# LEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS OF NORTH CAROLINA

Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina April 30th - May 2nd, 1946.

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, April 30th-May 2nd, 1946.

Tuesday, April 30th, 1946, at 8 P. M., the meeting was called to order by Dr. Roy B. McKnight, President. Dr. Charles W. Armstrong, M. D. Bonner, Thomas Leslie Lee, Paul G. Parker, Malory A. Pittman, Ivan Procter, Secretary, and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Acting Secretary, were present.

The agenda for the meeting was discussed and credentials of the applicants for reciprocity were studied by all the members of the board.

The meeting was adjourned.

The board convened at 11 A. M., Wednesday, May 1st, 1946, in order to interview applicants for licensure by endorsement of credentials. All members of the board were present. The meeting was called to order by the president.

ADDRESS

Dr. S. B. McPheeters, Director of Public Health, Goldsboro, N. C., appeared before the board in regard to a physician in his employ, who is a Middlesex graduate and, therefore, not eligible for licensure in the State of North Carolina. He was advised that it would be necessary for him to supplant this physician in ninety days by a physician with a North Carolina license.

The board was advised by the acting secretary that Dr. W. C. Davison, Dean of the Duke University School of Medicine, had requested information by telephone as to whether faculty members with no practice would be required to have a North Carolina license, those in question being instructors as follows: 1 brainwaves, 1 anatomy, 2 psychiatry.

Dr. Paul G. Parker moved that Dr. Davison's request, and any other similar request, be answered by the secretary by simply quoting section 90-18 of the Medical Practice Act. This motion was duly seconded and unanimously passed.

Dr. Thomas Leslie Lee moved that the North Carolina Medical Journal be requested to publish the North Carolina Medical Practice Act, with section 90-18 in italics. This motion was duly seconded and unanimously passed.

The following letter under date of April 16th, 1946, from Dr. Julian A. Moore, President of the Buncombe County Medical Society, was presented to the board:

"I have your letter of April 8th to Dr. B. O. Edwards in regard to doctors practicing in the State of North Carolina without a license. I would like to ask you if men who work for the Veterans Facility at Oteen are required to have a license and if men working at the State Sanatorium are required to have a license. In the law, the U. S. Veterans Facility is not specifically exempt although all the other Federal Agencies are."

Dr. Thomas Leslie Lee moved to advise Dr. Moore that it is the policy of the board that physicians on active duty with the Veterans Facility, United States Public Health Service, Army and Navy Medical Corps, doing no outside or private practice, are not required to have a North Carolina license, that physicians at the State Sanatorium are required to have license. This motion was duly seconded and unanimously passed.

Dr. Thomas Leslie Lee invited the board to hold its next meeting as his guests at his cottage, Morehead City, N. C. It was agreed that this meeting, for the purpose of interviewing candidates for licensure by endorsement of credentials, would be held at 2 P. M., July 5th, 1946, at the Hotel Bogue Sound Club.

Dr. Thomas Leslie Lee moved that the last sentence, "This shall not apply to candidates for licensure by endorsement of credentials", be stricken from the records of the motion made by Dr. M. D. Bonner at the March, 1946, meeting, said motion being duly seconded and passed, which motion was as follows: "That we recommend to the House of Delegates of the General Assembly of the North Carolina State Medical Society that the Medical Practice Act be amended so that a years interne work in a hospital approved either by the Council on Medical Education of the American Medical Association, the College of Surgeons or the North Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners, be required as a prerequisite for licensure, and that a committee be appointed to work with the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners to draw up such an amendment. This shall not apply to candidates for licensure by endorsement of credentials." This motion was duly seconded and unanimously passed.

Dr. Charles W. Armstrong reported that Dr. William John Judy voluntarily surrendered his license to him March 29th, 1946.

The acting secretary reported to the board that the case of State vs Richard Baker, Osteopath, which was set for trial at the April, 1946 term of court had been postponed until the July, 1946 term, due to a crowded docket.

The meeting was adjourned.

Dr. Roy B. McKnight, President, presented the Report of the Board of Medical Examiners for 1944-1946 for the secretary to the House of Delegates of the North Carolina State Medical Society Wednesday, May 1st, 1946.

The board convened at 9 P. M., Wednesday, May 1st, 1946. All members of the board were present and the meeting was called to order by the president.

The grades of examinees were reviewed by the board, all of which made a passing grade. The acting secretary was instructed to give the Associated Press the names of the two highest grades of examinees taking the four year examination, as well as a list of all examinees.

The acting secretary reported to the board the death of Dr. Walter C. Fisher three days after having completed the examinations in March. He died unexpectedly in the Baptist Hospital at Winston-Salem a few minutes before he was to undergo an operation. The board directed the acting secretary to write Dr. Fisher's widow a letter of sympathy and to forward to her his certificate.

The minutes of the acting secretary for the March, 1946 meeting were approved as read.

The members of the board signed their names to the certificates.

The meeting was adjourned.

The following resolutions were presented to the House of Delegates of the North Carolina State Medical Society by Dr. Roy B. McKnight, President, on May 2nd, 1945, which resolutions were unanimously passed:

1. Our State was the first in the Union to enact a law by which a duly authorized Board, elected by the State Medical Society, should determine the fitness of all those who would practice medicine and surgery in North Carolina. The first Board was elected May 10, 1859, at the 10th annual meeting in Statesville, N. C.

Perhaps our State has lagged just a little insofar as a Basic Science Law is concerned. Nineteen states now have such a law, and it is our understanding that twelve more are contemplating the introduction of such a law.

What is a basic science law? It establishes an impartial, non-sectorian, non-practicing Board of Examiners in the Basic Sciences of anatomy, physiology, pathology, chemistry and bacteriology, and requires that each person who desires to obtain his license to treat human beings, that the first step towards such a license shall be to demonstrate satisfactorily his or her ability in the fundamental basic sciences which are applicable to every form of treatment. When this examination is passed, then the applicant is entitled to present himself to his particular board whether it be allopath, osteopath, naturopath or chiropractic.

The secretary of the State Board of Medical Examiners, Dr. Ivan Procter, is preparing for the North Carolina Medical Journal a resume of the facts pertaining to a basic science law.

Therefore, the State Board of Medical Examiners asks the House of Delegates to instruct the incoming President to appoint a Committee to work with the State Board of Medical Examiners and the Legislative Committee of the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina in preparing such a Bill.

2. The State Board of Medical Examiners asks the House of Delegates to instruct the incoming President to appoint a Committee to work with them and the Legislative Committee of the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina in preparing a Bill to so alter the Medical Practice Act that a year's intermeship be required before a certificate of licensure is granted. Such an intermeship must be in a hospital approved by the Committee on Medical Education of the American Medical Association, the American College of Surgeons, or the North Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners.
