

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS OF  
THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

The Grove Park Inn, Asheville, North Carolina

August 9-12, 1973

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at The Grove Park Inn in Asheville, North Carolina, August 9-12, 1973 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and other business.

Thursday, August 9  
8:00 P.M.

The Board convened for business and reviewing credentials. Drs. Bryant L. Galusha, President, Charles B. Wilkerson, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Cornelius T. Partrick, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., E. Wilson Staub and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. were present. Dr. Joseph J. Combs, Executive Secretary, Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary Designate, Mrs. Betty Joe Cooke and Mrs. Diane G. Freeman were present also.

RE: Barry McNeill Welborne, M.D., Charlotte, N. C. -- The Executive Secretary presented recent correspondence received by the Board's office in regard to Dr. Welborne and his records in the Board's office.

VERDICT: The Executive Secretary was instructed to write Dr. Roy H. McDowell and advise him the Board is interested in getting the details of his complaint about Dr. Welborne in order to review it.

RE: Robert Marion Wilhoit, M.D., Asheboro, N. C. -- The Executive Secretary reviewed the report of Dr. Frank Edmondson in regard to Dr. Wilhoit's handling of controlled substances and his record-keeping practices in regard to these drugs. This report advised that Dr. Wilhoit is now in full compliance with the directives of the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs.

VERDICT: Dr. Edmondson moved that Dr. Wilhoit's records and practices be reviewed again in six to twelve months, at the discretion of the Board. Seconded by Dr. Partrick and duly passed. Dr. Edmondson was instructed to review Dr. Wilhoit's records in six months and report to the Board at that time.

RE: Dr. Frank W. Barr, Charlotte, N. C. -- The President reviewed his recent visit to Dr. Barr as instructed by the Board at the June, 1973 meeting to discuss his practice of prescribing certain medications for weight reduction.

VERDICT: Dr. Partrick moved that this report be received as information. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and discussion followed. Motion passed. The President was instructed to contact Dr. Barr and give him the action of the Board.

RE: Dr. John C. Wiggins, Sr., Winston-Salem, N. C. -- The Executive Secretary reviewed Dr. Wiggins' file on his prescribing of controlled substances and advised the Board that upon checking with the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs in Greensboro he was informed that Dr. Wiggins is not currently registered for prescribing controlled substances. That office also informed the Executive Secretary that the computer was programmed to have this Board contacted if Dr. Wiggins' applied for registration.

RE: Increase in cost of license certificate preparation -- The Board discussed the request from Mrs. Martha Farley for a raise in payment per license certificates from 65¢ to \$1.00 as presented by the Executive Secretary.

VERDICT: Dr. Hooper moved that the increase be granted as requested. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

VERDICT: Dr. James Quincy Whitaker approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. John Harvey Whiteside appeared applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Toronto in 1957 and is awaiting the results of the June, 1973 FLEX examination for certification for licensure in North Carolina.

Dr. Galusha: Dr. Whiteside will be joining the Bradford Clinic in Charlotte in the practice of obstetrics as soon as possible.

Dr. Whiteside presented letter from the U. S. Department of Justice, Immigration and Naturalization Service, certifying that he is on an H-1 visa status as a non-immigrant with indefinite renewal extensions available for him to remain in the United States as long as his presence is needed as indicated by a petitioner for his employment.

Dr. Galusha: Dr. Whiteside, have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No  
 Q: Have you ever used narcotics or barbiturates personally? A. No  
 Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No  
 Q: Have you ever had any difficulty with state medical boards? A. No  
 Dr. Galusha: Your license will be limited geographically until citizenship is obtained, to an area you so designate for your practice.

VERDICT: Dr. Partrick moved that applicants for license by endorsement on the H-1 visa status with the U. S. Department of Immigration and Naturalization be considered on an individual basis. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

VERDICT: Dr. Partrick moved that Dr. Whiteside be approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary, limited geographically until citizenship obtained. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed. (credentials completed)

Friday, August 10  
2:30 p.m.

RE: Dr. Joseph C. Fesperman, Stanley, N. C. -- Dr. Fesperman appeared for a routine interview. He advised he was feeling well except for some pain with his arthritis. He said he sees his physicians regularly and is taking medication prescribed by him, Librium and Sparine. Dr. Fesperman said he is practicing about one-half to two-thirds of his time and this arrangement is working well.

VERDICT: Dr. Edmondson moved that Dr. Fesperman be seen in one year. Seconded by Dr. Partrick and duly passed. The President advised Dr. Fesperman of the Board's action and also told him the Board was pleased to see he and his wife appearing so well and happy and hoped that things would so continue for them.



RE: Dr. William A. Moody, Morganton, N. C. -- Dr. Moody appeared for a routine interview and stated there had been little change in his life and he is still liking his work at Broughton Hospital, but still feels he is a "second class" physicians with no narcotic privileges, but he has learned to tolerate it. He stated he had had an offer from a clinic in Gastonia, but turned it down. Dr. Moody said he is taking Probanthine and \_\_\_\_\_, but rarely, and has felt no need for further medication.

VERDICT: Dr. Edmondson moved that Dr. Moody be seen in one year. Seconded by Dr. Partrick and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Jack E. Foster, Eden, N. C. -- Dr. Foster appeared for a routine interview and also to request the Board to endorse his application for medical license in South Carolina. Dr. Foster stated things were not going well at all in Eden in his practice and private life. He said he had received threatening calls, his wife was being accused of taking drugs and his son was being intimidated. Dr. Foster said he felt it was a "set group of doctors who are against me", "the establishment" and that if he had a small practice and had not taken over some of the other physicians patients, he would not be bothered. He feels it is caused mostly by "professional jealousy" of his large practice.

Dr. Foster said he would like to move his practice to Greenville, South Carolina as his wife was a native of that area and her family lived near Greenville and the people of that area, including the physicians, were eager for him to come to Greenville. He said if he did not receive a South Carolina license, he would not stay in Eden, but try to start another practice in North Carolina. Dr. Foster said his practice is mostly geriatrics, general medicine, with no hospital work. He is in his office about 5 or 6 hours a day and does make house calls. He advised that he was doing well personally and had had no problems as the result of limited narcotic privileges.

In regard to his endorsement to South Carolina, Dr. Foster said that the Executive Secretary of the South Carolina Board of Medical Examiners had told him that if the Executive Secretary of the North Carolina Board would endorse him personally, he would receive a license in South Carolina to practice medicine. He said that the Executive Secretary had also told him that if the North Carolina Board's endorsement was impartial or negative, he would not get a license in South Carolina.

The President advised Dr. Foster that this Board would certainly make no effort to indenture him or keep him in a position in which he was not happy. He was told that the facts of his situation would be made known to the South Carolina Board and the decision would then be up to that Board. The Board then discussed Dr. Foster's request.

VERDICT: The President advised Dr. Foster that the Board wished him well and hoped he would be able to locate himself and his family in an environment he would like, and the Board would do all it could to help him in<sup>his</sup> wish to relocate. The Board told him that if they had not felt he was qualified to practice medicine, his license would have been revoked. Dr. Hooper moved that Dr. Foster's application be endorsed to the South Carolina Board, with a separate report to be furnished to the South Carolina Board in regard to Dr. Foster's practice of medicine in North Carolina with an indication of the separate report being sent to be placed on the application form. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Stanton Vance Huffman, Elon College, N. C. and Glen Raven, N.C. -- Dr. Huffman appeared at the request of the Board following receipt of report from the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs that Dr. Huffman had purchased about 27,000 amphetamine-type drugs from August, 1971 through January, 1973 and appeared to be dispensing these from his office. Also, Dr. Huffman's recordkeeping was not very accurate, indicating shortages and overages in the various amphetamine drugs.

Dr. Huffman advised he had not put any new patients on the amphetamine drugs for weight reduction since the report, and possibly even had not started any new patients on this type of therapy for about one year. He stated that all of his patients were not an amphetamines for weight reduction, but "to make them feel better, which they do". He stated that as long as adequate controls were maintained he had no fear of these drugs and did not consider them too dangerous, and it did not bother him too much that many people were taking amphetamines.

Dr. Huffman stated that he had a general practice and worked at Memorial Hospital in Alamance County. He advised that he had some patients still on amphetamines who were taking them prior to this report. He said he had no problems with getting patients off of these drugs once they had taken them and that he dispensed

from his office mainly because of the shortage of pharmacies in that area. He stated he never gave these type of drugs to anyone he did not know or who requested a specific drug. (see file for complete interview)

VERDICT: The President advised Dr. Huffman that the Board felt he held a very non-chalant attitude toward a very dangerous drug, and the Board was very worried about his attitude and that he would be monitored very closely. If it appeared he was continuing the use of these drugs in this amount, he would be audited again and requested to appear in front of the Board again; that this could put his narcotic privileges in jeopardy, and possibly go further than that. He was advised that he should try to get some of his patients off of these drugs. Dr. Edmondson moved that Dr. Huffman be monitored again as soon as possible by the U. S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, to be followed by reports at least once a year. Seconded by Dr. Partrick and duly passed. The Executive Secretary was instructed to explain in the letter to the Department of Justice that the Board had interviewed Dr. Huffman but did not feel he was very concerned about the interview or about his use of these type of drugs and the Board would like strict monitoring of his practice.

RE: Dr. W. A. Y. Sargent, Burnsville, N. C. -- Dr. Sargent appeared applying for reinstatement of his full narcotic privileges, including Schedule 2, following letter submitted to the Board requesting same and signed by several physicians in the Burnsville area. Dr. Sargent stated it was very inconvenient for him to have another physician write for his patients for narcotics. He advised he had been without this particular privilege for seven years and that he needed this for use in his office and hospital practice. Dr. Sargent stated that he had never administered any narcotics to himself and had no contact with any addicts presently and had not for the past several years.

VERDICT: Dr. Partrick moved that the Board advise Dr. Sargent that he could re-apply for full BNDD privileges and the Board would approve his application for same. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.

The President advised Dr. Sargent of the Board's action and instructed him that he should keep his records accurately, taking special care with them and that he may be monitored periodically.

RE: Dr. Jasper R. Medlin, Garner, N. C. -- Dr. Medlin appeared for a routine interview following his beginning to re-use Talwin for self-medication. Prior to Dr. Medlin's interview, the President reviewed the recent report from his psychiatrist advising that Dr. Medlin appeared to be doing better, was taking no medication and that his recent appearance before the Board was very helpful to him and that he would continue to see Dr. Medlin as needed.

Dr. Medlin advised that things were going much better for him and he was taking some time off. He advised he was off Elavil and taking no medication at all. His practice was good and he had not taken any Talwin in about four months.

VERDICT: The Board advised that they were pleased to see him feeling better and looking well and were very glad to learn he was not taking Talwin and was on no medication at all. He was advised that if he felt he needed to talk with the Board, to let them know and they would be glad to see him and help him any way at all. They advised Dr. Medlin to stay in close contact with his psychiatrist. He was instructed to plan to appear before the Board at the December, 1973 meeting.

RE: Conversion of limited to full license --

Dr. Hooper moved that all applicants for conversion of limited to full license be approved for same if all credentials are in order. Dr. Taylor seconded the motion and it was duly passed. They are:

Dr. Wilkerson moved that all physicians applying for reinstatement of license who have paid all fees and penalties be approved for same. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

RE: Assistants to Physicians --

RE: Dr. Harold W. Glascock, Jr., Raleigh, N. C. -- application for Percy Elmer Golson complete. Dr. Partrick moved that Mr. Golson be approved for registration as an assistant to a physician. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Luther Randolph Doffermyre, Dunn, N. C. -- application incomplete for Paul Edward Craft. Mr. Craft will graduate from the Bowman Gray Physician's Assistant Program on August 24, 1973 and his application lacks certification of graduation from this program; all other credentials are complete. Dr. Edmondson moved that if Mr. Craft is graduated from the Bowman Gray Physician's Assistant Program and furnishes certification of same, he be approved for registration as an assistant to a physician. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Thomas R. Bryan, Jr., North Wilkesboro, N. C. -- application complete for William Graham Evans, Jr. The Board reviewed the application and advised the Executive Secretary to return the application form to Dr. Bryant requesting a clearer description of his supervision of the assistant and more detailed explanation of the scope of his activities.

RE: Application for Registration of Visiting Professors --

RE: Dr. Jarlath MacKenna, Durham, N. C.; application complete, sponsored by Duke University, requesting registration for two years as a Visiting Professor. Dr. Hooper moved that Dr. MacKenna be approved for registration as a Visiting Professor for one year and that he be advised that at the end of that year he may re-apply for registration for his second year. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.

RE: Dr. Michael John Whitfield, Bristol, England; application incomplete; sponsored by the University of North Carolina. Dr. Taylor moved that Dr. Whitfield be approved for registration as a Visiting Professor upon payment of fee for registration. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed. (fee paid)

RE: Cost of Printing of Rosters -- The Executive Secretary reviewed the correspondence and information presented by Capital Printing Company in regard to the printing of the biennial Roster of Registered Physicians in North Carolina. Dr. Edmondson moved that the Board approve the cost of the printing of the Roster by Capital Printing Company as presented by that company. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Aspen Systems Corporation -- The President reviewed a request from Aspen Systems Corporation for rules and regulations and related material in regard to the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners. The Executive Secretary was instructed to forward a copy of the Medical Practice Act and the Rules and Regulations for an Assistant to a Physician to the corporation.

RE: August, 1974 Board meeting -- Dr. Edmondson moved that the meeting be held at the Grove Park Inn in Asheville on August 8-11, 1974. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

RE: Memorandum from the North Carolina State Medical Society on "Medical Economics" article --

The Board discussed the article in the May, 1973 issue of "Medical Economics" in regard to disciplinary action taken by the Maryland Commission on Medical Discipline against physicians who have been found guilty of various charges of incompetency, immoral conduct and other charges. The Board received this report as information.

RE: Certification of June, 1973 examination grades --

Dr. Taylor moved that all examinees who received a FLEX Weighted Average of 75.0% or better on the June, 1973 examination receive license. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.



RE: National Health Service Corps --

The Board reviewed and discussed Board policies and rules and regulations in regard to physicians serving in the National Health Service Corps, which is a part of the United States Public Health Service, following report from Mr. Paris and Dr. Hooper in regard to correspondence received from Scotland Memorial Hospital. Physicians serving as federal officers in the USPHS are exempt from licensure in North Carolina as stated in the Medical Practice Act of North Carolina.

VERDICT: Dr. Wilkerson moved that this report be received as information and no action be taken. Dr. Hooper seconded and discussion followed with a substitute motion offered: VERDICT: Dr. Hooper moved that Mr. Robert Martin, Administrator of the Scotland Memorial Hospital be advised of Section 90-18, Subsection 4 of the Medical Practice Act and it would then be up to him and his hospital board as to whether a physician would have to be licensed in North Carolina in order to have privileges in that particular hospital, and that a copy of this letter be sent to Dr. J. Ralph Dunn, Jr., Chief of Staff of Scotland Memorial Hospital. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Family Nurse Practitioner -- The Board reviewed the proposed rules and regulations for the Family Nurse Practitioner, and Dr. Partrick reported on his recent correspondence and meeting with the Board of Nursing in regard to these proposals. Following this report, the Board discussed the present status of the two Board's positions on this matter.


VERDICT: Dr. Partrick moved that these proposed rules and regulations for Family Nurse Practitioners be adopted by the North Carolina Board of Medical Examiners. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed. Dr. Partrick was designated to advise the Board of Nursing of the Board's action, with copy of letter to be sent to the Governor of the State and the Secretary of the Department of Human Resources of the State. The President was instructed to respond to the letter from Governor Holshouser in regard to the Family Nurse Practitioner.

VERDICT: Dr. Edmondson moved that the Board approve the curriculum and training program as improvised at the University of North Carolina, and the Board go on record as approving this program and register those nurses that wish to be registered as Nurse Practitioners after they have completed this program, following review of the program by an appointed Board member, for out of hospital services, according to the proposed rules and regulations for the Family Nurse Practitioner. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed. The President of the Board was appointed to review the program for the Family Nurse Practitioner at the University of North Carolina. (Review of program for the Family Nurse Practitioner completed by Dr. Bryant Galusha, President, accompanied by Mr. Bryant Paris, Executive Secretary Designate, and same approved by the President.

RE: Dr. Robert LaBarbera, Pittsboro, N. C. -- Following information received by the Board that Dr. LaBarbera was practicing medicine in Pittsboro, N. C. and review of a newspaper article announcing that he would be practicing in that town, the Board reviewed Dr. LaBarbera's grades obtained on the June, 1973 North Carolina examination for medical licensure. These grades were below the 75.0% FLEX Weighted Average which is required for licensure in this state. The Board discussed the matter of Dr. LaBarbera already being in practice and what action the Board should take. Following this discussion, the Board decided to call Dr. LaBarbera in Pittsboro immediately and advise him he had not passed the examination and was not licensed to practice medicine in North Carolina.

The President of the Board spoke with Dr. LaBarbera, advised him that he had failed the examination and was not licensed to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina; that he should take immediate corrective action, and if he did not do so, he would be in violation of the General Statutes of the State of North Carolina. He was advised that if he did not cease immediately this practice, the Board would have to take further action. The President advised Dr. LaBarbera that he was ordering him to cease the practice of medicine immediately. He was advised that the results would be mailed to him of his examination and that Dr. Mathieson would be advised of the situation, which has been done.

There being no further business for discussion, Dr. Partrick moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Dr. Hooper and duly passed. Meeting adjourned.
