New Business

a. Proposed Changes to CME Rule

The American College of Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) has asked the Board to make it clear interprofessional continuing education (ICPE) approved by the Joint Accreditation for Interprofessional Continuing Education qualifies for CME credit.

This request is consistent with a resolution approved by the Federation of State Medical Boards House of Delegates (2019): "Resolved, that the Federation of State Medical Boards supports and recognizes Interprofessional Continuing Education for physicians that is identified by IPCE credit and is accredited by the Joint Accreditation system launched by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), and the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC), as an additional means of satisfying continuing medical education requirements for medical license renewal."

Committee Recommendation: Approve proposed amendments to the CME rule for filing with the Office of Administrative Hearings.

b. Proposed Change to PLLC Certification of Registration Rule

The Professional Limited Liability Company Certificate of Registration rule should be changed so that PLLCs renew their registration every year, not every two years, consistent with professional corporations.

Committee Recommendation: Approve proposed amendments to the CME rule for filing with the Office of Administrative Hearings.

c. Proposed Changes to Board Seal

Currently, the Board's seal includes the saying "Primum non nocere" (first do no harm). Although a fine adage, it is usually associated with professional medical associations, not state agencies. "Salus populi suprema lex esto" (the safety of the people is the highest law) more precisely captures the Board's public protection mandate.

Committee Recommendation: Adopt "Salus populi suprema lex esto" as the new maxim for the Board's seal effective November 1, 2020.

d. Request to Postpone Fingerprint Card Requirement
Current rules require NCMB applicants to submit fingerprint cards so the Board can
conduct background checks via the SBI and FBI. However, agencies across the country
that customarily perform fingerprint services have closed due to COVID-19. Staff
requests the Board postpone the requirement to produce fingerprint cards for all license
applicants (MD, DO, PA, AA, LP). If an applicant meets all other requirements for
licensure, a license will be issued. A list of every license issued via this process shall be
maintained by Board staff to make sure these applicants produce fingerprint cards at a
later date. Authority: NCGS § 90-12.5 which allows the Board to waive licensure
requirements when the Governor has declared a State of Emergency.

Committee Recommendation: Effective immediately, postpone the requirement to produce fingerprint cards for all applicants until the NC State of Emergency is cancelled. Afterwards, request fingerprint cards and conduct background checks on all those issued a license without a background check.

c. Registration Renewal Online Form Changes:

Annual registration renewal forms are filled out online by Physicians, Physician Assistants, Resident Training Licensees, Perfusionists, and Anesthesiologist Assistants. All of the registration renewal forms contain questions the licensee must answer.

The information provided by the licensees to these questions often do not provide pertinent facts. Field Investigations, Complaints and the LI Coordinator have to contact licensees about the information provided. In an effort to streamline this process, we have reviewed all registration renewal forms and modified the questions, asking for more specific information and allowing pertinent documents to be uploaded.

During this review process it was also determined that the registration renewal forms needed to be updated, and that not all forms allowed for qualified exemptions.

These proposed changes to the registration renewal forms will be added to the new database, ThoughtSpan, when it goes live this summer.
