

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS  
OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

The Hilton Inn  
Raleigh, North Carolina

June 10-13, 1974

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at The Hilton Inn, Raleigh, North Carolina, June 10-13, 1974 for the purpose of administering examination for licensure in North Carolina, interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and other business.

Monday, June 10

5:00 p.m.

The Board convened for business, and reviewing of credentials of applicants for license by endorsement. Drs. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., President, Charles B. Wilkerson, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Cornelius T. Partrick, E. Wilson Staub and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. were present. Also present were Mr. Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary, Mrs. Betty Joe Cooke and Mrs. Diane Freeman.

Following review of credentials, the Board adjourned until 9:00 a.m. the following morning, June 11.

Tuesday, June 11

RE: Interviews for license by endorsement of credentials --

RE: Dr. Fred Martin Abramovitz appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Ohio State University in 1973 and is licensed in Ohio by FLEX in 1973.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Abramovitz is in Ob-Gyn at Chapel Hill--when will you finish your residency training?

A: I have about three years to go still.

Q: Do you intend to stay in North Carolina and practice?

A: Well, we're not sure yet.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs?

A. No, not at all

Q: Have you had any trouble with any medical licensing boards?

A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Fred M. Abramovitz approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Richard Edwin Akers appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the Medical University of South Carolina in 1970 and is licensed in Georgia by examination in 1972 and is also a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Akers plans to practice Ophthalmology here in North Carolina--where are you planning to locate, Dr. Akers, and when do you plan to start? His application is complete.

A: Gastonia, sir, around the first of July.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever personally used habit forming drugs?

A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board?

A. No, sir

Q: Where did you take your training?

A: In Augusta.

VERDICT: Dr. Richard E. Akers approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Robert Wayne Alexander appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Duke University in 1969 and is a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Alexander will begin a fellowship--Cardiology--at Duke this summer. His application is complete.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. No, sir

Dr. Alexander, cont'd.

- Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No, sir

VERDICT: Dr. Robert W. Alexander approved for license by endorsement

RE: Dr. Stefan Kiril Alexandrov appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement. He is a graduate of Ivan Pavlov University in Bulgaria in 1963 and is licensed in Pennsylvania by FLEX in 1973.

- Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Alexandrov, do you have your alien registration receipt card-- could we see it please?  
 A: Yes, sir, I have it here.  
 Dr. Alexandrov presented same, Number A 19 233 887, and the picture compared favorably with the individual present.  
 Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Alexandrov has not been able to obtain certification of graduation from his medical school and a certified photograph due to the fact that his school is in a Communist country, but he does have a letter from a friend and fellow student at the same medical school who will verify that this is the Dr. Alexandrov who attended that medical school and he knew him as a medical student. What are your plans for this state, doctor?  
 A: My wife and I are both physicians and I will be planning to work in the Wake Hospital System in Apex, probably. We hope to come here about August.  
 Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No  
 Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. I do not drink.  
 Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board? A. No--it was the first time I applied to take FLEX, when I applied for a license.

VERDICT: Dr. Stefan K. Alexandrov approved for license by endorsement, to be limited geographically until citizenship is obtained.

RE: Dr. John Terrill Baker appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Harvard University in 1971 and is a diplomate of the National Board.

- Dr. Hooper: At the present time, Dr. Baker holds a resident's training license to Duke and wishes a full license.  
 Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No  
 Dr. Staub: What field are you in Dr. Baker?  
 A: Cardiology.

VERDICT: Dr. John T. Baker approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Peter Murray Banks appeared in May, 1974 applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He was approved for licensure upon satisfactory completion of those credentials, which has now been done.

VERDICT: Dr. Peter M. Banks approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Daniel Harris Barco appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Duke University in 1972 and completed National Boards in 1973.

- Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Barco holds a resident's training license to Duke presently. Do you hold any state licenses at all?  
 A: No, sir, I've only completed the National Boards.  
 Q: What field are you in Dr. Barco?  
 A: Family practice.  
 Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Barco's credentials are complete now.  
 Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. Not to excess.  
 Q: Have you ever used narcotics or barbiturates personally? A. No  
 Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board? A. No--this is my first application.

VERDICT: Dr. Daniel H. Barco approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Paul Kenneth Bates, Jr. appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Louisville in 1969 and is licensed in Kentucky by examination in 1970 and in Texas by endorsement in 1972.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Bates will begin practice in North Carolina in a couple of months-- where will you be going?

A: Hickory, sir, in Pediatrics.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No, sir

VERDICT: Dr. Paul K. Bates, Jr. approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Denis I. Becker appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a 1972 graduate of the University of Kentucky and is licensed in Ohio by FLEX in 1973.

Dr. Hooper: Where are you now, Dr. Becker?

A: At the Cleveland Clinic--doing my training there now.

Q: And you plan to come to North Carolina--where?

A: Well, I'll be at the Cleveland Clinic one more year, and then be moving to North Carolina, after my training.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used barbiturates or habit forming drugs personally? A. Never

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Denis I. Becker approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Patrick Box appeared applying for license by endorsement. He is a graduate of the University of Florida in 1973 and is a diplomate of the National Board in 1974.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Box, what are your plans for North Carolina now?

A: I'll be a first-year resident at Bowman Gray in Medicine.

Dr. Hooper: His application is complete. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Patrick Box approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Frank J. Breslin appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Tufts University in 1973 and is a diplomate of the National Boards in 1974.

Dr. Hooper: I believe you'll be coming to Durham to practice?

A: Yes, sir, the Community Health Clinic under Dr. Estes and possibly do some Internal Medicine work at Duke.

Dr. Hooper: His application is complete.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No,

Q: Have you ever personally used barbiturates, narcotics or other habit forming drugs? A. I've never used

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? any types of those drugs.

A. No, I haven't.

Q: When do you plan to start to work?

A: July first.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank J. Breslin approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. William John Brown appeared applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He is a graduate of McGill University in 1970 and is licensed in New York in 1973 and is a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Edmondson: Is New York the only state license you hold?

A: Yes, sir.

Q: What field are you in?

A: Anesthesiology--I'll be starting at Baptist Hospital next month.

Dr. Edmondson: The only think lacking in his file is the AMA inquiry--all other credentials are complete

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Dr. Brown, cont'd.

- Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you used narcotics or habit forming drugs personally? A. No, sir  
 Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No, sir--this is my second application only.

VERDICT: Dr. William J. Brown approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to Executive Secretary. (creds. comp.)

RE: Dr. Lee Kruidenier Buchanan appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials in January, 1974 and was approved for same upon satisfactory completion of those credentials, which has now been done.

VERDICT: Dr. Lee K. Buchanan approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Thavij Burapavong appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Chiang Mai University in Thailand in 1969 and is licensed in Illinois by FLEX in 1973.

Dr. Edmondson: Do you hold any state licenses?

A: No, sir, I am a resident in training at Bowman Gray now--in Surgery.

Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Burapavong does not have the letter from the dean about his graduation, but he does have a certified photograph and has his application certified by his medical school. All his other credentials are in order. His Flex Weighted Average was 84.7. Do you have your alien registration card?

A: Yes, sir, I have it here.

Dr. Burapavong presented same, No. A 19 666 016 and the picture compared favorably with the individual present.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No, sir

Q: What are your plans for North Carolina--for practice here?

A: I will finish my training next year, and will probably then practice in Winston-Salem.

VERDICT: Dr. Thavij Burapavong approved for license by endorsement of credentials, limited geographically until citizenship is obtained.

RE: Dr. Roger Warren Byhardt appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Marquette in 1968 and is licensed in Colorado and Wisconsin, both by endorsement with National Boards in 1969.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Byhardt will be joining the Duke staff in the Department of Radiology next month--is that correct?

A: Yes, Radiation Therapy.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess or personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Roger W. Byhardt approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Sherwood Washington Barefoot, Jr. appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement. He is a graduate of George Washington University in 1970 and is licensed in Florida by examination in 1972 and is a diplomate of the National Boards in 1971.

Dr. Edmondson: What are you doing now, Dr. Barefoot?

A: I'm in training in General Surgery at the University of Florida and will be transferring to U.N.C. this July to finish my training.

Q: Do you plan to stay here after your training?

A: Yes, sir, we're seriously considering that.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. Socially only.

Has it ever interfered with your work? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No, sir

Verdict: Dr. Sherwood W. Barefoot, Jr. approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary.

RE: Dr. James Paul Caldwell appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Vermont in 1968 and is licensed in Arizona by National Board certification in 1969.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Caldwell has accepted a position with the Family Health Center in Winston-Salem next month. What have you been doing in Arizona?

A: Finishing my residency in Internal Medicine.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess or used habit forming drugs personally? A. No

Dr. Taylor: What is the Family Health Center, Dr. Caldwell?

A: Well, it's a group of internists and pediatricians, mostly county supported, working with the poor people there and affiliated with Bowman Gray.

VERDICT: Dr. James P. Caldwell approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Paul Vincent Caporossi appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement. He is a graduate of the New Jersey College of Medicine in 1965 and is licensed in California in 1970 by examination and is a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Caporossi is presently in the military--or have you been discharged now?

A: As of July 15th I will be out.

Q: He plans on going to practice in Hickory next month--solo or group?

A: I'll be joining Dr. White's group to practice Ob-Gyn.

Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Caporossi is certified by the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology and his credentials are complete except for the California narcotic inquiry.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No, sir

Q: When do you plan to start practice?

A: About the first of August.

VERDICT: Dr. Paul V. Caporossi approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary.

RE: Dr. Augustin Sturgis Carswell, Sr. appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Georgia in 1945 and is licensed in Georgia, Florida and South Carolina.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Carswell owns some property near Hayesville and, will you be re-locating?

A: Not re-locating really, just would like to have my license when I'm in the state at my home here.

Q: Where are you practicing now?

A: In Augusta right now.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you personally ever used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No, sir

Q: At any time have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board or boards? A. No, sir

VERDICT: Dr. Augustin S. Carswell, Sr. approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Arthur Edward Charmatz appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the New Jersey College of Medicine and Dentistry in 1973 and is a recent diplomate of the National Boards.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Charmatz will be a resident at Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital beginning the first of July and his credentials are all complete.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. Never

VERDICT: Dr. Arthur E. Charmatz approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. C. Terrence Chastek appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials with incomplete application. He is a graduate of the State University of New York, Upstate Medical Center, in 1973 and is a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Chastek, where are you now?

A: I'm a resident at Chapel Hill in Psychiatry.

Q: Do you hold any state licenses?

A: No, sir this is the first one I've applied for.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No, I have not.

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards?

A. No--never applied.

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. No, I do not.

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No, I do not.

VERDICT: Dr. C. Terrence Chastek approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary.

RE: Dr. Douglas Brock Cines appeared applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He is a graduate of New York University in 1972 and is a diplomate of the National Board in 1973.

Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Cines holds a resident's training license to N. C. Memorial Hospital--what department, Dr. Cines?

A: I'm a junior resident in Medicine.

Dr. Edmondson: His application has not been returned yet, but everything else is here.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards?

A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Douglas B. Cines approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary. (creds. comp.)

RE: Dr. Edward Dana Congdon appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Columbia College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1944 and is licensed in New York by endorsement with National Boards.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Congdon is a diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry. What are your intentions for practicing in North Carolina, doctor?

A: I plan to live in Hendersonville--they have an opening there in the local clinic, the county clinic, where I'll work about half of my time, and the rest of my time I'll be in private practice. Plan to move down here sometime this fall.

Q: Where are you now?

A: Long Island. I have a son here in Raleigh and one in Hendersonville and also have found out that Henderson County does not have a psychiatrist at all, so, I have pretty much decided to move here.

Dr. Hooper: Dr. Conner will begin an Ob-Gyn residency at Bowman Gray next month. His credentials are complete.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No--no drugs except from another doctor's care.

A: Well, we have a home in Sapphire and have been thinking about some summer retirement practice there. We'll be there permanently sometime next year.

RE: Dr. Frederick Gerald Cox appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Kentucky in 1965 and is licensed in Kentucky by examination and in Virginia by endorsement in 1971.

- Dr. Hooper: What are your plans, Dr. Cox, for North Carolina? Your credentials appear to be complete.  
 A: General practice somewhat north of Charlotte. Next year, I hope.  
 Q: You are in general practice now?  
 A: Yes, sir.  
 Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Following said hearing, the Board considered the matter in executive session and on June 12, 1974 took the following action:

Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board revoke Dr. Frank Joseph Brown's license to practice medicine in North Carolina; that this revocation be suspended upon the following conditions: that for a period of five (5) years from this date, Frank Joseph Brown, M.D., shall practice medicine only in and at Broughton Hospital, Morganton, North Carolina, or in and at such other location as may be permitted or specified by this Board upon request of Frank Joseph Brown, M.D., and that for such period of time Frank Joseph Brown, M.D. does not violate any law, State or Federal; that he use and consume no drug or medicine designated and classified as a controlled substance under the laws of the State of North Carolina and the of the United States, except upon the written prescription of another physician, in the course of medical treatment and for medical reasons; that he refrain from excessive use of alcoholic beverages; and that he remain generally of good behavior and conduct his practice of medicine in accordance with proper professional and ethical standards, and that he furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board of his compliance with these conditions at such times as may be requested by this Board. FINDINGS AND ORDER

A hearing was held before the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina upon and concerning the charges and accusations preferred by the Board in the above matter at Raleigh, North Carolina, on June 11, 1974, at which hearing Frank Joseph Brown, M.D. appeared in person and was represented by Charles Blanchard and Irvin Tucker, Esquires, of Raleigh, North Carolina, and by Robert B. Byrd, Esquire, of Morganton, North Carolina.

Following the presentation of evidence, and after hearing argument by counsel for Dr. Brown, the Board denied the motions to dismiss the charges made on behalf of Dr. Brown by his counsel at the close of the presentation of the evidence for the Board and at the close of the presentation of all of the evidence and considered the charges and the evidence presented at the hearing and found and concluded as follows:

1) That on October 13, 1973, Frank Joseph Brown, M.D. personally appeared before the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina for the purpose of supporting and implementing his application to said Board for the issuance of a license to practice medicine in North Carolina, without examination, and by virtue of the Board's endorsement of his credentials and based upon his having been issued a license to practice medicine by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of Georgia. At that time, Dr. Brown was interrogated by the Board and among other things, he was questioned and answered to the Board as follows:

"Have you personally used narcotics or barbiturates, ever?"

Answer: "No, I have not."

That the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina relied upon the truthfulness of the foregoing statements to the Board in issuing to Dr. Brown a license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina.

That the foregoing answer given the Board by Dr. Brown was untrue as indicated by the testimony of Dr. Brown to the effect that in the latter part of 1972 and in April, May and June, 1973 he had used and consumed Percodan, a narcotic drug, in certain quantities which he obtained by writing prescriptions for the issuance of the same in the name of other persons, and in this respect grounds exist for the revocation of his license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina. Dr. Brown further testified that his answer to the foregoing question was not true and correct because at the time of making his answer he did not interpret or understand that the question applied to the use of drugs for medical reasons, and that the Percodan tablets which he had used were consumed to alleviate pain resulting from physical injuries resulting from accidental injuries to his body. Testimony was also presented on behalf of Dr. Brown to the effect that since he was employed at Broughton Hospital in November, 1973, his services have been satisfactory.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED that the license to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina heretofore issued by this Board to Frank Joseph Brown, M.D., be revoked, but that this Order be and is suspended upon the following conditions, to-wit:

1) That for a period of five (5) years from this date, Frank Joseph Brown, M.D., shall practice medicine only in and at Broughton Hospital, Morganton, North Carolina, or in at such other location as may be permitted or specified by this Board upon request of Frank Joseph Brown, M.D., and that for such period of time Frank Joseph Brown, M.D. does not violate any law, State or Federal, that he use and consume no drug or medicine designated and classified as a controlled substance under the laws of the State of North Carolina and of the United States, except upon the written prescription of another physician, in the course of medical treatment and for medical reasons, that he refrain from excessive use of alcoholic beverages, and that he remain generally of good behavior and conduct his practice of medicine in accordance with proper professional and ethical standards, and that he furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board of his compliance with these conditions at such times as may be requested by this Board.

The Board members and Mr. Bernstein discussed the operating clinic and the new ones to be funded the first of July, 1974 and where they would be opening. Also, they discussed the various legal aspects of



the practicing nurse practitioner and the supervision and back-up the nurse would have. Mr. Bernstein stated that the main intent and purpose of the clinics was to provide more primary care for the people of North Carolina and use the "health extenders" to the maximum, leaving a great deal of the supervision and back-up to the individual physician. Mr. Bernstein thanked the Board for their work on the program and said he would keep the Board's office informed of the progress of the program.

RE: MICT Program -- Mr. Chris A. Gentile, representative from the Office of Emergency Medical Services with the North Carolina Department of Human Resources appeared to discuss with the Board the proposed Rules and Regulations for the Mobile Intensive Care Program for North Carolina.
