The North Carolina Medical Board held its regularly scheduled April 2021 meeting at its offices at 3127 Smoketree Court, Raleigh, NC. HEARINGS

KENNETH JAY HEADEN, M.D. – GREENSBORO, NC

The Board was represented by Mr. Marcus Jimison. Dr. Headen was represented by Mr. Matthew W. Wolfe and Mr. Brad K. Overcash.

Dr. Headen was charged with unprofessional conduct, including but not limited to, departure from, or failure to conform to, the standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice, within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6).

Following the hearing, the Board found that Dr. Headen committed unprofessional conduct, including but not limited to, departure from, or failure to conform to, the standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice, within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6).

The Board voted to indefinitely suspend Dr. Headen's license to practice medicine.

The hearing adjourned at 6:10 p.m.

INVESTIGATIVE MATTER

The Board went into closed session pursuant to Section 143-318.11(a) of the North Carolina General Statutes to prevent the disclosure of information that is confidential pursuant to Sections 90-8, 90-14, 90-16, 90-21.22 of the North Carolina General Statutes and not considered a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes and/or to preserve attorney/client privilege to discuss the proposed settlement.
