY CRIMINAL TERM, 1957 - JUDGMENT

"State vs W. Percy Carter - Abortion - The defendant enters a plea of guilty. The judgment of the Court is that the defendant be confined in the State's Prison at Raleigh for a term of not less than one year nor more than two years. With the consent of the defendant and of his counsel and by their request, this prison sentence is suspended for a period of five years on the following conditions: (1) That the defendant pay a fine of \$300.00 together with the costs of this action; (2) That he remain of good behavior and violate none of the criminal laws of this or any other State of the United States, and (3) That he refrain from practicing or attempting to practice medicine in this or in any other State of the American Union@.

The secretary reported that Dr. Carter's medical license was forwarded to him by Dr. Carter on September 7th, 1957, and that the same is on file in the secretary's office.



RE: Dr. Percy W. Carter - continued

The secretary also reported that a form of consent for the voluntary surrender for revocation of Dr. Carter's license had been executed by Dr. Carter.

VERDICT: WHEREUPON, upon motion duly made and seconded, it was ordered that the license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina of Dr. W. Percy Carter be and is hereby revoked.

Thursday, October 10th  
2:30 P. M.

RE: Dr. George W. Melchior - (See Minutes June, 1957)  
Dr. Melchior was granted an interview upon request at this time. He stated that he came to discuss with the Board any possibilities there might be for him in the field of medicine. (See interview in file)

The meeting was adjourned.

Friday, October 11th  
9:30 A. M.

RE: Dr. Daniel Efland Forrest, Hillsboro, North Carolina - (See previous Minutes) - On September 24th, 1956 Dr. Forrest's medical license was revoked based upon evidence and his voluntary surrender.

Dr. Forrest appeared at this time petitioning for reinstatement of his medical license. He was released from the United States Public Health Service Hospital at Lexington, Kentucky in April, 1957. He stated that he had had no narcotic drugs since 1955 and no barbiturates since his readmission to the United States Public Health Service Hospital. (See complete interview on file). The secretary presented letters of recommendation from physicians and other citizens of Hillsboro. Dr. A. E. Pugh gave Dr. Forrest a recommendation when called on the phone by the secretary. (Letter of recommendation from Dr. Pugh in the office of the secretary upon return from this meeting.)

VERDICT: Dr. J. J. Combs moved, subject to the recommendation of Dr. A. E. Pugh, Director of Medical Services, Veterans Hospital, that Dr. Daniel Efland Forrest's medical license be restored on a conditional basis of 18 months probation; if during which time that the Board receives satisfactory information that he has misused the use of barbiturates or narcotic drugs, that his license be automatically revoked. If no evidence has been forthcoming within the period of the probation, that his license be in full force and effect. That recommendation for narcotic license not be made until approved by this Board. Seconded by Dr. T. G. Thurston and passed unanimously.

Dr. Combs further moved that this order go in effect when Dr. Daniel Efland Forrest has come to the secretary's office and signed a statement that he accept the probation period and his license will be restored as of that date. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Carl V. Tyner and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. John William Straughan, Warsaw, North Carolina - Pursuant to receipt of report of investigation by the State Bureau of Investigation alleging narcotic addiction, Dr. Straughan was requested to appear for an interview.

Agent R. W. Pope discussed this matter with the Board and advised that Dr. Straughan first received treatment at the United States Public Health Service Hospital, Lexington, Kentucky, in 1953 and had received treatment since that time in Greensboro; that it appeared now that he had rehabilitated himself; that Dr. Straughan related that he had been informed he was required by law to pre-scribed narcotics to addicts enroute to Lexington.

Dr. Straughan was interviewed and he readily admitted to the Board that he had been addicted to narcotics; that he had had no narcotic drugs since March, 1956; that he had worked continuously since May, 1956. That he used his order form to order narcotics in July, 1958 for the first time in 15 years.

VERDICT: Dr. Doffermyre: The Board is fully conscious of the fact that you have violated not only the law, but the ethics of the profession of medicine, but in view of the fact that you have apparently had no narcotics since March, 1956, it is going to allow your case to stand status quo. That is they are reserving judgment and will allow you to continue with your narcotic stamp, but that any violation of the Narcotic Laws, either state or Federal, will be cause for your reappearance before this Board, looking to revocation of your license to practice medicine in North Carolina. That you are advised that there is no law, state or Federal, that will allow you to prescribe to narcotic addicts, whether in transit or not. That the Board will have the State Bureau of Investigation to check on you at intervals. That any information received that you are using narcotics or prescribing narcotic drugs in excess will be investigated to ascertain the facts. That the Board will reserve the right to ask you to appear before one member of the Board at a time at its discretion for a test of blood or urine for narcotics.

RE: Dr. John A. Parrott - Dr. Parrott requested an appointment to appear before the Board in order to petition for recommendation for reinstatement of his narcotic license. Due to the fact that an investigation is being made in Duplin County by the State Bureau of Investigation in regard to Dr. Parrott and other matters, which is not complete, the Board took no action at this time. Letters of recommendation were received and are on file in regard to Dr. Parrott. (Copy of interview on file)

RE: Dr. David E. Plummer, Thomasville, North Carolina - Dr. Plummer requested an appointment to appear before the Board to petition for recommendation for reinstatement of his narcotic license, which he was given. He was also advised to obtain letters of recommendation. Letters of recommendation were not presented, Dr. Plummer did not appear at this time, and no further word has been heard from him.

RE: Dr. Louis D. Hayman, Jr., Jacksonville, North Carolina -(See previous Minutes)- The State Bureau of Investigation was requested to make a routine checkup on Dr. Hayman, the synopsis of which is as follows: That since Dr. Hayman's trial in the Superior Court of Onslow County in 1956 two incidents have occurred which caused associates to suspect him of being under the influence of a drug; that close associates do not feel his narcotic license should be restored at this time. That Dr. Hayman stated he was making progress in the direction of a complete cure of his trouble, but admitted two incidents since January, 1956 when he became depressed and took Seconal. That he did not wish his narcotic license restored at this time for fear of jeopardizing his practice of medicine. A report was received from

Dr. Cornelius Lansing, who stated his therapy was progressing satisfactorily.

The secretary reported that he had a telephone conversation with Dr. J. D. Piver, who conducted a poll of the medical profession in Jacksonville, the concensus of which was that it was better for Dr. Hayman not to have a narcotic license. That Dr. Piver upon being asked if there was good feeling there, replied that there was.

The above was received as information in regard to Dr. Louis D. Hayman, Jr.

RE: Dr. Paul Crumpler, Clinton, North Carolina (See previous Minutes) Agent R. W. Pope reported on his investigation made September 3rd, 1957, a synopsis of which is that Dr. Crumpler received requisitioned narcotics on July 10th, 1957 in violation of orders of the Board of Medical Examiners given orally by Dr. L. R. Doffermyre on July 9th, 1957; that he had also according to information presented narcotic prescriptions to patients with instructions that they obtain drugs and return them to his office, also in violation of the Board's instructions. That Dr. Crumpler said he is not dispensing narcotics from his office, only administering. That he stated most of the patients in that vicinity with kidney colic came to him as he was accessible, his office being connected with his home. That he had some narcotics in his office and some in his lock box at the bank. Mr. Pope said he understood that his patients are old, whome he has treated for years. It was brought out by Mr. Pope that drugs received on July 10th, 1957 had been ordered previous to Dr. Doffermyre's interview with him.

VERDICT: Dr. J. J. Combs moved that this report in regard to Dr. Paul Crumpler be received as information and no action taken, with the understanding that Agent R. W. Pope will follow through if indicated and call to the attention of this Board. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Carl V. Tyner and passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned.

Friday, October 11th

RE: Biennial Registration - The policies of biennial registration were discussed.

Dr. Carl V. Tyner moved that the fee of \$5.00 be set for biennial registration. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. E. A. Raspberry, Jr. and passed unanimously.

Dr. E. A. Raspberry, Jr. moved that the Board approve the employment of an additional secretary, who is on the basis of half-day. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. J. B. Anderson moved that the new secretary be bonded in the amount of \$10,00. This motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

The secretary reported to the Board as to office space obtained and equipment and supplies purchased to set up for biennial registration.

Dr. J. B. Anderson moved that the Board approve the expenses the secretary has incurred to establish the office for biennial re-

gistration. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Carl V. Tyner and passed unanimously.

Dr. Thomas W. Baker moved that the Board purchase a fireproof filing cabinet for the storage of irreplaceable records. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Anniversary Meeting - A discussion was had with reference to holding an Anniversary Dinner commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the Board of Medical Examiners in 1959.

VERDICT: Dr. J. B. Anderson moved that work be begun and continue until arranged. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Carl V. Tyner and passed unanimously.

The following committee was selected to prepare for the Anniversary Dinner: Drs. Carl V. Tyner, J. J. Combs, Thomas W. Baker, L. R. Doffenmyre and Ivan Procter, a former secretary of the Board.

RE: Foreign Graduates - Dr. L. R. Doffermyre reported that a committee meeting was held on Wednesday evening, October 10th, at the Sir Walter Hotel with J. Melville Broughton, Jr., Chairman, Senator Kelly Bennett and Dr. Yates Palmer from the Hospitals Board of Control and Drs. Carl V. Tyner, J. J. Combs and L. R. Doffermyre from the Board of Medical Examiners. That the committee from the Hospital Board of Control was thoroughly in accord with the stand of the Board of Medical Examiners. That plans were made to set up a meeting with the deans of the three medical schools in order to appoint a nine-man committee from the medical schools to screen the foreign graduates as to educational qualification and when that has been accomplished to allow them to take the written examination. That Senator Bennett suggested the possibility of meeting with the Governor to attempt to arrange in some way to raise salaries of physicians in the state institutions.

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials and special limited license were studied by members of the Board.

The meeting was adjourned.

Dr. Raspberry: You plan to be an instructor in the Department of Pediatrics?

A: Yes.

Dr. Doffermyre: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q. Have you ever taken habitually narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No

Q. Have you ever had any trouble with the Bureau of Narcotics?

A. No

VERDICT: Dr. John Hampton Arnold was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactorily to the secretary.



RE: Dr. Charles Markham Berry appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Raspberry: Where are you going? A. Highlands.

Dr. Doffermyre: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q. Have you ever had any trouble with barbiturates or narcotics?

A. No

Q. Have you ever habitually taken narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No. I had chest surgery and was on narcotics three or four weeks after that.

Dr. Combs: That was ordered by someone else? A. Yes

Dr. Doffermyre: Have you ever had any trouble with the Bureau of Narcotics? A. No

Dr. Raspberry: Do you plan to do surgery in Highlands?

A. I plan to do general practice and surgery if available. I have had some training and would like to do some surgery.

Dr. Combs: Do you plan to make Highlands your home? A. Yes sir.

Dr. Combs: It is not seasonal?

A. I plan to be there permanently.

Dr. Doffermyre: Do you plan to do solo practice?

A. I would like very much to have somebody with me. There are two fellows there who are leaving. They apparently have had it a little bit light in winter. They had their hands full in summer. I think if someone where there several years to build up, it would support someone the year round. They have been there one and one-half years. They are leaving now going to Florida.

VERDICT: Dr. Charles Markham Berry was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. Loyd Clarence Brannon appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. Dr. Brannon is now an interne at Rex.

Dr. Doffermyre: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No, I have not.

Q. Have you ever had difficulty with the Bureau of Narcotics? A. No, I have not.

Q. Have you ever taken narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No, I have not.

VERDICT: Dr. Loyd Clarence Brannon was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. William Patrick Coleman appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Thurston: Since graduation you have been where?

A. 4 years of training, 3 at the University of Virginia, 1 Mary Hitchcock.

Q. You plan to be associated with Dr. Andrew Taylor? A. Yes

Q. You have your specialty board?

A. No, I have to practice.

Dr. Doffermyre: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir  
 Q. Have you ever had any trouble with the Narcotic Bureau?  
 A. No sir  
 Q. Have you ever taken narcotics or barbiturates habitually?

VERDICT: Dr. William Patrick Coleman was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

RE: Dr. Ray Joseph Haddad, Jr., who is in the United States Navy, stationed in Raleigh, appeared with incomplete credentials, applying for license limited to the State Prison. He presented letters from the supervisor of Medical Service and W. F. Bailey, Director, of the State Prison, and a letter of approval from his commanding officer.

Dr. Thurston : You want to work some at the State Prison in Raleigh?  
 A. Yes

Q. Would that be full time?  
 A. Part time, I am in service.

Dr. Doffermyre: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir  
 Q. Have you ever had any trouble with the Narcotic Bureau?  
 A. No sir  
 Q. Have you ever taken narcotics or barbiturates habitually?  
 A. No sir

Q. What are your possibilities of staying in North Carolina after you get out of service?  
 A. I do not think I will. I am going back to Charity for a residency.

VERDICT: Dr. Ray Joseph Haddad, Jr. was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, limited to the State Prison, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary.

RE: Dr. Angus Holmes appeared without credentials applying for license by endorsement. No action was taken. See interview on file.

RE: Dr. John Charles Lawrence appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Baker: Dr. Lawrence is going to Lumberton to be associated with Drs. Norace Baker and Douglas Clark.

Dr. Tyner: Have you been to Lumberton?  
 A. Yes, I am there now.

Dr. Raspberry: What type of practice?  
 A. Surgery.

Dr. Doffermyre: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir  
 Q. Have you ever had any trouble with the Bureau of Narcotics? A. No sir  
 Q. Have you ever taken narcotics or barbiturates habitually?  
 A. No sir.

VERDICT: Dr. John Charles Lawrence was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.



RE: Dr. Harry Johnson Price appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Baker: You practiced 16 years in Atlanta, 3 years in Missouri? You have been in practice in Franklin since August of this year?

A. No sir, I got a letter from Dr. Combs not to.

Dr. Doffermyre: You are going to Franklin in general practice?

A. Yes

Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever had any trouble with the Bureau of Narcotics? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever taken narcotics or barbiturates habitually?

A. No sir

Dr. Anderson: Where have you been since finishing school?

A. In Atlanta with the Veterans Administration and teach-in at Emory. Then they sent me to Missouri. I then did private practice, then I became ill. I have been out of work a year with this illness, Guillieme-Barre disease.

RE: Dr. Gustavo Adolfo Lugo appeared before the Board on July 26th, 1957 with incomplete credentials applying for special limited license to Bowman Gray School of Medicine, where he is a resident in Pathology. Credentials are in order at this time.

VERDICT: Dr. Gustavo Adolfo Lugo was approved for special limited license to Bowman Gray School of Medicine, on an annual basis.

RE: Dr. Alfred Zettner appeared before the Board on July 26th, 1957 with incomplete credentials applying for special limited license to Bowman Gray School of Medicine, where he is a resident in Pathology. His credentials are in order.

VERDICT: Dr. Alfred Zettner was approved for special limited license to Bowman Gray School of Medicine, on an annual basis.

RE: Dr. Anne Sagberg, who is at Highlands Hospital failed to make a passing grade on the written examination in June, 1957.

VERDICT: Dr. J. J. Combs moved that the president instruct Dr. J. B. Anderson to ascertain the position and duties of Dr. Anne Sagberg at Highland Hospital. That if she is on

a residency basis that her special limited license be renewed to July 1st, 1958. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Anibal Adan was granted special limited license to Duke University School of Medicine on October 4th, 1954 and the same has been renewed annually since that time. On July 15th, 1957, the secretary received a letter from Dr. H. M. Ausherman of Charlotte stating that Dr. Adan, who is technically a third year resident on loan from Duke, was working under a temporary license expiring September 1st, 1957. He asked that Dr. Adan's license be extended until he could take the Virginia Board in about six months. In August, 1957, Dr. Adan's special license was renewed to January 1st, 1958. At that time he was asked to advise the status of his visa, to which inquiry Dr. Adan has failed to reply.

Since the action of the Board in August, 1957 a letter came to this office from Dr. Ausherman with Dr. Adan's name printed on the envelope below that of Dr. Ausherman. A number of letters have been received from Charlotte physicians recommending Dr. Adan for the Board's written examination.

VERDICT: Dr. J. B. Anderson moved that Dr. Anibal Adan be informed that if the status of his visa is still that of a student exchange and that the status of his position is still that of a resident, that when his special limited license expires and his status remains the same, it is possible for his special limited license to be renewed until July 1st, 1958. That if his visa is that of an immigrant, when the present special limited license expires January 1st, 1958, it will not be renewed. That he will no longer be entitled to apply for any type of license in North Carolina unless he should obtain an M. D. degree from an approved medical school. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Carl V. Tyner and was passed unanimously.

RE: Foreign Graduates - State Sanatoria - Dr. J. J. Combs moved that the agreement arrived at with the State Hospital Board of Control be considered and hereby include doctors from unapproved schools at the State Sanatoria. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. J. B. Anderson and passed unanimously.

Dr. J. J. Combs moved that the residency program at the State Hospital in Raleigh be part of the residency program of the University of North Carolina School of Medicine. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. J. B. Anderson and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Francisco B. McHugh Stewart, graduate of the Hospital Vincente D Antonoi, Honduras, C. A., has been a resident at the Community Hospital in Wilmington since November 22nd, 1954.

VERDICT: Dr. Carl V. Tyner moved that Dr. Francisco B. McHugh Stewart be investigated and the necessary action taken. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. J. B. Anderson and passed unanimously.



RE: Dr. Miriam N. Muldrow - The secretary reported that the case of State vs Dr. Muldrow would in all probability be tried in October of this year.

VERDICT: The Board ruled that if Dr. Miriam N. Muldrow is convicted in the Superior Court of Columbus County, North Carolina, to take up with the president and to proceed in the usual manner.

RE: Federation of State Medical Boards - The Board discussed the matter of the secretary attending the meeting of the Executive Council meeting of the Federation, of which he is a member, in Philadelphia in November, 1957.

VERDICT: Dr. J. B. Anderson moved that the Board approve the expenses of Dr. J. J. Combs to attend the meeting of the Executive Council of the Federation of State Medical Boards in Philadelphia November, 1957. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. T. W. Baker and passed unanimously.

Dr. J. B. Anderson moved that the expenses of the examiner in Pathology and Bacteriology be approved for the Examination Institute of the Federation of State Medical Boards. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Victor Anthony Politano was granted limited license to Duke University School of Medicine October 8th, 1951. He has been appointed to the staff of the Department of Urology at Duke University School of Medicine and has applied for conversion of his limited license to full license. His credentials are in order.

"I am writing to inform you that Dr. Norma Holt has returned to the State Hospital, here. As you recall, she was serving a Residency in Pathology at Chapel Hill on special limited license.

"According to our information, Dr. Holt did well at Chapel Hill, but experienced an increase in anxiety,

If there are any complications or developments regarding his services, I will notify you immediately."
