

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

Velvet Cloak and Raleigh Memorial Auditorium,
Raleigh, North Carolina

June 12 - 15, 1972

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Velvet Cloak Inn and the Raleigh Memorial Auditorium for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement, to hold Part II of the written examination and the Flex examination; also for other business.

Monday, June 12

6:30 P. M. - The Board convened for dinner. Drs. Cornelius T. Patrick, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr. and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Administrative Secretary, were present.

Credentials for license by endorsement were reviewed by the members of the Board.

RE: Conversion of limited to full license:

Dr. Nagui R. El-Bayadi has furnished evidence of naturalization and has requested full license. Dr. William Dalton Bradford has applied for conversion of limited to full license. VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that these physicians be granted full license. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed.

RE: Dr. Jack E. Foster, Eden, North Carolina - (See previous Minutes) - The secretary presented certified copy of judgment that Dr. Foster had been convicted in the Superior Court of Rockingham County, North Carolina, on five counts of obtaining drugs by misrepresentation, where he entered a plea of guilty; that he be sentenced to 30 days in jail, said sentence being suspended upon the following conditions; That within a period of five days he surrender to the proper State or Federal authorities any State or Federal authorization he has to prescribe hard narcotics; that for a period of one year he not possess, use or prescribe any hard narcotics and thereafter only after his license has been properly returned by the proper authorities and that in each of the five cases he pay a fine of \$100.00 and cost of court.

The Board directed that Dr. Jack E. Foster be seen at the August, 1972 meeting of the Board.

RE: Dr. William F. Dee, Homestead, Pennsylvania - The secretary presented letter which stated that Dr. Dee wishes to obtain license in the state to come here one day a week with Medi-Hair in Charlotte.

VERDICT: It was moved and seconded that Dr. William F. Dee be given application and requirements for license by endorsement. This was passed.

RE: Assistant to Physician - Dr. John T. Daniel, Jr. submitted application for Ernest Bernard Eason, which was in order.

VERDICT: Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. moved that Dr. John T. Daniel, Jr. be granted the privilege of hiring Ernest Bernard Eason as his assistant. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. Bobby Oliver Heafer - (See previous Minutes) - The secretary advised he had requested report from Dr. Heafer's physician, but the same had not been received. The Board directed the secretary to get a report by the August meeting and for the officers of the Board to decide whether or not he should appear.



RE: Dr. Joseph G. Gaal, a foreign medical graduate, holds resident's training license to Cherry Hospital, granted August 13th, 1972. He elected to wait for the June, 1972 examination, but then requested further extension of the same to remain at Cherry Hospital without taking the examination, which was declined by the secretary.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the action of the secretary be supported by the Board after the secretary confers with the Mental Health officer in Raleigh; that he bring it back to the Board. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. William M. Bethune, Cherry Hospital, Goldsboro, North Carolina - The Board received word that Dr. Bethune had been in the hospital and requested him to appear at this time. He said he had over extended himself with his regular duties and many outside activities in line with his work. He related that he became depressed and sought medical aid; that he was in the hospital; that he did not resort to drugs or alcohol. This was confirmed by his physician who gave him a good report. Dr. Bethune said he was back on a full schedule, but had reduced his outside activities. To be seen at the October, 1972 meeting of the Board.

RE: Dr. Leon R. Staton, Hayesville, North Carolina - Dr. Staton was indicted for charges of improperly prescribing drugs, which case has not been tried. He was requested to appear before the Board at the last meeting with the possibility that the Board might handle the situation and not have to go through court. Dr. Staton failed to appear due to inclement weather. The Board directed that he appear at this time or voluntarily surrender his license. It has been reported by Dr. Staton's physician that he has recently lost 40 to 50 pounds and he was attempting to have him go to the hospital for a thorough examination.

Dr. Staton appeared before the Board and it was evident that he was in poor health. After a short interview with him the Board heard statements from a practical nurse from Hayesville, Dr. Isa Grant with the North Carolina State Board of Health and Mr. Moses. After a short conference the president of the Board related to Dr. Staton that the Board was requesting him to follow the advice of his physician and seek a thorough examination and treatment, if necessary, in a hospital and that a report be sent to the office of the Secretary of the Board.

RE: Dr. Thomas O. Wheless, Louisburg, North Carolina, appeared petitioning for recommendation of reinstatement of full narcotic tax stamp, which was denied and he was so advised.

RE: University of Alabama Physician's Assistant Program - The president of the Board stated that the program looked good on paper but his conclusion was that the Board should await AMA approval for these programs outside of the State of North Carolina.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the Board accept the recommendation of the president on the application of the assistant's training program of the University of Alabama. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. William C. Ivey, Saxapahaw, North Carolina - Pursuant to report from the Pharmacy Board that there had been an increase in Dr. Ivey's prescribing of amphetamines he was requested to appear. He stated that he lived in a rural area, saw a great many patients, including many overweight and arthritic patients; that he did prescribe amphetamines for overweight. He also said he gave percodan to some of his arthritics. He related that he had had some trouble with misuse of amphetamines and several break-ins. Dr. Ivey was warned of the danger of prescribing amphetamines with regard to addiction and of resale; also to use caution in prescribing narcotics for arthritics. He said he would stop prescribing amphetamines.

RE: Dr. Elpener Rudolph Ohle, Celo, North Carolina - Pursuant to SBI report of investigation Dr. Ohle was requested to appear at this time. This report related that there were irregularities in dispensing and maintaining records of drugs. Dr. Ohle admitted to certain laxity and related that he had taken steps

to correct the same. He was urged by the Board to continue according to the



made by the SBI.

RE: Dr. James R. Hughes appeared and stated that he was doing well; that he was still at Dorothea Dix Hospital and had been made a unit director. He said he needed a BNDD number but did not desire to have the use of narcotics.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board advise the drug authorities that the Board would recommend for him BNDD number to include 3, 4 and 5 of the control drugs. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. and passed.

RE: Cherry Hospital - Pursuant to a confidential report sent to the secretary's office by Governor Robert W. Scott of an investigation made by the SBI, the Board interviewed the following physicians: Dr. William M. Ethune, Dr. Malcolm P. Mullen, Dr. Charles W. Taylor and Dr. Timothy Boehm. After carefully considering the report and taking into consideration the personal interviews with the physicians, the Board concluded no disciplinary action was indicated.

The meeting was adjourned.
