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MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Charles H. Duckett, M.D., President of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, called this meeting to order at 8:45 p.m., September 30, 1987, at the Sheraton Imperial Hotel, Research Triangle Park, North Carolina.

The Board members present at this meeting included: Eben Alexander, Jr., M.D.; John Thomas Daniel, Jr., M.D.; Harold L. Godwin, M.D.; Hector Himel Henry, II, M.D.; and Mrs. Martha Kirkland Walston.

Staff members present included: Bryant D. Paris, Jr.; Don Pittman; William H. Breeze, Jr.; Robbie Broyles; L. D. Beaver; Kathy Burke; Leslie Newton; and Sibyl Lamoreaux.

MC ELROY, Richard Allen, M.D., Landis, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board advise Dr. McElroy the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina will offer Dr. McElroy the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order with the Board containing the following conditions:

1. Dr. McElroy shall forthwith surrender his DEA prescribing privileges in all schedules of controlled substances;
2. Dr. McElroy shall take the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX Components I and II) in December, 1987, to demonstrate his medical knowledge. Failure of Dr. McElroy to achieve a passing score, as defined in N.C.A.C. 32B.0111, shall be cause for such further action by the Board as it may deem necessary;
3. Dr. McElroy shall cease administering Vitamin B-12 injections in situations where there is no valid medical need or reason therefor; and
4. Dr. McElroy shall appear before the Board of Medical Examiners for further interviews on an informal basis at such times and places as the Board may request.

QURESHI, Aftab Ahmad, M.D., Ahoskie, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board offer Dr. Qureshi the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina containing a Reprimand and stating:

1. The Board of Medical Examiners reprimands Dr. Qureshi and admonishes him to keep fully apprised of all laws applicable to the handling of controlled substances; and
2. Dr. Qureshi shall appear before the Board of Medical Examiners for further interviews on an informal basis at such times and places as the Board may request.

FISHER, John Apfel, M.D., Goldsboro, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board offer Dr. Fisher the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina containing a Reprimand and stipulating:

1. The Board of Medical Examiners reprimands Dr. Fisher for his unprofessional conduct in becoming habituated to the controlled substance Preludin;
2. Dr. Fisher shall surrender his DEA prescribing privileges for substances in Schedules 2 and 2N;
3. Dr. Fisher shall continue his attendance at AA and NA, as well as his participation in the programs of the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee of the North Carolina Medical Society;
4. Dr. Fisher shall provide to the Board of Medical Examiners a current report on his status from Dr. Clark and shall provide an additional report prior to appearing for an interview with the Board; and
5. Dr. Fisher shall appear before the Board of Medical Examiners for further interviews on an informal basis at the Board's meeting in March, 1988, and at such other times and places as the Board may request.

WYMAN, Robert West, M.D., Selma, North Carolina

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously

adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board offer Dr. Wyman the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order including a Reprimand with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina and that this Consent Order also contain the following stipulations:

1. Dr. Wyman shall surrender his prescribing privileges in Schedules 2 and 2N;
2. Dr. Wyman shall continue his psychiatric therapy until such time as his therapist shall recommend discontinuance;
3. Dr. Wyman shall provide a written progress to the Board of Medical Examiners from his Psychiatrist immediately prior to his next scheduled meeting with the Board; and
4. Dr. Wyman shall appear before the Board of Medical Examiners for further interviews on an informal basis at the March, 1988, meeting of the Board and at such other times and places as the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners may request.

HILL, Ivor Dennis, M.D., Cape Town, South Africa

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett:

that the Board send a letter to Dr. Simon inquiring if Dr. Hill is a physician who would qualify for Visiting Professor status and whether the Dean of the Bowman Gray School of Medicine recommends Dr. Hill for licensure;

that the Board review Dr. Simon's response at the next meeting; and

that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina consider issuing a license to Dr. Hill specifically limiting his activities to Bowman Gray School of Medicine and its affiliated institutions, waiving the requirement for the standard certificate of ECFMG, and allowing Dr. Hill a period of two years plus an extension of three to pass the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX).

VERWOERDT, Adriaan, M.D., Durham, North Carolina

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously

adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board request the Ethics Committee of the North Carolina Psychiatric Association to report its action concerning Dr. Verwoerd to the Board of Medical Examiners; and that, if the Ethics Committee does not provide this report, the Board request Dr. Verwoerd to obtain the information for the Board of Medical Examiners' review.

LLEWELLYN, Charles E., M.D., Durham, North Carolina

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board request the Ethics Committee of the North Carolina Psychiatric Association to report its action concerning Dr. Llewellyn to the Board of Medical Examiners; and that, if the Ethics Committee does not provide this report, the Board request Dr. Llewellyn to obtain the information for the Board of Medical Examiners' review.

CHELATION THERAPY

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board authorize its attorney to communicate with the attorney representing the physicians who practice chelation therapy stating, if his clients are, in fact, involved with a research protocol, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina has no difficulty accepting this type of activity; but, if his clients are not involved with a research protocol, the Board of Medical Examiners believes these physicians should not engage in administering chelation therapy in the treatment of diseases for which its efficacy has not been established.

MILLER, Norman Eric, M.D., London, England

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina issue Dr. Miller a license specifically limiting his activities to Bowman Gray School of Medicine and its affiliated institutions, waiving the requirement for the standard certificate of ECFMG, and allowing Dr. Miller a period of two years plus an extension of three to pass the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX).

LAU, Thomas Joseph, M.D., Gainesville, Florida

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board issue Dr. Lau a dated license for a period of one year.

KUHN, Brenda Gail, M.D., Hackensack, New Jersey

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board deny approval of Dr. Kuhn's licensure application based on the following reasons:

- (1) the podiatry education, which the Board has no way to verify or to evaluate, short of going to that school,
- (2) the accelerated program at Juarez of nine or ten months, which is far short of the months required, and
- (3) the rotations at the Beckman Tower downtown hospital in New York, where:
 - (a) at least one required residency was not in a program in which there was an approved residency, and
 - (b) two other residencies, which were not required rotations, may not have been in programs with approved residencies.

Dr. Kuhn stated, "I will withdraw my application." The Board of Medical Examiners then rescinded its action and accepted Dr. Kuhn's withdrawal of her application for medical licensure in this state.

DAVIS, Ben Keith, M.D., Colorado Springs, Colorado

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board deny approval of Dr. Davis' licensure application based on the fact that he has failed to satisfy the Board of Medical Examiners of his qualifications for licensure in this state because of Dr. Davis' difficulties with the criminal law authorities in the state of Colorado.

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board advise Dr. Davis, once he has completed the terms of his probation in Colorado: both with the

criminal authorities and the medical licensing Board, the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners will be prepared to reconsider a licensure application from him; and that the Board also advise Dr. Davis, should he elect to submit such an application in the future, the Board requests that, at such a time, he provide the Board of Medical Examiners with a current psychiatric report, including: prognosis, diagnosis, and any information affecting medical licensure.

MAHAN, Robert Gary, M.D., Winter Haven, Florida

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board issue Dr. Mahan a dated license for a period of one year based on the following stipulations:

Dr. Mahan shall continue his participation in AA;

Dr. Mahan shall associate himself with the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee of the North Carolina Medical Society;

Dr. Mahan shall appear before the Board prior to the expiration of this dated license; and

Dr. Mahan shall provide tangible evidence showing that he has complied with the Board of Medical Examiners' stipulations concerning participation in AA and involvement with the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee.

BEASLEY, J. Frank, M.D., Morganton, North Carolina

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board extend Dr. Beasley's dated license for a period of two years; and that the Board interview this physician prior to the expiration of this dated license.

CARSON, Rickey R., M.D., Raleigh, North Carolina

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners reviewed information indicating Dr. Carson's dated license expires October 31, 1987. The Board also reviewed information indicating that this physician now lives in Tennessee and does not intend, at this time, to practice medicine in North Carolina. On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners

unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that, if Dr. Carson requests further licensure in this state, the Board advise him to submit another application for the Board of Medical Examiners' consideration.

MAYFIELD, Michael Eugene, M.D., Winston-Salem, North Carolina

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board allow Dr. Mayfield to continue his training with no restrictions placed on this physician's license.

BUNN, David Glenn, M.D., Whiteville, North Carolina

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel:

that the Board endorse a request for reinstatement of Dr. Bunn's controlled substance prescribing privileges in Schedules 2 and 2N;

that the Board extend Dr. Bunn's dated license for a period of one year;

that the Board advise Dr. Bunn to continue participation in AA and the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee's program in Pinehurst;

that the Board instruct Dr. Bunn to provide progress reports from Dr. Clark at six month intervals;

and that the Board instruct Dr. Bunn to obtain at least fifty hours of continuing medical education prior to the October 1988 meeting.

WYNNE-ROBERTS, Caroline Rosales, M.D., Hillsbororough, NC

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board offer this physician the opportunity to take the North Carolina examination for licensure (FLEX Component I and II) in June 1988.

GAMBLE, Robert Keith, M.D., Howard Beach, New York

The Board informed this physician that his clinical clerkships

do not meet the statutory requirements for medical licensure in the state of North Carolina. On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel to offer this physician an opportunity to withdraw his application and receive a fee refund. Dr. Gamble withdrew his application for a license to practice medicine in this state.

HURD, Douglas Burdett, M.D., Rochester, Minnesota

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board deny approval of this licensure application on the basis of the fact that Dr. Hurd's medical education does meet the requirements of N.C. Gen. Stat. Sec. 90-9.

KHAN, Shahina R., M.D., Gaffney, South Carolina

On October 3, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board deny approval of Dr. Khan's licensure application on the basis of the fact this physician's graduate medical education and training does not comply with the requirements for medical licensure in North Carolina as set forth in N.C. Gen. Stat. Sec. 90-13 and 21 N.C.A.C. 32B.0213.

ANORECTIC STATEMENT

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board adopt the following statement as the opinion of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina regarding anorectic prescribing and that the Board develop a letter stating this opinion.

It is the opinion of the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners that under special circumstances anorectic agents may fill a limited adjunct role in the treatment of obesity in individual patients, if such treatment primarily involves diet, exercise, behavior therapy and frequent supervision by the physician.

If used, anorectic agents should be used for short term, non-repetitive periods of not more than twelve weeks.

Anorectic agents may produce drug dependency in some

patients.

The policy of the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners regarding the use of amphetamines and methamphetamines for treatment of obesity is still in effect. There are no indications for use of these drugs in weight control.

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel:

that the Board issue a statement prepared by Dr. Alexander combining the Medical Society's position on Amphetamine prescribing and the Board of Medical Examiners' opinion on Anorectic prescribing into one document; that the Board send this combined statement to the North Carolina Medical Society and the Journal; that the Board send a letter with this statement indicating, after consultation and input from various groups, this is the Board of Medical Examiners' statement on Amphetamine and Anorectic Prescribing; and that the Board provide copies of this combined statement to its investigative staff so that the investigators may appropriately utilize this information.

Dr. Alexander requested the staff to provide him with a copy of the Medical Society's statement on Amphetamine Prescribing.

NORTH CAROLINA PSYCHIATRIC ASSOCIATION

The Board adopted a motion that the staff send the North Carolina Psychiatric Association a copy of the Board of Medical Examiners' Order on Charles Llewellyn, M.D., and that the Board

request this Association to notify the Board of Medical Examiners of any North Carolina Psychiatric Association action concerning Dr. Llewellyn.

DAY, Phillip Mark, M.D., Grover, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board send the following letter to Dr. Day:

At a meeting held during October, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners instructed that you provide a progress report from the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee in accordance with the Consent Order effective February 20, 1987, stipulating that you shall furnish a progress report from the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee for the Board of Medical Examiners' review by June 1, 1987.

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a further motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Duckett that the Board schedule Dr. Day for an interview at the December, 1987, meeting, as stipulated by the Consent Order.

ROBERTSON, Logan Thomson, M.D., Canton, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board offer Dr. Robertson the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina containing a Reprimand, placing Dr. Robertson's licensure in a probationary status for a period of five years, and stipulating:

1. The Board of Medical Examiners formally reprimands Dr. Robertson.
2. The Board places Dr. Robertson in a status of probation for a period of five years from the date of entry of a final order in this case.
3. Dr. Robertson shall surrender his prescribing privileges accorded by the United States Drug Enforcement Administration for controlled substances in all schedules, 2 through 5 inclusive.
4. Dr. Robertson shall exercise proper supervision of all his employees, insuring that they not undertake in the course

of their employment with Dr. Robertson the performance of medical acts which the Board has not authorized these individuals to perform, and that they not hold themselves out as having any status which requires Board approval unless the Board has approved such status.

5. Dr. Robertson shall respond to or meet with the Board of Medical Examiners upon reasonable request of the Board.

GRIER, Raymond Edward, M.D., Greensboro, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board offer Dr. Grier the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order: (1) revoking his North Carolina medical license based on N.C. Gen. Stat. 90-14 (a) 13; (2) suspending the revocation based on compliance with the conditions imposed on his licensure in the state of California; (3) stipulating Dr. Grier shall submit to such monitoring of his practice activities as the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners deems necessary and (4) stipulating Dr. Grier shall appear for an interview with the Board at the end of six months.

WILLIAMS, Johnnie Lee, M.D., New Bern, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Daniel and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board offer Dr. Williams the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order based on the conditions imposed on his licensure in the state of New York.

ROGERS, Charles Wilburn, M.D., Chapel Hill, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Alexander: (1) that the Board send Dr. Rogers a registered letter documenting his non-compliance with the Order of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina.

BARRY, William, M.D., Fayetteville, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board offer Dr. Barry the opportunity to enter into a Consent Order which will remain in effect for the duration of

his court ordered probation containing the following stipulations:

1. Dr. Barry shall be and remain of high moral character;
2. Dr. Barry shall obey all state and federal laws;
3. Dr. Barry shall refrain from the use of all mind-altering substances, including alcohol;
4. Dr. Barry shall associate himself with a Psychiatrist of his choice or with a personal physician who will provide the Board with a current status report on Dr. Barry's general emotional and physical health and another status report at the end of six months;
5. Dr. Barry shall attend a minimum of three Alcoholics Anonymous meetings each week;
6. Dr. Barry shall contact the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee of the North Carolina Medical Society and involve himself in its program;
7. The Board of Medical Examiners shall also notify this group of Dr. Barry's situation;
8. Dr. Barry shall provide the Board with a report from the Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee at the end of six months; and
9. Dr. Barry shall appear before the Board at the end of six months.

STANLEY, Karl Harvey, M.D., Whiteville, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Godwin and seconded by Dr. Alexander that the Board instruct an investigator to perform occasional random drug screens on Dr. Stanley and that the Board schedule Dr. Stanley for an interview at the June, 1988, meeting.

KHATRI, Sat Dev, M.D., Asheville, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board endorse a request from Dr. Khatri for reinstatement of DEA prescribing privileges in all schedules; and that the Board advise Dr. Khatri it will continue to monitor his prescribing practices.

WHITE, Steven Merle, M.D., Greenville, North Carolina

On October 1, 1987, the Board unanimously adopted a motion that it accept as information a report indicating that Dr. White has entered into a Consent Order with the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina effective October 1, 1987.

MINUTES OF THE AUGUST, 1987, BOARD MEETING

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Board approve the Minutes of the August, 1987, Meeting as recorded.

FEDERATION MEETING

The Board adopted a motion to accept as information a report that the Federation Luncheon, to which this organization has invited members of the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, will be held Friday, October 9, 1987, at 12:30 p.m., in Pinehurst, North Carolina.

OCTOBER, 1988, BOARD MEETING

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board hold this meeting October 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16, 1988, at the Winston Plaza, Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

MAY, 1988, BOARD MEETING

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board hold this meeting at the Holly Inn at Pinehurst.

REGISTRATION FEE INCREASE

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners adopted a motion to accept as information a report on this matter.

PHYSICIANS HEALTH AND EFFECTIVENESS COMMITTEE

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Daniel that the Executive Secretary of the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners invite the Executive Vice-President of the North Carolina Medical Society along with two appropriate physician representatives to attend the December, 1987, meeting of the Board of Medical Examiners on Thursday, December 3, 1987, at 4:30 or 5:00 p.m., for a brief, well-organized discussion of plans for establishing a new Physicians Health and Effectiveness Committee in this state.

AETNA INSURANCE COMPANY Data Request

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board deny approval of this data request.

TRIANGLE PSYCHIATRIC INSTITUTE, INC., Proposed Name Change

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board reaffirm the opinion expressed in the Executive Secretary's letter of September 3, 1987, and deny approval of this proposed corporate name change.

WNC HAND SURGERY ASSOCIATES

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Alexander and seconded by Dr.

Godwin that the Board approve sending a reply to the attorney for these physicians based on wording in Mr. Weddington's letter to Mr. Robinson dated August 17, 1987.

DEAN, Christine, M.D., Lexington, North Carolina

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Henry that the Board approve the action taken concerning Dr. Dean's application for licensure.

POPIL, Mark M., M.D., Brooklyn, New York

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Duckett and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board allow this physician to withdraw his application; that the Board maintain Dr. Popil's original file in the office; and that the Board send Dr. Popil a copy of this application file.

PLOMARTIS, Titus, Jr., M.D., Eden, North Carolina

On October 2, 1987, the Board of Medical Examiners unanimously adopted a motion made by Dr. Henry and seconded by Dr. Godwin that the Board require payment of this temporary license fee prior to issuing Dr. Plomartis a full North Carolina medical license.

BOEHM, Marilyn Jean, M.D., Columbus, Ohio
