

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

March 14-16, 1975

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at The Mid Pines Club on March 14-16, 1975 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and conducting other business.

Friday, March 14
5:00 p.m.

The Board convened for business and reviewing of credentials. Drs. Frank Edmondson, President, Charles B. Wilkerson, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer, David S. Citron, J. Jerome Pence, Jr., E. Wilson Staub and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., were present. Also, Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary, Mrs. B. Joe Cooke, Mrs. Diane G. Freeman and Mr. David L. Miller were present.

RE: Dr. Jack Powell, Asheville, N.C. -- Resignation from Board

The Executive Secretary presented and read letter from Dr. Powell requesting the Board's acceptance of his resignation as a member of the Board of Medical Examiners, to be effective immediately.

ACTION: Dr. Wilkerson moved that the Board accept Dr. Powell's resignation. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

RE: Board membership -- Replacement member

Dr. Wilkerson moved that the Board appoint Dr. Bryant L. Galusha to serve on the Board to fill the vacancy created by Dr. Powell's resignation, and if Dr. Galusha cannot serve, the matter be reconsidered, and Dr. Emery Miller be appointed to serve as an alternate appointee. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Gerald L. Clay, Cambridge, Massachusetts -- Request to take Day III, only, of FLEX

The Executive Secretary presented a letter from Dr. Clay requestion permission to re-take the Clinical Competence section of FLEX only, when it is given next June, 1975.

ACTION: Dr. Pence moved that the Board deny this request and he be required to take the entire examination again for licensure. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Assistants to Physicians -- Consideration of Board policy regarding convicted felons being considered for approval as an assistant to a physician.

The investigator presented information gathered regarding the request from the University of North Carolina's Surgeons' Assistant Program.

ACTION: Dr. Staub moved that the Board advise the University of North Carolina that they will consider the application if submitted. Seconded by Dr. Citron. Motion defeated on vote of two for and four opposed.

RE: Audit, 1973-74 fiscal year -- Dr. Wilkerson, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the committee had reviewed the audit; everything appeared to be in order, and moved that the Audit be accepted by the Board as presented. Seconded by Dr. Citron and duly passed.

ACTION: Dr. Wilkerson moved that Mr. Paris and the attorney for the Board draw up some form of procedure to be presented to the Board at its next meeting regarding failures to comply with the vital statistics laws of the state. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed on vote of five for and one opposed.

RE: Post graduate education -- requirement for licensure -- Dr. Staub moved that the resident's training license be extended to cover all physicians in their first year of training after receiving the M.D. degree. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed. The Board instructed the Executive Secretary to notify all deans of medical schools in the state and heads of training programs at hospitals with such of the new requirement.

RE: Office of Emergency Medical Services -- meeting with the Board


Mr. Chris Gentile with the Office of Emergency Medical Services of the Department of Human Resources, Dr. Robert Youngblood of Wilson, and Dr. Thomas Griggs of Chapel Hill, appeared to discuss with the Board requested approval of amendments in the rules and regulations to allow for implementation of the Emergency Medical Technicians-I.V.

ACTION: Dr. Staub moved that the Board approve the amendments in the rules and regulations established pursuant to Section 143-514 of the North Carolina General Statutes as submitted and discussed with the Board and that the program so presented be approved. Seconded by Dr. Pence and duly passed.

RE: Registered nurses performing medical acts -- amendments to rules and regulations. Dr. Taylor reported on the sub-committee meeting with the sub-committee from the Board of Nursing and presented amendments to the rules and regulations for registered nurses performing medical acts as approved by the joint sub-committees.

ACTION: Dr. Citron moved that the amendments and changes as reported by the sub-committee and approved by the sub-committee be approved by the full Board. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this meeting, Dr. Taylor moved the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed. Meeting adjourned.
