

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Velvet Cloak Inn, Raleigh, North Carolina

March 27-28, 1970

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Velvet Cloak Inn, Raleigh, North Carolina, March 27-28, 1970 for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement, graduates of foreign medical schools applying for the written examination, and for other business.

Friday, March 27

2:00 P. M. - The Board convened and Drs. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., H. Lee Large, Jr., Cornelius T. Partrick, Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary, and Mrs. Betty Joe Cooke, were present.

RE: Dr. Paul G. Donner, Charlotte - The secretary presented correspondence that related that Dr. Donner belonged to the Charlotte Psychiatric Group, which is not a professional corporation; that he is objecting to a group incorporating and taking the name of Charlotte Psychiatric Associates. This corporate name was approved by the Board of Medical Examiners as this board had no knowledge of the name of the unincorporated group and it was also acceptable to the office of the Secretary of State.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that Dr. Paul G. Donner be advised that the Board of Medical Examiners considered his request about changing a corporate name; that the Board of Medical Examiners does not have the authority to change the name of any corporation. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.


RE: Resident's Training License - (See p. 3 these Minutes) - Pursuant to the instructions of the Board of Medical Examiners at the January, 1970 meeting, requirements were formulated for credentials to be furnished without an appearance before the Board, which requirements were presented to the Board, and approved.

RE: Flex Examination - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that this Board require Flex weighted average of 75% or above for the December, 1969 examination; that the Board waive its regulation on the requirement of the individual grade. RE: State Government Reorganization Study - Senator John T. Henley came to the Board to discuss the various facets under consideration in this matter. The 1967 Legislature authorized a study for reorganization of State Government. Senator Henley stated his committee was going to recommend that State Government be divided into about 25 departments and that it would also recommend that the Board of Medical Examiners be put in a health group. He said he did not think there would be any change in the operation of the Board other than to report to the respective departmental head.

RE: Resident's Training License (See p.1 of these Minutes) Representatives from the medical schools and hospitals having residency training programs appeared again to discuss the matter of licensing of residents. No representatives were present from Forsyth Memorial Hospital and New Hanover Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Bryant L. Galusha presented the new procedure whereby an applicant might apply for a resident's training license by furnishing certain credentials and not appear before the Board, which procedure gave the resident the option to apply for license by endorsement, with an appearance required. It was advised that the holder of a resident's training license was not eligible for any practice outside of residency training to the hospital in which he is being trained. Dr. Galusha stated that if a resident were not duly licensed, he would be in legal jeopardy, as well as the hospital, and that it was the responsibility of the institution that the residency staff be licensed to practice medicine.

RE: Medical Society Building - (See previous Minutes) - The secretary presented the lease for space in the new building, with request for additional space. He called attention to the fact that there was no privilege of renewing the lease at the end of five years, though it was stated in a letter that the Board of Medical Examiners would be in a preferred position. The secretary also related that if the expense of operating the building was more than anticipated, this would be pro rated on an increase in rent.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that the officers of the Board be authorized to negotiate the lease for office space in the Medical Society building. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

RE: Meetings of the Board of Medical Examiners

November 30-December 4 - Endorsement of credentials and Flex - The Board agreed that applicants for endorsement of credentials would be interviewed on December 1st.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper moved that the members of the Board stay at the Sir Walter Hotel for the December, 1970 meeting.

January 29-31, 1970 - The secretary reported to the Board that this meeting would be held at the Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst.

Meeting March 19-21, 1971 - Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that this meeting be set for the Carolina Hotel or some other place at the discretion of the secretary. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned.

RE: Written Examination June, 1970 - Part II

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the Board of Medical Examiners reconsider and that the examiners in Part II of the examination make up the examination and administer the same as has been done in the past. This motion was duly seconded.

Amendment to the motion: That Part II of the written examination will be given by this Board in 1970 and 1971 and the final make-up examination will be given in June, 1972. Dr. Combs and Dr. Large accepted the amendment and the motion was passed unanimously.



VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the same policy be followed for remuneration of the members of the Board of Medical Examiners that has been followed in the past for the December examination and for any examinations to be given in the future. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. Irving K. Bass - (See previous Minutes) - The secretary presented information of apparent irregularity in the practice of medicine regarding insurance.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that in view of the past history of Dr. Irving K. Bass and this information that the Board of Medical Examiners command him to make an appearance at the June, 1970 meeting and bring the complete medical record on the case referred to. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed by a vote of five and one against. (Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick)

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials and applicants who are graduates of foreign medical schools applying to take the written examination were reviewed by members of the Board.

RE: Foreign Medical Graduates - Staff State Institutions - December 1969 Examination -

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the examinees who failed the examination now in a position that they are working in North Carolina under the special limited license and make the statement they want to take our examination in June, 1970, be permitted to remain in their present positions so that they may take the forthcoming North Carolina examination and their grades be certified. That they be advised that they have to meet the deadline to register for the examination. That in the future, the Board of Medical Examiners will not grant special limited license for staff positions. This motion was duly seconded



by Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. and passed by a vote of four to two, one abstaining.

RE: Dr. Edwin Sims Mize, Jr. (See previous Minutes) appeared and petition for the Board of Medical Examiners to recommend that his narcotic tax stamp be reinstated. He said that he had been doing all right in his practice without the narcotic stamp, but that a new directive had been issued which required a registry number for some narcotic drugs. He said that he had been called before the Board of Censors because his nurse had ordered too much paregoric, which matter was cleared up; that it was not his custom for the nurse to do this. He stated that he planned to have a hospital practice as soon as he procured narcotic tax stamp.

The secretary was directed to procure the latest regulations from the Narcotic Bureau.

RE: Written Examination - The members of the Board examining in Part II of the examination were asked to have their questions in by May 1st.

RE: Dr. Paul J. Chambers, Charlotte, North Carolina - The secretary presented report received January 30th, 1970 from the State Bureau of Investigation alleging that Dr. Chambers was violating the drug law; that he sold seconal to an agent purporting himself to be a student, for which he charged \$2.00; that no physical examination was made.

Dr. Chambers was requested to appear before the Board. He admitted that he was dispensing barbiturates, amphetamines; that as to narcotics he only gave some empirin. He stated that his office was in downtown Charlotte; that he did insurance examinations, saw the poorer, more underprivileged class of people and that it had gotten out of hand. He said he charged for an office visit and dispensed the medicine. He stated he would be willing to go on probation or do anything the Board requested.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board of Medical Examiners ask Dr. Paul J. Chambers to surrender his narcotic tax stamp and what narcotics he has on hand, mail to the Narcotic Bureau; that he be told he will be on probation and subject to further investigation and subject to be recalled before this Board at future times; that he get rid of barbiturates and amphetamines. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed unanimously.

The action of the Board was given to Dr. Chambers by the president.

The Minutes of the January 9-10th, 1970 meeting were approved as read.
