MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS - OCEAN TERRACE HOTEL

WRIGHTSVILLE BEACH, N. C. - JULY 13, 14, 15.

1940

The Board of Medical Examiners of North Carolina held a routine business meeting July 13, 14, 15 at Wrightsville Beach in the Ocean Terrace Hotel. Dr. Karl B. Pace called the meeting to order and then turned the meeting over to Dr. Frank A. Sharpe, president. Dr. Lewis W. Elias opened with prayer. Dr. William M. Coppridge, Dr. J. Street Brewer, Dr. Lester A. Crowell, Jr., and Dr. W. D. James were also present.

Credentials of $^D\!r_{\,\bullet}$ Otto William Schwalb and $^D\!r_{\,\bullet}$ Clarence Edens were examined and found to be complete and in order. The Board authorized the secretary to forward their licenses to them.

Dr. Landis P. Mitchell and Dr. Alford J. Holton appeared before the Board for the endorsement of their credentials. They were given this privilege since it was possible for them to attend the June meeting.

Dr. Ira M. Fisher of Oriental, N.C. was granted license after appearing in person and showing credentials that he was a graduate of the Medical College of Virginia.

Dr. Erastus Genair Goodman appeared before the Board to explain why he did not take the examination in Pharmacology, Materia Medica, and Therapeutics. He showed his credits from the National Board and was given credit for this subject by the Board.

Dr. George R. Laub of New Bern, Austrian physician, was told to discontinue practice of medicine.

The Board of Medical Examiners decided to meet in Durham on December 10, 1940. The exact place was to be announced later. The meeting was adjourned.
