Doctors George H. Ross, Claude B. Williams, and Howard J. Combs appeared before the Board to explain their side of the controversy with the Narcotic Bureau.

Dr. Charles Lengyel, Austrian physician who was doing general practice with Dr. Camp of Pittsboro, was summoned before the Board at this time for practicing medicine without license. The Chatham County Medical Society had cooperated in bringing evidence concerning Dr. Lengyel. He was warned to regrain from practicing medicine in North Carolina without license.

The case of Dr. John J. Bender, who was licensed in 1937 and a graduate of a "B" grade school was discussed. No action was taken.

The members of the Board signed diplomas at nine o'clock P. M. and finished all discussions and business at ten o'clock P. M. At this time the meeting adjourned.
