

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

CAROLINA HOTEL, PINEHURST, NORTH CAROLINA

January 9-10th, 1970

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, January 9-10th, 1970, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials, for special limited license and for other business. Drs. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Cornelius T. Partrick, and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

Friday, January 9th

The president explained to the guests the purpose of this meeting was to consider the difficulties that had been experienced to have the resident hospital staff licensed. The Board's position was explained by various members. There was a frank discussion by all the visitors and they seemed to support the suggestion that it would be of great benefit to the hospitals if the Board in its consideration found that it could grant license covering residents without the residents having to make a personal appearance before the Board. The hospital representatives states that they would assume more responsibility in seeing that the residents got their credentials in to the secretary's office if the Board could see the way clear to grant these licenses without the personal appearance. Members of the Board then called attention that this would be a big help to the Board but that the hospital representatives were assuming a lot of responsibility.

The president thanked those in attendance for coming and advised them that the Board would give careful consideration to their suggestions. (See P. 305 these Minutes)

The meeting was adjourned.

Friday, January 9th

The Board convened and reviewed credentials for license by endorsement and special limited license.

RE: Written Examination December 1969 - Grades for make-up examinations on individual subjects and make-up on Part II were reviewed.

VERDICT: It was moved, seconded and passed unanimously that these grades be approved.

RE: Grades on Flex Examination - Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved when the grades on the December, 1969 Flex examination are received that the members of the Board be furnished a report for consideration at the March, 1969 meeting. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick and passed unanimously.



RE: Dr. G. Douglas Blenkarn, a Canadian graduate, who is on the senior staff at the University of North Carolina School of Medicine, presented a letter as to his activities in order that the Board might clarify his position. He stated that he expected to receive his permanent visa early in April, 1970.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that Dr. G. Douglas Blenkarm be advised that he does not satisfy our requirements for license. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combés and passed unanimously.

RE: Endorsement of Credentials - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board of Medical Examiners consider endorsement of individuals who have passed the Flex examination and received license in another state whether or not they may be foreign graduates. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Physicians' Assistants - Dr. Frank Edmondson reported that he, Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. and Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. met with Dr. Edgar T. Beddingfield, Jr., President of the North Carolina Medical Society, and Mr. John H. Anderson, Jr., Attorney, in December, 1969, and certain recommendations were made. A meeting is planned for January 11th, 1970.

RE: January, 1971 Meeting - Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the secretary and president, after consultation with Dr. Bryant L. Galusha, set time and place for the January, 1971 meeting and ask that they consider Whispering Pines. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: June, 1970 Meeting - The secretary advised that the examinations would be held June 16-18th, and that applicants for license by endorsement would be interviewed Monday, June 15th.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board convene at 6:30 P. M. Sunday, June 14th. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.


