

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS  
OF NORTH CAROLINA

Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina

May 11- 13th, 1968

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Carolina Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, May 11-13th, 1968, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for license by endorsement of credentials, for special limited license, and other business.

Saturday, May 11th  
6:00 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner. Drs. W. Boyd Owen, President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, H. Lee Large, Jr., Clark Rodman, Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, were present.

Dr. James E. Davis was absent for this portion of the meeting.

Credentials for license by endorsement of credentials, special limited license, and foreign medical school graduates petitioning to take the written examination were reviewed by the Board.

RE: Conversion of Limited to Full License - The following physicians were granted license by endorsement of credentials, limited geographically to cover them for residency training, and they are now applying for conversion of limited to full license:

RESOLVED that the limited license of the above physicians be converted to full license.

RE: Dr. William M. Bethune, Jr. - The Board of Medical Examiners at its meeting in March, 1968, recommended that it be suggested to Dr. Bethune that he voluntarily surrender his license to practice medicine in this state, which was carried out by the secretary.

The secretary reported at this time that Dr. Bethune had agreed verbally to voluntarily surrender his license to practice medicine and that he had mailed his license certificate in to the office of the secretary.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the license to practice medicine of Dr. William M. Bethune, Jr. be revoked on the basis of voluntary surrender. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed unanimously.

RE: Dr. William C. Piver - The secretary presented letter from Dr. Piver requesting recommendation of reinstatement of narcotic tax stamp.

VERDICT: The Board instructed the secretary to request Dr. William C. Piver to appear at the June, 1968 meeting.

RE: Dr. Stephen A. Butler - The secretary presented letter from Dr. Butler requesting that he be given a special examination on Obstetrics-Gynecology, which he



failed in 1967, as he would be unable to be present for the regularly scheduled examination.

VERDICT: Dr. H. Lee Large, Jr. moved that the examination as above requested not be given at any time other than the prescribed time. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Clark Rodman and passed unanimously.

RE: Biennial Registration - Reinstatement - The license to practice medicine of the following physicians was suspended for failure to register as required by General Statutes of the State of North Carolina 90-15.00 and they have now registered:

A. I am a Kentucky boy, I want to get out of the big city and want to spend my last days working in an area where I think there will be a little peace and quiet. I want to work and do something good.

I came to North Carolina because I want to get my boards in Preventive Medicine and I have to work two years in a health department that is qualified.

Dr. Davis: What are your duties in Guilford?

A. Directing maternity care project there. I am working in a family planning project.

Dr. Edmondson: When do you contemplate coming?

A. I have moved, came the first week in April.

Dr. Owen: You have not been seeing patients?

A. No, getting acquainted, discussing project.

Dr. Owen: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir

Dr. Adams lives in Winston-Salem and commutes to Mt. Airy. It amounts to about three days a week when covering.
