MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

January 24-26, 1975

The Pinehurst Hotel
Pinehurst, North Carolina

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at The Pinehurst Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, on January 24-26, 1975 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and conducting of other business.

Friday, January 24 5:00 p.m.

The Board convened for business and reviewing of credentials. Drs. Frank Edmondson, President, Charles B. Wilkerson, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer, David S. Citron, J. Jerome Pence, Jr., Jack Powell, and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. were present. Also present were Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary, Ms. B. Joe Cooke, David L. Miller and Diane Freeman. Dr. E. Wilson Staub joined the meeting late due to a hospital emergency.

RE: <u>Dr. James H. Simmons. Jr.</u>, Spartanburg, S.C. -- Board reviewed Dr. Simmons' file for license by endorsement and his request for consideration of his grades obtained by taking the Iowa Basic Science examination in lieu of the Basic Science grades obtained on the FLEX examination taken at a later date.

ACTION: Dr. Taylor moved that the Board accept the Basic Science portion of the Iowa examination as the portion of the FLEX Basic Science examination for Dr. Simmons, and he be considered for licensure in North Carolina if and when all other requirements are met. Seconded by Dr. Citron and duly passed.

RE: <u>Dr. James K. Pope</u>, San Antonio, Texas -- Board reviewed letter of January 17 regarding Dr. Pope's request to take the clinical portion of the North Carolina examination for licensure as he had never taken it since his graduation from medical school.

ACTION: Dr. Wilkerson moved that Dr. Pope be advised he can take the second half of the examination, but that he also be advised that he will have to take the last two parts of the FLEX examination, and it would be to his advantage to take all parts of the FLEX, since if and when he decides to apply for licensure in another state that state may not accept part of the FLEX and part of a state board examination; he should also be requested to advise if and when he decides to go to another state for practice. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

RE: Assistants to physicians and registered nurses performing medical acts --

Executive Secretary reviewed action taken at the last Board meeting concerning distribution of information regarding supervision of and writing of prescriptions by assistants to physicians and registered nurses performing medical acts, and recent information received from other agencies concerning this and possible new legislation that should be introduced in this regard.

ACTION: Dr. Citron moved that the action taken by the Executive Secretary and the President of the Board in withholding distribution of the information be sustained and the proposed legislation be held for further consideration by the Board. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed. (see page 87 of these minutes.)

RE: <u>Sub-committee meeting with Board of Nursing</u> -- Dr. Taylor reported on this Board's subcommittee meeting with the subcommittee from the Board of Nursing and the upcoming meeting on January 26 to discuss both Boards' definition of supervision for registered nurses performing medical acts and proposed legislation to amend the North Carolina law on writing prescriptions. Saturday, January 25 1:30 p.m.

RE: <u>Dr. Ludwig Tramer</u>, Israel -- Dr. Robert Rollins of the North Carolina Department of Mental Health appeared to request the Board's consideration of licensure for Dr. Ludwig Tramer. Dr. Rollins stated that Dr. Tramer does not hold the Certificate of the ECFMG and would like consideration of license in North Carolina, and possibly certification as a visiting professor or some type of limited license to work in the state mental hospital, to work with the patients at Broughton Hospital and work in an administrative capacity with other physicians in other hospitals in the system. Dr. Rollins stated that Dr. Tramer would like to immigrate to the United States, become a citizen and live in North Carolina and remain on the staff in the mental health system in this state.

ACTION: Dr. Rollins was advised by the Board to inform Dr. Tramer that the Board has no provision for any type of license to cover his work as a staff physician on the basis of the credentials presented on his behalf at this time; however, he could come to work in North Carolina on an administrative basis until he could take the FLEX for full licensure, and the Board would consider waiving the ECFMG requirement as part of his credentials.

Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Registered nurses performing medical acts -- applicants

RE: <u>Dr. Emile Werk</u>, Wilmington, N.C. — applications complete for Linda P. Jasinski and Shirley A. Sutton. Following review of the application which had been returned to the applying physician following the December, 1974 meeting for amendments, Dr. Staub moved that Ms. Sutton and Ms. Jasinski be approved to function as a registered nurse performing medical acts, but that Dr. Werk be advised that these nurses or any others functioning in the same manner cannot write prescriptions that are not signed by the physician according to law, and this should be deleted from the application by sending it back to Dr. Werk, and explain to him that there possibly will be some new legislation forthcoming regarding this situation. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

RE: <u>Dr. Robert L. Blake, Jr.</u>, Hot Springs, N.C. — applications complete for Linda Lee Tull, Kathryn A.S. Johnson and Margaret B. Myers. Following review of these applications and discussion of Dr. Powell's report on his visit to the Hot Springs Clinic, Dr. Powell moved that Ms. Tull, Ms. Johnson and Ms. Myers be approved to function as registered nurses performing medical acts. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Mobile Intensive Care Technician -- Mr. Chris Gentile of the N. C. Office of Emergency Medical Services appeared with Mr. Joseph Hoover, Training Officer for the Guilford County M.I.C.T. program, and Mr. Bob Bailey, also with the Office of Emergency Medical Services to discuss implementation of the Guilford County emergency medical services program. The Board reviewed the applications and credentials submitted for approval of this program and Dr. Staub moved that the applications presented for approval as emergency medical technicians for the Guilford County program be approved.
