

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS OF THE
STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

Grove Park Inn, Asheville, North Carolina

August 3-4, 1972

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Grove Park Inn, Asheville, North Carolina, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and other business.

Thursday, August 3rd
6:30 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner. Drs. Cornelius T. Partrick, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr. and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. were present. Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Administrative Secretary, and Mrs. Betty Joe Cooke attended.

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials were reviewed by the members of the Board.

RE: Assistant to Physician

RE : Dr. Harvey Estes, Jr. - The Board approved Dr. Harvey Estes, Jr. to register Joyce Clayton Nichols as an assistant to a physician.

RE: Clifford C. Lyon - The Secretary presented letter from Mr. Lyon giving certain information relative to a naturopath.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that the secretary be instructed to write and state on the basis of information received, it does not fall in the province of the Board and suggest that it be turned over to local authorities. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. Robert E. Gardner (See previous Minutes) - Dr. Gardner reported to the secretary that he had had some trouble and report from Dorothea Dix Hospital verified that he was treated there from June 28 to July 6th, 1972, diagnosis drug dependence on barbiturates and others. Report from his psychiatrist dated July 17th, 1972 revealed that he seemed to be making satisfactory adjustment without medication or drugs.

RE: WRITTEN EXAMINATION - PART II

The members of the Board reviewed the grades and certified all who took the examination except the following:

#203 - Dr. Charles J. Jaffe - to repeat Pharmacology, Pediatrics and Hygiene

#206 - Dr. Charles Raymond Lake - failed two out of four grades - The Board ruled that he take Flex

#207 - Dr. Jerrill Lee McEntire - failed two out of four grades - The Board ruled that he take Flex.

#205 - Dr. Barry Edward Kahan - failed three out of four subjects - The Board ruled that he take Flex.

RE: FLEX EXAMINATION - Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. moved that all candidates with a Flex weighted average of below 75 did not pass the North Carolina Board examination. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha

Q. How long has it been since you used any alcohol?

A. Since February when I got out of the hospital.

Dr. Partrick: We hope you will understand this Board finds it necessary to investigate your previous hospital commitments. We request you to furnish our office with a list of hospitals where you have been a patient, approximate dates, release so that we may procure those records. Probably the easiest way is to come to our office. We will request records ourselves and evaluate them and as soon as we have done this, we will let you know our action.

Q. Have you had any since?

A. No

Q. Did you lose your narcotic tax stamp?

A. After I got out of the hospital. It was reinstated.

Q. How have you gotten along since?

A. No problem, no trouble, I have no desire. I recognized the problem. An experience like that has a certain advantage seeing true addicts.

Q. Do you have any nerve or emotional problems since?

A. No

Q. Is your health good?

A. Yes sir

Q. Have you been doing emergency room work?

A. Yes

Q. Have you had problems?

A. Yes, I ran into one problem. We have in the State of Pennsylvania very extensive welfare program for blacks and others. One black came in and had a cold. I told her to wait, we had an emergency, I would see her when I could. They like to create incidents, raised hell. I got irritated and told them they would have to leave if they did not want to wait. They complained to the NAACP and an issue was made. They were strong politically. I was set aside for a while until it was settled. During that period I wondered if I wanted to stay. I had been there 10 years and had built it up. We have five full-time physicians now.

Dr. Partrick: Do you have a family?

A. Yes, a wife and two children.

Q. Living with you?

A. Yes

Dr. Hooper: What was the rukus?

A. The hospital apologized to me, said they had over-reacted to it. They had to get somebody. We had quite a few hassels with the NAACP.

Dr. Edmondson: Was morphine the only drug you had?

A. Yes

Q. What about alcohol?

A. No

VERDICT: Dr. William David Loose was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary.

The meeting adjourned.

RE: Dr. Jack Edward Foster, Eden, North Carolina - (See Previous Minutes) - Dr. Foster was tried in Rockingham County Superior Court for narcotic drug violation, for which he entered a plea of guilty to obtaining drugs by misrepresentation, which was accepted by the state. The judgment of the court was as follows: Thirty days in jail suspended upon compliance with following conditions, to which defendant gave assent; that within a period of five days the defendant shall surrender to proper state or Federal authorities any state or Federal authorization he has to prescribe hard narcotics; that for a period of one year from this date defendant is not to possess, use or prescribe any hard narcotics and thereafter only after his license has been properly returned by the proper authorities; and upon the further condition that in each of the five cases that the defendant pay a fine of \$100.00 and cost of court. This 30th day of March, 1972.

Dr. Foster has since been ill and was treated at a hospital at Virginia Beach for convulsions and fractured vertebrae. He was later treated at Bowman Gray School of Medicine and stated that he was diagnosed as having viral encephalitis.

Dr. Foster came in for an interview at this time and stated that his health had improved and that he was doing well in his practice; that he was not allowed to prescribe hard narcotics.

Dr. Foster is to be seen in one year.

RE: Dr. Walter Glenn Lewis, Gibsonville, North Carolina, was requested to appear at this time, which he failed to do. The secretary was directed to have Dr. Lewis at the next meeting.

RE: Dr. William A. Moody, Broughton Hospital, appeared for a routine interview. He said he was doing well and happy in his work. He was commended by the Board. To be seen in six months.

RE: Dr. Joseph C. Fesperman, Stanley, North Carolina - Dr. Fesperman came in looking well and said he was progressing in his practice; that he was working about two-thirds of the day. He said he had no problems. Reports from his physicians were very good. He was commended by the Board. To be seen in one year.

RE: Legislative Research Commission Report on Role of Expansion of Nurses: This matter was discussed by the Board in consultation with the attorney of the Board, Mr. John H. Anderson.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the chairman appoint a committee to meet with a similar group from the Nursing Board to congeal our activities and consult with the Pharmacy Board. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed.

The following committee was named: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick, Chairman, Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr.
