In February 2019, MD entered into a Consent Agreement with the State Medical Board of Ohio (Ohio Board) in which the Ohio Board reprimanded MD and placed him on a number of probationary terms. MD admitted to issuing approximately ten prescriptions for controlled substances to a colleague without documenting the prescriptions in a medical record. MD also admitted to failing to access and review the Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System as required by Ohio Board regulations prior to issuing the prescriptions.	Reprimand; MD shall abide by the terms and conditions of the Ohio Board Consent Agreement.

Additionally, the medical expert felt that MD should have explained his medical decision making in more detail in the patient's medical record.
