MD self-referred to NCPHP and began treatment for alcohol use disorder on December 30, 2020. On February 22, 2021, MD voluntarily inactivated his North Carolina license to practice medicine retroactively with an inactive license effective date of December 30, 2020. MD has entered into a monitoring agreement with NCPHP and has completed residential treatment.	Indefinite suspension

This employee reported this behavior to the Marion Police Department and warrants for MD's arrest were issued. MD was arrested for three counts of sexual battery and pled guilty to one count of Assault on a Female. The remaining two counts of misdemeanor sexual battery charges were dismissed. On June 15, 2021, MD retired from the practice of medicine.</p>

		<p>became increasingly uncooperative while being questioned and tried to leave the room. One of the police officers attempted to restrain MD and they ended up in a scuffle. MD was placed under arrest for Resist, Delay, and Obstruct an Officer. MD engaged in a barrage of vulgarities, insults, and profanity toward the police officers and threatened to use his position as a physician and prominent member of the community to retaliate against the officers. Additionally, MD initially refused a portable breath test (PBT) and could not be processed at the Moore County Detention Facility. He was taken to the local hospital, continuing his verbal abuse, was cleared, and was then transported back to the detention facility where he agreed to provide a breath sample. MD registered a .07 blood alcohol level according to PBT.</p>

The procedure was uneventful, and recovery progressed well until post-operative day eight when the patient presented with a profound change in his vision and retinal bleeding in his right eye. At that time, MD diagnosed the patient with central retinal vein occlusion which MD thought to be unrelated to the surgery. After evaluation of and discussion with the patient, MD performed a cataract extraction on the patient's left eye. The patient's right eye declined to the point where it could only perceive light, and his left eye was registering 20/40 vision. The vision in the patient's left eye rapidly declined due to retinal bleeding and restriction of the blood supply. The patient was immediately referred to a retinal specialist and diagnosed with Hemorrhagic Occlusive Retinal Vasculitis and Ocular Ischemic Syndrome. Despite multiple attempts at treatment, the patient lost vision in both eyes.</p> <p>The Board had MD's treatment reviewed by an independent medical expert who criticized</p>	
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		MD's decision to proceed with cataract surgery on the patient's left eye "without having a clear diagnosis and evaluation of decline of vision in the right eye."	
JUOPPERI , Thomas Douglass, PA (001011530) Durham, NC	07/30/2021	The Board is concerned about PA's history of alcohol use disorder. On March 12, 2012, PA entered into a Consent Order with the New York State Office of the Professionals and was placed on probation for five years due to multiple driving while impaired arrests. On December 18, 2012, PA was granted a physician assistant license in Colorado whereby the Colorado Medical Board ("CMB") required PA to abstain from alcohol use and enroll in the Colorado Physician Health Program ("CPHP"). On September 14, 2015, the CMB suspended PA's license due to a relapse. PA voluntarily surrendered his New York license on December 24, 2015. The CMB lifted his suspension on January 19, 2016, and removed all stipulations from his license on May 15, 2019, as a result of PA's successful and continued recovery and CPHP compliance. The Board favorably notes the steps PA has taken to live in	Public Letter of Concern

		active recovery since moving to NC. NCPHP has met with PA and advocates for his licensure.	
OKOLI , Alphonsus Eziagwu, MD (009600661) Potomac, MD	07/06/2021	Action based on another state medical board. NCMB is concerned that the Maryland Board of Physicians (Maryland Board) took action against MD's medical license based on a violation of a prior Consent Order MD had entered into with the Maryland Board in 2018. Pursuant to a condition of that prior Consent Order, ten of MD's patient charts were obtained for peer review who opined that MD failed to meet the appropriate standard of care for one patient and that he failed to keep adequate medical records for three of his patients. For these violations, the Maryland Board suspended MD's medical license for a minimum of six months, permanently prohibited him from prescribing controlled substances and certifying patients for medical use of cannabis, required MD to take focused continuing education, placed him on probation for two years, and assessed a civil fine of \$5,000.00. 		<p>left-sided sinusitis with near-complete opacification of maxillary, anterior ethmoid, and frontal sinuses. A second CT scan of the patient revealed no improvement in opacification with a new finding of erosion of the posterior table, which was concerning for possible intracranial extension. Sinus surgery for the patient had to be rescheduled and postponed due to insurance reasons and the MD was not informed. The patient was later brought to an emergency room and a frontal lobe abscess was revealed. This was emergently drained with a craniotomy procedure and concurrent endoscopic sinus surgery. However, her neurological status deteriorated over the next ten days, and she died in late June 2019. The Board had MD's care reviewed by a medical expert who felt that the findings on the second CT scan pointed to the possibility of intracranial spread, which is an urgent medical situation. The Board's expert felt that, in light of the findings on the second CT scan, MD should have considered an MRI or CT scan of the brain with</p>	
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		contrast or surgical intervention on an urgent basis. If this had been done, it is possible that his patient's outcome might have been different.	
SINGH , Sue Ellen, PA-C, (000101551) Lexington, NC	07/15/2021	Standard of care; PA failed to communicate elevated results of a prostate specific antigen (PSA) blood test to her patient for two sequential years. Upon the third elevated results, PA discovered the missed, abnormal PSAs, advised her patient, and referred him on an urgent basis to a urologist. PA's patient was subsequently diagnosed with Stage IIA prostate cancer and ultimately underwent a radical prostatectomy.	Public Letter of Concern
TODD , Jeffrey Allen, MD (000740246) Summerfield, NC	07/02/2021	The Board is concerned that MD prescribed a higher than recommended dose of Mirapex® (pramipexole) to a patient who he had diagnosed with Restless Leg Syndrome. His patient was at risk for falling because of her comorbidities, past history of falling, and the known side effects of Mirapex®. After taking her first dose of Mirapex®, the patient became hypotensive, fell, and suffered an injury.	Public Letter of Concern
