

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS  
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Blockade Runner, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina

September 26 - 27th, 1969

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Blockade Runner, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina, September 26-27th, 1969, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and special limited license, and for other business.

Friday, September 26th

2:00 P. M. \_\_\_\_\_ - The Board convened and Drs. Frank Edmondson, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr., Cornelius T. Partrick and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

RE: Dr. Rayford Lee Weinstein - Following the direction of the Board, Order for Examination by Dr. Hans Lowenbach, psychiatrist, of Dr. Weinstein for a psychiatric evaluation was issued to Dr. Weinstein on July 30th, 1969, which order was disregarded. Dr. Weinstein was then served with Accusations and Charges and the hearing set for this date. The attorney for the Board received word on July 24th that Dr. Weinstein was confined to the hospital and he asked for a continuance of the hearing, which was granted after conferring with the president of the Board. RE: Conversion of limited to full license - A motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously that the following doctors' limited license be converted to full license:

RE: Dr. I. M. Goco, a graduate of the University of St. Tomas, Philippines, was granted license by written examination in 1962, limited geographically until citizenship obtained, within six years. Dr. Goco was advised by letter as of January 23rd, 1962, the policy of the Board with regard to granting license to a physician before he received his citizenship. He was told that if he had not obtained citizenship within six years, his license would become null and void.

Dr. Goco has advised that he has not obtained citizenship; that his status is that of a permanent citizen.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that Dr. I.M. Goco be advised the policy of the Board of Medical Examiners that he had been given; that he be requested to appear and show cause why his license should not be revoked. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Joseph Kreplick (See previous Minutes of the July, 1969 meeting) - Dr. Kreplick appeared petitioning for license by endorsement of credentials. Investigation revealed that Dr. Kreplick's license to practice medicine had been revoked in another state and that the same had been reinstated. He had been given a position in one of our state mental institutions. At that time the Board deferred action.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that Dr. Joseph Kreplick be granted license, limited to Cherry Hospital. There was no second to this motion.

Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that Dr. Joseph Kreplick not be granted license to practice medicine. This motion was duly seconded and passed by a vote of five to one.

RE: Written Examination June, 1970

Dr. Hooper moved that if in the judgment of the secretary it is feasible, to make arrangements most applicable for the June, 1970 examination. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed unanimously.

Dr. Hooper moved that the secretary be instructed to have examinations prepared by Flex for Part II for those who have taken Part I. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. Combs moved that fee for Part II of the written examination be Fifty Dollars, one-half of the total examination fee. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

MEETINGS

Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the Board of Medical Examiners meet October 9-10th, 1970, at the Blockade Runner, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the interviews for licensure by endorsement of credentials be set during the meeting for the written examination December 2-4th, 1970. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Budget 1970 - Dr. H. Lee Large moved that the budget for 1970 be approved as recommended by the secretary; that the part-time secretary be made full-time; that the auditor assist in the bookkeeping as discussed. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Rayford Lee Weinstein - (See p. 195 these Minutes) - Attorney Henry Mitchell advised that the attorney for the defendant had stated he would attempt to keep Dr. Weinstein from practicing until he could be heard; that he would not represent him if he did not abide by this.



Dr. Weinstein continued

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper moved that the Board of Medical Examiners follow the advice of the attorney as to when the hearing of Dr. Rayford Lee Weinstein be set and the number in attendance at this hearing be left to the discretion of the president. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Henry Eugene Barnes - The secretary reported that Dr. Barnes had surrendered his narcotic tax stamp as directed; that evidence had not been received that he had carried out the portion of the verdict as to being examined by a psychiatrist.

VERDICT: The secretary was instructed to write Dr. Henry Eugene Barnes and ask him to authorize permission for the Board of Medical Examiners to procure copy of evaluation by the psychiatrist. The Board authorized if this was not carried out by the November, 1969 meeting, that it may desire to see him again.

RE: License Certificate - Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that the degree received be put on the license certificate.

Dr. Joseph W. Hooper moved that the original motion be tabled. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed by a vote of three.

The Minutes were approved as read.

RE: Professional Corporation Act - The secretary advised that inquiries are coming in as to how this act can be implemented.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the legal staff make recommendations to this Board as to how the Professional Corporation Act should be implemented with respect to rules and regulations needed by the Board. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper moved that a letter be written to Dr. Edgar T. Beddingfield, Jr. thanking him for his letter and say that the Board of Medical Examiners is primarily interested in the fair and impartial licensing of MDs and DOs to furnish medical care to the citizens of North Carolina. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. William Murphy Bethune, Jr. (See p. 191 of these Minutes) - The Board approved reinstatement of Dr. Bethune's license to practice medicine under certain conditions not to exceed one year. The secretary reported that Dr. Bethune had written that he had procured an appointment to Cherry Hospital and that confirmation of this appointment would be sent by the superintendent of that institution, which confirmation was not received prior to this meeting.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the secretary be given the authority to approve reinstatement to Cherry Hospital of Dr. William Murphy Bethune under limited conditions as per the resolution of the Board, upon receipt of request or confirmation of Dr. Frank James, Superintendent. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. Edmondson: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No sir

Q. Have you ever had any difficulty with any medical examining board?

VERDICT: Dr. Ray Hampton was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary.

RE: Dr. Richard Clarkson Baker, graduate of the Kirksville College of Osteopathy and Surgery in 1941, appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials from Missouri, where he took the examination of the Missouri Board of Registration for the Healing Arts.

Dr. Edmondson: In reviewing your credentials I noticed in your examination we do not have a grade in materia medica and pediatrics. Could you tell the Board if they were combined with any other subjects?

A. It was combined in 1941. I do not have a list. Practically 28 years ago it is difficult to recall things. Materia medica was part of the curriculum, it was called - - - - - drugs under one head. I seem to remember one thing, a subject that is apparently not on there. Would you go through the list one more time. This is list given by the Missouri Board?

Dr. Edmondson: Right

Dr. Edmondson read the list of subjects again.

Dr. Baker: No, I can only say that materia medica, we definitely were examined in the field of materia medica, I can not think of a synonymous word used in 1941. Terminology changes.

Dr. Edmondson: Could you tell us if pediatrics was combined?

A. Pediatrics was combined on one of those subjects. I believe my license has more subjects than this.

Q. You are not aware of what combination?

A. I can not, I am sure I was examined in materia medica. I do not recognize any of those subjects.

Q. What type of practice have you been engaged in North Carolina?

A. Gentlemen, I do not know how great a hurry you are in. When I first came into the state I was one of the first who wrote the North Carolina Board - - - - -. At the time we did not have narcotics permission and written prescription privileges. There might be one or two back in 1941, there were not any legend items as compared to sulfa, antibiotics had not come along. I commenced to practice in a small town, Rockingham, there was a need for doctors there. One or two did not feel that way, I went around and met them and tried to get to know them. I was called on for house calls. For the first two or three years of my practice I carried on essentially general practice insofar as house calls were concerned. At this time most of the proprietary drugs, some legend, were available - - - -. In many instances I would suggest use of that, I had reasonably good results, I signed a few death certificates. Those cases were sufficiently acute for me to need narcotics or related items. I would call on



Dr. Baker continued

the local medical people, friends of mine, to come in on a consultation basis. I am leading up to the fact that I was indicted for practicing medicine in 1943. The Richmond County Medical Society saw fit to bring this action. This was carried on for three years, to the Supreme Court, I was found guilty of practicing medicine without a license. I was fined \$50.00. Up until then I had carried on as best I could within the confines of the laws as I understood it. I had a manipulative practice, also I had a general practice. When the Supreme Court rendered its decision since that time I had been limited to a manipulative type of practice. I have been trained in medicine. I have approached all through the years cases with this training in the background and have referred acute cases not manipulative in nature. I do simple fracture work. You can imagine it would be difficult to do fracture work without medicine to relieve pain. I have a large practice, we do blood work, occasionally take care of fractures, the greater part of the practice has been manipulative. I am pleased with referred work in many instances. I stay busy, I am happy. I feel I have done some good here and there. It has been a constant source of irritation to have a source of medicine and not be able to utilize this knowledge. I am trying to keep up with things and am still being detailed by the - - - drug houses.

Dr. Edmondson: Have you tried to keep up as far as postgraduate training or attending lectures.

Dr. Baker: We have a three day refresher course in Asheville, I attend that, members of the divisional society. Refresher courses in Chicago. I have had occasions to be in Florida, visiting a good friend and relative, to be exposed to some of the more modern techniques of fractures. I have a minimum of a three day refresher work each year.

Q. If you were granted a full North Carolina, to what extent would it change your work at all?

A. I expected this question would be asked. Frankly, I do not think it would change my way of things a great deal. It would make me more efficient in the work I am in. I have a great deal of low back pain in which I need drugs and relaxants. I am blessed with friends who will call the drug store and order what the patient needs. I could do a little more fracture work. I could take care of more - - - - - cases that turn as to referral. I do not expect at the age of 50 to try to build a medical practice as such.

Q. Do you have any hospital association or hospital facilities?

A. We have a fine little hospital there. I can not by law to this point admit patients or treat them there. Many times I have had patients I would like to hospitalize, acute joint conditions, arthritics. I realize this is a transitory state in North Carolina, I realize if licensed I could not go in Richmond County Hospital and expect to be taken on the staff. I am not sure I would ever request that. Amalgamation of osteopathy I presume will be eventually worked out. I presume I would still call on my medical friends. I assume the American Medical Association would not - - - on an individual for working with a D.O.

Q. We have certain routine questions we ask all applicants. Have you ever had any convictions other than the one you tell us relative to practicing without a license?

A. No

Q. Have you ever had any difficulty with any medical examining board except that particular incident?

A. No

Q. Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. I would hope not to excess, I do use alcohol.

Q. Have you ever used narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No

Q. This will constitute your appearance before the Board and you will be notified as to the action of the Board. Of course, we will have to be guided by our interpretation of the Medical Practice Act.

A. I realize that.



Dr. Large: What laboratory work do you do in your office?

A. Urinalysis, red and white, hemoglobin, differential, BUN.

Q. Do you do these yourself?

A. No, I have a medical technician, had her seven years, registered last year. I have another girl who has had two years nursing training and lab.

Q. What is your method of hemoglobin?

A. We have a hemoglobinometer. I can not remember the name of it, 1969 instrument. It is supposed to be good. I recently bought a piece of equipment that does seven tests, we also check on it hemoglobin wise. I have a question or two.

Dr. Hooper: - - - -If you received license would you accept obstetrics?

A. At this time, no, I would never do obstetrics if I could help it. I delivered one child in a mill home. - - - I got a medical man in and admitted to the hospital, both died.

Dr. Baker: Can you give me some rough estimate as to when I will know where I stand in this.

A. It take office a week or two weeks to get all reports out.

Dr. Baker: This is an unusual situation, we have an osteopathic board and the privilege of our graduates taking the medical board and I am sure in some instances will approach the osteopathic board and some instances where you will have applicants that we will not know of it. I would hope your board would notify the DO Board, this liason would be beneficial to both groups.

Dr. Baker left the room - he asked to come back in and stated that the subject in which materia medica was combined was toxicology. He said Dr. Funk had made that statement.

RE: Dr. Richard Clarkson Baker

VERDICT:/ Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that based upon the interview and re-  
view of credentials, the Board of Medical Examiners finds that the application/should  
of Dr. Baker  
be denied. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and passed  
unanimously.

RE: Dr. Guy Tricillion Asay Funk, graduate of the Kirksville College of Osteopathy and Surgery in 1931, appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Edmondson: I believe Dr. Baker conferred with you and said credit in Materia Medica was combined with toxicology.

Dr. Funk: This is correct. We checked on this with the school. You asked a question, pediatrics was combined with principals and practice.

Q. What type of practice are you engaged in North Carolina?

A. In - - - -osteopathy manipulative.

Q. Has it been confined without the use of drugs?

A. Yes sir, it had to be.

Q. If granted a North Carolina license, how do you contemplate this would change your practice:

A. I do not contemplate any change in practice of osteopathic medicine. Primarily, I am 60 years of age, I have been in practice since 1931. My receiving a license to practice in North Carolina simply means I can perhaps do a little better job. I have no ambition to change my practice in anyway.

Q. Have you taken any courses, refresher courses, kept up, ever attended any medical meetings.

A. If you want an honest answer, I have probably attended more courses than any other man in the state in the osteopathic profession. In January a week by the head of the Department of Internal Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania, not quite a week in Internal Medicine, particularly G. I. diseases, Lea High Acres, Florida, eastern study course for osteopathic medicine. Since I am a member of the Penn Osteopathic Association I had notice of this. I attended the Virginia Osteopathic Medical Association meeting in May. We have tried to keep up, of course our own meeting each year.



Dr. Funk continued

Dr. Edmondson: Would you tell the Board what your practice consists of at the present time.

A. Mostly office work, house calls, surgery or what?

A. I do no surgery, my practice is muscular - - of course involved with osteopathic manipulation, diagnosis, much of our work is referred from men who do not do this work. The latter part of your question had to do with what I proposed to do with it. I think I have already answered that except using a few analgesics I have not been able to use where we have had to call on our friends.

Q. Do you have any association with any hospital in Winston-Salem?

A. No only through those members who are on the staff.

Dr. Edmondson: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No sir

Q. Have you ever had any difficulty with any medical examining board? A. No sir

Q. Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. I do not use alcohol.

Q. Have you ever used barbiturates or narcotics? A. No sir

Q. Do you have any questions?

A. Concerning what?

Q. Do you have any questions?

A. I was expecting to be asked what we proposed to do under this new situation which is rather awkward for all of us. I just received an appointment to the North Carolina Board of Osteopathic Examination and Administration. This is awkward involving one state out of 50 that has two examining boards. The only thing I can think to ask would be that you consider in my case that I do not intend to do any different primarily than I have done. If you gentlemen would like to know something more about my own situation, I will be happy to tell you.

Dr. Edmondson: The judgment of this Board has to be based on our interpretation of the Medical Practice Act.

Dr. Hooper: Is it your feeling that the science of medicine and osteopathy should be amalgamated or do you feel they should continue to be separate?

A. I am going to be very frank, you have asked a - - - question as far as my feelings are concerned. I got out of school a long time ago. I am a doctor of osteopathy by choice. I lived in Pennsylvania, because of some things that touch me personally I became a doctor of osteopathic medicine. Never have I been able to rationalize the - - - of medicine. In answering your question, I think there is no excuse for two schools of medicine. You perhaps know the history of the schools better than I do. I feel eventually, it is long delayed, the dominant school which you represent is going to have to take advantage of the research and knowledge that has come out of this school just as you did many years ago from the homeopathic school. My feeling is yes, I do not know the term amalgamation - at the present time the schools are serving best as they are but there has to be a meeting of the minds.

Dr. Edmondson: This will constitute your appearance before this Board. We will notify you in approximately two weeks as to the action of the Board.

RE: Dr. Guy Tricillion Asay Funk

VERDICT: / Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that based upon the interview and upon review of credentials, the Board of Medical Examiners finds that the application of / should be denied. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Edwin F. Merolla appeared in November, 1968 applying for license by endorsement of credentials and was approved contingent upon his locating in the state for practice, within one year. Dr. Merolla has notified the office of the secretary that he has established residence in Asheville and that his business address is Buncombe County Health Department.

VERDICT: Dr. Ali Jarrahi was approved for the written examination.



RE: Dr. Alfonso Lombana, graduate of the University of Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1961, appeared petitioning for the privilege of taking the written examination. He is married to a native of North Carolina.

Dr. Large: Why do you wish to take our examination?

A. I plan to reside in North Carolina, the western part of North Carolina. I will do Internal Medicine to associate with Dr. Musser at Swannanoa. He presented immigrant card A 13 391362.

VERDICT: Dr. Alfonso Lombano was approved for the written examination.

RE: Dr. Brazie-Guy Abbate, graduate of the University of Lausanne in 1960, appeared and petitioned for the privilege of taking the written examination.

Dr. Combs: Why do you wish to take our examination?

A. I have been asked by the Haywood County Society to go into the Waynesville area for the practice of Urology.

VERDICT: Dr. Brazie-Guy Abbate was approved for the written examination provided his credentials are completed.

Dr. Edmondson: This special limited license does not carry the privilege of narcotic tax stamp, for training only, to be renewed.

RE: Dr. John Milton Gambill - (See previous Minutes) - Dr. Gambill was involved personally with narcotics. He surrendered his narcotic tax stamp in 1955. His license to practice medicine was revoked for that and other problems. Dr. Gambill received treatment and was later given a special limited license in 1961 to work at Broughton Hospital. His license to practice medicine was reinstated in 1962.

Dr. Gambill appeared at this time to petition for recommendation of reinstatement of his narcotic tax stamp. He stated that he is clinical director of the Alcoholic Rehabilitation Center at Greenville; that he has no way to prescribe narcotics if needed. He stated that he is the only doctor there and is relieved by physicians in Greenville. He said that he had gotten along well and felt that there would be no problem if given a narcotic tax stamp.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that Dr. John Milton Gambill be advised to explore with the authorities of the institution all the possibilities of getting an institutional tax stamp, which would not necessitate that he receive narcotic tax stamp; that if this could not be done to be seen at a later date. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

Dr. Gambill was advised by Dr. Edmondson of the verdict of the Board.

RE: Dr. Bennie Brooks Ward (see previous Minutes) - Dr. Ward appeared for a routine interview at the request of the Board. He said he was practicing every day and doing well; that it had been five years since he had taken any narcotics. The Board directed that he be seen in one year.

RE: Flex Examination - The secretary presented letter from the committee as to a representative from this Board on the Text Committee. The secretary was directed to get some more information on the Test Committee and that Dr. Bryant L. Galusha be appointed to this Committee with the understanding that if he can not accept, that this matter be dropped for the time.

The secretary was directed to invite the deans of the medical schools and directors of medical education to meet with the Board at the January, 1970 meeting.

Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. nominated Dr. Vernon Williams Taylor, Jr. for president for the coming year. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed unanimously.

RE: Per Diem of the Secretary - Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously that the per diem of the secretary be increased \$50.00 per month for the coming year.

The Minutes were approved as read.
