

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

The Pinehurst Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina

May 19-22, 1974

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at The Pinehurst Hotel, Pinehurst, North Carolina, May 19-22, 1974 for the purpose of interviewing applications for license by endorsement of credentials and other business.

Sunday, May 19
3:00 p.m.

The Board convened for business. Drs. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., President, Charles B. Wilkerson, Jr., Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Cornelius T. Partrick, E. Wilson Staub and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. were present. Also present were Mr. Bryant D. Paris, Jr., Executive Secretary, Mrs. B. Joe Cooke and Mrs. Diane Freeman.

RE: Dr. Nabil S. Malek -- consideration for licensure

Dr. Trevor Hughes and Dr. Joseph Patterson appeared to request the Board to consider letting Dr. Malek apply for license by endorsement of credentials in North Carolina although he has not taken the FLEX examination, but is licensed in Pennsylvania by state board written examination and is a Fellow of the Faculty of Anesthetists of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, which has been determined to be comparable to the American Board of Anesthesiology certification.

ACTION: Dr. Partrick moved that the Board forward an application for license by endorsement of credentials to Dr. Malek and that the Board will consider same on an individual basis. Seconded by Dr. Galusha and duly passed.

RE: Mobile Intensive Care Technicians -- Mr. James Page with the North Carolina Department of Human Resources and three assistants met with the Board to discuss the Board's opinions and thoughts in regard to the new legislation passed by the 1974 General Assembly regarding various medical acts performed by certain emergency personnel, such as Mobile Intensive Care Technicians. Mr. Page is seeking the Board's approval for the proposed rules and regulations covering the Mobile Intensive Care Technician, and possible authorization by the Board for his department, Office of Emergency Medical Services, to enforce these rules and regulations and a positive statement from the Board of Medical Examiners regarding the authority of this agency.

Following the discussion, the Board advised Mr. Page that they would like to review the criteria and program for the Mobile Intensive Care Technicians and asked him to supply this for them as soon as possible so it could be discussed again at the June Board meeting, which Mr. Page advised that he would do.

RE: Biennial Registration - Reinstatement -- The following physicians' licenses were suspended for failure to register as required by North Carolina General Statute 90-15. They have now registered:

Dr. Edmondson moved that if all fees and penalties have been paid, the above physicians be duly registered. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Conversion - Limited to full license -- Dr. Taylor moved that all applicants for conversion of limited to full license be approved for same if all credentials are in order. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed. They are:

James Page Aplington and James Richard Boatright.

RE: Dr. Albert E. Barnhardt, Kannapolis, N. C. -- Board reviewed file.

ACTION: Dr. Galusha moved that Dr. Barnhardt be invited to appear before the Board at the June, 1974 Board meeting. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed.

RE: Dr. S. W. Fleming, Elm City, N. C. -- Board reviewed file.

ACTION: Dr. Taylor moved that Dr. Fleming may surrender his license to the Board and the Board would accept same. Seconded by Dr. Partrick and duly passed.

Dr. Wilkerson moved that the meeting be adjourned until 7:30 a.m. the following morning, Monday, May 20. Seconded by Dr. Taylor and duly passed.

Monday, May 20

The Board convened to review credentials of applicants for license by endorsement of credentials and other business.

RE: Dr. William B. Cota, Elizabethtown, N. C. -- assistant to Dr. Rex C. LaGrange, Elizabethtown, N. C. Board reviewed file.

ACTION: Dr. Wilkerson moved that the Executive Secretary and the attorney for the Board check on Dr. Cota's working in North Carolina and follow through with the appropriate procedures. Seconded by Dr. Edmondson and duly passed.

RE: Office procedures - computerization -- The Executive Secretary presented to the Board the study completed regarding computerization of records for the Board's office. At the Board's request, the Executive Secretary recommended that the Board purchase the Burroughs computer equipment on the installment purchase agreement plan; and that following this purchase and a period of use, if the equipment is not satisfactory or not meeting the requirements of the Board, the plan be converted to the lease agreement plan, and drop the lease, if necessary.

ACTION: Dr. Edmondson moved that the Executive Secretary's recommendation be approved. Seconded by Dr. Wilkerson and duly passed, unanimously.

The Board considered and interviewed applicants for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. James Wellington Asaph appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials with incomplete file. He is a graduate of the University of Oregon in 1962 and is licensed in New York by endorsement with National Boards.

Dr. Galusha: Dr. Asaph holds a resident's training license to the University in Chapel Hill and his application lacks the Oregon Board inquiry and New York narcotic inquiry.

A: Well, I only hold a Basic Science Certificate in Oregon--don't have a full license there yet.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. Not that I'm aware of.

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. No

Q: Have you ever used narcotics or barbiturates personally?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board?

A. No, sir

Dr. Wilkerson: Where are you now did you say?

A: I'll finish my training in July and will be on the staff at Memorial Hospital for about 2½ months before going back to Oregon.

VERDICT: Dr. James W. Asaph approved for license by endorsement of credentials if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary. (credentials completed)

RE: Dr. James William Baker appeared applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He is a graduate of West Virginia University in 1968 and is licensed in Ohio by endorsement with the National Board.

Dr. Galusha: Dr. Baker is now in the military at Fayetteville, and his credentials have now been completed with the missing letter of recommendation he has brought.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates?

A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever had any difficulty with a medical licensing board?

A. No

Q: Where do you plan to practice?

A: Right now, I'll just be moonlighting, but have been looking around at several parts of the state.

VERDICT: Dr. James W. Baker approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Peter Murray Banks appeared applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He is a graduate of Harvard University Medical School in 1971 and is licensed in Maryland by endorsement with the National Board.

Dr. Partrick: Dr. Banks plans to join the staff at Duke in July of this year. His file lacks the completed application form and certified photograph and graduation certification.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

 Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. No
 Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Peter M. Banks approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary.

RE: Dr. Edward William Bierman appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials with incomplete application. He is a graduate of the State University of New York, Downstate, in 1971 and is a diplomate of the National Board in 1973.

Dr. Partrick: Dr. Bierman has bought some property in Chatham County and plans to practice probably in Siler City or Sanford eventually. What field, Dr. Bierman? He has brought his missing letter of recommendation.

A: Pediatrics, sir.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. Traffic violations.

Any felonies?

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No

Dr. Wilkerson: Where are you now?

A: Fort Bragg, in the military. I'll be going to Bowman Gray when I get out to finish up my residency.

VERDICT: Dr. Edward W. Bierman approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. James Russell Brink appeared in March, 1974 applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He was approved for same upon satisfactory completion of those credentials, which has now been done.

VERDICT: Dr. James Russell Brink approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Lafayette Arthur Brittingham, Jr. appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the Medical College of Virginia in 1964 and is licensed in Virginia by examination in 1964 and in Washington by endorsement in 1970. He is also a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Partrick: Dr. Brittingham is planning to work in Surry County and cover for a Radiologist there who is ill -- is that correct?

A: Yes, sir, my partner, Dr. Fant, and I will be covering if needed.

Dr. Partrick: His file lacks only one letter of recommendation and a couple of inquiries.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. Never

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board? A. Never

VERDICT: Dr. Lafayette A. Brittingham, Jr. approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary. (credentials completed)

RE: Dr. David Erwin Brody appeared applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He is a graduate of New York Medical College in 1963 and is licensed in Connecticut, New York, California and Arizona.

Dr. Partrick: Dr. Brody was licensed by examination in Connecticut and by endorsement in the other states. His application is lacking his certified photograph and graduation certification and some board inquiries.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board at all? A. No, sir

Dr. Wilkerson: What are you planning to do in North Carolina?

A: I'll be going with the Guilford County Hospital System in Greensboro about July fifteenth.

VERDICT: Dr. David E. Brody approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary. (creds. comp.)

RE: Dr. Frank Mac Brown appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Loma Linda University in 1963 and is licensed in Tennessee and California by endorsement with National Boards.

Dr. Wilkerson: Dr. Brown's application is incomplete, lacking the certified photograph and graduation certification and the California Board inquiry.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir, I have not

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir, I do not

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or barbiturates? A. Never

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No, sir

Dr. Partrick: What are your plans for North Carolina, Dr. Brown?

A: I'll be going to Hendersonville to practice Orthopaedics.

VERDICT: Dr. Frank M. Brown approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary. (creds. comp.)

RE: Dr. David Joseph Burke appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Iowa in 1967 and is licensed in Iowa by examination, Illinois and Texas by endorsement.

Dr. Staub: Dr. Burke's credentials are complete and in order.

Dr. Hooper: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess or used habit forming drugs personally? A. No

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: When do you plan to come to North Carolina?

A: I'll be in Orthopaedics in Concord, hopefully about the first of July.

VERDICT: Dr. David J. Burke approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Raymond Edward Carr appeared in March, 1974 applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He was approved for same upon satisfactory complete of those credentials, which has now been done.

VERDICT: Dr. Raymond E. Carr approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. William Warren Carroll appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Case Western Reserve University in 1953 and is licensed in Ohio by examination in 1953 and licensed in Virginia and Illinois.

Dr. Staub: As I understnad it you'll begin practicing Ophthalmology in Rocky Mount this summer?

A: Yes, I was in general practice for 17 years, and then went to the Medical College of Virginia and took a residency in Ophthalmology and then moved to Illinois. My family doesn't like it there, so we've decided to move to North Carolina.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used alcohol to excess or used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. William W. Carroll approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. David Albert Clark appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the State University of New York, Upstate Medical Center, in 1973 and is a diplomate of the National Boards in 1974 and holds no state license.

Dr. Staub: What are your plans, Dr. Clark?

A: I will be finishing my internship this year, and will be a resident in Pediatrics at Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, I have not

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No, I have not-- this is the first board I've applied to.

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess or personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No, I have not

VERDICT: Dr. David A. Clark approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Helen Elizabeth Courvoisie appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. She is a graduate of the Medical University of South Carolina in 1970 and is licensed in South Carolina by examination in 1971.

Dr. Hooper: What are your planning to do here in North Carolina?

A: I'm planning to go to work in Winston-Salem sometime this summer--around July first.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical license board? A. No

Q: Have you ever used habit forming drugs personally, or narcotics, or used alcohol to excess? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. Helen Elizabeth Courvoisie approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Robert Dudley Cox, III appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the Medical College of South Carolina in 1967 and is licensed in South Carolina by examination in 1967.

Dr. Staub: What are your plans for a full license, Dr. Cox?

A: I'll be working at the state hospital--Broughton in Morganton.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess or used narcotics or other habit forming drugs personally? A. No--only if prescribed by another doctor.

Dr. Hooper: You plan to go to work when?

A: I hope to start immediately.

VERDICT: Dr. Robert D. Cox, III approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Flynn Keels Dickson appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the Medical University of South Carolina in 1967 and is licensed in South Carolina in 1967 by examination.

Dr. Staub: Dr. Dickson works in Otolaryngology and plans to join Dr. Ellison Edwards in Charlotte in that practice. His credentials are complete.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No--traffic violations only.

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or other habit forming drugs, or used alcohol to excess? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. F. Keels Dickson approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Arnold Ray Frazier appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Kentucky in 1969 and is licensed in Kentucky by examination and in Minnesota by endorsement, and also holds National Board certification.

Dr. Staub: Dr. Frazier plans to start practice in Charlotte in July--what field, Dr. Frazier?

A: Pulmonary diseases.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you ever used narcotics or habit forming drugs personally? A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. Yes, I have.

Dr. Hooper: Would you explain please?

A: Yes, sir. I have discussed this whole thing with Dr. Galusha and possibly he has talked with you about it. The trouble was regarding a loan I had and the Kentucky Board got into it.

Dr. Hooper: What is the status of that now?

A: At this time, that licensure board considered a request from the scholarship loan fund for discontinuance of the license, and elected to do nothing about their request--the way it stands now, I don't know. There is no appeal before them at this time, as far as I know.

Board discussion following Dr. Frazier's appearance.

VERDICT: Dr. Arnold R. Frazier approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. James Ellis Garrett appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement. He is a graduate of the University of South Carolina in 1973 and is a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Hooper: You hold no state license, Dr. Garrett?

A: No, sir, I have not applied before now.

Q: What are your plans for North Carolina?

A: For the immediate future I'll do some part-time emergency room work while I'm still taking my residency at Norfolk General--I'll practice over the state line.

Q: What type of residency are you in?

A: Internal Medicine, sir.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used narcotics or habit forming drugs personally? A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No

VERDICT: Dr. James E. Garrett approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary. (credentials completed)

RE: Dr. Joshua Bernard Grossman appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement. He is a graduate of Washington University in 1965 and is licensed in Missouri by examination in 1965.

Dr. Edmondson: Dr. Grossman's credentials are all in order and complete with the exception of the long term letter of recommendation. Dr. Grossman is now in Asheville, at the VA?

A: Yes, sir, that's right.

Dr. Galusha: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used narcotics or barbiturates personally? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any boards of medical examiners? A. No, sir

VERDICT: Dr. Joshua B. Grossman approved for license by endorsement if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the Executive Secretary. (credentials completed)

RE: Dr. Thomas Edward Hamilton appeared applying for license by endorsement with incomplete credentials. He is a graduate of Loma Linda University in 1973 and is a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Galusha: The reason you have no other state license is just because you've never applied anywhere else yet?

A: Yes, sir, that's right.

Dr. Galusha: Dr. Hamilton plans to go into General Practice in Andrews, North Carolina. His application lacks only the long term letter of recommendation.

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used narcotics or barbiturates personally? A. No, sir

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No, sir

Q: Have you had any difficulty with any medical licensing boards? A. No, sir

Dr. Staub: Dr. Harvey now holds a resident's training license at Moses Cone in Greensboro in Family Medicine. His application appears to be in order.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or other habit forming drugs? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Dr. Taylor: When will you finish your residency?

A: I have two more years.

VERDICT: Dr. Roy E. Harvey, III approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Kenneth Richard Haslam appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of Cornell University in 1960 and is licensed in California, Pennsylvania, Connecticut and Massachusetts by endorsement with the National Board.

Dr. Kenneth R. Haslam, continued

Dr. Staub: Dr. Haslam is on the staff at the University of North Carolina-- in what field, doctor?

A: Medical electronics--medical engineering. Setting up a new department there.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you had difficulty at any time with a medical licensing board? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No--have used a sleeping pill.

Q: Occasionally?

A: Once or twice a month while in med school.

VERDICT: Dr. Kenneth R. Haslam approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. William Charles Heymann appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the Medical College of Ohio in 1972 and is a diplomate of the National Board.

Dr. Taylor: Dr. Heymann plans to practice in Greenville and surrounding areas-- sometime this year, right?

A: Yes, sir, July one.

Dr. Hooper: Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No

Q: Have you ever used alcohol to excess? A. No

Q: Have you ever personally used narcotics or habit forming drugs? A. No

Q: Have you had any difficulty with a medical licensing board? A. No

Dr. Taylor: Just as a note of interest, Dr. Heymann is also a graduate of the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine in addition to his M.D. degree.

VERDICT: Dr. William C. Heymann approved for license by endorsement.

RE: Dr. Albert William Hilker appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a graduate of the University of Chicago, Rush Medical College, in 1939 and is licensed in Wisconsin by examination in 1940 and also in Illinois.

Dr. Taylor: Dr. Hilker is planning to come to the VA Hospital in Winston-Salem. His credentials are all complete. Have you been practicing in Illinois?

A: Well, I got my Illinois license in 1940 and shortly thereafter, after the war, moved to Wisconsin and have practiced there since--27 years. I've been in Winston-Salem for about 13 months now.


