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## MINUTES

Call to Order

Thomas E. Fitz, M.D., President, called this meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina to order at the Great Smokies Hilton, at 8:22 p.m., Wednesday, October 16, 1985. Board members present included: Jack A. Koontz, Secretary; Eben Alexander, Jr., M.D.; David S. Citron, M.D.; John Thomas Daniel, Jr., M.D.; Charles Howard Duckett, M.D.; Rose Pully, M.D.; and Mrs. Martha Kirkland Walston. Harold L. Godwin, M.D., for orientation purposes, also attended this meeting. Staff members in attendance included: Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary; Mrs. Betty Joe Barick, Assistant Executive Secretary; Don Pittman and William H. Breeze, Jr., Investigators; and Sibyl Lamoreaux, Secretary.

Staff members distributed material for Board members' review and the President reviewed the scheduled events for this meeting. Dr. Koontz expressed the Board's appreciation to Dr. and Mrs. Duckett for their hospitality during the Board of Medical Examiners' Retreat.

Malcolm McLean, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Dr. McLean.

Board Correspondence of a Disciplinary Nature

The Board instructed that the President sign all correspondence of a disciplinary nature.

Summers, Gerald, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Koontz that the Board of Medical Examiners institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Dr. Summers and that the basis for these charges be 90-14. (a) (5) and (11).

Ott, David, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Mrs. Walston and seconded by Dr. Koontz that the Board of Medical Examiners institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Dr. Ott.

## REGULATION HEARING

The Board of Medical Examiners held a hearing to amend regulations promulgated within North Carolina General Statute 90-12 and 55B-12. The Board proposes to amend Regulation 21 NCAC 32B .0605; PERSONAL INTERVIEW as follows:

## .0605 PERSONAL INTERVIEW

Applicant is required to appear in person before a Board member.

No one attended this hearing to speak for or against the proposed regulation change.

Regulation 21 NCAC 32C .0001; AUTHORITY: SCOPE AND DEFINITION; catchline is corrected and second paragraph is proposed to be amended as follows:

## .0001 AUTHORITY, SCOPE AND DEFINITION

The rules in this Subchapter supplement the basic statutory law governing professional corporations and shall be interpreted so as not to conflict with such statutory law, as it may be amended from time to time, or with other statutes and laws governing corporations generally.

No one attended the hearing to speak for or against the proposed regulation change.

The President of the Board declared the hearing closed at 9:15 a.m., Friday, October 17, 1985.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that, with the editorial change "before the full Board, a Board member, or the Executive Secretary," the Board of Medical Examiners adopt the amendment to Regulation 21 NCAC 32B .0605.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners adopt the amendment to Regulation 21 NCAC 32C .0001.

## REPORT ON REGULATION HEARING HELD IN RALEIGH, SEPTEMBER 26, 1985

Dr. Koontz, the Hearing Officer, reported on this Hearing held in Raleigh at 2:00 p.m., September 26, 1985, on proposed amendments to Regulation 21 NCAC 32B .0109; FEE; and to Regulation 21 NCAC 32B .0408; MEDICAL EDUCATION.

Dr. Koontz reported that no one appeared to speak for or against these proposed amendments and that he declared the Hearing closed at 2:04 p.m., September 26, 1985.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Citron that, with appropriate typographical corrections, the Board of Medical Examiners adopt these Regulation changes.

Regulation 21 NCAC 32B .0109; FEE; is to be amended as follows:

.0109 FEE

Fee for both components, taken together, shall be four hundred dollars (\$400.00) to be paid at time of application.

Fee for each component, taken separately, shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) to be paid at time of application

In the event applicant fails to make a passing score on the examination, there will be no refund of fee. In the event applicant does not appear for the regularly scheduled examination or application is withdrawn, no portion of the fee will be refunded.

Regulation 21 NCAC 32B .0408; MEDICAL EDUCATION; is to be adopted as follows:

.0408 MEDICAL EDUCATION

A physician applicant must be a graduate of a medical school approved by either:

- (1) LCME (Liaison Commission on Medical Education), or
- (2) AOA (American Osteopathic Association).

If graduated from a medical school not approved by the LCME or AOA, and, if clinical clerkships are taken in the U.S.A., the applicant must:

- (1) furnish evidence that he has satisfactorily completed clinical clerkships at teaching hospitals in the U.S.A. with ACGME (Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education) or AOA-approved graduate medical education and training programs in the areas of the specific clerkships;
- (2) if clerkships do not meet the above requirement, deficiencies may be remedied as follows:

- (a) re-apply to medical school so that the school may arrange for the applicant to complete approved clinical clerkships as required; or
- (b) apply for admission to advanced standing at a medical school approved by the LCME or AOA to repeat one year of clinical clerkship.

BURDEN OF PROOF OF MEDICAL EDUCATION IS ON THE APPLICANT

By common consent, the Board agreed that the Board of Medical Examiners disseminate these Regulation changes to all North Carolina medical schools and residency programs.

HEARING

Navab, Abdol Hossein, M.D.

At the request of Abdol Hossein Navab, M.D., the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing at the Great Smokies Hilton, Asheville, North Carolina, at 10:00 a.m., Friday, October 18, 1985.

Dr. Navab appeared at this Hearing without counsel.

At the conclusion of this Hearing, the Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Koontz that the Board of Medical Examiners deny Dr. Navab's application to take Component II of FLEX.

Durante, Spencer E., Jr., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board of Medical Examiners institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Dr. Durante, that it so inform this physician in writing, and that it further inform Dr. Durante the Board will hold a hearing on the charges preferred against him.

Nelson, Robert P., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Pully and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Dr. Nelson.

Stowell, Jeremy, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Koontz that the Board of Medical Examiners, through its attorney, offer Dr. Stowell the opportunity to sign a Consent Order containing the same conditions as those imposed upon his licensure in the state of Virginia.

## HEARING

Guess, George, M.D.

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina held a Hearing on charges preferred against George Guess, M.D., at 1:00 p.m., Friday, October 19, 1985, at the Great Smokies Hilton, Asheville, North Carolina, at which Hearing, Dr. Guess appeared with counsel. This Hearing has been continued to a future date for completion.

## AGENDA ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

Boyd, Arthur B., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners not approve Dr. Boyd's request to appear before the full Board.

Knelson, Mark Henry, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board of Medical Examiners:

1. assume Dr. Knelson has withdrawn his application;
2. so notify this physician and refund his fee; and
3. further notify Dr. Knelson that, if in the future he wishes to apply to take FLEX in North Carolina, he must complete the entire application process.

Ekelund, Lars-Goran C., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Pully and seconded by Dr. Koontz that the Board of Medical Examiners take this matter under advisement and request Dr. Greenfield to furnish the Board with a certificate verifying that Dr. Ekelund has completed one year of post-graduate training.

Unsworth, Ian, M.D.

The President of the Board instructed that the Board of Medical Examiners accept Mr. Paris' report concerning this physician as information and approve the Executive Secretary's issuance of a Visiting Professor Certificate of Registration to Ian Unsworth, M.D.

Updike, Jan Charles, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners

reinstate this physician's license to practice medicine in the state of North Carolina.

Carson, Rickey Reynolds, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board of Medical Examiners:

1. issue Dr. Carson a temporary license for a period of one year;
2. place the following conditions on this temporary license:
  - a. that he remain of good character;
  - b. that he obey all federal and state laws;
  - c. that he refrain from all alcoholic beverages, including wine and beer;
  - d. that he not consume any controlled substances;
  - e. that he regularly attend Alcoholics Anonymous meetings; and
  - f. that he appear before the prior to the expiration of this temporary license.

The Board unanimously adopted another motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that, when Dr. Carson appears before the Board prior to the expiration of this temporary license, the Board of Medical Examiners, at that time, determine this physician's future licensure status.

Verma, Virendar K., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners return Dr. Verma's photograph and inform him that, in order to comply with the Board's requirements, the seal of his medical school must be affixed to this photograph.

Conversion of Limited Licenses issued to Physicians' Practicing Across State Lines

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners, after obtaining reports from the Virginia Board indicating there is no derogatory information concerning Drs. Melnick and Hoffman, issue these physicians license certificates without limitations. The Board also unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners authorize its staff, after obtaining appropriate information, to remove similar limitations from license certificates.

Hanham, William James, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board of Medical Examiners enter into a Consent Order with Dr. Hanham stipulating that, as Dr. Hanham has met with the Board and voluntarily discussed various aspects of his current medical practice; and that, furthermore, as Dr. Hanham is prepared to undertake various responsibilities to enhance his current medical practice, the Board of Medical Examiners, therefore, orders:

1. that this physician immediately discontinue prescribing drugs contained in Schedules 2 and 2N except in a hospital, institution, or in the treatment of patients whose records document terminal cancer;
2. that this physician commence participation in an active, structured continuing medical education program;
3. that this physician take and pass Component II of the Federation Licensing Examination (FLEX) by the August, 1986, meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners;
4. that, if this physician fails to take and pass Component II of FLEX, he shall surrender his license to practice medicine in North Carolina; and
5. that this physician meet informally with the Board as it may request, but specifically, at the August, 1986, meeting, to discuss his progress and compliance with this Consent Order.

Berrios, Oswald, M.D.

Dr. Citron reported to the Board on his review of material submitted by Dr. Berrios attesting to this physician's medical knowledge. The Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board of Medical Examiners advise Dr. Berrios in writing with a copy to his attorney that:

1. The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North has carefully reviewed all the material provided by Dr. Berrios;
2. As a result of this review, the Board is impressed with his sincerity and desire to comply with the instructions of the Board of Medical Examiners;

3. In consideration of the material which Dr. Berrios submitted and his expression of willingness to cooperate with the Board, the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners rescinds its request that Dr. Berrios sign a Consent Order;
4. However, the Board of Medical Examiners, urges him to maintain more complete and legible records, suggests that his chart entries be typed or block-printed; advises him the Board will monitor his prescribing practices, and further advises it will request Dr. Berrios to appear for an informal interview at the end of six months in order that the Board of Medical Examiners may review his progress.

Mathew, Roy Jacob, M.D.

The Board adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that, as Dr. Mathew will be primarily involved in teaching and research; as he is Board-certified; as he is well-trained; and, as he is recognized as an authority in his field by Texas, Vanderbilt, and Duke, the Board of Medical Examiners issue him a license limited to Duke University Medical Center and its affiliated hospitals. Dr. Koontz abstained from voting on this motion and the President did not vote as he only votes to break a tie.

O'Neil, Howard William

Dr. Alexander conducted this interview. Dr. O'Neil answered affirmatively to all questions routinely asked of licensure applicants with the exception of the question concerning difficulty with a medical licensing Board. The Board reviewed information indicating that the court convicted Dr. O'Neil of using fraudulent prescriptions to obtain amphetamines for himself.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners issue Dr. O'Neil a temporary license for a period of one year based upon the following conditions:

1. that Dr. O'Neil be and remain of high moral character;
2. that Dr. O'Neil violate no state or federal law;
3. that Dr. O'Neil abstain from alcohol;
4. that Dr. O'Neil continue his participation in Alcoholics Anonymous;
5. that Dr. O'Neil refrain from the use of any controlled substances not prescribed by another physician or dentist;

6. that, upon request, Dr. O'Neil submit to random drug screens;
7. that, should Dr. O'Neil apply for hospital privileges, he fully disclose the nature of his past difficulties;
8. that, should Dr. O'Neil change his practice site, he notify the Board of Medical Examiners immediately, explaining the reasons; and
9. that, prior to the expiration of this temporary license, Dr. O'Neil appear before the Board of Medical Examiners.

#### Physicians Resigning Prior to Completion of Residency Programs

The Board adopted a motion that the Board of Medical Examiners send letters to all Directors of Residency Programs in North Carolina requesting that, should a resident resign prior to completion of a training program, the Director of the program inform the Board of this resignation and the reasons for it.

#### Locklear, J.C., M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board of Medical Examiners issue Dr. Locklear a temporary license for a period of two years and that the Board interview him prior to the expiration of this temporary license.

#### Beasley, J. Frank, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners issue Dr. Beasley a temporary license for a period of one year; that the Board advise Dr. Beasley not to apply for DEA privileges; that the Board limit this license to Broughton Hospital and its administrative locations; and that the Board of Medical Examiners interview Dr. Beasley prior to the expiration of this temporary license.

#### Hamer, Richard Dallas, M.D.

Dr. Koontz interviewed Dr. Hamer and presented a report to the full Board indicating that Dr. Hamer has been doing well and has expressed appreciation to the Board of Medical Examiners for its assistance. The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners:

1. reinstate Dr. Hamer's medical license;
2. endorse an application for DEA prescribing privileges in Schedules 3, 4, and 5; and,

3. continue to monitor this physician's activities and prescribing for a period of two years.

#### AGENDA ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION CONTINUED

##### Aiken, George Stephens Elkin, M.D.

The Board reviewed a request that it permit Dr. Aiken to take FLEX under specifically controlled circumstances. The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Pully and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners:

1. table this matter until December, 1985;
2. obtain more information on Dr. Aiken's previous examinations;
3. inform Dr. Aiken, if he wishes to take FLEX in December, 1985, he must take this examination as it is routinely administered pending further investigation by the Board of Medical Examiners; and
4. refund Dr. Aiken's fee if he wishes to take FLEX at a later date.

#### AGENDA ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION CONTINUED

##### Form Letters

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board of Medical Examiners accept the form letters as information and add to the letter regarding amphetamine prescribing "and the Board of Medical Examiners concurs with the North Carolina Medical Society's recommendation on prescribing amphetamines and amphetamine-like substances."

##### Ivey, Fay, Data Request

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board not approve this request.

##### Optometry Letter to Attorney General

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board rescind its previous action and that it not send the letter in question to the Attorney General.

##### Carolina Eye Associates, P.A./Carolina Eye Associates of Charlotte, P.A.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board of Medical Examiners approve this corporate name with the stipulation that the corporation use it only in relationship to a practice located in or near Charlotte, North Carolina.

Form Letter Drafted by the Board's Attorney

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board of Medical Examiners add this letter, with one editorial change, to its Form Letters.

Doctors Imaging Center

The Board adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board accept a report concerning this Center as information. Dr. Pully voted in opposition to this motion.

Kej, Gary Gyan, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners instruct its attorney to prepare a Consent Order containing the following stipulations:

1. Dr. Kej will surrender his license to practice medicine in North Carolina;
2. Dr. Kej will close his practice while participating in a training program;
3. The Board will issue Dr. Kej a temporary license limited to the University of Maryland's Program for Re-training Physicians, contingent upon his acceptance into this program;
3. Dr. Kej will make the Director of the Program aware of his problems with the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners;
4. Dr. Kej will provide the Board with such progress reports as it may require from the Director of the Program, as well as proof of satisfactory completion of the program;
5. Dr. Kej will take and pass Component II of FLEX by June, 1986;
6. Dr. Kej will remain of high moral character; and,
7. Dr. Kej will violate no federal or state laws.

The Board unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board not permit Dr. Kej to moonlight during any portion of the time the Consent Order is in effect.

Freymann, Moyer Wicks, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board's attorney send a letter to Dr. Freyermann, certified - return receipt requested - stating the Board has directed him to prepare charges against Dr. Freyermann; but, if Dr. Freyermann will agree to appearing before the Board of Medical Examiners informally, the Board will consider discussing this matter with him.

May, 1986, Meeting

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners not hold a meeting during May, 1986; that it add one to one and one-half days to its June, 1986, meeting; and that, during March, the Executive Secretary maintain a running total of necessary business and inform the Board members so that, if a need for a meeting exists, they can decide when and where to hold it.

October, 1986, Meeting

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board of Medical Examiners hold this meeting October 8 - 12, 1986, at the Green Park Inn, Blowing Rock, North Carolina; and that, upon Dr. Citron's recommendation, a second site option be the new hotel in Charlotte.

Joint Practice Committee Representative, Letter from

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Pully that this letter be accepted as information and that the Board write the following letter to Hettie Garland.

At its October, 1985, meeting, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina reviewed your letter of August 7, 1985. As a result of this review, the Board expresses its appreciation for your support and participation in the Nurse Practitioner program review process.

The Board of Medical Examiners will appreciate the Joint Practice Committee's continuing to remain available for review of Nurse Practitioner programs as the Joint Subcommittee of the Board of Medical Examiners and the Board of Nursing may deem appropriate.

Alcoholic Rehabilitation Center

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board request the Administrator to write a letter explaining the current physician supervision of extenders at this site and the Center's plans for physician supervision once it replaces Dr. Johnstone; and that the Board of Medical Examiners approve the temporary supervisory arrangements with the stipulation that, as soon as the Center has a new Medical Director, the Alcoholic Rehabilitation Center submit the proper forms in order that the Board may consider approval of the new Director as a supervising physician for extenders performing medical acts at this site.

Durham County Health Department Extenders

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners permit the extenders who work in the active sexually transmitted disease clinic to administer IM medications in accordance with the conditions outlined in the letter from the Durham County Health Department dated September 17, 1985.

Micropigmentation Surgery Associates, P.A.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners approve this proposed name.

Carolina Cosmetic Surgery Center, P.A.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Citron and seconded by Dr. Pully that the Board of Medical Examiners approve this proposed name.

Women's Health Care Nurse Practitioner Program, Harbor-UCLA Medical Center, Torrance, California

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board approve this program.

Catenacci Corporation

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Citron that the Board of Medical Examiners approve this proposed name.

Todd, Gary Price, M.D.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Mrs. Walston that the Board of Medical Examiners institute the proper procedures to prefer charges against Dr. Todd.

Emergency Medical Services Report

Dr. Daniel presented this report and recommended that all Emergency Medical Technicians-Paramedic, Emergency Medical Technicians-Intermediate, and Mobile Intensive Nurse applications submitted be approved. Dr. Daniel also recommended that all Bee Sting Certifications submitted be approved. The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Koontz that the Board of Medical Examiners approve all these Emergency Medical Services applications.

The Board unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Koontz and seconded by Dr. Daniel:

1. that the Work Notes show names of members who made and seconded motions, details of discussions, and how members voted;
2. that the Minutes include formal actions and the number voting for and against these actions;
3. that the staff distribute Minutes for Board members' review;
4. and that the Board members formally act upon the Minutes of each meeting.


